METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets dropped the opening game of a three-game series to the Pirates, 14-7, last night...New York is a season-low four games below .500 and is a season-high 9.5 games behind first-place...The Mets continue their six-game road trip (0-4) to Atlanta (0-3) and Pittsburgh (0-1)...Following this series, the Mets are off on Monday before the start of a six-day, five-game homestand against the Yankees (two games) and Cardinals (three games).

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: New York has lost seven straight games, which is the longest stretch of the season...The last time the Mets lost seven straight was in 2019, from June 23-29...The last time the Mets had a longer losing streak was when they dropped a season-high eight games from May 31-June 9...The Mets have posted a 6.82 ERA (46 ER/60.2 IP) with 26 walks and 57 strikeouts during the streak...The team is batting .225/.286/.408 over the span...New York has been outscored 51-31 over the last seven games.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded 73 strikeouts through his first 11 career major league games, that is the third-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (87) and Nolan Ryan (75) have more in their first 11 career starts...His 73 strikeouts are tied with Yu Darvish for the third-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 11 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (96) and Masahiro Tanaka (88).

FRANKLY SPEAKING: Francisco Lindor is on a five-game hitting streak...He is batting .353 (6-17) with four runs, one doubles, two home runs, three RBI, three walks with a 1.215 OPS in that span.

TAKE IT TO THE BANK: The Mets play at PNC Park for the first time this year...New York went 2-1 at the yard in 2022...Eduardo Escobar has hit .500 (23-46) with 11 runs, five doubles, one triple, two home runs, 10 RBI and four walks in 13 career games at the ballpark...He has safely hit in 10 of his 13 games in Pittsburgh...Omar Narváez has hit .351 (26-74) with 14 runs, four doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI with 11 walks and a .435 OBP and a .527 SLG in 24 games in Pittsburgh.

A STARLING IS BORN: Over his last 29 games, Starling Marte is batting .307 (31-101) with 14 runs, one double, one triple, two home runs, 10 RBI, three walks with a .346 OBP...He has safely reached base in 10 of his last 12 games...He has safely hit in six of his last seven games...Marte has played 478 career games at the ballpark and is a .290/.348/.445 career hitter with 46 home runs and 204 RBI.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo is batting .331 (48-145) with 21 runs, eight doubles, three triples, three home runs, 21 RBI, 20 walks with a .412 OBP and .490 SLG in 37 games on the road this season...His .331 road average ranks sixth in the majors...Nimmo owns a career .398 OBP on the road...That is the fourth-highest mark in the majors since the Wyoming native entered the league in 2016.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 31-37 in the history of PNC Park... The Mets took the series in Pittsburgh, 2-1, from September 6-7, 2022.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York has played 37 games on the road this year, the most in the majors...New York is 15-22 with a 5.137 ERA away from Citi Field in 2023...The team's 304 strikeouts on the road are the second-most in the majors.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS: Francisco Alvarez has hit 11 home runs this season...That is the third-most by a rookie in the majors and the second-most in the National League...Only two rookie catchers in Mets history have had more homers in a season...Travis d'Arnaud (13) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Jason Phillips hit 11 as a rookie in 2003...Alvarez's 12 career homers (one last year) before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993.

PHAM-TASTIC: Over his last 14 games, Tommy Pham is batting .324 (12-37) with six runs, four doubles, one triple, three home runs, 13 RBI, five walks with a .395 OBP, a .730 SLG and a 1.125 OPS.

COME AT THE KING, BEST NOT MISS: Omar Narváez has reached base safely in seven of his eighth games this season, batting .273 (6-22) with three runs, two RBI and two walks.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 49-14 in the first inning this year.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 17-6 (.739) when scoring first this season...On the other hand, the Mets are 13-28 (.317) when their opponent scores first.

IF YOU START ME OFF: New York is 16-1 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are still 6-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets are second in the major leagues with an 88.0% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 17 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 331 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals...Pete Alonso has stolen 12 bases in 13 tries in his career.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets are hitting .242 (118-488) with runners in scoring position, ranking 11th in the NL and 21st in the majors this year...Last season, New York batted .269 (371-1,378), good for third in the NL and fourth in the majors.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 2.2 innings, allowing four runs on four hits, with five walks and three strikeouts...Did not factor into the decision in the Mets loss against Toronto on June 4...Was his first career start on four days rest.

STRIKE 'EM OUT: Senga has 73 strikeouts through his first 11 career major league games, the fourth-most by a Met...Only Dwight Gooden (87), Nolan Ryan (81) and Matt Harvey (80) have more in their first 11 career starts.

SHUT 'EM OUT: On May 30 against the Phillies, Senga became the 10th rookie in franchise history to throw 7.0 or more innings, while one hit or less and was the first Met since Steven Matz did so on August 14, 2016...Joins Jonathon Niese, who tossed a complete game shutout on June 10, 2010, as the only Mets rookie to accomplish the feat without allowing a walk.

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 39 of his 73 strikeouts through 11 starts...The pitch has a 58.8 percent whiff rate and a 26.9 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just seven hits in 58 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .121 batting average.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven Matz.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

2022: Last season, Senga went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION: Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 5.0 innings in the Mets 6-4 loss against Atlanta on June 6...Allowed four runs on six hits, with two walks and four strikeouts.

MILESTONES & MORE: At this point in the 2023 campaign, Carrasco is nearing 1500.0 career innings with 1484.1...Is also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 290 and 243, respectively. Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.
