BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals and division-rival Cincinnati Reds play the second game of a three-game weekend series tonight at Busch Stadium as the team continues their eight-game homestand against the Diamondbacks (0-1), Reds (0-1), and Cubs (4g) ... St. Louis is 2-6 through its first eight games of 20 consecutive games before their next open date on August 6, longest since the Cardinals played 20 straight from April 19-May 8, 2022 (11-9 record).

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters play today in 4th place in the National League Central, 12.0 games behind 1st place Milwaukee ... The Cardinals are 5th in the NL Wild Card race, sitting 2.5 games behind Arizona for the final spot ... According to *Elias*, St. Louis has played the hardest strength of schedule so far this season, facing opponents with a combined .511 win percentage through the first 103 games ... St. Louis has lost 14 of 19 since July 4th.

VICTORY BLUES: Coinciding with tonight's Victory Blue jersey gate giveaway to 15,000 fans, the Cardinals are wearing blue uniforms in St. Louis for only the 2nd time in history, following Saturday, August 5, 2012 vs. Milwaukee when they donned their throwback Powder Blues for the 30-year anniversary of the 1982 World Series ... The Cardinals have traditionally worn their modern Victory Blue uniforms for Saturday road games since 2019 and previously donned their original Powder Blues in road games from 1976-84.

URÍAS BEGINS REHAB: INF **Ramón Urías** is scheduled to begin his injury rehab assignment tonight with Memphis (AAA) ... The 32-year-old Urías has missed the previous 68 games since May 5 due to right elbow lateral epicondylitis.

ANDRE THE GIANT: RHP **Andre Pallante** who is 10-6 this season after going just 6-15 in 2025, is the first Cardinal since RHP **Joaquín Andújar** (1983-84) to bounce back from a 15+ loss season and then win 10 or more games the very next season ... Andujar lost 16 games in 1983, but then produced a 20-win season in 1984 and a 21-win season in 1985.

GAME TIME IS ON TIME: Beginning with last Sunday's series finale in Arizona at 1:10 MT, the Cardinals will not repeat game times for nine straight games, playing at 7:10 PT, 6:38 PT and 1:07 PT in Anaheim, followed by 4:15 CT, 7:15 CT, 6:15 CT, 1:15 CT and 6:45 CT starts this homestand.

COOPERSTOWN CARDINALS: Former Cardinals OF **Carlos Beltrán** (2012-13), 1B **Bill White** (1959-65, '69) and broadcaster **Joe Buck** (1991-2007) will be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame this weekend in Cooperstown, NY ... Those with connections to the Cardinals and scheduled to attend include **Dennis Eckersley**, **Jim Kaat**, **Tony La Russa**, **Scott Rolen**, **Ozzie Smith**, **Larry Walker**, **Lee Smith**, **Ted Simmons**, **John Smoltz**, and **Joe Torre**.

- Today at 2 p.m. CT at Cooperstown's Alice Busch Opera Theater, Buck will receive the Ford C. Frick Award for broadcasting excellence and White will be honored with the Buck O'Neil Lifetime Achievement Award, presented to an individual for extraordinary efforts to enhance baseball's positive impact on society.
- Beltrán becomes the 56th individual with ties to the Cardinals organization to be inducted into the Hall of Fame and joins fellow Class of 2026 members 2B **Jeff Kent** and OF **Andruw Jones** in tomorrow's Induction Ceremony at 12:30 p.m. CT at Cooperstown's Clark Sports Center.

CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Former Reds Executive, the late **Walt Jocketty**, served as the Cardinals GM for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, St. Louis compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06) & one World Series Championship ('06).

Terry Francona played in 86 games in 1990 with the Louisville Redbirds (AAA), including five at pitcher...his father, **Tito Francona**, played parts of two seasons (1965-66) with St. Louis...became a Cardinal via trade by Cleveland in exchange for a player to be named (Dec. 15, 1964)...originally signed by the St. Louis Browns before the 1952 season (MLB debut for Baltimore in 1956).

Reds pitching coach **Derek Johnson** played baseball & coached at Eastern Illinois Univ. (1991-94)...coached at Southern Illinois Univ.(1995-97).

Hall of Famer **Scott Rolen** played his final four seasons with the Reds (2009-12)...won the 2010 Gold glove and was a two-time All-Star (2010-11

Reds Asst. Pitching Coach **Matt Tracy** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Christian Brothers College HS.

Justin Bruhl pitched for the Reds Triple-A Louisville affiliate in 2024.

Riley O'Brien made his MLB debut with Cincinnati (Sept. 28, 2021 at Guaranteed Rate Field).

Bryan Torres made his MLB debut at Cincinnati on May 23, 2026 (G1)...singled off Chris Paddack for his first MLB hit and homered off Jose Franco.

Julio Rangel served as Bullpen Coach for the Reds in 2019.

Cardinals.TV broadcaster **Mark Sweeney** played outfield for both the Cardinals (1995-97) and Reds (1999).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played in 33 games for Cincinnati in 1996.

Reds Senior Advisor **Cam Bonifay** played two minor league seasons with the Cardinals...worked for St Louis as a professional scout and special assistant.

Reds Special Asst. to the GM **John Morris** played five seasons (1986-90) with the Cardinals.

Reds President of Baseball Ops **Nick Krall** previously interned for the New Jersey Cardinals of the NY Penn League (SS).

Reds broadcaster **Jeff Brantley** pitched in 48 games for St. Louis in 1998.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played 13 games for the Reds in his final season (2010).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Julián Javier** played in 44 games for the Reds during his final 1972 season.

Reds Senior Advisor **Eric Davis** played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Office **William DeWitt Jr.** was a prior owner of the Reds and shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals...his father, **William O. DeWitt**, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds CEO **Robert Castellini**, Chairman **W. Joseph Williams Jr.** and Vice Chairman **Thomas Williams** were Cardinals investors from 1995-2006...interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Making his 20th start of the 2026 season tonight and his 81st career start (189th career appearance); will have put together three consecutive 20+ start seasons with 31 in 2025 & 20 in 2024.
- Looking to become the NL's 6th starter with 11 or more wins and snap his two-game losing streak at home.
- Is making his 11th career start (21st appearance) against the Reds who he has 7 career wins against - his most among all opponents (7-4, 2.41 ERA).
- Pallante's 10 wins in his first 17 starts were the most by a Cardinal through their first 17 starts in a season since **Carlos Martinez** (10 in 2015).
- He's the first Cardinals pitcher since **Joaquin Andujar** (1983-84) to bounce back from a 15+ loss season and win 10 or more games the very next season; Andujar lost 16 games in 1983 but then produced a 20 win season in 1984 and a 21 win season in 1985.
- Is 10-15 with a 4.58 ERA in 28 career starts (79 app.) Post All-Star Break.
- Owns an 11.25 Run Support Average on the road (highest in MLB) but just 2.93 at home ... He's received 3 runs or fewer in 10 of his 11 Home starts, yet 5 runs or more in 7 of his 8 Road starts.
- Making his his 189th career appearance tonight to move to within one game of matching **Steve Carlton** (190) for 63rd all-time among Cardinals pitchers. He has joined **Adam Wainwright** (478 starts), **Carlos Martinez** (274), **Lance Lynn** (206), **Miles Mikolas** (204) and **Chris Carpenter** (198) since 2000 to reach both 188 career games pitched for St. Louis while also making 80 or more starts.
- Is 6-0 in eight Road starts (St. Louis is 6-2) and he's 4-6 in Home games with the Cardinals going 5-6 in his Home starts after starting out 1-4 in his 1st five Home starts.
- Leads all current Cardinals pitchers in career starts (80), wins (34), and innings pitched (565.1).**
- Began the season with 10 consecutive starts of 5.0+ IP (March 31-May 23), first Cardinal to do so since RHP **Sonny Gray** ran off 10 straight such starts to begin 2024.
- Alternated Home & Road starts in first 11 starts to begin the season, but that trend ended on May 29-June 7 homestand after consecutive Home starts. Now is alternating again through his last four.
- Allowed 2 runs or fewer in five of six starts from May 17 to June 22 (2.88 ERA) and led the Cardinals starting staff with his 3.16 ERA in June.
- Made the Cardinals Opening Day Roster for the 5th time (2022-26), tied with **Lars Nootbaar** for most among active Cardinals.

LAST TIME OUT (Sunday, July 19 at Arizona): L, 8-7; 5.1 IP, 5 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 2 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR - 88 pitches.

- Was in line for his 11th win, departing with a 7-3 lead in the 6th before the D-Backs rallied for an 8-7 walk-off win in 10 innings.
- It was his 8th consecutive road start of 5.0+ IP, one shy of **Kyle Leahy's** 9-straight such starts on the road.

2026 NOTES:

SLIDE ON IN: Is holding opposing batters to a .194 BA (24-124) with his slider, and 37 of his 75 strikeouts this season have come via the slider ... Boasts a 9 Run Value on his slider, 8th best slider in MLB according to *Baseball Savant* this season.

COUNT ON ME: Has worked at least 5.0 IP in 18 of his 19 starts this season, allowing 2 runs or fewer in 10 of those games.

IF AT FIRST: Has had issues with 1st inning, allowing a .801 OPS, 14 runs and 4 HRs in 1st inning ... Batters are hitting .320 (16-50) when contacting the 1st pitch of an at-bat.

WRIGLEY WIPE OUT: Picked up his 10th win of the season with 5.2 scoreless IP on 7/3 at Wrigley Field as the Cardinals rolled to a 17-1 win over the Cubs - their most lop-sided win over the Cubs since a 21-3 mauling on 4/27/77 at the Friendly Confines.

SIX & THIRTY: Snapped a 4-game losing skid in games pitched at Busch Stadium as he matched his season total from 2025 with his 6th win of the season vs. TEX (6/3); also marked his 30th career win.

THE STATE OF WINNING: With a win in Sacramento (May 12), earned his first MLB in his home state of California.

BITTER BREW: Allowed four 1st inning runs, including 3-run HR, in 6-2 loss to MIL (5/6), losing his 3rd straight decision at Busch Stadium.

AHOY MATEY: Pitched then season-best 6.0 IP while allowing 1 run in Cards 5-4 win at PNC Park (4/29) in G3 of a 4-game series sweep of Pittsburgh.

TRI-DENT: Fanned 8 Mariners on 4/24 in 5.1 IP, but took the 3-2 loss after Josh Naylor's solo HR in the 6th snapped a 2-2 tie.

SPACE TRAVELER: Earned his 1st road win since 5/16/25 (at KC) in a 7-5 Space City win over the Astros on 4/18 in Houston.

MARCH MADNESS: Made his 2026 season debut vs. NYM (3/31) and gained a 3-0 win as he worked 5.0 scoreless IP, allowing just 3 hits.

CAREER:

- Has made the Cardinals Opening Day Roster for five consecutive seasons (2022-26) after arriving at 2022 Spring Training as a non-roster invitee, his first official invite to Major League Spring Training.
- Since his 2022 MLB debut, boasts the highest ground ball pct. (62.2%) in Major League Baseball among pitchers with 500.0+ IP.*** As a starting pitcher (433.2 IP), Pallante's 59.1 career groundball pct. currently is the 9th-best in MLB since the stat has been tracked since 1987 (min. 400.0 IP as starter).

PALLANTE vs. CINCINNATI:

- Is 7-4 with a 2.41 ERA in 10 career starts and 20 app., vs. the Reds; his most wins (7) and starts (10) against any opponent.
- Of active pitchers with 50.0 or more career IP vs. CIN, his 2.41 ERA ranks 3rd behind **Max Scherzer** (1.67) and **Zack Wheeler** (2.24).
- Has registered a decision in all 10 career starts vs. CIN (6-4, 2.63 ERA, 54.2 IP, 44 K) with 4 Quality Starts.
- Received one run of support or less in 5-of-10 starts.
