TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs former Reds media relations intern **Alex Mayer's Mariners** and the fourth game (2-1) of Cin's longest road trip of the 2026 season, a 10-day/9-game journey that began with a 3-game series victory at **Col** (2-1) and includes an upcoming set at **StL** (Fri-Sun).

- The Reds return home to **Great American Ball Park** on 7/27 to begin an 11-day/10-game homestand against the **Guardians** (7/27-7/29), **Pirates** (7/30-8/2), and **Athletics** (8/4-8/6).

HOMER HAPPY: INF/OF **Spencer Steer** (Fri), **C Jose Trevino** (Sat), and **C Tyler Stephenson** (Sun) each posted a 2-homer game in the Reds' 3-game series victory at **Col** over the weekend.

- Marks the first time the Reds had at least 1 player hit multiple home runs in 3 straight team games since 8/24-8/27, 2010 (**Brandon Phillips**, 2hr; **Joey Votto**, 2hr; **Jay Bruce**, 3hr)...Cin has never had a streak of 4 consecutive team games in which at least 1 player hit multiple homers.
- With **Trevino** and **Stephenson** both producing their first multi-homer game of 2026 in each of the last 2 days, **Cin** has had 2+ HR from their starting catcher in back-to-back games for the first time since 1900...last MLB team to accomplish this was **TB** in 2015 (**Curt Casali**, 7/27-7/28).
- The Reds combined to hit 10 homers in the 3-game series victory at **Col**, tied for their third-most in any 3-game set since 1900 (15hr, 9/3-9/5, 1999 at **Phi**; 11hr, 6/7-6/9, 2005 vs **TB**).

'SAL'UTATIONS: INF **Sal Stewart** on Sun at **Col** extended his team lead with his 20th homer of 2026, becoming the eighth Reds rookie to ever hit 20+ HR.

- Stewart** on Sun also became the sixth Reds rookie with at least 20 homers and 20 doubles in a season (see chart below).
- His 70 RBI on the year are tied for third-most in MLB, behind only **StL's Jordan Walker** (76) and **Hou's Yordan Alvarez** (73).
- Stewart** is aiming to become the fourth Major League rookie since 1920 to lead his team in home runs, RBI, walks, and hits...would join teammate **Spencer Steer** (2023), **Don Lenhardt** (1950 w/**St. Louis Browns**), and **Wally Berger** (1930 w/**Boston Braves**).

POWER SURGE: The Reds rank T6th in the majors with 129 home runs this season...have scored 49.8% of their 414 runs via the HR (206), the second-highest rate in MLB (**Sea**, 50.5%).

- On Sun at **Col** hit at least 4 homers in a game for the eighth time this season, tied with the **Braves** for the most-such instances in MLB.
- The Reds lead MLB this season with 9 sets of back-to-back home runs (the **Athletics**, 8, rank 2nd).
- Hit back-to-back-to-back HRs in the 4th inning on 7/8 vs **Phi** (**Elly De La Cruz**, **Sal Stewart**, **JJ Bleday**)...marked their 15th set of 3 straight home runs in the expansion era (since 1961).
- Are on pace to hit 213 homers this season, which would mark the 10th time in club history reaching 200 HR.
- Have hit a Major League-leading 27 homers to the opposite field this year, 6 more than the next closest team (**Phi** and **NYN**).
- Are 1 of 7 teams in the majors to boast at least 6 players with 10 or more HR this season (also: **NYN**, **Sea**, **Pit**, **Atl**, **Chc**, and **LAD**).
- Have hit multiple HR in each of their last 3 games and in 5 of their last 6.

FEEL THE BURN(S): Cincinnati Reds President of Baseball Operations **Nick Krall** on Sat announced that the club has agreed to terms with **RHP Chase Burns** on a new 7-year, \$105-million contract extension through the 2033 season.

- Burns**, 23, earned his first career All-Star nod after posting an 11-1 record with a 2.54 ERA and 118 strikeouts in his first 18 starts this season.
- Selected by Cin with the 2nd-overall pick of the 2024 MLB Draft, **Burns** became the second Red to ever earn an All-Star nod within 2 years of being drafted (also: **Scott Williamson**, drafted in 1997 and AS in '99).
- The Reds own a 14-4 record in his 18 starts this season, including wins in each of his last 6 appearances and in 10 of his last 11.

SERIES NOTES:

- The Redlegs are 6-21 all-time vs **Sea**, including 1 series at **Cinergy Field** (2002, 0-3), 4 series at **Great American Ball Park** (2013, 1-2; 2016, 0-3; 2023, 2-1; **2025, 1-2**) and 4 series at **T-Mobile Park** (2007, 1-2; 2010, 0-3; 2019, 1-2; 2024, 0-3).
- Sea** took 2 of 3g in 2025 at **GABP** & swept Cin in 2024 at **T-Mobile Park**.
- The Reds lost their first 6 series vs the **M's**, including 3 series sweeps, until taking 2 of 3g in 2023.
- On 4/17/24 at **Sea**, Cin's lone hit was a solo HR from **SS Elly De La Cruz**...it marked the first time since 4/25/13 at **Wsh** that the Reds were held to just 1 hit with that hit being a HR (**Joey Votto**, solo HR).

SMART STEERING: In Fri's 7-2 win at **Col**, INF/OF **Spencer Steer** capped off his fifth career multi-homer game (last: 6/2 vs **KC**) with an inside-the-park homer off **Jeff Criswell** in the 8th inning.

- Marked his first career inside-the-park home run and the first by a **Reds** batter since **Noelvi Marte** on 9/24/25 vs **Pit**.
- Steer** is the fifth **Red** in the expansion era (since 1961) to hit an inside-the-park homer as part of a multi-HR game (last: **Elly De La Cruz**, 2024).

GOING THE EXTRA MILE: INF **Elly De La Cruz** and INF/OF **Spencer Steer** both recorded their 200th career extra-base hit in Fri's 7-2 win at **Col**...became the first pair of Major League teammates since 1900 to each collect the 200th extra-base hit of their respective careers in the same game.

- At 24 years, 187 days old, **De La Cruz** became the fourth-youngest **Red** to reach 200 career extra-base hits since 1900...also became the second Major Leaguer since 1900 with 200+ XBH and 150+ SB within his first 4 career seasons (also: **Juan Samuel**, 1983-86 w/**Phi**).

GENO MACHINO: DH **Eugenio Suárez** homered in a season-high 3 straight games from 7/11-7/17, marking the 10th time he hit a homer in at least 3 consecutive games in his career (last: 7/19-7/21, 2025 w/**Diamondbacks**).

- Hit his 201st career homer as a member of the **Reds** on Fri at **Col**...is 2 HR shy of tying **Eric Davis** for 10th place on the club's all-time list.

STAR-STUDDED: RHP **Chase Burns** and INF **Sal Stewart** represented the Reds as National League All-Stars at the 2026 MLB All-Star Game in Philadelphia.

- It was the first career All-Star selection for both players...2026 marks the third straight year in which Cin had multiple All-Stars.
- Burns** did not pitch in the Midsummer Classic...**Stewart** entered as a defensive replacement at third base and went 0-for-1 with a walk.
- Burns** and **Stewart** are the third set of teammates in Reds history to each earn an All-Star selection at age 23 or younger in the same season (**Johnny Bench** and **Wayne Simpson** in 1970, **Frank Robinson** and **Vada Pinson** in 1959).

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in the 8-4 loss vs Chc on Sun, 7/12 (4.0ip, 4h, 4r/4er, 3bb, 3k, 0hr, 79TP).
• Threw 31 of his 79 pitches in the 1st inning (2r/2er, 1bb, 2xbh, 6 batters faced).
• 7 of his 19 baserunners reached.
• Was his shortest outing since 4/24 vs Det (4.0ip).

JULY 7 vs PHI: Suffered the 4-1 loss on Tue, 7/7 vs Phi (6.0ip, 5h, 3r/3er, 0bb, 8k, 1hr, 95TP).
• Was his first quality start since notching 3 in-a-row from 5/27-6/8.
• Produced a season-high 8 strikeouts.
• Was the first time this season that he didn't issue a walk.
• Threw first-pitch strikes to 14 of his 23 batters...was ahead in the count to 15 batters.
• His 71.6% strike rate marked a season high (95 pitches, 68 strikes).
• Allowed all 3 of his runs in the 3rd inning (25 pitches)...allowed just 2 hits combined over his other 5 innings.

JULY 1 at MIL: Did not factor in the decision in the 4-2 loss at Mil on Wed, 7/1 (5.0ip, 5h, 2r/2er, 5bb, 3k, 96TP).
• Issued a season-high 5 walks.
• Threw 56 of his 96 pitches in the first 2 innings.
• Held batters to 1-for-7 with RISP (William Contreras' RBI-single in the 2nd).
• His 10 base runners matched a season high (also: 4/12 vs LAA).
• Was the 10th time this season that he allowed fewer than 3 runs.

HE'S BEEN GOOD: Over his last 14 starts, beginning 4/30 vs Col, has pitched to a 3.18 ERA (76.1ip, 29r/27er, 63h, 35bb, 65k, 12hr, .222/.304/.380, 6 quality starts).

MILESTONE: Is approaching 100 career starts (95)...would become the first left-handed pitcher to make 100 starts with the Reds since John Smiley (123gs, 1993-97), Tom Browning (298gs, 1984-1994), Fred Norman (196gs, 1973-1979), and Don Gullett (156gs, 1970-1976).

HE EARNED IT: His 3.56 ERA through his first 95 career starts is the lowest by a Reds starting pitcher in that span since RHP Mario Soto (3.07, 1977-83).

STIFF COMPETITION: In games Andrew Abbott has pitched in 2026, opposing starting pitchers are 4-5 with a 3.19 ERA and holding Reds batters to a .228/.288/.376...Abbott this year has faced: **Garrett Crochet** (AS), **Paul Skenes** twice (AS), **Sandy Alcantara** (AS), José Soriano, Taj Bradley, **Framber Valdez** (AS), Michael Lorenzen (AS), Jameson Taillon, Kai-Wei Teng, Tanner Bibee, **Aaron Nola** (AS), Huascar Brazobán (opener), Noah Cameron, **Walker Buehler** (AS), **Zac Gallen** (AS), Will Warren, Shane Drohan, **Zack Wheeler** (AS), and Matthew Boyd (AS).

ALL-STAR APPEARANCE: Selected as an All-Star for the first time in his career...did not pitch in the 2026 Midsummer Classic...selected with the 2nd-overall pick in the 2024 MLB Draft, became the second Red to earn an All-Star selection within 2 years of being drafted (also: Scott Williamson, 1999).

2 RUNS OR FEWER: His 15 starts of 2 runs or fewer are tied for the most in the majors...allowed 2 runs or fewer in 12 straight starts from 4/16 to 6/21 to match the single-season record by a Reds pitcher since 1900 (also: Edinson Volquez 12g, 2008).

11 WINS & 118 STRIKEOUTS: Became the third Reds pitcher in club history with 11 or more wins and 118 or more strikeouts before the All-Star break, joining Edinson Volquez (12w, 126k in 2008) and Jim Maloney (13w, 121k in 1093).

AS A STARTER: His 175 strikeouts through his first 26 career starts rank third by any Reds pitcher in that span since 1900, behind only current teammates Nick Lodolo (178) and Hunter Greene (177).
