Homers

Atlanta clubbed three more home runs yesterday afternoon, and hit nine in its three-game series with Tampa Bay. The Braves won the series, two-games-to-one.

The Braves last hit more home runs in a single three-game series last September, when they totaled 11 homers here at home against the Cardinals.

Atlanta hit multiple homers in each of the three games versus Tampa Bay, and has at least two home runs in three straight games for the first time this season. The club had such a streak on 13 different occasions last season, including a season-best run of six straight games from June 30 to July 5.

Five different Braves homered against the Rays, with Austin Riley (three), Jarred Kelenic (two) and Marcell Ozuna (two) each doing so multiple times.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Tigers tonight open a three-game series in what is the only scheduled meetings between the clubs this season...The two teams met last year in Detroit, and are playing in back-to-back seasons for the first time.

- A* The Braves swept a doubleheader in the final two games of the series last season to win the set and take two-of-three from the Tigers.
- A* Atlanta has won the series, two-games-to-one, in each of the last three seasons these two clubs have met...The Braves won the series by that margin last year, in 2019 and in 2016, and have not lost a series to the Tigers since getting swept in 2013.
- A* The Braves and Tigers have met 27 times since the advent of interleague play in 1997, with Atlanta going just 12-15 (.444) against Detroit all-time... Despite the losing record, Atlanta has won five of the nine total series between the clubs, although Detroit has the only two sweeps between the teams.
- A* The Braves have hosted just one series all-time against the Tigers here at Truist Park, taking two-of-three in 2019...In 18 total games in the city of Atlanta, the two teams have won nine games apiece.
- A* LH Max Fried has never faced Detroit, one of just five teams in baseball he has yet to pitch against... The 6-foot-4, 190-pound left-hander has also never faced Kansas City, Los Angeles-AL, Oakland or Texas...Fried took his third loss of the season in his last turn, June 11 at Baltimore, after allowing six hits and four runs over just 5.0 innings...In his last three starts here at home, the California native has pitched to a 1.27 ERA and allowed just three total runs in 21.1 innings.
- A* RH Reese Olson has made one career appearance against Atlanta, facing the Braves in the third outing and second start of his major league career...The 6-foot-1, 160-pound right-hander allowed five hits and seven runs, six earned, over 3.1 innings to take the loss, June 14 of last year...A native of Gainesville, Ga., Olson attended North Hall High School, located just over an hour from Truist Park...Olson is 1-8 this season despite pitching to a 3.68 ERA, and his four losses in games in which he allows no more than two earned runs are tied for the most by a starter in baseball.

ROSTER MOVES: The Braves today recalled OF Forrest Wall to Atlanta after optioning OF J.P. Martínez to Triple-A Gwinnett following yesterday's game... Additionally, the club recalled RHP Daysbel Hernández to Atlanta and placed RHP Hurston Waldrep on the 15-day IL with right elbow inflammation.

- A* Wall is in tonight's lineup, batting eighth and playing left field..He broke camp with Atlanta and rejoins the club after playing 44 games with Triple-A Gwinnett, during which he batted .287/.393/.415 with an .808 OPS.

AUSTIN RILEY: Collected two more hits yesterday afternoon, including a game-tying, two-run home run in the bottom of the eighth...Riley homered in each of the three games versus Tampa Bay, and is tied for the longest active homer streak in the majors.

- A* Riley's eighth-inning homer concluded an 11-pitch at-bat, in which he fell behind 1-2 and fouled off five more pitches...The at-bat was one of just four across baseball this season to see at least 11 pitches and conclude with a home run, and the only such plate appearance by the Braves...KC's MJ Melendez and CLE's José Ramírez each homered in 12-pitch at-bats, while MIL's William Contreras did so in 13 pitches.
- A* Riley's 11-pitch at-bat was the longest of his career to end in a home run, and the longest by any Braves batter since Matt Adams also homered on the 11th pitch on June 4, 2017 at Cincinnati.
- A* Atlanta's third baseman went 6-for-10 with three homers, a double and eight RBI versus Tampa Bay... He was just 6-for-38 over his previous 10 games... His home run on Friday night snapped a 90 at-bat homerless drought, the longest of his six-year MLB career.
- A* Riley's three-game homer streak is tied for the fourth-longest such run of his career...He homered in five straight games last July, and had four-game runs in 2021 and 2022.

OLSON STREAKING, TWICE: Matt Olson reached in all four of his plate appearances yesterday afternoon, going 3-for-3 with two singles, a double and a walk...He has hit in a season-best 10 straight games.

- A* Olson's run dates to June 6 at Washington, and is tied for the third-longest active streak in the majors... He has batted .410/.465/.692 during the streak, with five multi-hit games...He has raised his batting average by 27 points during the streak, from .234 to .261, and his OPS by 61 points, from .752 to .813.
- A* His eighth-inning double also gave him at least one extra-base hit in five straight games, the longest active run in the majors...He has six total extra-base hits during the streak, four doubles and two homers.
- A* Since joining the Braves in 2022, Olson's 193 extra-base hits are most in the majors...The Yankees' Aaron Judge and Dodgers' Freddie Freeman are tied for second with 192.

KELENIC AT LEADOFF: Jarred Kelenic drove the second pitch he saw in yesterday's first inning out to right for the first leadoff home run of his career...In two games since moving to the top of the order, he is 4-for-10 with two homers and three RBI, and has struck out just once.

- A* He replaced Ronald Acuña Jr in the leadoff spot on May 26 and collected three hits off the bench, and is batting .500/.500/1.000 in three total games from the top spot in the order.
- A* Kelenic has gone deep three times in his last seven games, batting .320/.370/.680 in total since June 9.

Today's Game

- Set to make his 14th start of the season and first of his career against Detroit.
 - Sporting a 2.02 ERA over his last nine starts.
 - The Tigers will be the 25th team Fried has faced in his MLB career.
- Dating to his 2017 debut season, Fried's .701 winning percentage is the third highest in the majors, trailing only Clayton Kershaw and Justin Verlander (min. 700 IP).
- Opponents are being held to an average exit velocity of 84.6 MPH against Fried; the lowest among qualified pitchers...Teammate Chris Sale ranks third.
 - Also leads the league with the lowest percentage of balls barreled against him at 11.2% (among qualifiers).
- Pitching to a 8.53 ERA in the first frame and a 2.18 ERA in all other innings this season.
 - Allowed a combined nine runs in the first innings between his first two games in 2024.
- Sporting a 2.20 ERA in 11 starts after allowing a combined 10 earned runs through 5.0 frames tossed between his first two starts of the season.
 - Ranks as the fourth lowest ERA in the NL among qualifiers during that span dating to April 7.
- Producing a 60.9% groundball rate this season; the highest rate in the majors among qualified starters.
 - His 131 groundballs induced are tied for the most in MLB among lefties.
- His 66 wins over the past five seasons are most in the National League, and most by any left-hander in baseball.
 - Only one pitcher, the Yankees' Gerrit Cole, has more wins than Fried since the start of 2019...Cole has 71 wins.
 - Additionally, the Braves have 90 wins in games started by Fried since the beginning of 2019, the most such wins by a pitcher in the National League... Only Cole and José, Berríos, whose teams have won 94 and 92 of their starts respectively, have more in the majors.
- Fried's 26 successful pickoffs since debuting in 2017 are the most in baseball and five more than the next closest pitcher, Washington's Patrick Corbin.
 - Corbin has attempted 486 pickoffs in that time, compared to Fried's 190.
 - Fried has successfully nabbed a runner on 13.5 percent of his career pickoff attempts, drastically higher than the MLB average since his debut (1.7 percent)...Since 2017, 1.6 percent of MLB's successful pick attempts have been executed by Fried.

2024 Recap

- Recorded a career most 13 strikeouts on June 4 against Boston.
 - His previous career high was 11 punchouts, done twice.
- Earned his second win of the season while throwing a three-hit shutout against the Marlins on April 23; the fourth of his career and the third of the nine-inning variety.
 - Each of his four shutouts have qualified as a "Maddux" (fewer than 100 pitches).
 - Since pitch tracking began in 1988, Hall-of-Famers Greg Maddux (11) and Tom Glavine (5) are the only Braves pitchers to log more "Maddux" outings.
 - It's the first 9.0-inning shutout by a Braves pitcher since RHP Bryce Elder on September 26, 2022 at Washington.
- Tossed a two-run complete game against Chicago (NL) in his last start, fanning nine hitters while scattering three hits, one earned run and issuing zero walks.
 - Became the first Braves pitcher to record two complete games in which he did not allow more than one earned run and three hits in the team's first 50 games of the season since Shelby Miller in 2015...Only Boston-era pitchers Irv Young, Lou Fette and Jim Tobin have more such games in that same span.
- He is the only pitcher in baseball with two no-hit bids through the sixth inning this season...Also the first pitcher in the National League to have taken multiple no-hitters through the sixth in a season since Clayton Kershaw in 2022.
- Struckout Christian Walker looking in the top of the second inning to reach 700 punchouts on his career.
 - Fried became the sixth left-handed pitcher in franchise history to reach the milestone.
 - Joins Hall-of-Famers Warren Spahn and Tom Glavine along with with Denny Lemaster, Lefty Tyler and Steve Avery as the only lefty Braves pitchers to do so.
- Had the shortest start of his career against Philadelphia on March 30, 2024.
 - Lasted 0.2 innings while allowing three earned runs and two hits, issuing three walks on 43 pitches.
