JOE GARAGIOLA JR. INDUCTED INTO AZ SPORTS HALL OF FAME: Yesterday, Joe Garagiola Jr., the D-backs' first general manager who helped lead the franchise to its first World Series in 2001, will be officially inducted as a member of the 2024-25 Arizona Sports Hall of Fame class at Chateau Luxe in Phoenix.

8-member class: Arizona Diamondbacks' former GM and current Senior Director of Special Projects Joe Garagiola Jr., Arizona Cardinals owner Michael Bidwill, former Olympic and Arizona State swimmer Melissa Belote Ripley, former University of Arizona and NBA basketball player Mike Bibby, former U.S. Women's National Team soccer player and Mesa native Julie Ertz, former University of Arizona football standout Ricky Hunley, former MLB player and Scottsdale Chaparral alum Paul Konerko, and the late Matt Shott, former Sr. Director of Amateur Hockey Development for Arizona Coyotes.

GENO BOBBLE TOMORROW: Tomorrow, the D-backs will give away the **Eugenio Suárez** Bobble, courtesy of Chase, to the first 20,000 fans @ Chase Field.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won 9-0 in their 14-hit affair on Wednesday vs. Orioles.

- It marked their first shutout of the season (last: Sept. 21, 2024 @ Brewers, 5-0) and second-ever shutout vs. Orioles (first @ Chase Field) in franchise history (also: June 10, 2004 @ Orioles, 3-0).
- Was the first series win vs. Orioles since July 22-24, 2019 @ Chase Field.
- D-backs' 1-4 hitters (Corbin Carroll, Geraldo Perdomo, Pavin Smith and Josh Naylor) each logged multi-hit games with a homer.
- **Brandon Pfaadt** (W; 0 ER in 6.0 IP) allowed just 4 singles in his second quality start.
- Relievers Jalen Beeks and Bryce Jarvis combined for 3.0 perfect innings.

VS. BREWERS: Since 2022, the D-backs are 12-8 vs. Brewers (6-4 @ home).

 Arizona has won 4 of its last 5 games vs. Milwaukee, dating back to Sept. 15, 2024.

CARROLL WATCH: Over his last 6 games, since April 4, **Corbin Carroll** has 7 extra-base hits (2 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers)...in the span, is slashing .435 AVG/.519 OBP/1.130SLG/1.649 OPS...his1.649 OPS is the highest in MLB, while his 4 homers are tied for most with Mike Trout/LAA, Kerry Carpenter/DET and Kyren Paris/LAA.

 Carroll's looking to homer in 3 straight games for first time in his career.

SPLASH LANDING: Pavin Smith's fifth-inning homer on Wednesday vs. Orioles marked the 40th homer hit directly into the Chase Field pool by a D-back (73rd all-time)...Smith was also the last D-back to do so on Sept. 25, 2024 vs. Giants (8th inn.).

SMITH & NAYLOR BACK-TO-BACK FIRST-PITCH HOMERS: On Wednesday, **Pavin Smith** and **Josh Naylor** became the second D-back duo all-time to hit back-to-back homers on the first pitch for their first long balls of the season, joining Jorge Fabregas and Brent Brede (fourth inning on April 8, 1998 @ Dodgers) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

FREE PASSES: The D-backs 55 walks rank tied for fourth in the Majors with the Red Sox (14 G), behind the Cubs (76/15 G), Phillies (59/12 G) and Mariners (56 thru 13 G).

- Arizona's 55 walks thru their first 13 games are tied for fifth most in franchise history (also: 2021), behind 2005 (59), 2022 (58), 2018 (57) and 2008 (56).
- The D-backs franchise record for the most walks thru their first 14 games is 63.

BULLPEN PICK UP: In the last 7 games, the D-backs' bullpen has allowed just 1 run over 23.2 innings (0.38 ERA) and owns a 0.59 WHIP, opponent .117 AVG., with 5 walks and 21 strikeouts.

 Since April 3, the D-backs bullpen's 0.44 ERA, 0.68 WHIP, 1 run allowed and 9 hits allowed are the best in the Majors.

SCORELESS RELIEVERS IN APRIL: Since April 1, D-backs' relievers **Jalen Beeks** (6.2 IP), **Ryne Nelson** (5.1 IP), **Shelby Miller** (4.0 IP), **Justin Martinez** (3.0 IP) and **Bryce Jarvis** (3.0 IP) are scoreless and have combined to allow 4 hits with 19 strikeouts.

CARROLL'S 13-GAME ON-BASE STREAK: Corbin Carroll has reached base in each of his first 13 games this season (16 H, 6 BB, 3 HBP)...his on-base streak to start the season is the longest by a D-back since Josh Rojas in 2022 (14 G; May 6-20).

- Dating back to Sept. 23, 2024, Carroll has reached base in 19 straight games, 2 shy of tying his career high of 21 from July 7-Aug. 4, 2024.
- Entering today, 5 players in the Majors had reached base in 13+ straight games to start their respective seasons: Shohei Ohtani/LAD (14 G), Corbin Carroll (13 G), Kristian Campbell/BOS (13 G), Vladimir Guerrero Jr./TOR (13 G) and Jacob Wilson/ATH (13 G).

NEXT STARTER: RHP CORBIN BURNES (0-1, 5.79)

 Will make his second career start vs. Brewers...last was on April 14, 2024 with the Orioles (ND; 2 ER in 5.0 IP, 6 H, 2 BB, 5 K).

AT A GLANCE: Is in his second season with the D-backs (10th overall in MLB; did not pitch in 2020).

- · Signed a 4-year contract in December 2023 (2024-2027) with a conditional option for the fifth year.
- Was a member of the 2018 World Series champion Red Sox.
- Finished tied for sixth in the 2019 AL Cy Young Award vote after going 19-6 with a 3.81 ERA (86 ER in 203.1 IP) and 213 strikeouts.
- From 2018-23, his 63 wins were tied for third most in the AL (also: Justin Verlander), behind Gerrit Cole (86) and Jose Berríos (66).
- Made 2 Opening Day starts during his stint with the Tigers (2022-23).

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Making his second home start and third overall.

- In search of his first home win as a D-back and his first home win vs. an NL Central opponent.
- His 41.5 strikeout percentage leads all starters in the Majors, ahead of L. Gilbert/SEA (38.5%), M. Gore/WSH (37.3%) and J. Luzardo/PHI (36.2%).
- Is holding lefties to a .091 AVG (1-for-11)/.349 OPS with 1 walk and 6 strikeouts.

LAST START: Made his first road start of the season on April 5 @ Nationals (L; 4 ER in 5.0 IP, 5 H, 12 K).

- His 12 strikeouts were his most since Sept. 14, 2019 @ Phillies (W; 1 ER in 6.2 IP, 4 H, BB) and came 1 strikeout short of matching his career best (Sept. 25, 2016 @ Rays).
- Struckout 10 of his final 14 batters faced.

VS. BREWERS: Is making his third career start (second as a D-back and second @ Chase Field).

- In 2 career starts, is 0-1 with a 2.45 ERA (3 ER in 11.0 IP), .216 opponent AVG, 1.00 WHIP, 3 walks and 12 strikeouts.
- Opened with 3.0 scoreless frames in his last start on Sept. 13, 2024 vs. Brewers (L; 2 ER in 5.0 IP, 5 H, 3 BB, 7 K)...allowed a 2-run home run to Rhys Hoskins in the fourth inning.

VS. NL CENTRAL: In 11 career starts (5 quality), has gone 3-3 with a 3.71 ERA (26 ER in 63.0 IP), .232 opponent AVG, 25 walks and 66 strikeouts.

- Has struckout 5+ batters in each of his 11 starts.
- His last 2 losses have been 1-run decisions (4-3, 2-1).

2024 RECAP: Went 3-4 with a 5.04 ERA (28 ER in 50.0 IP), 19 walks and 47 strikeouts over 10 starts in his first season with the D-backs.

- Limited to a career-low 10 starts after beginning the season on the 15-day injured list (left shoulder strain) and being transferred to the 60-day on April 17...was reinstated on Aug. 6.
- Earned the win in his first start of the season and debut as a D-back on Aug. 7 @ Guardians in Game 2 of a doubleheader.
- In his first 3 bids with the D-backs, went 2-0 with a 3.94 ERA (7 ER in 16.0 IP), opponent .294 OBP, 4 walks and 11 strikeouts...the D-backs went 4-0 in his first 4 starts.
- Held lefties to a .222 average (8-for-36) with 8 strikeouts.

POSTSEASON PRESENCE: Appeared in the Postseason 3 times with Boston: 2017 Division Series (1 G); 2018 Division Series, League Championship Series and World Series (7 G-1 GS); 2021 ALDS and ALCS (3 GS).

• Was a member of the 2018 World Champion Red Sox and made the start in Game 4 @ Dodgers...posted a no-decision after allowing 4 runs over 5.2 innings with 6 strikeouts in the 9-6 win.

2023 RECAP: In his second season with Detroit, went 13-9 with a 3.30 ERA (56 ER in 152.2 IP), 143 strikeouts, .227 opponent average and 1.15 WHIP over 26 starts.

- · Posted career bests in ERA, opponent AVG and WHIP, while tossing 150.0+ innings for the third time in his career.
- Made his second consecutive Opening Day start for the Tigers and led the team in starts, quality starts (14), wins and strikeouts.

- Retired the first 20 batters @ Orioles on April 23 to become the first Tiger to accomplish the feat since Jordan Zimmermann (6.2 IP) @ Blue Jays in 2019.

NEARLY A NO-NO: Carried a no-hitter into the eighth inning on Sept. 4, 2016 @ Athletics that was broken up by a Marcus Semien 2-out single.

HOW IT STARTED: Signed by Orioles as a non-drafted free agent in 2010.

 Made his Major League debut on May 28, 2015 for the Red Sox @ Rangers...became the first pitcher in Red Sox history to pitch at least 7.2 innings and allow no runs, yield 3 hits or fewer and strikeout 7+ in a debut.
