✳	Since June 23, he ranks highly in the AL in hits (T1st, 31), doubles (T5th, 7), average (6th, .326), and OBP (6th, .398)...he is also hitting .476 (10-for-21) with runners in scoring position over that span, raising his season RISP average to .344, fifth best in the AL.					
✳	Over his last 31 games on the road (May 8-pres.), he is hitting .322 (37-for-115) with 3 2B, 2 HR, 14 RBI, 15 BB, and an .804 OPS...he reached base safely in 17 straight games away from home between May 8-June 15, a stretch that included a career-best 11-game road hitting streak (May 8-June 5).					
✳	His 30 multi-hit games are tied with Chandler Simpson for second most on the team behind Yandy Díaz (31)...produced a career-high-tying four-game multi-hit streak (4x, last: May 25-29) from July 8-11...was the third time he's turned the trick this season and the fourth instance by a Ray this year (also: Díaz, June 17-21)...has multiple hits in 14 of his last 35G (June 12-pres.), the most multi-hit efforts in the AL and tied with STL JJ Wetherholt for most in the majors over that span.					
✳	Is batting .308 (66-for-214) against fastballs, ranking fifth in the AL (min. 200AB)...he has been thrown 1,049 fastballs (four-seamer, sinker, cutter), the second most in the AL behind BAL Taylor Ward (1,127).					
✳	Of his 65 RBI, 55 have come vs. RHP, second most in the AL and tied for fourth in MLB...is batting .376 (32-for-85) vs. RHP over his last 32G (June 14-pres.).					
✳	Matched his career high with his 14th home run (also: 2025) on July 12 vs. SEA...joined Junior Caminero and Yandy Díaz as the only Rays with double-digit homers in the first half of each of the past two seasons (2025-26)...13 of his 14 long balls have come off right-handed pitchers.					
✳	Tallied his seventh game of the season with three hits or more on July 11 vs. SEA...marked the second time in his career he tallied three hits or more in back-to-back games (also: May 3-4, 2026)...his seven such games this season are tied for sixth most in the AL.					
✳	<u>His 160 times on base marked the most in team history at the All-Star break</u> , ahead of teammate Yandy Díaz (157) this year...he also had 64 RBI at the break, <u>the third-most RBI by a Rays hitter at before the Midsummer Classic</u> , trailing José Canseco (69) in 1999 and Evan Longoria (66) in 2009.					
✳	In May, he led the majors in average (.374/34-for-91) and on-base pct. (.464)...he also ranked highly in OPS (2nd, 1.025) and hits (T2nd)...was the first Ray to lead MLB in average over a month since Yandy Díaz in June 2024 (.400)...his 43 RBI were second most in team history through May (Evan Longoria - 2019, 55RBI).

★	He has hit safely in each of his 14 career games at Rogers Centre, tying TB Tommy Pham (Sept. 3, 2018–Sept. 29, 2019) and CAL/KC Wally Joyner (July 17 [G1], 1989–April 26, 1992) for the longest career-opening streaks in the ballpark's history...the only longer streak at a Toronto stadium was BOS/CAL Jerry Remy's 19-game streak at Exhibition Stadium between May 27, 1977–May 11, 1981.					
★	Worked his third game of 2026 with three walks or more last night at TOR (last: May 3 vs. SF)...he paces the majors with five multi-hit, multi-walk games and has tied the franchise record for the most in a single season, joining Evan Longoria (2011), Fred McGriff (2000), and Dave Martinez (1999).					
★	Since June 23, he paces the majors in home runs (14) and total bases (77) and ranks highly in XBH (T1st, 18), RBI (2nd, 28), SLG (2nd, .802), OPS (2nd, 1.216), R (T3rd, 20)...he became the first Ray to homer 14 times in any 21-game span (June 23–July 17 [G2]) and the first player since PHI Trea Turner (Aug. 19–Sept. 12, 2023).					
★	Upon hitting his next home run, he will become the eighth player in the modern era (since 1900) to have back-to-back 30-homer campaigns in age-22-or-younger seasons, joining MIA Giancarlo Stanton (2011-12), FLA Miguel Cabrera (2004-05), STL Albert Pujols (2001-02), OAK José Canseco (1986-87), ATL Bob Horner (1979-80), MLN Eddie Matthews (1953-54), and PHA Jimmie Foxx (1929-30)...he would also join Evan Longoria (2016, 2013, 2011, 2009), Carlos Peña (2007-09), and Brandon Lowe (2025, 2021) as the only players with multiple 30-homer seasons in a Rays uniform, with Peña the only one to do it in consecutive seasons.					
★	Has hit an MLB-leading 10 HR on pitches outside the strike zone— COL Hunter Goodman ranks second in the majors with seven...marks the most such HR by a Ray during the pitch-tracking era (since 2008), surpassing Carlos Peña (8) in 2010... DET Miguel Cabrera (13, 2012) holds the MLB record.					
★	Is one of three MLB hitters to log 25 HR or more with fewer strikeouts (80) than games played (100) alongside HOU Yordan Alvarez (33HR/76SO/101G) and NY Yankees Ben Rice (29HR/94SO/95G).					
★	Min. 100 AB, his .367 (66-for-180) average vs. fastballs leads the AL...has tallied 26 of his 45 XBH vs. fastballs (10 2B, 16HR).					
★	Paces MLB with an average bat speed of 79.8 mph...leads the majors with 128 batted balls hit at 100 mph or faster.					
★	His 78 HR before turning 23 (on July 5) were 20th most in the modern era (since 1900)...currently has 74 HR between his age 21-22 seasons (2025-26: age as of June 30). <u>third most in the modern era (since 1900) behind the Milwaukee Braves Eddie Mathews (87HR) and NY Yankees Joe DiMaggio (75HR).</u>					
★	Became the first player in franchise history to start multiple All-Star Games...also became the first third baseman and 14th player in the modern era (since 1900) to start back-to-back All-Star Games in age-22-or-younger seasons (age as of June 30).					
★	Clubbed 11 HR in 11 games (June 23–July 4), becoming MLB's youngest player and 12th overall to turn the trick, first since WSH Kyle Schwarber (June 19 [G2]-30, 2021)...from June 24–July 1, tied a club record with a HR in six straight games, becoming the youngest player in modern era (since 1900) to accomplish the feat...had 22 RBI during the 11G span, the 3rd player since 1957 to have 22 RBI in an 11G stretch before turning 23, joining SD Fernando Tatis Jr. (2021) and WSH Bryce Harper (2015).					
★	With his homer July 3 at HOU, became the third primary third baseman (6x) in the modern era (since 1900) to record multiple 25-HR seasons in age-22-or-younger campaigns (2025, 45HR), joining ATL Bob Horner (2x, 1979-80) and BSN/MLN Eddie Mathews (3x, 1952-54)...he also joined Evan Longoria (5x) as the only primary third basemen in Rays history to have multiple 25-home run seasons.
