TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin a 6 -game road trip with the first of 3 games against the Chicago White Sox...Seattle will also visit the Boston Red Sox (3 G, July 29-31) on the trip...tonight's game against the White Sox will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Aaron Goldsmith and Mike Blowers on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on Seattle Sports ( 710 AM) with Rick Rizzs and Dave Sims.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners lost Wednesday's series finale with the Angels 2-1...the Mariners are 38-6 (.864) when out-hitting their opponent this season...Seattle is $34-31$ in night games and 19-20 in day games.

- Start Your Engines - The Mariners starting rotation has posted a 1.40 ERA (8 ER, 51.1 IP) with 6 walks and 50 strikeouts over their last 8 games ( $7 / 13-\mathrm{c}$ ), while holding opponents to a .171 average during that span with a 0.72 WHIP.
- The Muny Effect - Andrés Muñoz has not allowed a hit over his last 6.0 innings (7/5-c)...he has not allowed a run over his last 8.0 innings ( $6 / 28-\mathrm{c}$ ).
- Programming Note - Saturday's game against the White Sox will air exclusively on FOX (4:15 pm PT first pitch) with Aaron Goldsmith and A.J. Pierzynski on the call...Sunday's game will return to normal programming on ROOT SPORTS.
- Change of Plans... - The Mariners Aug. 11 game versus the Mets has been selected for ESPN Sunday Night Baseball, with first pitch now slated for $4: 10$ pm PT...the Sunday Night broadcast will return to Seattle for the first time since June 6, 2004 vs. the Chicago White Sox and will feature the Mariners for the first time since July 31, 2016 at the Chicago Cubs.
RANDYLAND COMES TO SEATTLE....yesterday, the Mariners acquired All-Star outfielder Randy Arozarena from the Tampa Bay Rays in exchange for minor leaguers RHP Brody Hopkins, OF Aidan Smith and a player to be named later...Arozarena is batting $.284(42 \times 148)$ with 20 runs, 12 doubles, 7 home runs, 18 RBI and 9 stolen bases, getting on base at a . 397 clip and slugging . 507 (. 904 OPS) since June 1... during that span, his 397 OBP ranks 7th in the American League, while his . 903 OPS ranks 16th
ROBLES IS ROLLING...Victor Robles has reached base safely in 8 consecutive games (7/13-c), batting .407 (11x27) with 2 runs scored, 2 doubles, 3 walks, 1 hit-by-pitch and 6 stolen bases during that span...in July, Robles is batting .394 (13×33) with 4 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 2 RBI and 7 stolen bases, getting on base at a .474 clip and slugging .576 (1.050 OPS)...since joining the Mariners, Victor is batting .365 (19x52) with 5 runs, 5 doubles, 1 home run, 3 RBI and 8 stolen bases with a .441 on-base percentage, .519 slugging percentage and a . 960 OPS.
JORGE BUMP DAY...George Kirby is set to make his 22nd start of the season in tonight's game, and is 7-7 with a 3.20 ERA (44 ER, 123.2 IP), 13 walks, 122 strikeouts and a 0.98 WHIP this season...he leads the Majors in walks-per-9-innings (0.9) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (9.38), while ranking 4th in fWAR (3.6), 5th in FIP (2.74) and T-7th in WHIP.
- Last 10 - Over his last 10 starts since May 29, Kirby is 3-2 with a 2.05 ERA (14 ER, 61.1 IP), 7 walks, 65 strikeouts and a 0.93 WHIP...during that span, he leads the Majors in fWAR (2.6), while ranking 2nd in ERA, trailing only Paul Skenes-PIT (1.84).
- Historic Command - Kirby is on pace to post the 2nd season of his career with a SO/BB ratio of 9.00+ (also: 2023, 9.05), and could become just the 2nd player in MLB history with multiple such seasons (also: Jim Whitney (1883-84), and the first in the Modern Era (1900-c)...Kirby is also on pace to become the 14th pitcher in the Modern Era with 3 seasons of $100.0+$ IP with a SO/BB ratio of at least 6.0 and the first to do so in his first 3 MLB seasons.
PITCH PERFECTS...the Mariners pitching staff is $53-51$ with 27 saves and a 3.41 ERA ( 349 ER, 920.0 IP) with 246 walks and 879 strikeouts this season...Seattle leads the Majors in ERA (3.41), ranking ahead of Philadelphia (3.46)...Mariners pitchers lead the Maiors in opponent batting average (.217), WHIP (1.07), walks-per-9 innings (2.41), hits-per-9 innings (7.21) and rank 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.57) behind Minnesota (3.59).
THREAT ON THE BASES...since May 24, the Mariners are 53-for-62 in stolen base attempts (85.5\%), the best mark in the AL and 4th-best in the Majors, while their 53 steals during that span are also tied for 5th in the Majors and tied for the most in the American League...Julio Rodríguez (9 SB), Victor Robles (8), J.P. Crawford (5), Cal Raleigh (5) all have swiped multiple bases without being caught since May 24...the Mariners $80.6 \%$ stolen base percentage overall this season is tied for the franchise record (also: 2001).
THEY PREFER SOCKS WITH SOME COLOR... 5 players on the Mariners active roster have a career OPS over . 800 against the White Sox: Luke Raley (1.215) paces Mariners hitters, followed by Cal Raleigh (1.124), Mitch Garver (.857), Jorge Polanco (.832) and Tyler Locklear (.808)...Raley's OPS versus the White Sox ranks 3rd among active players, trailing only Aaron Judge (1.371 OPS) and Michael Chavis (1.240), while Raleigh ranks 7th among active players (min. 30 PA vs. Chicago-AL)...Locklear clubbed his first career home run against White Sox All-Star Garrett Crochet on June 13.
SHAKE YOUR MUNY MAKER...right-handed reliever Andrés Muñoz, who was named a American League All-Star for the first time in his career, has recorded 16 saves, 6 holds and a 1.35 ERA (6 ER, 40.0 IP) with 18 walks and 49 strikeouts in 40 appearances this season...Muñoz sports a 1.00 WHIP and 11.00 strikeouts-per-9 innings...Muñoz is tied for the MLB lead with 6 saves of $4+$ outs and is 1 of only 3 MLB pitchers with $10+$ saves and $5+$ holds, joined by José Alvarado-PHI and Jason Foley-DET...Muñoz is 1 of 3 AL relievers with a sub-2.00 ERA and $10+$ saves, along with Emmanuel Clase-CLE and Kirby Yates-TEX. CAL DOES IT ALL...Cal Raleigh has 20 home runs, 62 RBI and 5 stolen bases this season...Cal leads MLB catchers in both home runs and catcher caught stealing (19), while he is tied for the lead in stolen bases...Cal could become the first player to lead catchers in HR, CCS and SB since they began tracking catcher caught stealing in 1974...Cal could also become the first player to lead catchers in both HR and SB in a season since JT Realmuto-PHI in 2020 and the first to lead catchers in a full 162-game season since Carlton Fisk-CWS in 1985.

AS YOU KNOW...Mariners starting pitchers are 35-35 with a 3.25 ERA (220 ER, 609.1 IP), 125 BB, 549 strikeouts and a 1.02 WHIP this season, leading MLB rotations in WHIP, Opp. AVG (.219), BB/9 (1.85), and SO/BB (4.39) while ranking 2nd in ERA and fWAR (11.1) and T-2nd in FIP (3.54), but...DID YOU KNOW?...that the Mariners starting rotation's 1.02 WHIP is tied for the lowest in a season in MLB history with the 1908 Chicago White Sox?...the Mariners rotation also ranks 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.39) trailing only the Los Angeles Dodgers 4.55 SO/BB ratio in 2019.

## ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY

- 26-year-old right-hander is making his 22nd start of the season, his 1st against Chicago-AL....he is also making his 78th career start and 2nd against the White Sox.
- Is in his third season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB FirstYear Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record with 7 earned runs, 3 walks, 34 strikeouts and .263 opponent batting average in 5 games started
- Named Colonial Athletic Pitcher of the Year in 2019 for Elon University after posting a 2.75 ERA and 19-8 record in 88.1 innings pitched across 14 games started.
LAST TIME OUT...ND on $7 / 20$ vs. Houston...he pitched 6.0 innings and allowed 1 run ( 1 earned) on 4 hits with 0 walks and 6 strikeouts...he has gone 5.0+ innings in each of his last 18 outings, and 19 of 21 this season.
MID-SEASON FORM...over his last 10 starts (5/29-c) he is $3-2$ with a 2.05 ERA (14 ER, 61.1 IP ) and 65 strikeouts to 7 walks...over that span, he has a 9.54 SO/9 with a 0.93 WHIP, 9.29 SO/BB and 9 quality starts.

NO FREE RIDES... is the only pitcher since 1900 (min. 50 GS) to have more games started than walks allowed ( 77 starts, 54 walks).
EMPTY BASES...the right-hander ranks T-5th in the AL in opponent on-base percentage (.255) and 5th in the AL in WHIP this season (0.98)...both are career-bests for him...in 2023, he had a 1.04 WHIP and a . 270 OBP against.
TOP RANKS...in 2024, ranks 1st in SO/BB (9.38) and in BB/9 (0.95) in the Majors...since his debut in 2022, he ranks 1st in MLB with $1.09 \mathrm{BB} / 9$ (min. 400.0 IP)...Miles Mikolas-STL ranks 2nd during that span with a $1.67 \mathrm{BB} / 9$ mark.
NO JUNE GLOOM...in his 5 starts in June, he held a 3-0 record with a 1.74 ERA ( 6 ER, 31.0 IP) and 31 strikeouts to 3 walks...the 1.74 ERA in June is his lowest in a month during his career... his ERA was the 2nd lowest on the Mariners last month (min. 20 IP), trailing Logan Gilbert with a 1.51 ERA.
A LOT OF Os...did not allow a run in 17.0-consecutive innings from his start on $4 / 15$ vs. Cincinnati to allowing 1 run in the 4 th inning against the Astros on $5 / 3$.
NL EXPERIENCE....he has made 5 starts against National League opposition this season with a 2-1 record and a 2.61 ERA ( 9 ER, 31.0 IP ) in those outings...NL hitters are slashing .202/.222/.404 against Kirby with 33 strikeouts and 3 walks.
WALK THE WALK ...among pitchers with at least 80.0 innings pitched this season, Kirby is tied for the fewest walks in the Majors with 13 (also: Zach Eflin-TB)....his BB\% is $2.6 \%$, best in MLB in front of Zach Eflin-TB (2.8\%) and ranks in the 99th percentile of all Major League pitchers.
UNDER CONTROL....has not allowed more than 3 walks in any of his first 77 career starts, the T-4th-longest streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher (also: Tanner Roark-WSH)...has a 52-start streak with 2-or-less walks, tied for the longest active streak in the Majors by a starting pitcher (also: Zach Eflin-PHI/TB, 52).
QUALITY MATERIAL...recorded his 14th quality start of the season in his last start vs. Houston...in 2023, had 20 starts of at least 6.0 innings while allowing 3 earned runs or fewer, which ranked T-5th in the Majors and T-3rd among AL pitchers.
LEADING BY EXAMPLE...since his MLB debut on $5 / 8 / 22$, he ranks among the top pitchers in the American League in various categories (min. 350 IP), including SO/BB (1st, 7.91), WHIP (3rd, 1.07), ERA (3rd, 3.32), innings pitched (4th, 444.1), wins (T-6th, 28) and strikeouts (7th, 427).
QUICK STARTER...this season, opposing hitters are batting . $163(20 \times 123)$ when leading off an inning with 5 extra-base hits ( 4 doubles and 2 home runs) and 32 strikeouts...the opposing hitters OBP is .189 in these situations.
END THE INNING...this season, opposing hitters are batting . $208(31 \times 149)$ with 4 doubles, 2 triples and 5 home runs and 36 strikeouts with 2 outs in an inning...with 2 outs and runners in scoring position, hitters are batting .229 ( $11 \times 48$ ) with 11 strikeouts.
GET A WHIFF OF THIS...earned a personal single-game career-high against Arizona on $4 / 27$ with 12 strikeouts...tallied 23 swings-and-missed during that start which also marked a career-high... 19 of his whiffs were fastballs.
MISSION CRITICAL...the Mariners own a 31-19 record in games that Kirby tosses at least 6.0 innings in his career...in games Kirby goes 5.2 innings or less, the Mariners are 11-16.
MARINERS HISTORY...made his 70th career start on $6 / 9$ at Kansas City....he ranks 5th in franchise history for strikeouts (383) through a pitcher's first 70 games in a Mariners uniform.
STRIKE 24...began his outing on $8 / 24 / 22$ vs. Washington by throwing 24 consecutive strikes, the most to start a game since the pitch tracking era ( 1988 -current), passing the 21 thrown by Joe Musgrove on $8 / 30 / 18$ vs. STL with PIT.
