The Mariners and Orioles square off in their first of 2 series in 2025...the teams will meet again at Camden Yards in Baltimore for 3 games from Aug. 12-14.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the final series of a 9-game homestand with the second of three against the Baltimore Orioles (0-1)...the Mariners hosted the Washington Nationals (1-2) and the Minnesota Twins (2-1) already on the homestand...following tomorrow's series finale, the Mariners will embark on a 6-game road trip at the Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 6/6-8) and Arizona Diamondbacks (3 G, 6/9-11)...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Dave Valle** on the call and **Jen Mueller** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs**, **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Angie Mentink** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped yesterday's series opener to the Orioles by a 5-1 final score...Seattle is 16-15 at home and 16-12 on the road this season...the Mariners are 15-7 in day games and 17-20 at night.

- **Guess What Day It Is? Hump Day!** - The Mariners are 7-2 on Wednesdays this season.
- **Chaos Ball Lives On** - The Mariners are 12-7 (.632) in 1-run games this season T-3rd most in the Majors and have 131 1-run victories since 2021, most in MLB by a wide margin (2nd: Mets, 118).
- **Did You Catch That?** - **Cal Raleigh** is the first catcher in MLB history to reach the 20 home run mark before June 1...it also marks the 29th season in MLB history with 20 HR by the end of May.
- **Great to Have them Back** - Both **Jackson Kowar** (3 G, 4.0 IP) and **Matt Brash** (10 G, 8.1 IP), have yet to allow a run since their returns from the Injured List...both Kowar and Brash missed all of last season.

ALL-STAR VOTING IS LIVE...MLB today opened voting for the 95th MLB All-Star Game at Truist Park in Atlanta on July 15th...fan voting is split into two phases with phase 1 running until June 26th at 9 am PT, with fans allowed to submit up to 5 votes per day during phase 1...after phase 1 is completed, the top 2 vote getters at each position (top 6 outfielders) will face off head-to-head in phase 2 of voting, which will determine who will start the All-Star Game, phase 2 of voting will run from June 30th-July 2nd...the overall leading vote getter in each league will skip phase 2 and receive an automatic starting assignment...the All-Star starters will be announced on ESPN at 4 pm PT on July 2nd and full rosters on July 6th at 2 pm PT.

CAL RALEIGH, ALL-STAR GAME STARTER?...catcher **Cal Raleigh** is tied for the MLB lead with 23 home runs this season (also: Shohei Ohtani-LAD)...Raleigh's 4 multi-home run games this season (4/16 at CIN, 5/2 at TEX, 5/27 vs. WSH, 5/30 vs. MIN) are also tied for the most in the Majors (also: Corbin Carroll-ARI)...the 28-year-old backstop is batting .259 (56x216) with 39 runs, 10 doubles, 23 home runs, 45 RBI, 37 walks and 6 stolen bases, with a .374 on-base percentage, .625 slugging percentage and .999 OPS...he leads MLB catchers in virtually every offensive statistical category, and overall in the Majors ranks T-1st in home runs, 10th in walks, 4th in slugging percentage, 4th in OPS, T-5th in extra-base hits (33), 4th in total bases (135), T-7th in RBI, 4th in bWAR (3.4), 4th in OPS+ (189), 2nd in fWAR (3.8) and 3rd in wRC+ (183)...Cal has appeared in all 59 of the Mariners games this season.

J.P. SIZZLE...infielder **J.P. Crawford** went 3-for-4 last night and has recorded multiple hits in 4 straight games, including recording 3 hits twice...over his last 10 games (5/23-c), he is batting .371 (13x35) with 5 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 3 RBI, 4 walks, a .436 OBP and slugging .514 (.950 OPS)...among qualified AL shortstops this season, he leads in walk rate (15.1%) and OBP, while ranking among the leaders in OPS (4th), AVG (4th), wRC+ (3rd, 138), fWAR (4th, 1.7) and bWAR (5th, 2.1).

#51...The Mariners announced Monday that Baseball and Mariners Hall of Famer **Randy Johnson's** number 51 will be retired by the club during the 2026 season (date TBD)...Johnson's #51 will be the 5th number retired by the Mariners, joining **Ken Griffey Jr.** (#24), **Edgar Martinez** (#11), **Ichiro Suzuki** (#51) and Jackie Robinson (#42, retired by all MLB teams)...Johnson is the 13th player to have his number retired by multiple MLB franchises and his (and Ichiro's) #51 is the 8th number to be retired by the same club for multiple players.

RALLY KIDS...the Mariners have won 6 series this season when dropping the opener, including winning a franchise-record 4-consecutive series when dropping game 1...the franchise record streak included series wins at the Reds (4/15-17), at the Blue Jays (4/18-20), at the Red Sox (4/22-24) and at the Marlins (4/25-27)...the Mariners have also rallied in the final two games to capture series victories at the Athletics (5/5-7) and against the Twins on the current homestand (5/30-6/1).

CAL RALEIGH IN MAY...Cal Raleigh had a marvelous month of May, batting .304 (28x92) with 19 runs, 4 doubles, 12 HR, 26 RBI, 19 walks and 2 stolen bases, getting on base at a .430 clip and slugging .739 (1.169 OPS) in 27 games...among AL hitters in May, Cal ranked among the leaders in home runs (1st), RBI (3rd), extra-base hits (T-3rd), walks (T-4th), slugging percentage (2nd), OPS (2nd), OBP (7th) and average (14th), while he was tied for the MLB lead in fWAR (2.2)...he was edged out by Aaron Judge for the AL Player of the Month award.

MUÑOZ: STILL THE BEST CLOSER IN BASEBALL...despite allowing his first earned runs of the season this weekend, **Andrés Muñoz** is 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA (4 ER, 25.2 IP) with 9 walks (2 intentional), 33 strikeouts and a 0.857 WHIP, holding opponents to a .149 average...the March/April AL Reliever of the month set the Mariners record for most innings pitched (23.2) to begin a season without allowing an earned run...Muñoz ranks T-2nd in saves (17), trailing only Robert Suárez-SD (18).

ALL-TIME MARINERS...active Mariners **J.P. Crawford** (10th, 19.4 bWAR) and **Julio Rodríguez** (13th, 18.2 bWAR) both rank among the top-15 Mariners position players in franchise history in WAR (*Baseball-Reference*)...**Cal Raleigh** (14.8 bWAR) leads all catchers in franchise history and currently sits 18th all-time in Mariners history.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...the Mariners wrap up the 9-game homestand with the final two games against the Baltimore Orioles...the final two games are highlighted by **Pride Night** tonight and a **Mariners Value Game** tomorrow, with tickets starting at \$11...following the next road trip, the Mariners will have a 6-game homestand against the Cleveland Guardians (3 G, 6/13-15) and Boston Red Sox (3 G, 6/16-18), highlighted by **Sing-Along Fireworks Night** on June 13, **African American Heritage Night - Steelheads Cap Giveaway** on June 14 and **Father's Day - Socks Giveaway** on June 15.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Cal Raleigh is the reigning **AL Co-Player of the Week** (also: Junior Caminero-TB) after batting .348 (8x23) with 6 HR, 10 RBI and a 1.576 OPS in 6 games during the week (5/26-6/1), and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW...**that Cal is the 3rd Mariner to win Player of the Week this season, joining **Dylan Moore** (April 14-20) and **Jorge Polanco** (April 21-27) won back-to-back earlier this season, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...it marks the 13th time in franchise history, and just the 2nd time since 2015 that the Mariners have had 3 players win Player of the Week in the same season?...the Mariners have also had 3+ players named player of the week in 2023, 2015, 2014, 2006, 1998 (4 players), 1997 (4), 1996 (4), 1995 (5), 1991, 1990 (4), 1998 (4) and 1982 (4).

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season tonight and his 1st against Baltimore...he is also scheduled to make the 25th start of his career and 1st career start against the Orioles.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on May 29 vs. Washington, he threw 5.1 innings, giving up 2 runs on a season-low 2 hits with 3 walks and 4 strikeouts...it was his 3rd career start throwing 5.0+ innings and allowing 2-or-less hits (last: April 26, 2024 vs. ARI), and has allowed 3-or-less runs in 7 of 9 starts this season.

LENGTH ON THE MOUND...after his May 23 start vs. Houston, it marked his 4th start this season where he has tossed 6.0+ innings...he has tossed 6.0+ innings in 8 of his 24 career starts, and 5.0+ innings in 17 starts...in those 17 starts of 5.0+ innings pitched, the Mariners hold a 13-4 record.

HOME WARRIOR...Hancock has thrown 5.0+ innings in each of his last 3 home starts, and has allowed 3-or-less runs in 11 of his 13 career home starts at T-Mobile Park, while throwing 5.0+ innings in 10 of those 13 starts.

BRINGIN' THE HEAT...this season Hancock has increased his average fastball velocity by 1.8 mph (94.5 mph), up from an average fastball velocity of 92.7 mph in the 2024 season...in his 5/17 start against the San Diego Padres, Hancock threw a career-high 97.6 mph fastball to strikeout Jake Cronenworth in the 2nd inning...in that outing, 42 of his pitches touched 95+ mph which was nearly double his previous career-high of 22 pitches over 95 mph on April 17 vs. CIN...the fastest pitch he had thrown prior to 2025 was a 96 mph sinker on 7/07/24 vs. TOR.

LOCKING IT IN...his 3 starts on April 23, April 30, and May 6, marked just the 2nd time in his career where he threw 6.0+ innings in 3 consecutive starts (also: 2024 season, 4/13 at CHC, 4/21 at COL and 4/26 at ARI)...this season, Hancock has recorded more strikeouts (32 SO), and less runs allowed (28) in his first 9 starts this season, then his first 9 starts of the 2024 season (28 SO, 29 RA).

AMERICAN LEAGUE TOTALS...Hancock has made 15 career starts against American League teams, holding a 4-3 record with a 5.85 ERA (47 ER, 72.1 IP), while collecting 41 strikeouts and 22 walks, and a 11-4 Mariners record...in his last 8 of 10 starts against AL teams, the Mariners have a 7-3 record with Hancock throwing 5.0+ innings in 8 of those starts, including 4 quality starts.

LATEST STRETCH...in his last 5 starts (5/6-c), Hancock has collected 2 quality starts, and has 27.0 innings pitched, the 4th time in his career throwing 27.0+ innings in a 5-game span...in his last 10 starts (9/28/24-c), the Mariners are 7-3 with Hancock throwing 5.0+ innings in 8 starts, and allowing 2-or-fewer walks in 7 of his last 10 starts.

GET AHEAD, STAY AHEAD...when pitching ahead in the count this season, in 16.2 innings pitched Hancock has a 2.50 AVG against, a 0.96 WHIP, with no walks and 18 strikeouts.

QUICK TRIP TO TACOMA...after his 1st major league start of the season (3/30 vs. DET), Hancock was optioned to Triple-A Tacoma...between his two starts with the Rainiers, he allowed 4 runs on 9 hits (1 HR), 2 walks, 2 hit by pitches, and struck out 12 in 9.2 innings of work...between the 2024 and 2025 seasons, Hancock holds a 3.46 ERA (40 ER, 104.0 IP) and is 7-4 with Tacoma across 19 game starts.

THE VERY FIRST ONE...recorded his 1st career win on 4/1/24 vs. Cleveland at T-Mobile Park...tossed 5.1 innings, gave up 4 hits (1 home run) and 3 earned runs with 1 strikeout.

THE DEBUT...made MLB debut on 8/9/23 against the San Diego Padres, allowing just 1 run on 2 hits and 3 walks with 3 strikeouts... became just the 6th starting pitcher in franchise history to pitch 5.0+ innings and allow 2-or-fewer hits in a Major League debut, joining Pat Rice, Ken Cloude, Taijuan Walker, Roenis Elías and Bryce Miller.

THE COMPLETE PACKAGE...on July 21, 2024 vs. Reno, Hancock threw a 9.0 inning complete game shutout...it was the only 9.0 inning complete game shutout in Triple-A in 2024 and only 1 of 2 in the full-season minor leagues this year...there have only been 2 complete game shutouts in the Pacific Coast League since the start of 2019.

PCL PITCHER OF THE MONTH...was awarded Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Month for June 2024...held a 1-0 record with a 0.84 ERA in 4 starts as he allowed 2 runs on 14 hits with 7 walks over 21.1 innings...he tallied 17 strikeouts and held opponents to a .187 (14x75) average... after allowing 2 runs in his first inning of June, he did not allow another run in his next 20.1 innings during the month with Tacoma.

HOME SWEET GEORGIA...is 1 of 5 players in MLB history born in Cairo, GA, the same birthplace as Jackie Robinson, Ernie Riles, Willie Harris and Hurston Waldrep...was the 11th Georgia Bulldog in school history to be drafted in the first round...he became the highest Georgia selection since Derek Lilliquist went 6th overall in 1987...1 of 7 Bulldogs to play in MLB in 2024 (also: Jonathan Cannon-CWS, Kyle Farmer-MIN, Jared Walsh-TEX, Alex Wood-OAK, Zac Kristofak-LAA and Aaron Schunk-COL).
