THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY
SEPT. 20
2007 - Rookie C J.R. Towles , who was playing in just his sixth MLB game, sets a franchise record by tallying eight RBI in an 18-1 Astros win in St. Louis...Towles finished his night 4x4 with two doubles and a home run...this record stood alone for 12 years before being matched by 1B Yuli Gurriel on Aug. 7, 2019 vs. COL.

TODAY'S GAME: With just seven games remaining on their schedule, the Astros will play their final home game of the season today as they try to salvage a win in their three-game series vs. the Braves...today's pitching matchup is a good one between Astros ace **RHP Hunter Brown** (6-3) and Braves veteran **LHP Martín Pérez** (9-9).

BROTHER BROWN: Astros ace **RHP Hunter Brown** has posted a 5-2 record and a 3.00 ERA (19ER/57IP) in his last nine starts (since July 25), pitching through the 5th inning in all nine outings... Brown, who finished third in the AL Cy Young Award voting last season, has been limited this season, missing over two months due to a lengthy stint on the IL (April 1-June 15) with a right shoulder strain.

THE POSTSEASON CHASE: The Astros and Rangers are locked in a tight race down the stretch for the AL West with the two teams separated by just one game with seven left to play... the Astros own the tiebreaker over the Rangers with a season series victory (9-4 record).

CHALLENGING STRETCH: The Astros are within a stretch of playing 16 of 19 games against opponents with winning records (CWS, ARI, PHI, TB, ATL), going 6-9 so far in those contests...on the season, the Astros are 38-29 against teams with .500 or better records, the fourth-best mark in the Majors, immediately behind the Braves (42-30).

FAN APPRECIATION DAY: Today is the final regular season game at Daikin Park, so the Astros will celebrate the best fans in baseball with **Fan Appreciation Day**, presented by SeatGeek...each half inning, select fans will score unique prizes based on seat numbers.

HISPANIC HERITAGE WEEKEND: The Astros are currently celebrating **Hispanic Heritage Weekend** at Daikin Park...as part of the celebration, 10,000 fans in attendance will receive a **Viva Los Astros Rally Towel**, presented by Coca-Cola.

LOS ASTROS: Space City Home Network will televise today's game in English and Spanish with the Spanish broadcast being televised on SCHN2... **Danny Gonzales** and **Gene Flores** will be on the call on the Spanish telecast today.

ROAD WARRIORS: After today's game, the Astros will hit the road for their final road trip of the season which will take them to Seattle for two games and West Sacramento for four...the Astros have been better on the road (38-37) than at home (39-41) on the season and are 37-28 on the road after their 1-9 start in road games.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Staked to a 2-0 lead after the 5th, the Astros were unable to hold on in a 6-3 loss to the Braves last night...the offense collected 10 hits on the night, including a combined five by **3B Isaac Paredes** (2x3, HR, 2RBI) and **2B Jose Altuve** (3x4)...**RHP Hayden Wesneski** (1ER/5.1IP) started for Houston in a no decision.

YESTERDAY'S ROSTER MOVES: The Astros made a pair of moves yesterday, first reinstating **IF/OF Brice Matthews** from the 60-day IL and designating **OF Jorge Barrosa** for assignment... later, just before game time, the Astros recalled **RHP Logan VanWey** from Triple A Sugar Land and placed **RHP Enyel De Los Santos** on the 15-day IL with right knee tendonitis.

TWO-OUT MAGIC: The Astros lead the American League in two-out runs with 307 on the season, trailing only the Cubs (324) in the Majors...**3B Isaac Paredes** has led this effort, as he leads the Majors with 44 two-out RBI, immediately ahead of second-place **1B Alec Burleson** (43).

STRONG SEPTEMBERS: **3B Isaac Paredes** has a .986 OPS this month to go along with a team-leading 17 RBI, which ranks second in the AL...**C Yainer Díaz** is also having a strong September, as he's hitting .346 (18x52) with two homers, six RBI and a .901 OPS in 16 games (13 starts) this month.

TRIPLE THREAT: DH Yordan Alvarez, who is a solid candidate for the AL MVP Award, currently ranks first or second in the AL in all three **Triple Crown** categories...he enters today leading the AL in batting avg. (.312), while ranking second in HR (40) and RBI (99)...Alvarez also leads the Majors in OPS (1.026), SLG (.597) and OBP (.429)...since **Carl Yastrzemski** won the AL Triple Crown in 1967, there has been just one Triple Crown winner in the Majors, **Miguel Cabrera** in 2012 (AL):

FORTHREE!: **2B Jose Altuve** went 3x4 last night for his 226th career three-hit game, which is the Astros franchise record...he surpassed Hall of Famer **2B Craig Biggio** (225 three-hit games) with last night's performance.

THE FIREMAN: **LHP Josh Hader** has converted 26 consecutive save chances to open his season, which is the Astros record...should Hader finish the season without a blown save, he would become the seventh pitcher in MLB history to post 26-plus saves without a blown save...the last Major Leaguer to do so was **RHP Ken Giles** in 2018 (26 SV).

RACKING UP K'S: **RHP Bryan Abreu** has posted 527 career strikeouts, which ranks fourth among relievers in Astros history...he's closing in on third-place **RHP Dave Smith** (529), needing only two strikeouts to match the Astros reliever from the 1980s...**LHP Billy Wagner** (694) and **RHP Brad Lidge** (557) sit atop that all-time list.

ASTROS MILB PLAYERS OF THE YEAR: The five Astros prospects that won organizational awards this season will be recognized in a pregame ceremony at today's game...those are the Astros Minor League Player of the Year **C Jason Schiavone**, the Astros Minor League Pitcher of the Year **RHP Bryce Mayer**, the Astros Minor League Baserunner of the Year **OF Anthony Huez**, the Astros Minor League Defender of the Year **IF Max Holy**, and the Astros Standard Award recipient **IF Yamal Encarnacion**.

LAST START, SEPT. 15 vs. KC: Matched his season high of 10 strikeouts in just 5.0 innings of work, allowing 1 run on 2 hits with 3 walks to record the winning decision in the Astros' 4-2 win on Tuesday vs. the Royals...marked the 2nd time in his last 4 starts to record 10+ strikeouts (also, Aug. 28 at NYM) and was his 4th career start with 10+ strikeouts...marked the 17th instance in Astros history a player struck out 10+ batters in an outing of 5.0-or-fewer innings (last, 12 SO in 5.0 IP from **LHP Framber Valdez** on June 12, 2025 vs. CWS).

THE DIESEL: The Astros 2026 Opening Day starter, Brown has been limited to 18 Major League starts on the season due to a 2-plus month-long IL stint (April 5-June 16) due to a right shoulder strain...the Astros have gone 9-9 in his 18 starts...owns a .216 opponent average and has fanned 110 in his 97.0 innings pitched on the season.

THE TURNAROUND: Has returned to form as the Astros ace over his last 10 starts, posting a 5-2 record with a 3.00 ERA (19ER/57IP), 67 strikeouts, a .221 opponent batting average and a 1.18 WHIP dating back to his start on July 25 at CWS...prior to this run, he struggled in his first 6 starts back from the IL, posting a 5.22 ERA (17ER/29.1IP) from June 16-July 19.

700 PUNCHIES: Enters today's start with 695 strikeouts and is looking to become the 20th pitcher in Astros history to record 700 strikeouts with the club...would become the 3rd pitcher in Astros history to reach 700 strikeouts within their first 119 apps. with the club, joining **RHP Nolan Ryan** and **RHP Lance McCullers Jr.**

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Had one of his best starts of the season on July 25 at CWS, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings with 7 strikeouts while allowing just 2 hits and no walks...was the 1st start of his career in which he tossed 7.0+ scoreless innings while allowing 2-or-fewer hits without issuing a walk...also was outstanding in his start on Aug. 28 at NYM, allowed 1 run on 5 hits and 1 walk with 10 strikeouts in 6.2 innings.

SAVANT SAYS: Among all Major League pitchers, he ranks in the 93rd percentile in average exit velocity (86.4) and 96th percentile in groundball percentage (56.0)...also ranks in the 91st percentile in xBA (.198) and the 78th percentile in extension (6.8).

FOUR SEAMS: Has held opponents to a .151 batting average (13x86) with his 4-seam fastball and has tossed the pitch at a 31.3-percent rate, the highest of all his pitches...his .151 opponent average with his 4-seamer would be the lowest single-season mark of his career, ahead of a .167 opponent batting average vs. the pitch in his debut 2022 season.

ALL-STAR SEASON: A 2025 All-Star, Brown finished third in the AL in Cy Young voting last season after turning in the best year of his career with a 12-9 record, a 2.43 ERA (50ER/185.1IP) and posting a 1.03 WHIP...in 2025, Brown held opponents to a career-low .201 average and posted 206 strikeouts in 185.1 innings pitched...his 2.43 ERA ranked 10th all-time among Astros starters and was the second-lowest by an Astros starter in the last 20 seasons (since 2005)...among AL starters, he ranked first in opponent SLG (.318) and second in ERA (2.43)...lastly, by reaching 206 strikeouts, he became the 18th pitcher in club history to reach 200 strikeouts in a season.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU: By finishing third in the AL Cy Young voting in 2025, the Astros were granted a compensation pick immediately after the first round of the 2026 draft (No. 28 overall)...the Astros earned the pick through the Prospect Promotion Incentive (PPI), which was ratified into the latest CBA...the PPI rewards teams for promoting their best prospects to the big leagues at the start of the season, having them accrue one full year of service time and then having them factor into a major award that season or prior to qualifying for arbitration...the Astros used that selection on **RHP Jack Radel** out of Notre Dame.
