D-BACKS ROSTER MOVES: Recalled RHP Slade Cecconi from Triple-A Reno; optioned RHP Justin Martinez to Reno.

SLADE ON THE BUMP: In 7 games (4 starts) over 2 stints with Arizona in 2023, Slade Cecconi went 0-1 with a 4.33 ERA (13 ER in 27.0 IP).

- This season with Triple-A Reno, went 2-2 with a 4.58 ERA (10 ER in 19.2 IP) and 23 strikeouts in 4 starts.
- Made his MLB debut on Aug. 2, 2023 @ Giants (GS; 4.2 IP, 2 R, 4 H, 1 BB, 2 K).

IT'S MARTE'S PART-AY: Ketel Marte, over his last 16 games vs. Giants, is hitting . 355 (22-for-62)/1.001 OPS with 2 doubles, 4 homers, 12 runs, 11 RBI and 6 walks.

- Since April 16 [min. 15 PA], Marte is batting an MLB-best .565 (13-for-23)/1.496 OPS with 2 homers and 4 RBI...in his 22 games this season, is slashing .344/.396/.589 with 5 homers (3 leadoff) and 12 RBI.

- On Friday night, Alexander collected his first career grand slam (8th inning off Nick Avila) and became the first Rookie in 2024 to collect 5 RBI in a game....he is also the fourth player ever to record 2+ extra-base hits, 1 home run and 5 RBI in a game @ Oracle Park [also: Josh Donaldson/OAK (May 18, 2012), Paul Lo Duca/LAD (June 26, 2001) and Jeff Kent/SF (Aug. 3,2000 )] as well as the youngest player ever to do so @ Oracle Park at age 24-313 (previous: Donaldson, 26-162).

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 12 games this season with $1+$ runs scored in the first inning is tied for the most in the Majors (also: Dodgers).

- In the opening frame this season, the D-backs have tallied an MLB-leading 27 runs ( 2.25 runs per game), .396 average, 42 hits, .444 OBP, .717 SLG, 1.161 OPS, 10 doubles, 8 home runs and 7 stolen bases.

OFFENSE OFF STARTERS: D-backs hitters, against opposing starting pitchers, are batting .300 (133-for-443)/. 844 OPS with 73 runs, 27 doubles, 17 homers and 36 walks. - Among all teams' offenses vs. starting pitchers, the D-backs rank in average (1st, .300), hits (1st, 133), runs (1st, 73), total bases (1st, 211), OBP (T-1st, .355), OPS (2nd, .832), doubles (T-2nd, 27), extra-base hits (T-2nd, 44) and home runs (T-4th, 17).

- Ketel Marte's 44 hard hits are second in the Majors, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (44).
- The D-backs' 25 hard hit balls on Friday @ Giants set a franchise record and tied for the second-highest mark by any team in the Statcast Era [since 2015] (also: Blue Jays, June 11, 2021 \& July 22, 2022; Nationals, July 31, 2018), behind the White Sox (26, Sept. 8, 2022) and Giants (26, Sept. 1, 2020).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The D-backs' +26 run differential is fifth in the Majors, behind the Guardians (+48), Royals $(+43)$, Braves (+37) and Brewers (+33).

- The D-backs' 126 runs in their first 22 games of a season are fourth most in franchise history, behind 2001 (140), 2008 (134) and 2010 (129).

WHEN SCORING FIRST: The D-backs have scored first in all 10 games they have won this season...they have scored first in a game 16 times, the second most in the Majors, only behind the Red Sox (17).

## STOPPING THE OPPONENT RUNNING GAME: Through 22 games

 this season, D-back backstops have held opponents to an MLB-low 4 stolen bases in 7 attempts...Gabriel Moreno's 39.7 caught-stealing pct. (31-for-78) since 2022 is highest among all active MLB catchers.- The 7 stolen base attempts against Arizona are the fewest among all MLB teams over a total of 308 stolen base opportunities.

FRIDAY'S FRANCHISE MARKS: The D-backs' 22 hits on Friday marked the most hits in a 9-inning game in franchise history (previous: 21, 4x; last: July 17, 2019 @ Rangers) and tied for the most ever in any game by the D-backs ( 22 hits in 18 inn. on Aug. 24, 2013 @ Phillies).

- The 16-run differential on Friday also tied for the largest margin of victory in franchise history (also: 16 runs on May 24, 2019 @ Giants).

ON DECK - ST. LOUIS CARDINALS: The D-backs took 2 out of 3 in their first series of the season from April 12-14 @ Chase Field.
-Last season, the D-backs went 3-3 vs. Cardinals (2-1 on the road, 1-2 @ home).

- Over his last 9 games vs. Cardinals, Corbin Carroll is hitting .356 ( 9 -for-26) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 5 runs, 5 RBI, 5 walks and 4 stolen bases.
