To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays conclude their seven-game, eight-day road trip against the Rangers (2-2) and Braves (2-0, one to play) today in Atlanta...after going 18-4 between July 20-Aug. 12, they are 13-12 in their last 25 contests (Aug. 14-pres.)...they are a combined 31-16 over those spans, which stands as the best record in the majors since July 20...are on a stretch of 14 road games within their final 23 games of the season (Sept. 3-27), going 4-2 thus far...have the second-toughest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .524 (BAL, .530), with five of their six remaining series (including current set) coming against opponents currently in position to qualify for the postseason...maintain a 4.0-game lead over the second-place Yankees in the AL East standings, marking the third latest date in franchise history they have a lead of 4.0 games or more (Oct. 3, 2021 - 8.0GA; Sept. 27, 2020 - 7.0GA)...have spent 115 days leading the division (75 consecutive days, June 27-pres.), 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...have held the AL's best record for 114 days in addition to leading the AL East for 115 days, both of which are franchise records (Stats Perform)...are seeking their fifth AL East division title, first since winning the division in back-to-back campaigns from 2020-21.

- ★ The Rays claimed the series with a 7-2 win over the Braves...the Rays have won three consecutive games in Atlanta for the first time in franchise history dating back to June 16, 2024.
- ★ They have reached a high-water mark of 29 games above .500 for the first time since the conclusion of the 2023 season (96-63)...the club has reached 29 games above .500 in six different seasons in team history (also: 2023, 2021, 2019, 2010, 2008).
- ★ The Rays have won or split seven of their last eight road series (6-1-1, July 20-pres.) on the heels of a losing six of seven road sets between May 25-July 19 (1-6-0).
- ★ Today's probable starter, **Nick Martinez**, has earned the win in each of his last five road starts...it is tied for the third-longest streak by a Rays pitcher and is one start shy of **Blake Snell** (Aug. 10, 2018-April 8, 2019) and **Chris Archer**'s (April 11-June 18, 2015) franchise record.

PLAYOFFS? DON'T TALK ABOUT PLAYOFFS!—Per MLB, the Rays can be the first major league team to clinch a spot in the postseason today with either of the following scenarios listed below...Sept. 10 would mark the earliest date in franchise history the club has clinched a postseason berth, surpassing 2023 and 2020 (Sept. 17).

- ★ The Rays win today over the Braves AND the Mariners win today over the Rangers.
- ★ The Rays win today over the Braves AND the Pirates win tonight over the White Sox.

BUSINESS IS BROOMIN'—With a win today, the Rays would claim their MLB-best 15th sweep of the season, surpassing 2021 (14) for the most in franchise history...since the Rays became a franchise in 1998, only 23 major league teams have swept 15 series or more in a season (last: 2022, LAD - 17; HOU - 15)...the 2018 Red Sox (also 15) are the only AL East team to have swept 15 sets or more in a single season since 2004.

- ★ A win would mark the first time the Rays have swept the Braves in Atlant, their third sweep of the club overall, and their first over the Braves in a three-game series...they have previously swept them in a pair of two game sets at Tropicana Field between Aug. 11-12, 2015 and July 27-28, 2020.

DEADLINE DEALS—Prior to the Aug. 3 trade deadline, the Rays acquired RHP **Freddy Peralta** (Aug. 2), **C Liam Hicks** (Aug. 3), and RHP **Tyler Wells** (Aug. 3)...according to Baseball-Reference, the trio have combined for a 1.7 bWAR in the 34-game span since the deadline closed on Aug. 3.

- ★ Since Hicks was acquired on Aug. 3, his 1.1 fWAR leads Rays hitters, is tied for the fourth highest by an AL catcher, and tied for the sixth highest by an AL left-handed hitter...over that span, he has slashed .310/.402/.494 (27-for-87) with 4 2B, 4 HR, 17 RBI, and an .89% OPS with more walks (11) than strikeouts (10)...min. 75 PA over that timeframe, his .89% OPS is the second best in the AL by a primary catcher behind SEA **Cal Raleigh** (.955).
- ★ Peralta turned in his third consecutive quality start (Aug. 26-pres.) Tuesday, earning the win in all three outings...his four quality starts in seven appearances as a Ray equal his total across 22 starts to begin the year with the Mets...during the three-start streak, the right-hander has spun a 1.00 ERA (18.0IP, 2ER) with 13 strikeouts to one walk and a 156 (10-for-64) opp. average.
- ★ Through 17 relief appearances, Wells has posted a 2-0 record with two saves, a 1.69 ERA (16.0IP, 3ER), a .135 (7-for-52) opp. average, and a 0.69 WHIP...his 0.69 WHIP is the second lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors since Aug. 3 (min. 15.0IP), while his .135 opp. average is tied for fourth in the AL and tied for seventh in MLB...he has allowed no runs in 10 of his 12 outings and allowed no hits in seven of 12.

HIT MAKER—**Chandler Simpson** (.309) is three points behind HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (.312) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only Rays to win an AL batting title...in doing so he would become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title in one of his first two MLB seasons and the third since 1942 along with SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season) in 2001 and Rays Hall of Famer BOS **Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season) in 1983...after posting a .295 (122-for-109) average last season, he is attempting to become the fifth player in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to bat .295 or better in each of his first two MLB seasons (min. 400AB in each season), joining CHC **Starlin Castro** (2010-11), NYY **Robinson Cano** (2005-06), STL **Albert Pujols** (2001-02), and Suzuki (2001-02)...Simpson leads the AL in singles (140) and triples (6)—no Ray has ever paced the AL in the former category over a full season, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have finished atop the Junior Circuit's leaderboard in the latter...since 1983, only two AL hitters have led the league in both singles and triples: **CLE Amed Rosario** in 2022 and **KC Whit Merrifield** in 2019...Simpson needs five singles over the Rays final 17 games to match Crawford's club record from 2003 (145).

- ★ Per Baseball Savant, his 57 infield hits are the most across a single season by a Ray in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008) are tied for the fifth-most by any player in a single season over that time frame (see table on the right).
- ★ Simpson has recorded 52 multi-hit games this season, including nine in his last 16 games (Aug. 23-pres.)...he is seven multi-hit efforts shy of tying **Carl Crawford**'s franchise record from 2006 (59G).
- ★ With 41 SB, he joined **CAL Chad Curtis** (1992-93), **MON Delino DeShields** (1990-91), **STL Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and NYY **Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns.

THE LONG BALL RACE—Tuesday night, **Junior Caminero** surpassed HOU **Yordan Alvarez** for sole possession of the AL lead in home runs for the second time this season, joining Sept. 5 (38HR)...he trails only PHI **Kyle Schwarber** (44) and CHC **Pete Crow-Armstrong** (41) across all of MLB...he is one homer shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-HR campaigns (45HR in 2025)...and is attempting to join **Carlos Pena** (1st, 39) as the only players in club history to hold at least a share of the AL home run lead, with a chance to become the first Ray to finish as the outright leader...he has registered 91 career home runs, making him the 12th player in the modern era (since 1900) to reach that mark before his age-23 season (age as of June 30)...the only other players to turn the trick are **Mel Ott** (115), **Eddie Mathews** (112), **Alex Rodriguez** (106), **Tony Conigliaro** (104), **Juan Soto** (98), **Mike Trout** (98), **Frank Robinson** (98), **Bryce Harper** (97), **Giancarlo Stanton** (93), **Bob Horner** (91), and **Ted Williams** (91).

.300; THIS IS SPARTA—Since Aug. 1, **Yandy Diaz** has collected multiple hits in 17 of his 35 games—in all of MLB, only teammate **Chandler Simpson** (19) has more multi-hit efforts...he (.305/170-for-557) is looking to become the second player in franchise history to finish back-to-back seasons with a .300 average or better (min. 502PA)...only **Carl Crawford**, who turned the trick twice in his career, has accomplished the feat as a Ray, doing so between 2005-07 and 2009-10...the pair are the only players in team history to have multiple qualified .300 or better seasons.

THE RAY WAY—The Rays have opened September 5-3 and need to win eight of their final 17 games to clinch their six straight month with a .500 record or better...it would mark the first time in franchise history they have finished a full season with a .500 record or better in every month and tie the franchise record for consecutive months going .500 or better (also: July 2019-Sept./Oct. 2020)...they have secured their 13th winning season across 29 campaigns in franchise history, all of which have come in the last 19 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...their 13 winning seasons since 2008 are tied with the Braves and Brewers for fourth most among all major league clubs, trailing the Dodgers (18), Yankees (18), and Cardinals (16)...the Astros, Guardians, and Red Sox (all 11) are the next closest AL teams over that timeframe.

- ★ The Rays are approaching their first postseason berth since 2023 and sixth in the last eight seasons since 2019...as it stands, their five postseason appearances since 2019 are sixth most in the majors, trailing the Dodgers (7), Astros (6), Braves (6), Brewers (6), and Yankees (6)...they have made the postseason nine times since becoming the Rays in 2008, tied with the Astros and Brewers for fifth most in MLB behind the Dodgers (15), Yankees (13), Braves (10), and Cardinals (10).

LET 'EM KNOW. BRING 'EM OUT—The Rays conclude their stay at Truist Park today...prior to **Kevin Cash** becoming manager in 2015, they were 7-17 against the Braves, including a 4-11 record at Tropicana Field and a 3-6 record in Atlanta...since the appointment of Cash, the Rays are 14-12 overall with a 7-5 record at home and 7-7 on the road...this marks the second-closest geographical matchup for both clubs, with Tropicana Field and Truist separated by only 437 miles (TB, 204mi to MIA, ATL, 360mi to CIN).

- ★ In 10 career games at Truist Park, **Liam Hicks** has slashed .400/.450/.600 (14-for-35) with 1 2B, 2 HR, 10 RBI, and a 1.050 OPS...against the Braves in his career he is 23-for-64 (.359) with 3 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI, and a .917 OPS.
- ★ **Yandy Diaz** has hit .309 (268-for-867) in his career against the NL, the second-best average against Senior Circuit clubs among current AL hitters, trailing **Chandler Simpson**'s .328 (85-for-259) average (min. 250AB; see table on the right).

TODAY'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 28th start of the season and 14th on the road this afternoon at Truist Park...marks his 157th career start (308th appearance)...ranks second among qualified AL arms in winning pct. (.778/14-4) to BOS **Sonny Gray** (.810/17-4), is tied for second in wins (career-high 14) with teammate **Drew Rasmussen**, and owns the sixth-best ERA (3.04)...the Rays are 21-6 in his starts, including 11-2 on the road...has yielded three runs or fewer in 23 of 27 starts and two runs or fewer in 18 of 27...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026...was originally drafted by the Rangers in the 18th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft and began his major league career with the club from 2014-17.

- ★ When pitching in the 1st inning this season, Martinez has posted a 1.67 ERA (27.0IP, 5ER) with 18 strikeouts and a .194 (19-for-98) opp. average...ranks highly among AL arms (min. 25G) in the 1st frame in ERA (4th), WHIP (T4th, 0.88), opp. OBP (5th, .248), and opp. AVG (T7th).
- ★ Boasts the fourth-highest left-on-base percentage in the majors (82.4%), the third-highest mark in the AL behind BOS **Sonny Gray** (83.7%) and NYY **Cam Schlichtler** (82.9%).
- ★ His club-leading 14 starts with one or zero runs allowed are tied for fourth most in the AL and tied for sixth most in the majors.

LAST TIME OUT—Logged his career-high 14th quality start of the year and earned the win after yielding 3 ER over 6.1 innings in a 7-6 win on Sept. 4 at TEX (W, 6.1IP, 5H, 3ER, 2BB, 4SO, HR), his first career start against his former club...allowed just a single in the 1st inning before surrendering a solo home run to **Ezequiel Duran** to lead off the 2nd...proceeded to retire eight of his next nine batters, and allowed a single in each of the 5th and 6th frames...yielded a walk and a single in the 7th before being replaced by **Garrett Cleavinger**, who permitted both inherited runners to score.

- ★ 16 of his 27 starts have been 6.0 innings or more, tied for the seventh-most such starts among AL arms...he has met the mark in a season-high-tying three straight starts (3x, last: July 20-31), with his last longer streak being a career-best six-start stretch from Apri 28-May 26, 2025 with the Reds.
- ★ Marked the 19th time in 27 starts he has yielded two extra-base hits or fewer.
- ★ He has now started against all 30 major league clubs in his career.

ATL-IENS—Martinez is set for his sixth career appearance (fifth start) against the Braves...owns a 2-1 record with a 2.81 ERA (25.2IP, 8ER), 19 strikeouts, and a .196 (18-for-92) opp. average against the club...marks his first outing against Atlanta since Sept. 9, 2024 with Cincinnati at Truist Park (W, 7.0IP, 2H, OR, BB, 5SO)...his teams have gone 4-1 in his five career outings vs. ATL.

- ★ Marks his fourth career appearance (third start) at Truist Park...has gone 1-0 with a 2.63 ERA (13.2IP, 4ER), 10 strikeouts, and a .163 (8-for-49) opp. average in the previous three outings.
- ★ He is set to make his third start of the season against an NL East club, posting a 2.25 ERA (12.0IP, 3ER) and nine strikeouts in those starts...across 42 career outings (16 starts) opposite NL East foes, he boasts a 7-3 mark with a 3.26 ERA (127.0IP, 46ER), 100 strikeouts, and a .239 (112-for-468) opp. average.
- ★ When facing NL opponents this year, Martinez has gone 3-1, pitching to a 2.50 ERA (54.0IP, 15ER), 38 strikeouts, and a .250 (52-for-208) opp. average.

HITTING THE ROAD—In 12 road starts this season, Martinez has produced a 7-1 record with a 2.15 ERA (79.2IP, 19ER), 44 strikeouts, a 0.98 WHIP, and .229 (68-for-297) opp. average...his road ERA ranks third in the AL behind Cy Young frontrunners NYY **Cam Schlichtler** (1.14) and TOR **Dylan Cease** (1.89) and is fifth best in the majors...he is on pace to surpass **Blake Snell's** franchise-record 2.45 road ERA (95.2IP, 26ER) from 2018...Martinez has yielded three runs or fewer in 12 of his 13 road starts and two runs or fewer in 10 of them.

- ★ His seven road wins lead the Rays staff...he has earned the win in five straight starts away from home, tied with **Alex Cobb** (2014) and **David Price** (2010) for the third-longest streak in franchise history, one win shy of the club record shared by **Blake Snell** (2018) and **Chris Archer** (2015).

TURNING BACK THE CLOCK—Martinez has a chance to become the fifth AL pitcher (6x) in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to make 30 starts or more and record a sub-3.00 ERA in an age-35-or-older campaign (age as of June 30)...he would join TEX **Jacob deGrom** (30GS/2.97 ERA, 2025), HOU **Justin Verlander** (2018-19), OAK **Bartolo Colon** (30/2.65, 2013), and TOR **Roger Clemens** (33/2.65, 1998)...the right-hander's 14 wins are second most in franchise history during such a season behind **Corey Kluber** (16) in 2022 (age 35), and his 160.0 IP are fourth most, trailing **Charlie Morton** (2019, 194.2IP), **Bobby Witt** (180.1IP, 1999), and Kluber (180.1IP, 2022).

- ★ This season, Martinez became the fifth player in Rays history to earn an All-Star selection in an age-35-or-older season, joining Morton (2019, 35), **RHP Fernando Rodney** (2012, 35), **OF Greg Vaughn** (2001, 35), and **INF Fred McGriff** (2000, 36)...since 2020, the only AL pitchers to turn the trick are Martinez, Verlander (2026, 2022), and deGrom (2025).
