TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 9-game homestand with the first of 3 games against the Baltimore Orioles...Seattle opened the homestand with a 3-game series vs. the Minnesota Twins (1-2)...the 9-game homestand will end with the Mariners welcoming the Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, July 5-7) to T-Mobile Park...today's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Dave Sims, Mike Blowers and Mariners Hall-of-Famer Dan Wilson on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) with Rick Rizzs and Aaron Goldsmith.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped Sunday's game to the Twins 5-3...despite the loss, the Mariners are 16-12 (.571) over their last 28 games (5/31-c) and 20-13 (.606) over their last 33 games ( $5 / 26-c$ ).

- First Place - Seattle (47-39) is in 1st place in the American League West Division by 3.0 games over the 2nd place Houston Astros (43-41)...the Mariners have held 1st place for 51 consecutive days ( $5 / 12-c$ ). - Six Plus - The Mariners are 40-15 (.727) when their starting pitchers go 6.0+ innings this season.
- Greatest Hits - Seattle is 35-4 (.897) when out-hitting its opponent this season.
- Men of Steal - The Mariners are 31-for-35 (.875) in stolen base attempts since May 27, the 4th-best stolen base percentage in the Majors during that span and best in the American League.
- Set The Tone - The Mariners are currently on a 12-game winning streak in series openers at home ( $4 / 1-\mathrm{c}$ )...Seattle won their 12th consecutive series opener at home against the Twins on Friday night, extending their franchise record.
- Kirby's Dream Ballpark - George Kirby this season at T-Mobile Park is $5-1$ with a 2.34 ERA (11 ER, $42.1 \mathrm{IP})$ and 48 strikeouts with 5 walks...in 7 starts at home, he has 6 quality starts.
TERRIFIC AT T-MOBILE...Seattle is 28-14 (.667) at T-Mobile Park this season, 4th-best home record in the Majors behind Cleveland (.743/26-9) and Philadelphia (.702/33-14) and Milwaukee (.675/27-13)...the Mariners are 13-4 (.765) over their last 17 home games since May 27, tied for 2nd-best home record in the Majors during that span, trailing Milwaukee (.789/15-4).
PITCHING AT HOME...Seattle's pitching staff has allowed 123 runs at T-Mobile Park this season, he fewest runs allowed at home in the Majors (next: Cleveland, 130 R allowed)...the Mariners lead the Majors in home ERA (2.63), opponent batting average (.198), WHIP (0.92), hits-per-9 innings (6.44), walks-per-9 innings (1.86) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.99), ranking 5th in strikeouts-per-9 innings (9.26)...Seattle's 4.99 strikeout-to-walk ratio this year is currently the highest home SO/BB ratio in Major League history.

THE RECIPE...the Mariners are 36-6 (.857) this season when scoring 4+ runs in a game, as opposed to 11-33 (.250) when scoring 3-or-fewer runs...Seattle's 857 winning percentage when dialing up $4+$ runs is best in the Majors...it is also on pace to be the 2nd-best record when scoring 4+ runs in franchise history, trailing only the 2001 Mariners (.886/101-13).
ALL-STAR(TERS)...the Mariners starting rotation has several All-Star candidates...Logan Gilbert leads the American League in WHIP (0.88), tied for the AL lead in quality starts (14) and 2nd in innings pitched (112.1), 2nd in opponent batting average (.195) and 6th in ERA (2.72)...George Kirby leads the Maiors in strikeout-to-walk ratio (10.67) and ranks 2nd in MLB in fewest walks-per-9 innings (0.82)...Luis Castillo's 103 strikeouts rank 10th in the AL, while Bryce Miller ranks 5th in the AL in opponent batting average (.208). QUALITY ASSURANCE ...the Mariners pitching staff leads the Majors in quality starts (50), with Seattle going 39-11 (.780) when its starter goes $6.0+$ innings while allowing 3 -or-fewer earned runs...the Mariners have 4 starters with 8+ quality starts this season: Logan Gilbert (14 QS), Luis Castillo (10), George Kirby (10) and Bryce Miller (8)...Gilbert's 14 QS are tied for most in MLB with Seth Lugo-KC...the Mariners and Phillies (Aaron Nola, Cristopher Sánchez, Ranger Suárez and Zack Wheeler) are the only teams in the Majors with 4 pitchers recording 8+ QS this season.
THREE WINNING MONTHS ...the Mariners are coming off of their 3rd consecutive winning month, going 15-12 during June...Seattle went 17-13 in March/April and 15-14 in May...Seattle has started the season with 3 winning months for the 5th time in franchise history (2001-03, '18, '24).
ANDRÉS MUÑOZ: WORTHY OF BEING AN AL ALL-STAR...right-hander Andrés Muñoz has 13 saves and a 1.64 ERA ( 6 ER, 33.0 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 13 walks in 33 appearances this season...his next save will set a career-high, after he recorded 13 saves in 2023...this season, Muñoz has posted a 1.03 WHIP and limited opposing hitters to a . 179 batting average...the 25 -year-old is 1 of 3 American League pitchers with $13+$ saves and a sub-2.00 ERA, along with Emmanuel Clase-CLE and Mason Miller-OAK Muñoz is 1 of 2 MLB pitchers with 10+ saves and $5+$ holds this season, along with José Alvarado-PHI.
R\&R AT HOME...Luke Raley and Josh Rojas have the 2 highest OPS's at T-Mobile Park among Mariners this season...in 35 home games, Raley is batting . 286 ( $28 \times 98$ ) with 16 runs, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 16 RBI and 5 stolen bases with an .866 OPS...in 35 home games, Rojas is batting .275 ( $28 \times 102$ ) with 18 runs, 6 doubles, 4 homers, 11 RBI, 4 stolen bases and 15 walks with an 824 OPS.
EARLY IN COUNTS...Seattle this season is batting . 332 ( $244 \times 735$ ) with 41 home runs, a .344 on-base percentage and a . 576 slugging percentage this season in 1-pitch or 2-pitch at-bats...the Mariners have hit best in $0-1$ counts this season, slashing $.360 / .373 / .555$ with 18 doubles and 10 home runs...the Mariners are batting .165 ( $94 \times 569$ ) in at-bats with 6+ pitches.
ON THE HOMESTAND...the Mariners are home for a 9-game homestand through July 7, hosting the Minnesota Twins (3 G, June 28-30), Baltimore Orioles (3 G, July 2-4) and Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, July 5-7)... upcoming promotions on the homestand include Bark at the Park on July 2, Patriotic Fireworks on July 3 and Patriotic Cap on July 4

AS YOU MAY KNOW...tonight's starting pitcher George Kirby ranks highly among AL pitchers this season...he is 1st in SO/BB (10.67), 2nd in BB/9 (0.82), 4th in OBP (.251), 5th in WHIP (0.97), 6th in pitching WAR (2.5) and tied for 10th in wins (7), but...DID YOU KNOW?...in 5 starts during June, he was $3-0$ with a 1.74 ERA ( 6 ER, 31.0 IP ) with 31 strikeouts and 3 walks...opposing hitters batted .204 ( $23 \times 113$ ) against the right-hander with a 0.839 WHIP...his ERA and AVG against are the lowest in a single month during his career and his WHIP was 2nd-best, and...DID YOU ALSO KNOW?...teammate Logan Gilbert also posted a stellar June with 31 strikeouts, 1 walk and a 1.51 ERA (6 ER, 35.2 IP)...Gilbert and Kirby are the first teammates in Major League history to each post a sub-2.00 ERA in the same month with $30+$ strikeouts and 3 -or-fewer walks.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY

- 26-year-old right-hander is making his 18th start of the season, his 2nd against Baltimore...he is also making his 74th career start and 6th against the Orioles.
- Is in his third season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB FirstYear Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record with 7 earned runs, 3 walks, 34 strikeouts and .263 opponent batting average in 5 games started.
- Named Colonial Athletic Pitcher of the Year in 2019 for Elon University after posting a 2.75 ERA and 19-8 record in 88.1 innings pitched across 14 games started.
LAST TIME OUT...W\#7 on $6 / 26$ at Tampa Bay...he pitched 6.0 innings and allowed 1 run ( 1 earned) on 4 hits with 0 walks and 7 strikeouts...he has gone $5.0+$ innings in each of his last 14 outings, and 15 of 17 this season.
MID-SEASON FORM...over his last 5 starts $(6 / 4-c)$ he has a $3-0$ record with a 1.74 ERA (6 ER, 31.0 IP) and 31 strikeouts to 3 walks...over that span, he has a $8.1 \mathrm{SO} / 9$ with a 1.11 WHIP and 4 quality starts.
AGAINST THE ORIOLES...in 6 career outings against Baltimore, he has held batters to a . 254 average..marks the 10th lowest opponent average against teams he has faced in his career.
NO JUNE GLOOM...in his first 5 starts in June, he has a 3-0 record with a 1.74 ERA ( $6 \mathrm{ER}, 31.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) and 31 strikeouts to 3 walks...his ERA is the 2nd lowest on the Mariners this month (min. 20 IP), trailing Logan Gilbert with a 1.51 ERA.
NO FREE RIDES...is the only pitcher since 1900 (min. 50 GS) to have more games started than walks allowed (73 starts, 50 walks).
EMPTY BASES...the right-hander ranks 3rd in the AL in opponent on-base percentage (.251) and 5th in the AL in WHIP this season (0.97)...both are career-bests for him...in 2023, he had a 1.04 WHIP and a .270 OBP against.
TOP RANKS...in 2024, ranks 1st in SO/BB (10.67) and 2nd in BB/9 (0.82) in the Majors...since his debut in 2022, he ranks 1st in MLB with 1.07 BB/9 (min. 400.0 IP)...Miles Mikolas-STL ranks 2nd during that span with a 1.73 BB/9 mark.
A LOT OF Os...did not allow a run in 17.0-consecutive innings from his start on $4 / 15$ vs. Cincinnati to allowing 1 run in the 4th inning against the Astros on $5 / 3$.
NL EXPERIENCE...he has made 5 starts against National League opposition this season with a 2-1 record and a 2.61 ERA (9 ER, 31.0 IP) in those outings...NL hitters are slashing .202/.222/.404 against Kirby with 33 strikeouts and 3 walks.
WALK THE WALK...among pitchers with at least 80.0 innings pitched this season, Kirby has the 2nd-fewest walks in the Majors with 9....his BB\% is 2.3\%, 2nd-best in MLB behind Zach Eflin-TB (1.9\%) and ranks in the 99th percentile of all Major League pitchers.
UNDER CONTROL...has not allowed more than 3 walks in any of his first 73 career starts...it is the 7th-longest streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher...has a 48-start streak with 2-or-less walks, the 2ndlongest active streak in the Majors (Zach Eflin-PHI/TB, 49).
QUALITY MATERIAL...recorded his 10th quality start of the season in his last start at Tampa Bay...in 2023, had 20 starts of at least 6.0 innings while allowing 3 earned runs or fewer, which ranked T-5th in the Majors and T-3rd among AL pitchers.
LEADING BY EXAMPLE...since his MLB debut on $5 / 8 / 22$, he ranks among the top pitchers in the American League in various categories (min. 350 IP), including SO/BB (1st, 8.02), wins (3rd, 28), WHIP (3rd, 1.07), ERA (3rd, 3.36), innings pitched (4th, 420.0) and strikeouts (6th, 401).
QUICK STARTER...this season, opposing hitters are batting . 152 ( $15 \times 99$ ) when leading off an inning with 5 extra-base hits (3 doubles and 2 home runs) and 24 strikeouts...the opposing hitters OBP is . 168 in these situations.
END THE INNING...this season, opposing hitters are batting . 215 ( $26 \times 121$ ) with 3 doubles, 2 triples and 5 home runs and 29 strikeouts with 2 outs in an inning...with 2 outs and runners in scoring position, hitters are batting .225 ( $9 \times 40$ ) with 9 strikeouts.
GET A WHIFF OF THIS...earned a personal single-game career-high against Arizona on 4/27 with 12 strikeouts...tallied 23 swings-and-missed during that start which also marked as a career-high, T-6th most whiffs in a start this season across MLB... 19 of his whiffs were fastballs.
MISSION CRITICAL...the Mariners own a $31-15$ record in games that Kirby tosses at least 6.0 innings in his career...in games Kirby goes 5.2 innings or less, the Mariners are 11-16.
STRIKE 24...began his outing on $8 / 24 / 22$ vs. Washington by throwing 24 consecutive strikes, the most to start a game since the pitch tracking era (1988-current), passing the 21 thrown by Joe Musgrove on $8 / 30 / 18$ vs. STL with PIT.
