**RAY REPORT**—The Rays open a brief three-game road trip at Yankee Stadium this evening...they went 4-3 on their seven-game homestand against the Giants (2-1) and Angels (2-2)...the Rays have alternated wins and losses over their last six contests (3-3) following a 5-1 stretch from April 6-12...they are 4-3 so far in a stretch of 13 consecutive games without an off day that concludes on April 24 vs. DET.

★ The Rays are undefeated in their last four series (3-0-1) after going winless in their first two (0-1-1)...they are 18-6-3 over their last 27 series dating back to July 28-30, 2023 at HOU, including 10-1-1 on the road...the lone road defeat came from Sept. 1-3, 2023 at CLE (2-1) in a set that featured a pair of one-run losses.

★ The Rays are 1-5 in series openers, including 1-1 following an 0-4 start...only the D-backs (1-6), White Sox (0-6) and Marlins (0-6) have worse records.

★ Yesterday's 2-1 win over the Angels was the 750th of **Kevin Cash's** career...he is five victories shy of surpassing his predecessor, **Joe Maddon** (754), as the Rays all-time managerial wins leader.

**20 DOWN, 142 TO GO**—The Rays are above .500 through their first 20 games for the sixth consecutive season dating back to 2019...they were a club-record 17-3 through 20 contests in 2023...the Rays have been at or above .500 through 20 games in 10 of the last 11 seasons since 2014, with the lone exception being 2018 (7-13).

★ Rays hitters have posted the AL's 10th-ranked OPS (.669), their lowest through 20 games since 2011 (.655) and the fourth-lowest mark in club history behind 2001 (.661) and 2004 (.663).

★ The pitching staff's 4.69 ERA is their highest at this juncture since 2007 (5.91).

**IN THE BOX**—The Rays offense is slashing .241/.306/.363 compared to .288/.361/.544 through 20 games last season...they rank third in the AL in singles (116), but are tied for 10th in extra-base hits (45)...they have been held to 2 XBH or fewer in four straight games, their longest streak since Sept. 10-13 (G2), 2022.

★ The Rays have 4 SB in their last 11 games since April 7, 13th in the AL/tied for 25th in the majors in that span...from Opening Day through April 6, their 14 SB tied the Reds for the MLB lead.

★ Over their last four games, the Rays are 5-for-33 (.152) with RISP...this comes on the heels of posting a .312 (24-for-77) RISP average from April 2-13 (10G).

★ Rays hitters have been at their best in late-game situations, batting .312 (48-for-154) from the 8th inning on, second best in the majors behind the Braves (.355)...their .220 (113-for-513) average in innings 1-7 ranks 26th.

**ON THE MOUND**—Rays pitching has posted a 2.61 ERA (31.OIP, 9ER) over the last three games after producing a 7.33 ERA (27.OIP, 22ER) in their previous three contests (April 13-15)...on the season, their 4.69 ERA is fifth worst in the majors—the starters 3.64 ERA (101.IP, 41ER) ranks fourth in the AL/seventh in the majors while the bullpen has turned in an MLB-worst 6.00 ERA (81.OIP, 54ER)...in Rays history, only the 2012 (6.49), 2007 (6.11) and 2002 (6.06) bullpens recorded a higher ERA through 20 contests.

★ The Rays rotation has turned in a 2.77 ERA (26.OIP, 8ER) over their last five outings...three of their last four starts have been quality.

★ The bullpen has recorded second-highest walk rate in MLB (13.62%) behind the White Sox (13.64%)...Yankees hitters owns the majors' highest walk rate (12.52%).

★ The Rays have yielded 11 SB over their last three games, matching their most in a three-game span in club history (also July 18-20, 2011)...the record over a four-game span is 12 SB (2x, last: July 17-20, 2011)...opponents are 23-for-26 (88.5%) on SB attempts against the Rays—only the Mets (25-for-25) have allowed more steals.

**HOMER (UN)HAPPY**—The Rays have been tagged for 29 HR, tied with the Blue Jays for the most in the majors...it marks the second-most homers allowed through 20 games in club history, trailing only the 2000 Devil Rays (30HR)...the 2003 and 2000 clubs share the record through 21 contests (31HR)...they have allowed at least 1 HR in 15 of 20 games, going 6-9 in those affairs compared to 5-0 when holding the opposition homerless...on the season, 45 of the 101 (44.6%) runs allowed by Rays pitching have come off the 29 HR.

★ Meanwhile, the Rays offense has tallied 2 HR in their last four games since launching a season-high 4 HR on April 14 vs. SF.

★ They have 9 HR in their last 14 games since April 3, tied with four other clubs for the second fewest in the majors, ahead of only the White Sox (4HR)...from Opening Day through April 2, their 8 HR tied the Astros and Royals for the AL lead.

★ **Randy Arozarena**, **Yandy Diaz** and **Jose Siri**, who combined for 70 HR last season, have gone a combined 207 AB since homering...Arozarena homered twice in a span of 3 AB from March 30-31, but does not have a long ball since (63AB).

**KEEP IT CLOSE**—The Rays are an MLB-best 7-1 (.875) in games decided by two runs or fewer, with the only loss being a 5-4 setback to the Angels on April 17 in which the Rays held a 4-3 lead entering the 9th inning...however, they are 4-8 in all other contests—the eight defeats by 3+ runs tie the Astros for the most in the majors...they also lead MLB with five losses by 6+ runs, ahead of four clubs tied at four...last season, the Rays recorded only eight such defeats, the fewest in baseball.

**HOT AND COLD**—**Amed Rosario** has gone 18-for-44 (.409) with 2 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR and 9 RBI during his 10-game hitting streak, the longest active run in the AL...he has multiple hits in five of six and three straight games, one shy of his career-long streak (4G: Aug. 18-22, 2021), and has an RBI in five of six and three straight games.

★ **Yandy Diaz** has hit safely in five of his last six games, going 7-for-24 (.292) with 2 2B...in his previous five games, he went 1-for-21 (.048)...he owns a 22-game on-base streak against the Yankees dating back to Aug. 15, 2022.

★ **Randy Arozarena** is 2-for-24 (.083) over his last seven games...he has gone 16 games since his last multi-hit effort on March 31, the longest drought of his career.

★ **José Caballero** is 2-for-18 (.111) over his last five games following a career-best 12-game on-base streak to open the season.

**NEW YORK, NEW YORK**—The Rays and Yankees open a 13-game season series tonight in the Bronx...the Rays went 8-5 against the Pinstripes in 2023, taking four of seven games in New York...they have won three of the last four season series vs. the Yankees since 2020, posting the best record against New York by any AL team over that span (35-26/.574)...they went 38-57 (.400) from 2015-19.

★ After taking two of three at Yankee Stadium from July 31-Aug. 2, 2023, the Rays are seeking back-to-back series victories in the Bronx for the first time since claiming three straight from Aug. 18, 2020-April 18, 2021.

★ In 13 meetings against the Yankees last season, Rays batters were hit by 12 pitches, their most against any opponent...the Astros (7) were next closest.

★ This marks the first time the Rays face the Yankees while trailing them in the AL East standings since New York led the Rays by 4.5 games on Sept. 11, 2022 en route to the division title.

- ★ Hitting coach **Chad Mottola** was selected fifth overall by the Reds in the 1992 First-Year Player Draft, one spot before the Yankees drafted **Derek Jeter**.
- ★ **OF Richie Palacios**, a Brooklyn native, will be playing his first series in the Bronx...he has plans to attend the Knicks playoff game with his father on Saturday night.
- ★ **C René Pinto's** father, **René Sr.**, was also a catcher who played seven seasons in the Yankees farm system (1994-2000).
- ★ **C Ben Rortved** appeared in 32 games for the Yankees last season and spent Spring Training with them before being traded to the Rays on March 27.
- ★ **RHP Zack Littell** began the 2017 season in the Yankees minor league system before being dealt to the Twins at the trade deadline.
- ★ Yankees **RHP Luke Weaver** is a Florida State University alum and hails from Tallahassee.
- ★ Yankees P.A. announcer **Paul Olden** was a member of the Devil Rays radio broadcast crew from 1998-2004.
- ★ YES Network analyst **John Flaherty** was the Devil Rays Opening Day catcher in 1998 and spent five of his 14 major league seasons with Tampa Bay.

**TONIGHT'S START**—Alexander is slated to make his fourth appearance of the season, including his second starts...in his lone start on April 6 at Colorado, he didn't factor into the decision after working 4.1 innings, allowing four runs on eight hits and two walks with four strikeouts while tossing a season-high 93 pitches.

✦ The 93 pitches were his most in an outing since Aug. 20, 2024 vs. Los Angeles-AL.

**LAST TIME OUT**—Worked as a bulk reliever behind RHP Shawn Armstrong and earned the win...tossed 6.0 innings, allowing two runs on six hits and one walk with four strikeouts.

✦ It marked his longest outing since tossing 6.0 frames on Sept. 25, 2022 at Chicago-AL.

**THE EVIL EMPIRE**—Alexander has made three appearances (1GS) against the Yankees...worked 1.0 inning in the lone start on April 19, 2022 at Comerica Park, allowing two unearned runs on one hit and two walks.

✦ In his only appearance at Yankee Stadium on April 30, 2021, he threw 3.0 relief innings, allowing one run on four hits with no walks and three strikeouts.

**BEAST OF THE EAST**—He has made 21 appearances (10GS) against the AL East, going 2-3 with a 3.67 ERA (81.0IP, 33ER)...in the 10 starts, he is 2-3 with a 2.45 ERA (51.1IP, 14ER).

**HOMER (UN)HAPPY**—Alexander has allowed two home runs in each of his first three outings in 2024...he has allowed a homer in four straight outings dating back to July 2, 2023, tied for the second-longest streak of his career (4x, last: Oct. 5, 2022–April 8, 2023)...his career-long streak is six outings from Aug. 14, 2022–Sept. 11, 2022.

✦ In his last 12 starts dating back to Aug. 14, 2022, Alexander has yielded 16 home runs (2.44 HR/9.0IP), allowing a homer in 10 of the 12 outings.

✦ In 26 relief appearances since the beginning of the 2023 campaign, he has allowed 10 homers across 52.0 innings (1.73 HR/9.0IP).

**SPLITTING HAIRS**—Through three appearances, Alexander is holding left-handed hitters to an .111 (2-for-18) mark...right-handed hitters, however, are batting .383 (18-for-47).

✦ Both hits allowed to lefties have been home runs, a two-run shot by COL Ryan McMahon on April 6 and a solo homer by SF Michael Conforto on April 14.

**UP IN THE AIR**—Alexander's 24.5 pct. ground ball rate is the second-lowest in the majors, trailing only CHC Shota Imanaga (22.0%)...he has produced a career 37.4 pct. groundball rate, including a 33.3 pct. clip in 2023.

**SMALL SAMPLE**—In 2024, Alexander has utilized his cutter 29.5 pct. of the time and his four-seam fastball 28.0 pct...opponents are 3-for-15 (.200) with 1 HR against the cutter compared to 7-for-19 (.368) with 2 HR against the four-seamer.

**STARTER vs. RELIEVER**—He has made 123 career appearances, 44 of which have been starts.

✦ Is 4-20 with a 4.78 ERA (203.1IP, 108ER) in 44 career starts compared to 8-3 with a 4.05 ERA (153.1IP, 69ER) in 79 relief appearances.

**2023 RECAP**—Alexander made the Tigers Opening Day roster for the fourth consecutive season and went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (44.0IP, 22ER) over 25 outings (1GS).

✦ In his first three outings from April 1-8, recorded an 8.64 ERA (8.1IP, 8ER)...went 2-1 with a 3.53 ERA (35.2IP, 14ER) over his final 22 appearances, including 1-1 with a 0.96 ERA (18.2IP, 2ER) across eight appearances (1GS) in June.

✦ Placed on the 60-day IL on July 4 with a left lat/shoulder strain, ending his season.

**IN CONTROL**—He was one of three MLB pitchers last season to throw 40.0+ innings while allowing five walks or fewer, joining PIT Ryan Borucki (40.1IP, 4BB) and LAD Ryan Pepiot (42.0IP, 5BB).
