SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

TO CLINCH A POSTSEASON BERTH TODAY...: For the D-backs to clinch a Postseason berth today, they must win today's game vs. Padres and both the Mets (@ Brewers) and Braves (vs. Royals) lose their games today.

60 MILLION @ CHASE FIELD: With last night's attendance of 42,915, the D-backs have welcomed over 2.3 million fans to Chase Field in 2024, their largest attendance mark in 16 seasons, since 2008 (2,509,924), and fifth largest since 2003, and have eclipsed 60 million fans all-time...totals heading into today's game:

2024 Regular-Season Attendance: 2,302,984 All-Time Regular-Season Attendance: 60,033,936

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost, 5-0, last night vs. Padres... the game went scoreless thru 8.0 innings before the Padres scored 5 in the top of the ninth.

- ◆ Corbin Carroll (1-for-4, 2B, SB) has hit safely in 5 straight games.
- ◆ Eduardo Rodriguez (ND) tossed 4.2 shutout innings with just 4 hits and 2 walks allowed, and 3 strikeouts.

BBWAA AWARDS: Last night, the Arizona Chapter of the Baseball Writers' Association of America presented their annual D-backs awards to:

- ♦ MOST VALUABLE PLAYER: **Ketel Marte**
- ♦ MOST VALUABLE PITCHER: Zac Gallen
- ♦ ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Justin Martinez
- ♦ GOOD GUY AWARD: Eugenio Suárez

88 WINS: The D-backs' 88 wins, which surpass their total from last year (84-78), are their third-most wins since 2008, behind 93 in 2017 and 94 in 2011...have now reached 88+ wins 7 times in franchise history (also: 1999/100 W, 2002/98 W, 2011/94 W, 2017/93 W, 2001/92 W and 2007/90 W).

SUÁREZ'S BIG FEATS: Tonight marks **Eugenio Suárez**'s 155th game at third base, the most by any D-back third baseman in a single season (previous: Matt Williams, 153 G in 1999)...Suárez, at 29 HR and 99 RBI, is looking to join only Jake Lamb/2017 (30 HR/104 RBI/143 G) and Williams/1999 (35 HR/142 RBI/153 G) as the only primary third basemen to record a 30+-HR, 100+-RBI season in franchise history.

◆ **Ketel Marte** (35 HR/93 RBI) and **Suárez** (29 HR/99 RBI) look to become the first D-backs pair to each have a 30+-homer, 100+-RBI season since 2017 (last: Paul Goldschmidt, 36 HR/120 RBI and Jake Lamb, 30 HR/105 RBI)...only other occurrence was in 1999 (Steve Finley, 34 HR/103 RBI; Jay Bell, 38 HR/112 RBI; Matt Williams, 35 HR/142 RBI).

D-BACKS LOOKING TO MAKE DEFENSE HISTORY: Per Elias Sports Bureau...since 1900, there has not been a MLB team with consecutive seasons of 65 or fewer errors...Arizona has committed 62 errors in 2024 after finishing the 2023 season with a franchise-low 56 errors.

◆ The D-backs' .989 fielding pct. and 62 errors are the best in the Majors, ahead of the Braves (.988, 68 E), Twins (.988, 69 E) and Rangers (.988, 70 E).

FIRST-INNING FANS: The D-backs lead the Majors with a franchise-high 38 occurrences of scoring 2+ runs in the first inning [previous high: 34 in 2018], ahead of the Yankees (31), Marlins (28) and Padres (26)...their 31 homers in the first inning are the most in the NL, ahead of the Phillies (30) and Dodgers (30).

♦ In the first inning, the D-backs lead MLB with franchise highs of a .324 AVG, .383 OBP, .563 SLG, .947 OPS, 212 hits and 369 total bases...also lead MLB with 124 runs (third most in franchise history, behind 2018/129 R and 1999/125 R).

FIRST-INNING HISTORY: The D-backs are the first team to boast a first-inning average of .324+ since the 2000 Cardinals (.336) and are just 1 of 9 teams since 1979 to have a first-inning average of .320+:

PUK JUST SHY OF ALL-TIME RELIEVER STREAK: Last night, **A.J. Puk** ended his career-best scoreless streak at 23.2 IP (25 G) from Aug. 3-27...in the scoreless span, he only allowed 9 hits and 4 walks with 38 strikeouts.

◆ Puk's 25 appearances finished 1 shy of tying the franchise record for consecutive scoreless appearances by a reliever (26 by Yoshihisa Hirano from May 6-July 3, 2018, 22.2 IP) and 1.1 innings shy of the franchise record for consecutive scoreless innings pitched by a reliever (25.0 IP by Brandon Lyon from April 9-June 12, 2008, 24 appearances).

KETEL AND THE BABE: Ketel Marte's 22 combined home runs in the first inning and ninth inning (or later) are tied for the most all-time in a season with **Babe Ruth**'s 22 in 1927 [Stats Inc.].

DINGER SEASON: The D-backs reached 200+ homers in a season for the first time since 2019 (220)...their 208 homers are tied for fourth most in a single season in franchise history (also: 2001), behind 2017 (220 HR), 2019 (220 HR) and 1999 (216 HR).

- ♦ The D-backs' 208 homers this season are fifth most in the Majors, behind the Yankees (236), Orioles (233), Dodgers (232) and Braves (210).
- ♦ The only time the D-backs finished a season in the Top 5 in home runs is 1999 (5th, 2016), behind the Mariners (244), Athletics (235), Rangers (230) and Rockies (223).

NAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: Second season with the D-backs...debuted in 2023 and made 5 starts in the Postseason (1 Wild Card, 1 NLDS, 2 NLCS, 1 World Series).

- Named the D-backs' 2022 Minor League Pitcher of the Year after leading the organization's farmhands in wins (11), ERA (3.83) and strikeouts (218).
- D-backs' fifth-round pick in the 2020 draft (Bellarmine University).

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Leads the team in starts (31), quality starts (13), innings pitched (176.1) and strikeouts (176).

• Arizona is 11-5 over his last 16 starts and 8-3 in his last 11 home bids.

LAST START: Lost on Sept. 24 vs. Giants (4 ER-5 R in 2.2 IP, 6 H, 2 BB, 4 K).

VS. PADRES: In 5 career starts (2 quality) is 0-2 with a 3.81 ERA (12 ER in 28.1 IP), 6 walks and 28 strikeouts.

- In his last start on July 6 @ Padres, posted a no-decision in the 7-5 win, allowing just 1 run on 7 hits and no walks over 4.1 frames with 6 strikeouts.
- Posted a quality start in his last start @ Chase Field on May 4 but took the loss (L; 3 ER in 6.0 IP, 10 H, 0 BB, 4 K).

AMONG TOP ARMS: Since June 30, ranks among top NL starters in wins (T-5th, 7), strikeouts/BB (8th, 5.29), strikeouts (T-10th, 90) and BB/9.0 IP (12th, 1.93).

FEELING AT HOME: Is 5-3 with a .625 win pct. over his last 11 home starts.

- 2 of his 4 double-digit strikeouts performances have come at home.
- Has yielded 2 walks or fewer in 13 of his 15 home games, including no walks in 6 of those.

WORKHORSE: Has worked 5.0+ innings in 26 of his 31 starts this season and matched his career-high 7.0 innings 6 times.

- Has tossed 5.0+ innings in 12 of his 15 home games and gone 6.0+ frames in 10.
- Is 1 of 9 NL pitchers to record 19+ starts of 6.0+ innings.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS: Since last season improved his first pitch strike percent by 6.5% from 63.9 to 70.4.

• Additionally, decreased his hard-hit percentage by 4.6, from 44.0% last season to 39.4%.

VS. RIGHTIES: Is limiting righties to a .220 AVG (67-for-305)/.620 OPS with a 1.02 WHIP, 16 walks and 96 strikeouts over his last 28 starts.

THEN AND NOW: In his 18 starts last season, went 3-9 with a 5.70 ERA (57 ER in 90.0 IP), 25 walks and 90 strikeouts...in comparison, over his last 18 starts this season, has gone 8-5 with a 4.96 ERA (54 ER in 98.0 IP), 26 walks and 100 strikeouts.

LUCKY NO. 7: Has worked a career-high-tying 7.0 innings 6 times this season (last: Sept. 19 @ Brewers) and 8 times in his career.

NO-HIT FRAMES: Has opened with 4.0 no-hit innings twice this season (April 22 @ Cardinals and May 15 vs. Reds), which are tied for second longest in his career, behind his 6.1 innings on Aug. 18, 2023 @ Padres.

STEE-RIKE!: On Sept. 19 @ Brewers, set a career high with 12 strikeouts, his fourth career double-digit game.

2023 RECAP: Went 3-9 with a 5.72 ERA (61 ER in 96.0 IP) in 18 starts.

- Entered the season rated as the D-backs' No. 4 prospect by MLB Pipeline (No. 59 overall) and No. 5 by *Baseball America*.
- Made his Major League debut on May 3 @ Rangers (7 ER in 4.2 IP).
- Got his first Major League win on Aug. 25 vs. Reds (5.1 IP, 2 ER, 5 K).
- Had a trio of career-high 8-strikeout games on Aug. 13 vs. Padres and back-to-back on Sept. 22 @ Yankees and Sept. 27 @ White Sox.
- Had a 12.2-inning scoreless streak spanning 3 starts from Aug. 13 vs. Padres (2nd inning)-Aug. 25 vs. CIN (2nd inning).

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Appeared in 5 Postseason games, going 0-1 with a 3.27 ERA (8 ER in 22.0 IP) and 26 strikeouts.

- Second-youngest (24-353) D-back to start a Postseason game in franchise history, behind Daniel Hudson (24-207 on Oct. 2, 2011 @ Brewers) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- Third D-backs rookie to start a Postseason game (also: Josh Collmenter/2011 vs. MIL and Micah Owings/2007@ COL [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- Youngest (24-361) D-backs' pitcher to start a home Postseason game (previous: Josh Collmenter (25-239) vs. Brewers on Oct. 4, 2011 in NLDS Game 3) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
 First pitcher in MLB history to allow 0 runs and 0 walks in consecutive Postseason starts.
- •Second D-back with 9+ strikeouts and 0 walks in a Postseason game (also: Curt Schilling, 2001 World Series Game 7)...fourth rookie pitcher in Postseason history with 8+ strikeouts and 0 walks.

- ♦Is limiting hitters to a .229 AVG (24-for-105) off his slider (38.4%) with 44 strikeouts and a 42.0% whiff.
- ♦ Has allowed just 4 of his 29 inherited runners to score (13.8%).
- ♦ Issued 4 walks in his last 19 games since Aug. 18 (71 BF, 16.2 IP).
- ♦ With runners in scoring position, opponents are hitting .188 (16-for-85)/.237 OBP with 5 walks and 27 strikeouts.
- ullet Scoreless in 8 of his last 10 games (7.1 IP) with 2 walks and 10 strikeouts.
- ♦In 23 home games from May 26-Sept. 11, went 3-2 with a 0.79 ERA (2 ER in 22.2 IP), opponent .233 AVG (20-for-86)/.624 OPS, 6 walks and 29 strikeouts.
- ♦Did not allow an earned run in 15 of his 17 games from Aug. 5-Sept. 11, going 2-1 with a 1.62 ERA (3 ER in 16.2 IP), 1.08 WHIP, opponent .203 AVG (12-for-59)/.595 OPS, 6 walks and 22 strikeouts.
