METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets swept a doubleheader from the Nationals yesterday, winning game one, 4-2, and game two, 8-0...Today, the Mets will play their last game of the regular season...New York will finish the regular season going 36-11-4 in 51 series this year.

NO MINOR THING: The Mets announced that infielder Brett Baty was named the organization's Minor League Player of the Year and RHP Dornic Hamel was named Minor League Pitcher of the Year...Infielder Jesús Báez and outfielder Dyrón Campos were named DSL Complex Players of the Year and RHP Wilson Esterlin was tabbed as the Mets DSL Complex Pitcher of the Year...Additionally, Collin Hetzler, the Mets Complex Hitting Coordinator was named Mets Minor League Staff Member of the Year and Yezmin Chalas, Coordinator, Dominican Academy's Operations was named DSL Complex Staff Member of the Year...The recipients will be honored during a pre-game, on-field ceremony at 3:40 pm today...In addition, the club will also honor Bobby Floyd, Senior Advisor, Player Development Initiatives prior to the game...Floyd, who has spent 55 years in professional baseball, including 37 with the Mets organization, will retire after the season.

IT WAS IN THE CARDS: The Mets are headed to the Postseason for the first time since 2016 and for the 10th time in franchise history...This will mark the third Wild Card appearance in team history...The Mets will play a best-of-three game series against the San Diego Padres starting on Friday...Game times have yet to be announced...All games will take place at Citi Field.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have clinched the season series against the Nats and have won it in four of the last five years.

THESE METS! Postseason games at Citi Field are now on sale...Fans can access the sale by visiting Mets.com/Postseason...Fans should log on early, as a limited number of tickets for potential Mets home games in the Wild Card Series, National League Division Series and National League Championship Series will be available during this sale.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Buck Showalter owns a 1,651-1,578 (.511) career record as a manager...His 1,649 wins place him 19th all-time in major league history...Showalter has now managed four teams to the Postseason...He is the fourth manager to accomplish that feat in major league history, joining Dusty Baker (five teams) and Billy Martin and Davey Johnson (four teams)...Showalter is the first manager in Mets history to record 100 victories in his first season with the club...He also joins Yogi Berra as the only managers to guide the Mets and Yankees into the playoffs.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have won 53 games at home this year...That their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets are 53-27 at Citi Field...The team's .663 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage...The Mets have posted a 3.07 ERA with 220 walks and 821 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the best home ERA in the NL...The Mets have struck out 821 at home this year, which is the second-most in the NL...That is the second-most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,558 batters this season, which places them atop the majors...The team's 1,558 strikeouts is the most in a single-season in franchise history...The previous record was 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.81 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.3 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .618 winning percentage (42-26) following the All-Star break...The team's 42 wins are sixth-most in the majors since the break...The Mets are batting .267/.342/.431 with 77 home runs in 68 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets lead the majors in average and OBP and are sixth in SLG following the break.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 49-26 against the East this year...Their .653 winning percentage against the NL East is the best mark in club history since the divisions were reformed in 1994...Only the 1986 team (.656) had a higher winning percentage overall against the NL East...They have lost only three series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18, Washington, September 2-4 and September 30-October 2 at Atlanta)...They won the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.39 ERA against the East, while hitting .261/.335/.423...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 372-270.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor has hit 26 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 home runs in 2018 for the most by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .300/.359/.472 with 44 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 38 RBI, 23 walks with an .831 OPS in 68 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 6.8 fWAR this season.

A CENTURY: Brandon Nimmo has recorded 102 runs this season...His 102 runs are a single-season career-high...It is the 21st time in Mets history that a player recorded at least 100 runs in a season...He became the 13th player in Mets history to record at least 100 runs in a season and the first since Pete Alonso scored 103 runs in 2019...Francisco Lindor is two runs away from 100...His career-best is 129 which he accomplished in 2018...The last time the Mets have multiple players with at least 100 runs scored in a season was 2008, when Carlos Beltrán, José Reyes and David Wright all accomplished that feat.

THIS IS 40: Pete Alonso has hit 40 home runs this season...He is the first player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs...Only two players this season have recorded 40 or more home runs - Aaron Judge and Kyle Schwarber...Alonso's 40 home runs are tied for fourth-most in a single season in Mets history with Mike Piazza...Alonso owns the franchise record with 53 in 2019...Carlos Beltrán (2006) and Todd Hundley (1996) each recorded 41 home runs.

ONLY A FEW CAN COM-PETE: Pete Alonso has set a franchise single-season RBI record with 131 this season...His 131 RBI is tied for the top of the majors...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He has 27 game-winning RBI this season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI are tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

JEFF MCHITS: Jeff McNeil leads the majors and the National League with a .326 batting average...He is right ahead of Freddie Freeman (.322) for the major league lead...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned an NL batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011...McNeil would be the first Mets player to lead the majors in average...As it stands, his .326 batting average would place him sixth on the franchise's single-season list...It would be the highest average to end a season since Reyes' .337 mark in 2011.

10/10 WINS: McNeil is on a 10-game hitting streak...Since September 23, he is batting .465 (20-43) with nine runs, two doubles, two home runs, four RBI, three walks with a .500 OBP, a .651 SLG and a 1.151 OPS...He has recorded multiple hits in eight of those games, including in six straight from September 27-October 4...Six consecutive games with multiple hits tied his career-high, accomplished from April 12-17, 2019...His six-game streak with multiple hits was tied for the third-most in team history.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have won 100 games in 2022...Including this year, the Mets have recorded 100 wins in a season four times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 2022 (100), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The team's 100 wins are tied for the second-most in franchise history...Only the 1986 team (108-54) finished with a better record in franchise history...The 1988 team went 100-60 and the 1969 team went 100-62.

HECK OR HIGHWATER: With a victory today, the Mets would once again be a season-high 40 games over .500...Prior to this year, it is their most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60), their highwater mark for that year.

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK: The Mets became the eighth team in MLB history to open a game with three consecutive home runs...They join the Padres 4/13/1987, Braves 5/28/2003, Brewers 9/9/2007, Orioles 5/10/2012, Diamondbacks 7/21/2017, Diamondbacks 6/10/2019 and Twins 6/9/2022...Buck Showalter (2012) and Torey Lovullo (2017 & 2019) are the only managers whose team did this twice...Courtesy of Elias...It is the fifth time this season the Mets have scored at least seven runs in an inning (last, eight runs, September 10 at Miami)...This is the first time since May 10, 2019 vs. MIA the team has scored seven or more runs in the first inning...The last time the Mets homered in back-to-back-to-back at-bats was August 7, 2021 when Michael Conforto, Jonathan Villar, and James McCann did it off Mauricio Llovera

BLANK STREET COFFEE: The 2022 Mets recorded 19 shutouts in the season...Their 19 shutouts were the most in the major leagues...That is tied with the 2010 and 1985 teams for the fourth-most such games in a season...Only the 1969 (28), 1968 (25) and 1988 (22) teams had more shutouts.

THREE'S COMPANY: The 2022 Mets will join the 1972 side as the only teams in franchise history in which they never had more than a three-game losing streak...The last such National League team to not lose more than three-in-a-row prior to 2020 was the 2014 Dodgers (three games)...Courtesy of Elias.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Francisco Álvarez homered last night after coming in the game in the fifth inning to catch, his first catching appearance...He became the 16th Met to homer for his first career hit...It was the third time this season that a Met has slugged a home run for their first career hit (also, Brett Baty and Nick Plummer)...He became the youngest player (20 years, 319 days) to hit a home run as a catcher since Ivan Rodriguez on July 6, 1992 (20 years 222 days).

WILLIAMS NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed two runs on three hits with one hit batter and two strikeouts through 2.0 innings of relief on September 27 vs. Miami...Each of his last six outings since September 4 (14.0 IP) have come as a reliever.

LAST START: Threw 4.0 scoreless innings of the no decision on August 20 at Philadelphia (game one)...Gave up four hits and two walks while striking out three.

GONE STREAKING: Williams did not allow a run across 24.1 innings from July 7-September 4, surpassing his previous career-long streak of 21.0 scoreless innings from July 11-September 4, 2018 while with Pittsburgh...It is the longest such streak by a Mets pitcher this season...He posted a 0.88 WHIP and held opponents to a .190 (16-84) batting average over the eight-game stretch (two starts).

VS. WASHINGTON: Will be making his second start against the Nationals this season...Tossed 5.0 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and one strikeout on May 31 at Citi Field...Has gone 1-1 in four appearances (one start) overall against the Nats this season, posting a 1.29 ERA (two earned runs/14.0 innings).

DIVISION RIVALS: Against the National League East this season, Williams has pitched to a 1.86 ERA (eight earned runs/38.2 innings) in 12 games (three starts)...Among MLB hurlers with at least 30.0 innings pitched, his ERA ranks fourth and his eight earned runs allowed are tied for the sixth-fewest.

GOT 'EM: Entered as a reliever with one out in the first inning on September 14 vs. Chicago-NL and tossed 4.1 innings of one-run ball with four hits, a walk and eight strikeouts...The eight punchouts were a career-high in a relief outing and also matched his career-high from two starts (April 27, 2021 & August 29, 2018)...Was tied for the second-longest relief appearance of his career...As a Mets reliever, only Tug McGraw (August 10, 1971) has struck out more batters (nine) in an outing...Ray Sadecki (July 1, 1973-G1) was the last Mets relief pitcher to punch out at least eight batters in a game...Is tied with seven other relievers for the most strikeouts in a contest this season.

PUTTING UP GOOSE EGGS: This season, Williams has tossed at least 3.0 scoreless innings in eight games, tied for the seventh-most such appearances in the majors...Four of those outings have come as a reliever, tied for the fifth-most scoreless relief appearances of at least 3.0 innings in the majors and second-most in the National League behind five from Keegan Thompson (CHC).

DOIN' THE SPLITS: In 15 games (four starts) at home this season, Williams is 2-1 with a 2.61 ERA (14 earned runs/48.1 innings), 14 walks and 49 strikeouts...He went 0-4 and pitched to a 4.08 ERA (16 earned runs/35.1 innings) with nine walks and 29 strikeouts in 14 games (five starts) on the road this year...In 12 day games (four starts), Williams is 0-2 with a 3.44 ERA (13 earned runs/34.0 innings)...This compares to posting a 2-3 record and 3.08 ERA (17 earned runs/49.2 innings) in 17 contests at night (five starts).

START ME UP: Williams is 2-4 with a 4.19 ERA (18 earned runs/38.2 innings), eight walks and 29 strikeouts across nine starts this season...Four of his nine starts were scoreless and he registered his lone quality start of the season on July 7 at Miami when he tossed 7.0 shutout frames with two hits, no walks and seven strikeouts...It was his first scoreless start of at least 7.0 innings since August 11, 2018 and was the third time in his career allowing two or fewer hits in a start of at least 7.0 innings...Marked his first quality start as a member of the Mets.

- Is a career .331/.424/.686 hitter against the Nationals...His 22 homers, 39 extra-base hits and 49 RBI are his most against any opponent.
- Named the Co-NL Player of the Week after he became the first Met ever to reach the 125-RBI threshold with a season-high-tying five RBI performance (fourth time) on September 25 at Oakland...In that game, hit a two-run shot to break the Mets RBI record, then added another three RBI with a bases-clearing double.
- Has seven home runs and 23 RBI in his last 20 games...Had an RBI in eight straight games from September 13-20.
- Has nine games with at least four RBI this season, the most in Mets history and most by any player since José Bautista had 10 such games in 2010...Had just three games with four or more RBI from 2019-2021...Alonso is tied for second in the majors with 33 multi-RBI games this season.
- Ranks third in MLB and second in the NL with 40 home runs...Tied for the MLB lead with 131 RBI...Tied for 14th in the majors and ranks 11th in the NL with 95 runs.
- Ranks 11th in MLB and sixth in the NL with a .518 SLG...Is 12th in the majors and seventh in the NL with an .869 OPS...Is 11th in the NL with a .352 OBP.
- Ranks tied for 10th in the NL with a career-high 162 hits this season...His 42 multi-hit games tie his career high set in 2019.
- Has a 1.099 OPS with runners in scoring position, going 48-160 (.300/.424/.675) with nine doubles, 17 homers, 96 RBI and 37 walks (NL-high 16 intentional).
