RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a season-long, 10-game, 10-day homestand against the Nationals (1-1, one to play), Royals (four to play), and Diamondbacks (three to play) today at Tropicana Field...have dropped four of five and six of their last eight games since sweeping the Red Sox (June 8-10)...are 8-16 in their last 24 games (May 24-pres.), tied with the Padres for MLB's worst record in that span, on the heels of a 22-4 stretch (April 22-May 22)...have lost 8.5 games on the AL East-leading Yankees during that timeframe, whom they now trail by 3.0 games for the division lead...could fall a season-high-tying 4.0 games back with a loss today and a Yankees win vs. CIN...are 1-1 on a stretch of 23 games in 24 days leading into the All-Star break (June 19-July 12), with the lone off day coming on June 29...had the best record in the AL for 35 straight days between May 9-June 12, which included eight consecutive days atop the majors from May 18-25...have spent 41 days in first place in the AL East, 33 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

* The Rays went 3-for-13 with RISP and left 11 men on base, including the tying run in scoring position to conclude the game, in yesterday's 4-3 setback...they tallied a double and nine singles, their MLB-most 29th game with 1 or 0 XBH.

* They scored first for second time in their last eight games (June 12-pres)...the club has gone 9-7 over the last 16 games in which it plated the opening run since winning 17 straight when scoring first from April 4-May 12...the Rays have led in three of their last four losses compared to one of their previous nine (May 27-June 13), but their 14 blown lead losses are still tied for third fewest in the AL.

* The Rays 12-16 mark in interleague play ranks 11th in the AL/23rd in the majors, but their 30-14 intraleague record leads MLB.

* Today marks the Rays ninth rubber match, first since a 2-1 loss on June 7 at MIA...they are 3-1 in their last four following a 1-3 start...the club has won back-to-back rubber games at Tropicana Field (May 31 vs. LAA & May 17 vs. MIA) and is 9-2 in home series finales overall.

* The Rays have lost three of their last four games vs. left-handed starting pitchers, but their 16-7 (.696) record against southpaw starters still leads the AL, second in MLB to the Diamondbacks (14-6/.700).

* The Rays are 14-13 on Father's Day, including 4-7 at home...last year, they beat the Mets, 9-0, at Citi Field, their second straight win on the holiday...this marks their first home game on Father's Day since 2019 (W, 6-5 vs. LAA) after their last five were on the road (2021-25).

WHAT'S AT STAKE

—With a win today, the Rays would:

* Claim their fourth straight series win over the Nationals (2023-pres.)...avoid their first home series loss to Washington/Montreal since June 5-7, 1998 (4-0-3 in last seven).

* Earn their eighth series win in their last nine sets at Tropicana Field.

* Improve to 3-2-0 in their last five Interleague series after losing their first five.

* Tally their third series win over an opponent that entered with a winning record, joining April 10-12 vs. NYY (3-0) and April 27-29 at CLE...improve to 3-4-1 in such sets.

* Move to 13-3-1 in series play after winning the opening contest, including nine straight wins in home sets in which they won the series opener.

QUALITY CONTROL

—The Rays staff has not walked a batter this series and in their last 19.0 IP overall, marking their first time going consecutive games without a free pass since a franchise-record four-game streak from March 29-April 1, 2025...this comes after they walked eight batters on Wed. at LAD, their fourth time this season recording 8 BB or more...they have only one other streak longer than two games in club history: a three-game stretch from Sept. 2-3 (G2), 2019 vs. BAL, which is also their only set of three games or more with no walks...they have also issued zero walks twice in two-game series, accomplishing the feat exactly 10 years apart from June 4-5, 2024 at MIA and June 4-5, 2014 vs. MIA.

* The Rays have not walked a batter in an AL-leading eight games this season, third most in the majors behind the Dodgers (10G) and Phillies (9G).

BAG BANDITS

—Jonny DeLuca (1) and Taylor Walls (2) combined for 3 SB in the 9th inning yesterday, the Rays first time swiping three bases or more in a frame since Aug. 24, 2025 vs. STL (3SB in 5th) overall, the Rays stole a season-high 4 SB, matching April 4 at MIN...they have collected an AL-most 14 SB in their last 12 games (June 7-pres.) after recording 1 SB in their previous 13 games (May 22-June 6).

* Walls recorded the 77th and 78th steals of his career, tying Jose Capalero for 10th most in club history, one shy of ninth-ranked Josh Lowe (79) and two shy of eighth-ranked Randy Winn (80).

* Chandler Simpson broke a career-long 30-game drought without a stolen base after swiping second in the 3rd inning...prior to the skid, his 14 SB through his first 40 games (May 11) ranked second in the AL, trailing only CLE Jose Ramirez (16).

* Rays pinch runners have combined for 4 SB, tied for second in the majors behind the Royals (7).

CAMI CAN

—Junior Caminero went 3-for-3 with an intentional walk yesterday, his seventh game reaching base safely four times or more, tying HOU Yordan Alvarez and LAA Mike Trout for the most in the AL...in all of MLB, only WSH James Wood (10G) has more such games...the three hits tied his season high, matching June 5 at MIA...his .378 on-base pct. on the season ranks ninth in the AL and marks a 67-point improvement from 2025 (.311), the third-largest year-to-year increase among AL hitters behind BAL Taylor Ward (+.073) and TEX Josh Jung (+.069)...he has reached base at a .413 clip since the calendar flipped to May, fourth in the majors, trailing ATH Nick Kurtz (.445), CHC Michael Busch (.429), and LAD Shohei Ohtani (.423).

HOMER (UN)HAPPY

—Over the last five games, 11 of the 16 runs (68.8%) the Rays have allowed have come on 8 HR...across their last 19 games (May 30-pres.), 50.6 pct. (45) of the 89 runs against the Rays have come on 30 HR, the second-highest percentage in the AL—only the Yankees (51.3%) staff has a higher mark over that span...conversely, 33.3 pct. (23) of the 69 runs the Rays have scored across that timeframe have come on 14 HR, fourth lowest in the majors...only the Rangers (30.9%), Royals (31.2%), and Cardinals (32.3%) have lower marks.

* Since May 13, the Rays have homered in 13 of 17 games at Tropicana Field compared to four of their 15 road games...they are 7-1 when tallying multiple long balls at home.

* Overall, the Rays are 11-3 in games they record multiple homers and 16-1 when out-homering their opponent...they have gone a combined 30-7 when equaling or surpassing their opponent's home run total compared to 12-24 when they are out-homered.

HOME SWEET HOME

—The Rays MLB-leading 25-10 home record ties 2008 for the second-best home start in team history behind 2023 (29-6)...they have won 21 of their last 27 games at Tropicana Field...since May 13, the Rays are 11-6 at home (2nd in AL/14th in MLB) compared to 3-12 in road affairs (30th in MLB)...on the year, the 267-point discrepancy between their home (25-10/.714) and road (17-21/.447) winning percentages is the largest in MLB...the Rays are in a stretch of 19 home games within a 28-game span from May 29-June 28, going 9-11 thus far (6-5 at home)...they have several notable active home streaks:

* The Rays have recorded double-digit hits in a season-high four straight home games...the club has had only five longer streaks, most recently a five-game run from Aug. 16-31, 2024.

* The Rays are 12-0 against the AL East at Tropicana Field, MLB's longest season-opening, home winning streak over division rivals since the 2009 Dodgers won their first 12 home games vs. the NL West...among AL clubs, only the 2003 Royals (13-0) have had a longer streak in the divisional era (since 1969)...they are 13-10 against all other opponents at home.

* Junior Caminero has hit safely in a career-high 16 straight home games (May 16-pres.), tied with NYY Cody Bellinger (April 13-May 20) and HOU Yordan Alvarez (March 27-May 4) for the second-longest active streak in the AL this season behind ATH Zack Gelof (18G, active streak)...the last Ray with a longer single-season streak was Wilson Ramos (20G) from April 14-June 12, 2018, and the single-season club record is 21 games, established by Aki Iwamura from June 22-Aug. 19, 2008.

* Caminero is batting .446 (25-for-56) with 9 XBH, 12 RBI, 15 BB vs. 9 SO, and 12 R during the streak, reaching base safely in 40 of 72 PA (.556 OBP)...min. 50 PA, he leads MLB in home batting average and on-base pct. since the streak began on May 16 while ranking fourth in OPS.

* Yandy Diaz has reached base safely in 18 straight home games (May 5-pres.), tied with Gelof for MLB's second-longest active streak behind SD Fernando Tatis Jr. (19G)...he is slashing .400/.463/.757 (28-for-70) with 4 2B, 7 HR, and 21 RBI at Tropicana Field during that stretch.

* Kevin Kelly has recorded 16 scoreless outings (17.0IP) at Tropicana Field, the third-longest season-opening streak at home by a Rays reliever behind Jake McGee (19G) in 2012 and Trevor Miller (17G) in 2008...per Stats Perform, the 17.0-IP streak at home is the third longest to begin the season in MLB this year, trailing NYY Brent Headrick (18.2, active) MIA Tyler Phillips (18.1), and is tied for the longest to open a campaign in Rays history (see table on the right).

ON DECK

—The Rays and Royals will complete a seven-game season series over the course of 11 days from June 22-July 2, beginning with tomorrow night's series opener...it will mark the Rays first four-game series this season—they were scheduled to play four at Fenway Park from May 7-10, but the third contest of the series was postponed due to inclement weather...the Rays and Royals have split their last two season sets (3-3 in 2024-25), but the Rays have not lost a season series to Kansas City since 2017 (4-3), going undefeated in the previous seven (5-0-2; clubs did not meet in 2020)...last year, the road team swept both series, with the Rays posting back-to-back shutout wins from June 25-26 to close the season set (4-0, 3-0).

SCORING CHANGE

—Last night, MLB announced a scoring change from Friday vs. WSH...in the top of the 8th, WSH Jacob Young reached on what was ruled a missed catch error by 1B Jonathan Aranda with an assist to 3B Junior Caminero...this has been changed to a throwing error by Caminero.

TODAY'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 15th start with the Rays and eighth at Tropicana Field...marks his 295th career appearance (144th start) and 10th (third start) opposite the Nationals...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026.

- ★ Ranks third among AL qualifiers with a 2.60 ERA (83.0IP, 24ER) behind NYY Cam Schlichter (1.71) and teammate Drew Rasmussen (2.59)...is eighth among MLB qualifiers.
- ★ Eight of his 14 starts this season have been quality, tied for seventh most in the AL.
- ★ Martinez has fashioned a 2.35 ERA (30.2IP, 8ER) in Interleague games, the third-lowest mark in 2026 among AL pitchers (min. 30.0IP) behind ATH J.T. Ginn (2.13 ERA) and DET Tarik Skubal (2.20)...is the fourth-lowest mark among major league pitchers.

LAST TIME OUT—Did not receive a decision after allowing three earned runs over 5.1 innings in a 4-3 loss on June 15 at LAD (5.1IP, 5H, 3ER, HR, BB, 6SO)...marked his third consecutive start, and third of 2026, in which he surrendered three runs or more...worked a clean 1st inning before allowing two baserunners to reach base prior to a Kyle Tucker three-run home run that cleared the bases and tied the game at 3-3...retired his next eight batters and allowed just three other baserunners (1B, 2B, BB) over his final 4.1 frames.

- ★ Tossed a season-high 96 pitches, his most in a game since throwing 104 on Aug. 26, 2025 at LAD (w/CIN).
- ★ Marked Martinez's 12th start with one or zero walks, the most among major league pitchers...is 6-1 with a 2.59 ERA (73.0IP, 21ER) in those starts, with the Rays going 9-3.

LET TEDDY WIN—The veteran right-hander has a 2.89 ERA (18.2IP, 6ER) and 13 strikeouts in nine career appearances (two starts) opposite the Nationals...in the two starts, he has pitched to a 3.27 ERA (11.0IP, 4ER) with nine strikeouts...his last start against them came on May 4, 2025 at Great American Ball Park with CIN, when he yielded one earned run on four hits with nine strikeouts in a 4-1 loss.

- ★ Martinez is 7-3 with a 3.20 ERA (121.0IP, 43ER) and 161 strikeouts in 41 career appearances (15 starts) vs. NL East opponents...is 6-3 with a 4.11 ERA (85.1IP, 39ER) and 67 strikeouts in those starts...today will mark his second start against an NL East club in 2026 (also: May 16 vs. MIA).

ON TROP OF THE WORLD—In seven starts at home this season, Martinez is 4-1 with a 3.02 ERA (41.2IP, 14ER) and 26 strikeouts...with a win today, would join teammate Shane McClanahan (5-0) as the only Rays arms with five wins or more at the Trop this season.

- ★ Martinez's 1.47 ERA (30.2IP, 5ER) through his first five home starts was the lowest mark through a traditional starter's first five home starts with the franchise in club history (min. 25.0IP)...the last traditional starter in the majors with a lower ERA under the same parameters was CWS Adrian Houser (1.38ERA) in 2025.

A CHANGE WILL DO YOU GOOD—Opponents have gone just 12-for-91 (.132) against Martinez's changeup, the lowest mark in the majors (min. 50AB)...under the same parameters, he also ranks highly among major league pitchers in hard-hit rate (1st, 16.2 pct.), opp. OBP (3rd, .168), and SLG (4th, .187) on changeups...min. 1,000 total pitches, his 28.2 pct. usage rate on the pitch is fourth in the AL and is seventh among major league pitchers.

- ★ Allowed a season-high three hits (including 1 HR) on the pitch in his last outing on June 15 at LAD...marked the first HR on the pitch since July 2, 2025 at BOS (w/CIN)...in his 34 appearances between the long balls (July 8, 2025-June 9, 2026), opponents hit just .113 (13-for-115) with a .130 SLG on the pitch.

WHOLE LOTTA RED—Martinez ranks highly in multiple MLB pitching rankings, according to Baseball Savant...his Offspeed Run Value (9) is in the 100th percentile and his Pitching Run Value (11) is in the 91st percentile, an improvement from his -2 Pitching Run Value and -2 Offspeed Run Value in 2025.

- ★ Since the start of 2023, Martinez's 32.2 pct. hard-hit rate is fourth lowest in the majors (min. 1,000BF) behind NYY Ryan Yarbrough (29.8 pct.), TOR Tyler Rogers (29.9 pct.), and LAA Brent Suter (29.9 pct.).
- ★ Opposing hitters have an average exit velocity of 86.8 mph since the beginning of 2023, ranking fourth lowest in the majors during that span (min. 1,000BF) behind LAA Kyle Hendricks (85.8), NYY Max Fried (86.7), and SD Michael King (86.7).

NO FREE 90S—Since the start of 2024, Martinez has issued only 74 walks, recording the fifth-fewest walks per 9.0 innings (1.70) in the majors during that stretch (min. 250.0IP)...the veteran right-hander trails only SEA Bryan Woo (1.47), DET Tarik Skubal (1.55), SEA George Kirby (1.61), and CHC Shota Imanaga (1.69) during that span...min. 50.0 IP this season, his 1.52 walks per 9.0 innings ranks third in the majors, behind Skubal (1.34) and teammate Drew Rasmussen (1.46).

- ★ His 4.1 pct. walk rate is the lowest among qualified major league pitchers ahead of Rasmussen (4.2pct.) and Woo (4.5pct.).

WHO LET UNC COOK—Through his first 11 starts this season (March 30-May 29), Martinez posted a 1.62 ERA (66.2IP, 12ER), the fifth-lowest ERA by a traditional starter through their first 11 starts with a franchise at age 35 or older since the start of the live-ball era (since 1920), trailing WSH Johnny Niggeling (1943, 1.25ERA), BAL Hoyt Wilhelm (1958, 1.34ERA), DET Doyle Alexander (1987, 1.53 ERA), and NYY Phil Niekro (1984, 1.60ERA)...allowed two runs or fewer in each of his first 11 starts, the longest season-opening streak by an MLB starter age 35 or older in the live-ball era...his 11-start streak is the longest by a traditional starter in Rays history to begin a season...was also the longest such streak by an AL pitcher age 35 or older at any point in a season since TEX Jacob deGrom posted 14 straight from April 18-July 1, 2025.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS: RHP DREW RASMUSSEN (6-3, 2.59)

LAST TIME OUT—Rasmussen spun his third straight outing of 7.0 innings or more with one or zero runs on June 16 at LAD, becoming the third Rays starter since Blake Snell (4GS, June 19-July 7, 2018) to turn the trick in three or more straight starts...tossed a career-high 102 pitches in the 1-0 loss (7.0IP, 6H, 1ER, 7SO, HR).
