METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Cubs, 5-2, last night...The Mets are 71-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 32-9-3 in 44 series this year...The Mets continue a seven game homestand (0-1) against the Cubs (0-1) and Pirates (four games).

NO MINOR THING: Two Mets minor league affiliates start their playoff run tonight...The Brooklyn Cyclones will play the Aberdeen IronBirds, an affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles, in a best-of-three series beginning tonight in Brooklyn...The St. Lucie Mets kick off their quest for the championship in a best-of-three series that begins tonight at the Palm Beach Cardinals in Jupiter...Both games start at 6:30 p.m.

THE 7.0 LINE: Jacob deGrom has completed 7.0 innings in each of his last two starts, tied for his longest starts of the season...The last time deGrom finished 7.0 or more innings in at least three straight starts was in 2019, when he concluded his second Cy Young season with eight starts of exactly 7.0 innings.

I <3 STREAKS: DeGrom has a 38-start streak of allowing three earned runs or fewer... Only one starter, Jim Scott (1913-1914) has ever had a longer streak...Scott made 39 straight starts with 3 ER or fewer allowed, a mark deGrom can tie tonight...DeGrom is currently tied for second all-time with Ray Washburn, who had a 38-start streak from

RIGHT WHERE HE LEFT OFF: Since returning from the IL on August 2, deGrom has been one of MLB's top pitchers, ranking among league leaders in WHIP (0.55, first), strikeout rate (41.4 percent, first), strikeouts (63, second), opponent average (.135, second), ERA (1.66, fifth) and wins (five, tied for fifth).

HANG 10: Eduardo Escobar is on a 10-game hitting streak, his longest as a Met HANG 10: Eduardo Escobar is on a 10-game hitting streak, his longest as a Met and tied for the second-longest of his career...lt is one shy of tying his career-high and is tied for his longest in a single season...His career-best 11-game hitting streak included the final 10 games of his 2018 season and Opening Day 2019...It is the third time he's had a 10-game hit streak within one season (also accomplished last year, May 25-June 3)...He is batting .500 (18-36) with eight runs, a double, five home runs, nine RBI, four walks with a .537 OBP and a 1.000 SLG in that span...In 15 games since he returned from the IL on August 27, he is batting .420 (21-50) with eight runs, two doubles, five home runs, nine RBI, four walks with a .455 OBP and a .800 SLG...In those 14 games, he is batting .500 (18-36) with a double, a triple, four home runs, nine RBI and three walks against right-handed pitching.

WINNING!: The Mets are seeking their 90th win today...It would be their most wins since they also recorded 90 in 2015...The Mets have clinched a winning record both at home and on the road...It is the first time the team has posted record winning records at home and on the road since 2016, when they collected 44 wins and home and 43 on the road.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .633 winning percentage (31-18) following the All-Star break...That is the third-highest winning percentage in franchise history, right below the 1969 (.671) and 1988 (.644) squads...The team's 31 wins are tied for tied for fourth-most in the majors...The Mets are batting .271/.341/.438 with 54 home runs in 498 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets rank third in average and OBP and fifth in SLG following the break.

HERE'S THE CATCH: As a team, Mets catchers are batting .378/.442/.595 in 11 games this month...Their .378 batting average is the highest in the National League and second-highest in the majors...Tomás Nido is batting .286 (22-77) with 12 runs, nine doubles, a home run, nine RBI, five walks with a .325 OBP and a .442 SLG in 28 games since the All-Star Break...He is 6-12 (.500) with four runs, three doubles, a home run. three RBI, a walk with a .538 OBP and a 1.000 SLG over his last three games...James McCann is batting .246 (15-61) since the All-Star break...Over his last nine games, McCann is batting .345 (10-29) with six runs, two doubles, an RBI, four walks, a steal with a .424 OBP.

RIB EYE STEAKS: Francisco Lindor has recorded 92 RBI this season...That is tied for his career-high of 92 set with Cleveland in 2018...Pete Alonso is tied for second in the majors and tied for the National League lead with 109 RBI this season...Only five times in franchise history have the Mets had multiple players with 100 more RBI on the same team....The 2008 Mets were the last team to accomplish this feat (Carlos Beltrán, Carlos Delgado and David Wright).

30 FOR 39: Díaz is tied for seventh in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons. **CUBS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are seeking their first season series victory over the Cubs since they went 5-2 against Chicago in 2016.

LINDOR CITY: Francisco Lindor hit his 23rd home run of the season...It tied Asdrubal Cabrera's record for most home runs by a Mets shortstop in a single season, accomplished in 2018...He is on a five-game hitting streak, batting .429 (9-21) with six runs, three doubles, two home runs, six RBI, two walks with a .500 OBP and an .857 SLG over that span...He is batting .310/.387/.481 with 33 runs, nine doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 26 RBI, 21 walks with an .868 OPS in 49 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the National League with a 5.9 fWAR this season.

AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 59-82 Cubs today... Each of their next six games and 14 of the their 20 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 50-23 against teams with a record below .500 this year, giving them a .685 winning percentage...Their .685 winning percentage is the third-highest in MLB vs. sub-.500 opponents.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha has safely reached base in eight straight games, batting .267 (8-30) in that span with six runs, two doubles, a home run, three walks, four RBI, a .371 OBP and a .433 SLG in that span...Over his last 25 games, Canha is batting .298 (25-84) with 14 runs, 11 doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI, six walks with a .379 OBP, a .607 SLG and a .986 OPS...He has recorded 19 extra-base hits in 44 games since the break compared to 15 he collected in 77 first-half games... Canha slugging .489 in the second half (.381 SLG in the first half).

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil is batting .350 (14-40) with five runs, two doubles, seven RBI, four walks, two steals with a .396 OBP in 11 games in September...He is slashing .354/.387/.500 in 47 games following the All-Star break...His .354 average is second in the NL...Dating back to August 20, McNeil has just four strikeouts in his last 92 plate appearances...Overall this season, McNeil ranks sixth among qualified hitters and econd in the NL with an 11.3 percent strikeout rate.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 94 times this year... The team's 94 HBP is tied for the second-highest total in franchise history with the 2021 team...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...Since 1901, the Reds set the major league record in 2021 after they were hit by 105 pitches...Mark Canha has been plunked 19 times this year, which is tied for second in the majors...His 19 hit by pitches are the fourth-highest single-season total in franchise history...Brandon Nimmo set the record with 22 HBP in 2018.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,343 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...Only the Braves with 1,362 have struck out more...The team's 1,343 strikeouts are already the sixth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.57 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.6 percent), the second-highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

CITI SLICKERS: New York has won 18 of its last 25 games at home...Overall, the Mets are 46-24 at Citi Field...New York's 46 wins at home are fourth in the NL...They are are 40-24 at Cit Field...New York \$ 40 wins at nome are fourtin in the Nt...They are third in National League with a .657 winning percentage at home...The team's .657 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage...The Mets have posted a 3.10 ERA with 200 walks and 685 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL...The Mets have struck out 685 at home this year, which is the second-most in the NL...That is already the seventh-most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 26 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985) with 24...That is the most by any player since the statistic was officially tracked in 1974...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) with 27 each are the only players with more in a season (data incomplete pre-1974)...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 12 of the Mets' 31 second-half wins.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 102 strikeouts...That is 14 strikeouts more than the second place relievers with 102 strikeouts...That is 14 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Craig Kimbrel (53.1 IP in 2017, 54.0 IP in 2012) and Chapman (53.2 IP in 2012) round out the top five fastest to 100 K all-time...Armando Benítez owned the previous franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias...Díaz has posted a 0.81 ERA (three earned runs/33.1 innings) with 15 hits, seven walks and 64 strikeouts in 33 appearances since the start of June.

deGROM NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Recorded his second scoreless outing of the season, throwing 91 pitches in 7.0 innings and allowing just three hits with eight strikeouts and one walk as New York defeated Pittsburgh, 10-0 on September 7 at PNC Park.

THE 7.0 LINE: Has completed 7.0 innings in each of his last two starts, tied for his longest starts of the season...The last time deGrom finished 7.0 or more innings in at least three straight starts was in 2019, when he concluded his second Cy Young season with eight starts of exactly 7.0 innings.

RIGHT WHERE HE LEFT OFF: Since returning from the IL on August 2, deGrom has been one of MLB's top pitchers, ranking among league leaders in WHIP (0.55, first), strikeout rate (41.4 percent, first), strikeouts (63, second), opponent average (.135, second), ERA (1.66, fifth) and wins (five, tied for fifth).

HISTORY LESSON: With a win in his last start, deGrom tied Jon Matlack for seventh in Mets history with 82 victories...With a win tonight, he will take sole possession of seventh place...Al Leiter is next in line with 95 wins.

HIGH QUANTITIES OF QUALITY: Nearly three-quarters of deGrom's starts have lasted at least 6.0 innings with three earned runs or fewer allowed...He has recorded 152 quality starts in 205 career outings (74 percent)...Additionally, deGrom has allowed one or no runs in 101 of his 205 starts (49 percent)...No pitcher in the history of the game has more starts like that through 205 career games.

THIS IS GETTING RIDICULOUS: Through his first seven starts, deGrom has yielded just 20 hits and four walks while striking out 63 batters...It's the second straight year he has allowed fewer than 20 hits and fewer than 10 walks with 60 or more strikeouts in his first seven outings...All other pitchers in MLB history have combined to do that zero times...DeGrom allowed 20 hits and seven walks and had 74 strikeouts through seven starts in 2021.

I CAN ONLY COUNT TO THREE: Enters tonight's start riding a 38-start streak of allowing three earned runs or fewer...Only one starter (plus Ryne Stanek, an opener) has had longer a streak, and that was Jim Scott (1913-1914), who had 39 straight starts with 3 ER or fewer allowed...He is currently tied for second all-time with Ray Washburn, who had a 38-start streak from 1968-1970.

IN deCITI: Has allowed more than three earned runs only once in his last 36 starts in Queens, posting a 1.58 ERA (40 ER/227.2 IP) at home since May 1, 2019...Has allowed two earned runs or fewer in his last 24 home starts dating back to September 9, 2019...Has allowed one or zero earned runs in 18 of those starts...He had a 1.20 ERA (8 ER/60.0 IP) in 2021...His 2.07 career home ERA is the best among active pitchers (min. 500.0 innings) and the fifth-lowest since ER became an official stat in 1913...The four pitchers with a better home ERA all had their careers end before 1930.

AGAINST THE CUBS: Will face Chicago (NL) for the 11th time in his career...Has gone 2-3 with a lifetime 3.13 ERA (21 ER/60.1 IP) against the Cubs...Additionally, deGrom holds a 2-2 record with a 2.48 ERA (10 ER/36.1 IP) against the club at home...He last faced the Cubs on June 16 in an injury-shortened start...Before departing, deGrom fanned eight in 3.0 perfect innings, including seven straight strikeouts to end his outing.

THE EXCELLENCE IS SUSTAINABLE: Since 2018, deGrom owns a 1.92 ERA in 98 starts... That is the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 500.0 IP)...He has 313 strikeouts in 34 starts since 2020...He and Dwight Gooden are the only Mets pitchers ever to fan 300 or more in a span of 34 games...See the chart below for an overview of his 2018 and 2019 Cy Young Award-winning seasons compared to his last three seasons combined:

200 CLUB: On August 7, 2022 against Atlanta, deGrom set the MLB record for most strikeouts through a pitcher's first 200 career starts with 1,523...He surpassed the previous record set by Yu Darvish with 1,517...Through his first 200 games, deGrom recorded a 2.50 ERA...Only five pitchers have had a lower ERA through 200 career games (min. 1,000 IP): Dutch Leonard (2.09), Carl Mays (2.23), Reb Russell (2.28), and Baseball Hall of Famers Red Faber (2.41) and Tom Seaver (2.42).

AUGUST IS THE HOTTEST MONTH: In his first month back in over a year, deGrom finished the month of August among the MLB leaders in several categories...He led the majors in strikeouts (55), WHIP (0.55), opponent's batting average (.136), opponent's OPS (.388) and K/BB (18.33).
