METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets blanked the Rockies, 2-0, at Coors Field yesterday...New York is in a stretch of 16 games in 16 days...They own an 8-5 record in that span...The Mets continue a six-game West Coast trip (2-1) against the Rockies (2-1) and Giants (three games)...The team is off on Thursday and then returns home to Citi Field on Friday for the start of a six-game homestand against the Phillies (three games) and Nationals (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: Mets Manager Buck Showalter celebrates his birthday today...Showalter begins his first season with the team...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with 1,579...He ranks 23rd on the all-time win list, surpassing Dick Williams (1,571) earlier this year...Tommy Lasorda is next at 1,599 wins.

FUGGEDABOUTIT: The Mets have won franchise-record 14 straight games following a loss, surpassing the previous club record of 12 straight wins following a loss during the 1985 season... Courtesy of Elias...Overall, the team is 14-1 in the game following a loss this year...The Mets have lost back-to-back games only once this season (April 10-11).

BLANK STREET COFFEE: The Mets collected their seventh shutout of the season...That is tied with the Angels and Astros for the major league lead...The Mets recorded a total of eight shutouts in 2021...The Mets recorded just their second shutout at Coors Field...The Mets also blanked the Rockies, 5-0, on April 15, 2010...The team's seven shutouts is tied for the second most shutouts after 43 games in team history...The 1985 team also recorded seven...Only the 1988 team with nine, recorded more shutouts through the team's first 43 games.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN': J.D. Davis, who was born in Elk Grove, CA, has posted a .353 (13-34) average with two runs, a double and two RBI in eight games at Oracle Park...Travis Jankowski has hit .341 (15-44) with eight runs, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, three RBI and four walks in 20 games at the yard...Eduardo Escobar has posted a .316/.368/.469 slashline with 11 runs, seven doubles, a triple, two home runs, 15 RBI and eight walks in 26 career games at Oracle Park...Mark Canha, who was born in San Jose, CA is a .286/.395/.542 hitter with eight runs, a double, a triple, two homers, nine RBI and seven walks in 12 games at the home of the Giants.

EARLY EDITION: The Mets own a season-high 8.0-game lead in the division...It is their largest division lead since they were 9.5 games ahead on September 27, 2015...It's the earliest the Mets have held an 8.0 game lead in the division...The previous record was June 5, 1986 when the Mets were 34-14 and held an 8.5 game lead in the NL East...The Mets are the 10th team (17th occurrence) to ever have an 8.0 game lead or larger after 43 games...It has happened just 10 times in the divisional era (see chart below).

WINNING!: The Mets are a season-high 13 games above .500 for the second time this year (also, 27-14)...The last time New York was 14 games over .500 was on October 4, 2015, when the team finished the season at 90-72.

THE GUILLORME CHEF: Over the last 12 games, Luis Guillorme is batting .438 (14-32) with three runs, a double, a home run, two RBI, a walk, a steal with a .455 OBP and a 1.017 OPS...Overall in 27 games this season, Guillorme is batting .338/.411/.446 with nine runs, four doubles, a home run, three RBI, eight walks and a steal...As a starter, he is batting .344/.420/.459 with nine runs, doubles, three RBI, eight walks and a steal...He has recorded a hit in each of his last five starts, batting .529 (9-17) in that span with two runs, a double, an RBI and a steal...The Mets are 13-6 when Guillorme starts.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets earned their 11th series victory of the season yesterday...The team has completed 13 series this season...They have won 11 of those series, lost one and split one...The Mets did not lose any of their first 10 series...It was the longest span the Mets have gone into a season without losing a series, surpassing the 1998 Mets, who did not lose any of their first eight series.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is 15-7 on the road this year...Their .682 road winning percentage is the third-best in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The Mets did not record their 15th win on the road until June 9 in 2021 in their 34th road game (15-19)...New York is batting .252/.328/.373 away from Citi Field...Their .252 average ranks fifth in the majors, while their .328 OBP ranks fourth.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have posted a 28-15 record through the team's first 43 games... Only the 1988 (31-12), 1986 (31-12) and 1972 (31-12) teams posted a better record through the first 43 games of the season...The 2007 team also went 28-15 through the first 43 games...New York's pitching staff has struck out 401 this season...That is the fourth-most strikeouts in team history through the first 43 games.

GIANTS-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost the season series against the Giants in each of the last two years...New York won the series, in the prior three seasons (2017-2019).

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz recorded his 10th save of the season yesterday...He is second in the majors with 34 strikeouts as a reliever...His 17.00 strikeouts per nine innings ranks second as well...He has struck out 34 of the 71 batters he faced, good for 47.9%...He is 1-0 with 10 saves, a 2.00 ERA (four earned runs/18.0 innings), allowing 11 hits and eight walks...He has allowed just two runs over his last 11 games, posting a 1.64 ERA (two earned runs/11.0 innings) with seven hits, five walks and 22 strikeouts...The Mets are 18-0 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 74 saves as a member of the Mets...That places him ninth on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Francisco Rodríguez who recorded 83 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 183 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is 10-14 with 74 saves, a 3.78 ERA (69 earned runs/164.1 innings) with 67 walks and 272 strikeouts...His 272 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (302) and Josh Hader (292) have struck out more...Additionally, his 272 strikeouts are the 10th most by a reliever in franchise history...Seth Lugo is ninth with 283...Aaron Heilman is eighth with 289.

A STARLING IS BORN: Starling Marte is batting .333 (21-63) with nine runs, six doubles, a triple, two home runs, seven RBI, a walk with a .344 OBP and a .556 SLG in 15 games this month...He is on a five-game hitting streak, batting .364 8-22) with four runs, three doubles, a triple, a home run, two RBI and a steal in that span.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor went 2-4 with a run and an RBI in yesterday's victory over the Rockies...He is now two RBI away from 500 in his career.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has 37 RBI this season, which is tied for first in the majors and is first in the National League...In 21 games this month, Alonso is batting .309/.385/.580 with 13 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 20 RBI, nine walks with a .965 OPS.

IRON PETE: Pete Alonso has played 413 games of a possible 427 games (97 percent) since he joined the major leagues in 2019...Alonso has played in all 43 games this season...He missed one game his rookie season in 2019, three games in 2020 and 10 games when he was on IL in 2021...His 413 games since he made his big league debut ranks fifth in the majors.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has reached base safely in 34 of his 38 games this year...He is tied for eighth in the majors and fourth in the Senior Circuit with a .390 OBP...Overall, Nimmo is batting .293 (41-140) with 25 runs, seven doubles, three triples, three home runs, 15 RBI, 22 walks with a .390 OBP, a .450 SLG and an .840 OPS...He has posted a 1.9 fWAR this year, which is 11th in the majors and sixth in the National League.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil has recorded 15 multi-hit games, which is seventh in the major leagues...McNeil did not log his 15th multi-hit effort in 2021 until August 10 in his 75th game... He has recorded 125 multi-hit games since he entered the majors on July 24, 2018...That is places him tied for 43rd on the team's all-time list with Carlos Delgado...Doug Flynn is next with 126 multi-hit games...Pete Alonso is tied for eighth in the majors with 14 multi-hit efforts... He has recorded 103 multi-efforts in his career, which places him tied for 54th in team history with Roger Cedeno.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil is batting .306 (45-147) with 18 runs, 12 doubles, a triple, a home run, 21 RBI, 11 walks, a .356 OBP and a .422 SLG this season...He is 13th in the majors and fifth in the National League in batting average...His 12 doubles are tied for 12th in the majors and tied for sixth in the NL...His 1.8 fWAR places him 11th in the National League among hitters...McNeil owns a lifetime .300 batting average...That ranks second in franchise history among players with at least 1,500 plate appearances...John Olerud is the franchise leader with a .315 mark.

K LO K: Mets hitters rank fourth in the majors and third in the NL with a 19.8% strikeout rate... On the mound, Mets pitchers have fanned 25.5 percent of the batters they've faced, the third-highest clip in the majors behind only Milwaukee (27.6 percent) ...The club's 401 punchouts from their pitching staff rank second in the majors behind the Brewers (417).

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

RECENT PETERSON: Since Peterson last appeared in the majors, he has made two scoreless starts for Triple-A Syracuse...On May 8, he held Lehigh Valley to four hits and three walks as he registered 5.0 scoreless innings...Struck out eight batters...On May 13, he tossed 6.0 shutout innings for at Scranton-Wilkes Barre on May 13...Allowed just three hits, walked two and struck out six.

LAST MLB START: Peterson tonight is set to make his first start in the majors since May 3...In that start, he earned his first win of the season in game one of a doubleheader vs. Atlanta on May 3...Struck out a season-high six batters in 5.0 innings of work...Allowed four runs (three earned) on four hits with three walks...Ended a streak of 20.0 innings without allowing a home run.

NEW FOE, WHO DIS?: Peterson tonight will make his first career start against the Giants...It will mark his first career start against any of the five California-based clubs.

HOME/ROAD: In two road outings this season, Peterson has an ERA of 0.93 (one earned run/9.2 innings)...At home, he is 1-0 with a 2.89 ERA (three earned runs/9.1 innings)...In 2021, Peterson went 2-2 with a 2.84 ERA (10 earned runs/31.2 innings) with 27 strikeouts in six starts at Citi Field...He tossed a quality start in five of his six outings at home...He is 5-2 in his career at Citi Field with a 3.26 ERA (18 earned runs/49.2 innings)...Peterson was 0-4 with a 7.97 ERA (31 earned runs/35.0 innings) in nine starts away from Citi Field...His 7.97 road ERA was the highest in franchise history (min. 35.0 innings).

TIMES ARE CHANGIN': During his rookie campaign in 2020, opposing hitters batted .333 (12-36) off his changeup...Since then, opposing hitters have batted .186 (11-59) off his changeup.

RAMMING DOWN RIGHTIES: This season, Peterson has limited right-handed batters to a .180 (9-50) average, the eighth-lowest among left-handed pitchers (min. 50 RHB faced)...Since 2020, Peterson has held right-handed batters to a .224 average (86-384), the ninth-lowest total among southpaws during that span (min. 300 RHB faced).

2021 REVIEW: Before his season-ending injury, Peterson was 2-6 with a 5.54 ERA (41 earned runs/66.2 innings), 69 strikeouts and 29 walks in 15 starts...On April 14 vs. Philadelphia, Peterson allowed one earned run on three hits over 6.0 innings with 10 strikeouts...He did not issue a walk...Peterson became the seventh southpaw in franchise history to strikeout at least 10 batters without issuing a walk...On May 14 at Tampa Bay, Peterson tossed a career-high 7.1 innings, allowing two earned runs and striking out nine in a no-decision...In three starts from June 14-25, he went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA (two earned runs/16.2 innings), allowed just six hits and struck out 14.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (4-2, 2.77)

LAST TIME OUT: Bassitt took a no-decision after throwing 6.1 innings and allowing four runs on a season-high nine hits on May 19 vs. St. Louis...He walked one batter, struck out three and yielded a season-high two home runs...The Mets won the game in extra innings on a two-run, walk-off home run from Pete Alonso...New York improved to 6-2 in his starts.

6.0 OR MORE: Bassitt has completed 6.0 innings or more in six of his eight starts this season...Only five pitchers in the majors have had more outings of 6.0 or more innings.
