TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 13, 1985: Down 8-6 with two on and two out in the bottom of the 9th, Don Mattingly takes former Yankee and then-Twin Ron Davis deep for the "walk-off" three-run homer giving the Bombers the 9-8 win. The Yankees had been down 8-1 going into the sixth.

May 13, 1955: Mickey Mantle goes 4-for-4 with 3HR (2LH, 1RH) and all 5RBI in a 5-2 victory vs. Detroit at the Stadium. It marks his only career three-homer game and his first of 10 career games with HRs from both sides of the plate.

May 13, 1929: The Yankees lose, 4-3, at Cleveland, marking the first Major League game between two clubs wearing numbered uniforms.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 14, 1996: Dwight Gooden throws the eighth no-hitter in franchise history, defeating the Seattle Mariners, 2-0, at Yankee Stadium. He tosses 134 pitches in the contest (74 for strikes), walking six and striking out five.

May 14, 1967: Mickey Mantle hits his 500th career home run in the seventh inning off Baltimore's Stu Miller, providing the margin of victory in a 6-5 win at Yankee Stadium.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game road trip tonight with the second game of a three-game set at Seattle (1-0 thus far)...are 3-1 on the road trip after winning two-of-three games against the Athletics this past weekend and winning their series opener at Seattle...following this road trip, will return home for a six-game homestand featuring three-game sets vs. the Mets (Fri.-Sun.) and Texas (5/20-22).

- Have won five of their last six games (since 5/6).
- Their 24-17 (.585) record is tied for the second-best in the AL and is tied for the fifth-best in the Majors.
- Are a season-high 7G over .500.
- Their +81 run differential this season is the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (+84).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Mariners, 11-5, on Monday at Seattle...**RHP Clarke Schmidt** (6.0IP, 3H, 3R/ER, 2BB, 6K, 2HR) started and earned his first win of the season...**CF Trent Grisham** (3-for-6, 2R, 2HR, 2RBI) recorded his fourth career multi-HR game, hitting game-tying solo home runs in the third and fifth innings...**1B Paul Goldschmidt** (2-for-5, 2R, 1RBI) hit a go-ahead RBI single in the fifth inning...**C Austin Wells** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 4RBI, 1SF) hit a three-run HR in the fifth inning and a sac fly in the seventh inning...**LF Cody Bellinger** (2-for-4, 2R, 1RBI, 1BB) reached base three times and hit an RBI single in the fifth inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-3, 1R, 1 double, 1RBI, 2BB, 1SF) reached base four times and drove in a run with a sac fly in the ninth inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (2-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI, 2BB) reached base a career-high-tying four times and hit his sixth HR of the season with a two-run shot in the ninth inning...**3B Oswaldo Cabrera** left the game in the ninth inning with a left ankle injury.

LAND OF THE FRIED: LHP Max Fried is 6-0 with a 1.05 ERA (51.2IP, 6ER) in eight starts this season...his 1.05 ERA is the third-lowest by a Yankee through his first eight starts of a season (since 1913 when ER became an official stat), trailing only Whitey Ford's 1.01 ERA through his first eight starts in 1956 and Phil Niekro's 1.04 ERA through his first eight starts in 1984.

- Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his eight starts this season and 1ER-or-fewer in six of those starts...**has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in six of his last seven starts (since 4/4), posting a 0.77 ERA (47.0IP, 4ER) in that span.**
- Leads the Majors in ERA and pickoffs (four), is tied for first in wins (tied for first in AL), ranks fourth in opponents' OPS (.515, fourth in AL), fifth in opponents' SLG (.269, fifth in AL), sixth in opponents' BA (.187, fifth in AL) and WHIP (0.91, fifth in AL), and seventh in opponents' OBP (.245, sixth in AL).
- The Yankees are 8-0 in Fried's starts this season...is one of just two pitchers in the Majors this season to make at least eight starts and have his team win all of his starts, joining San Francisco's Robbie Ray (team is 8-0)...**marks just the fourth time in franchise history the Yankees have won a pitcher's first eight starts with the team**...the Yankees also won Whitey Ford's first 22 starts with the club from 1950-53 (won first 23GS when including postseason), Joe Cowley's first 11 starts in 1984 and Russ Ford's first eight starts in 1910.

GOOD AS GOLD: INF Paul Goldschmidt recorded his 19th multi-hit game of the season on Monday at Seattle, including a go-ahead RBI single in the fifth inning...has hit safely in 28 of his last 35 games (since 4/4), batting .365/.405/.504 (50-for-137) with 21R, 10 doubles, 3HR, 19RBI, 10BB/11BB, 2SB and 1SF in that span.

- **Has hit safely in each of his 20 road games this year, batting .432/.462/.580 (38-for-88) with 15R, 7 doubles, 2HR, 11RBI, 5BB and 1SB...is one of only three Yankees in franchise history to hit safely in his first 20 road games of a season,** joining Derek Jeter (23G in 2007) and Jack Lelivelt (21G in 1912)...his 20-game road hitting streak is the longest by a Yankee since Derek Jeter's 44-game streak from 8/20/06-5/28/07.
- Has hit .439/.500/.610 (18-for-41) with 4 doubles, 1HR, 17RBI, 5BB/21BB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year...with RISP this season, leads the Majors in hits, is tied for eighth in OBP (fourth in AL) and ranks 10th in BA (seventh in AL).
- Has reached base safely in 32 of his 41 games this season, batting .350/.398/.497 (55-for-157) with 26R, 11 doubles, 4HR, 21RBI, 12BB/21BB, 1HP, 1SF and 2SB.
- Ranks second in the Majors in multi-hit games (19, second in AL), BA (second in AL) and hits (second in AL) and 10th in OBP (fifth in AL).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters scored double-digit runs for a Major League-leading ninth time this season on Monday at Seattle...**have scored at least 10R in back-to-back games and four of their last six games (since 5/6), scoring 56R over that span.**

- **Have hit a Major League-leading 74HR this year, their most home runs through their first 41 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 66HR in 2009)...**have homered in a season-high 12 straight games** (since 4/29), hitting 29HR over that span...marks their longest single-season home run streak since a 13-game streak from 5/21-6/4/24.
- Lead the Majors in HR (74), BA (.267), OBP (.351), SLG (.489), OPS (.840), runs scored (246), runs per game (6.00), walks (168), total bases (685), times on base (566) and XBH (157).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge reached base four times for his second straight game on Monday at Seattle...has reached base in 12-of-21 PA during the Yankees' current road trip, batting .529/.571/1.059 (9-for-17) with 5R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 6RBI, 3BB/11BB and 1SF.

- **Leads the Majors in BA by 64 points, OBP by 71 points, SLG by 142 points and OPS by 232 points.**
- **Has reached base in 39 of his 41 games this year,** batting .414/.500/.783 (65-for-157) with 39R, 12 doubles, 2 triples, 14HR, 40RBI, 26BB/61BB, 2HP, 1SF and 3SB.
- **Has reached base multiple times in 26 of his last 32 games (since 4/7), 29 of his last 36 games (since 4/3) and 31 of his 41 games this year**...his 31 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.

- With 14HR and a .414 BA, is one of just three players in the Modern Era to record as many home runs and as high of a BA in their club's first 41 games of a season, joining the Yankees' Mickey Mantle (20HR and .425 BA in 1956) and Philadelphia-AL's Jimmie Foxx (17HR and .417 BA in 1932).

- **Is one of three Yankees (sixth time) in franchise history to reach base multiple times in 31 of the club's first 41 games of a season,** joining Babe Ruth (4x: 33G in 1927 and 31G in 1923, 1924 and 1928) and Lou Gehrig (32G in 1936).

- **Has hit 6HR in his last 12 games (since 4/29) and 7HR in his last 14 games (since 4/27-G2).**

- Over his last 32 games (since 4/7), has hit .442/.524/.750 (53-for-120) with 25R, 9 doubles, 2 triples, 8HR, 23RBI, 21BB/41BB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB.

- Has hit .484/.575/.839 (15-for-31) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 25RBI, 7BB/51BB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year.

- **Has hit 13HR in his last 27 games vs. the Mariners (since 6/21/18) and 15HR in his last 35 games against Seattle (since 7/21/17)**...has 10HR in his last 19 games at T-Mobile Park (since 7/21/17)...since 2017, has hit .361/.489/.875 (26-for-72) with 18R, 7 doubles, 10HR, 24RBI, 19BB/51BB, 1HP, 3SB and 2SF in 20 games at T-Mobile Park.

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham recorded his fourth career multi-HR game and second of the season on Monday at Seattle (also 2HR on 4/5 at Pittsburgh), hitting game-tying solo home runs in the third and fifth innings...**has 4HR in his last six games (since 5/5) and 8HR in his last 16 games (since 4/19)**...**nine of his 12HR this season have either tied the game (three) or given the Yankees the lead (six).**

- Is hitting .288/.373/.663 (30-for-104) with 23R, 1 double, 1 triple, 12HR, 22RBI, 13BB and 1HP in 34 games this season...has 12HR in 34 games this season after hitting 9HR in 76 games in 2024.
- Is tied for fourth in the Majors in game-winning RBI (six, tied for second in AL), tied for fifth in HR (third in AL) and tied for ninth in go-ahead RBI (eight, tied for second in AL).

SEA-ING CLEARLY: The Yankees have won or split 13 of their last 15 completed series vs. the Mariners (since 8/22/16) and 16 of their last 19 completed series (since 6/10/14)...overall, are 34-15 in the last 49 matchups vs. the Mariners (since 8/23/16).

- **The Yankees have won 12 of their last 13 completed series at T-Mobile Park (since 9/12/11) and 13 of their last 15 completed series (since 7/8/10)...their 29-10 (.744) record at T-Mobile Park since 2012 is the third-best by any team (min. 30G) at any stadium in that span,** trailing only Tampa Bay's 24-7 (.774) record at loanDepot park and Los Angeles-NL's 28-9 (.757) record at Citi Field.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have posted a 2.94 ERA (141.0IP, 46ER) over their last 26 starts (since 4/14)...over that span, lead the Majors in opponents' BA (.207) and opponents' OBP (.274), rank second in WHIP (1.10, second in AL) and opponents' OPS (.616, second in AL), third in opponents' SLG (.343, second in AL) and fourth in ERA (third in AL).

- Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 21 of their last 26 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 18 of those starts.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP MAX FRIED (6-0, 1.05 ERA)

LHP Max Fried will make his ninth start of the season tonight at Seattle...the 31-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...allowed only 1R/ER over 7.0IP and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 4-3 "walk-off" win on Wednesday vs. the Padres...**is 6-0 with a 1.05 ERA (51.2IP, 6ER) in eight starts this season...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of those starts and 1ER-or-fewer in six of those starts...the Yankees are 8-0 in his starts this season**...leads the Majors in ERA and pickoffs (four), is tied for first in wins (tied for first in AL), ranks fourth in opponents' OPS (.515, fourth in AL), fifth in opponents' SLG (.269, fifth in AL), sixth in opponents' BA (.187, fifth in AL) and WHIP (0.91, fifth in AL), and seventh in opponents' OBP (.245, sixth in AL)...went 11-10 with two complete games (one shutout) and a 3.25 ERA (174.1IP, 146H, 71R/63ER, 57BB, 166K, 13HR) over 29 starts with the Atlanta Braves in 2024...over nine Major League seasons with the Atlanta Braves (2017-24) and Yankees (2025), has gone 79-36 with six complete games (four shutouts) and a 2.96 ERA (936.0IP, 819H, 343R/308ER, 257BB, 910K, 79HR) in 176 career games (159 starts)...among Major League pitchers since 2020 (min. 500.0IP), ranks first in ERA (2.68), tied for first in shutouts (four) and pickoffs (22), second in winning percentage (.706), HR/9.0IP (0.66), opponents' SLG (.326), opponents' OPS (.605), third in groundball percentage (54.3%), fourth in wins (60) and fourth in groundball/flyball ratio (2.22) and tied for sixth in complete games (five)...his 77 wins since 2019 rank second in the Majors, trailing only Gerrit Cole (79)...the two-time All-Star (2022 and '24) and three-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020-22) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting twice in his career (second in 2022 and fifth in 2020)...has made seven career Opening Day rosters (2019-24 with Atlanta and 2025 with the Yankees)...the Santa Monica, Calif., native was originally selected by San Diego in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Atlanta along with INF Jace Peterson, INF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on 12/19/14...was signed by the Yankees to an eight-year contract extending through the 2032 season on 12/17/24.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed only 1R/ER over 7.0IP and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 4-3 "walk-off" win on Wednesday vs. the Padres...allowed his only run on a solo HR to Jackson Merrill in the fourth inning...retired 11 of his first 12BF.

WINNING WAYS: The Yankees are 8-0 in Fried's starts this season...is one of just two pitchers in the Majors this season to make at least eight starts and have his team win all of his starts, joining San Francisco's Robbie Ray (team is 8-0)...**marks just the fourth time in franchise history the Yankees have won a pitcher's first eight starts with the team**...the Yankees also won Whitey Ford's first 22 starts with the club from 1950-53 (won first 23GS when including postseason), Joe Cowley's first 11 starts in 1984 and Russ Ford's first eight starts in 1910.

- ★ **Is the 12th pitcher in franchise history and the third Yankees pitcher in the last 72 years since 1954 to have the Yankees go 8-0 in their first eight starts of a season (excluding openers)**, joining Joe Cowley (Yankees went 11-0 in his 11GS in 1974) and Orlando Hernández (Yankees went 8-0 in first 8GS in 2004)...the Yankees also won Chad Green's first nine opening assignments in 2019...*if the Yankees were to win tonight*, it would mark the sixth time in franchise history the club has won a pitcher's first nine starts of a season...the Yankees won each of Whitey Ford's 12GS in 1950 (13GS when including postseason) and his first 10GS in 1953, each of Joe Cowley's 11GS in 1984, each of Tom Zachary's 11GS in 1929 and Atley Donald's first 9GS in 1939.
- ★ His team has won 106 of his starts since 2019, marking the second-most team wins in a pitcher's starts over that span, trailing only the 108 team wins in José Berríos' starts.
- ★ **Owns an eight game-inning streak dating back to last season (since 9/21/24)...is tied for the second-longest winning streak of his career**, trailing only a nine-game winning streak from 4/19-7/6/22 (also had eight-game winning streaks from 9/21/19-9/18/20 and 8/4/23-4/23/24)...has posted a 0.95 ERA (66.1IP, 7ER) over that span.
- ★ Won a career-high six straight starts from 4/4-5/2, posting a 0.68 ERA (40.0IP, 3ER) over that span.

2025: Is 6-0 with a 1.05 ERA (51.2IP, 6ER) in eight starts this season...leads the Majors in ERA and pickoffs (four), is tied for first in wins (tied for first in AL), ranks fourth in opponents' OPS (.515, fourth in AL), fifth in opponents' SLG (.269, fifth in AL), sixth in opponents' BA (.187, fifth in AL) and WHIP (0.91, fifth in AL), and seventh in opponents' OBP (.245, sixth in AL)...also ranks third in the AL in groundball percentage (51.4%), is tied for sixth in innings pitched and ninth in HR/9.0IP (0.52).

- ★ Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of those starts and 1ER-or-fewer in six of those starts...**has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in six of his last seven starts (since 4/4), posting a 0.77 ERA (47.0IP, 4ER) in that span**.
- ★ **Is one of eight pitchers in franchise history (excluding openers) to allow 2ER-or-fewer in each of his first eight starts of a season** (since ER became an official stat in 1913), joining Michael Pineda (first nine starts in 2014), Lefty Gomez (first nine starts in 1937), Michael King (first eight starts in 2023), Gerrit Cole (first eight starts in 2021), Bill Stafford (first eight starts in 1960), Jack Quinn (first eight starts in 1919) and Ray Caldwell (first eight starts in 1913)...Chad Green also did so in his first 11 starts as an opener in 2019.
- ★ **Among pitchers to debut with a team since 1913 (when ER became an official stat in both leagues), is just the eighth pitcher to record at least six wins and post an ERA of 1.05-or-lower in his first eight starts with a franchise**, joining Los Angeles-NL's Max Scherzer (6-0 and 0.88 ERA in 2021), Houston's Randy Johnson (7-1 and 1.00 ERA in 1998), the Yankees' Phil Niekro (6-1 and 1.04 ERA in 1984), Los Angeles-NL's Fernando Valenzuela (8-0 and 0.50 ERA in 1981), Boston's Boo Ferriss (8-0 and 0.75 ERA in 1945), Philadelphia's Lee Meadows (6-2 and 0.77 ERA in 1919) and Boston Braves' Dana Fillingim (6-2 and 0.38 ERA in 1918) - confirmed by *Elias*.
- ★ His eight starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Texas' Tyler Mahle's nine such starts.
