**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets begin the season-half of the season tonight with the start of a three-game series against the San Diego Padres...Following the series, the Mets are off on Monday before the Subway Series against the Yankees on Tuesday and Wednesday...The Mets have won four of their last five games...The Mets are 46-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 21-5-3 in 29 series this year.

**HANGOOK-IN EUI BAM:** Tonight, the Mets will celebrate Korean Night at Citi Field... The Mets will welcome South Korean actor Jang Hyuk who is currently starring in The Killer and will throw out the ceremonial first pitch...In addition, the Mets will welcome South Korean music star Luna to Citi Field...She will star in the upcoming musical KPOP...Fans who purchased a special ticket will receive a limited edition Korean Night Mets hat.

**COOKIE'S KIDS:** Earlier today, Carlos Carrasco visited patients at the Cohen Children's Medical Center and gifted them with Mets swag, Cookie's Kids T-shirts and signed photos as part of the Cookie's Kids Program...Throughout this season, Carlos is partnering with Northwell Health to meet with pediatric cancer patients and their families to share his inspiring story and show his support.

**TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME!:** With anticipated high attendance figures for the Subway Series, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays...Gates will open at 5:10 p.m., while parking lots open will open at 4:10 p.m...The Mets will offer \$5 Nathan's Hot Dogs at concession stands between 5:10 - 6:10 p.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday.

**JULY! JULY! JULY!:** New York's 2.36 team ERA this month is the second-best mark in the majors, trailing only Seattle (2.28)...The club's 190 strikeouts in July are second in the majors, trailing only Houston's 196...Mets starters have gone 7-3 with 2.37 ERA (26 earned runs/98.2 innings) with 24 walks and 124 strikeouts in 17 games in July...Their 2.37 ERA is the best in The Show, while their 124 strikeouts from starters in July is the second-most in the majors.

**FATHER OF MINE:** Jeff McNeil is a .433 (13-30) hitter with five runs, four doubles, two RBI and three walks in 11 career games against the Padres...Tomás Nido has hit .333 (9-27) with two runs, a home run, three RBI and two walks in eight games against the Friars...Eduardo Escobar owns a .271/.346/.444 slashline with 29 runs, 10 doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 31 RBI and 23 walks in 56 career games against San Diego.

**GIMME A BREAK:** The Mets won 58 games before the All-Star break this season, despite the first slate of games being rescheduled due to the lockout...That is the second-most wins before the break in franchise history...Only the 1986 Mets (59-25) won more games before the break...The last time the Mets won 50 or more games before the break was in 2006 (53-36)...The Mets headed into the break in first place for the second straight season...This marks just the second time in franchise history that the Mets head into the break in first place in back-to-back seasons (also, 2006-2007).

**ON THE RECORD:** New York has won 58 games this season, the second-most in the National League...Their .624 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 58-35 record through the team's first 93 games...Only the 1986 (63-30) team posted a better record through the first 93 games of the season.

**CITI SLICKERS:** The Mets have played 43 games at Citi Field this year, which is tied for the third-fewest in the majors and tied for the second-fewest in the Senior Circuit...By comparison, the Braves have played 51 home games, tied for the most in the majors... The Mets have won 17 of their last 24 home games...Overall, the Mets are 28-15 at home this year...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .651 winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.31 ERA with 130 walks and 416 strikeouts at Citi Field this year...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the National League.

**IT'S BEEN TWO WEEKS:** Over the last 14 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .281 (16-57) with 16 runs, three doubles, four home runs, nine RBI, nine walks with a .388 OBP, a .544 SLG and a .932 OPS...He has posted a .271/.358/.437 slashline with 17 doubles, five triples, nine home runs, 33 RBI and 37 walks this season...His 3.1 fWAR places him 11th in the National League.

**THIS ONE GOES TO 11:** Francisco Lindor is on an 11-game hitting streak, his longest as a member of the Mets...He is batting .298 (14-47) with six runs, a double, a triple, three home runs, nine RBI and a .906 OPS in that span...In 17 games this month, Lindor is batting .275/.351/.493 with nine runs, a double, one triple, four home runs, seven walks, two steals and 10 RBI...He has posted a 3.5 fWAR this year which places him ninth in the National League.

**SWIPE RIGHT:** Lindor stole his 10th base of the season in the first half finale at Chicago-NL on July 17...Stole 10 bases all of last season...He is one of five players in the majors with 10+ home runs and 10+ steals in at least seven of the last eight seasons, joining José Ramírez, Trea Turner, Mookie Betts and Marcus Semien.

**LINSANE IN THE MEMBRANE:** Lindor has recorded 66 RBI in 92 games this year...Lindor recorded a total of 63 RBI in 2021...Francisco Lindor set a franchise record with the most RBI by a shortstop before the All-Star break...José Reyes was the previous record holder, collecting 43 RBI before the 2008 Midsummer Classic...He's broken his own record for most RBI before the break (62) when playing with Cleveland in 2018.

**PADRES-METS NOTES:** The Mets have gone 6-3 against the Padres at Citi Field since the start of the 2018 season...The team has won the last three series at the ballpark.

**IN GOOD COMPANY:** Max Scherzer struck out 11 in his last start in game two of a doubleheader on Saturday, July 16 at Wrigley Field...That marked the 108th time in his career he struck out 10+ batters in game...That ties him with Pedro Martínez fourth in MLB history...Next up is Roger Clemens with 110 games with 10+ strikeouts.

**CANHA GET AN AMEN?:** Mark Canha ranks seventh in the NL with a .370 OBP...Over his last 13 games, Canha is batting .289 (11-38) with six runs, three doubles, a home run, an RBI, nine walks with a .449 OBP and an .896 OPS.

**FOUR MORE:** Max Scherzer has 196 career wins, five away from joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (238) and Zack Greinke (222) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career... He is 196-98 in his career...If he wins four of his next five decisions, he will reach 200 career wins before losing 100 games...Elias says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came before their 100th loss: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96).

**CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD:** Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts...He has since been passed by Justin Verlander, who has moved up to 14th on the all-time list...In his last three starts, Scherzer passed John Smoltz (3,084 strikeouts) and CC Sabathia (3,093 strikeouts) and currently ranks 17th on MLB's all-time strikeout list...Scherzer is still within striking distance of several pitchers above him this season...He is six behind Curt Schilling, seven behind Bob Gibson and 44 behind Pedro Martinez...He currently trails Verlander by 11 strikeouts...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

**PUT IT IN THE RECORD BOOKS:** Edwin Díaz has converted 84 saves as a member of the Mets...That ties him with Roger McDowell (1985-89) for seventh place on the team's all-time list...Tug McGraw is next...He converted 86 saves with the Mets from 1965-74... Díaz has struck out 313 batters as a member of the Mets...That is eighth all-time by a Mets reliever.

**DOMINATING DÍAZ:** Edwin Díaz, the reigning NL Reliever of the Month, has posted a 1-0 record with 10 saves, a 0.48 ERA (one earned run/18.2 innings) with 10 hits, three walks and 41 strikeouts over his last 19 appearances since May 27...He has recorded 20 saves this season, tied for the fourth in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 75 strikeouts...His 18.08 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...He has struck out 75 of the 145 batters he faced, good for 51.7%...He is 2-1 with 20 saves, a 1.69 ERA (seven earned runs/37.1 innings), allowing 25 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 34-4 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

**GLASS HALF FULL:** Mets pitchers struck out 891 batters this season...That is a franchise record for most strikeouts in the first half of a season...The previous record with 837 through 94 games in 2018...The Mets rank second in the majors in strikeouts this season...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 710 times this season...That is the fifth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game six times this year, which is tied for the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 49 times this year, the most in the majors.

**CONNECT FOUR:** New York is 49-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game...The team's 49 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .908 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors...The Mets have won 17 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 27-1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more.

**THE BUCK STARTS HERE:** Buck Showalter has recorded 1,609 career managerial wins...Earlier this year, he moved into 21st place on the all-time win list...His 1,609 wins rank fourth among active managers...Ralph Houk is 20th with 1,619 wins.

**ADAM EXPLAINS EVERYTHING:** Adam Ottavino is eighth in the majors in lowest average exit velocity at 84.5 MPH...He has allowed three earned runs over his last 26 appearances, posting a 3-1 record with a 1.04 ERA (three earned runs/26.0 innings) with five walks and 24 strikeouts...Overall, he is 4-2 with a 2.52 ERA (10 earned runs/35.2 innings) with 10 walks and 41 strikeouts in 37 appearances this season... Right-handed batters are hitting .148 (13-88) against him this season.

### SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw his third quality start in three tries off the Injured List on July 16 at Wrigley Field in Game 2 of a doubleheader sweep over the Cubs...Pitched 6.1 innings and allowed two runs on eight hits with a walk and a season-high-tying 11 punchouts...Has a 1.40 ERA (3 ER/19.1 IP) with 31 strikeouts and one walk in three starts since coming off the shelf.

**DOUBLE THE FUN:** Scherzer's last start was the 108th double-digit strikeout game of his career, tied for fourth all-time with Pedro Martinez...Roger Clemens (110) is next on the list... Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212) are the top two.

**MAX K'S, MIN WALKS:** Scherzer has issued just three walks in his last six starts (38.0 innings) combined, producing 48 strikeouts in that span...This season, he has 90 strikeouts to just 12 walks, a ratio of 7.50 K/BB that ranks third in MLB (min. 65.0 innings).

**VS. PADRES:** Scherzer faced San Diego five times last season, including twice as a National and three times after being traded to Los Angeles...He's faced the Friars 16 times in his career and allowed six hits or fewer in each of his first 15 starts against the club before yielding six runs on 11 hits in their last matchup on September 29 last season...He owns a 2.87 career ERA against the Padres with 142 strikeouts and just 24 walks in 103.1 innings spanning those 16 starts.

**DIG DEEP:** Over the last two seasons, opponents are slashing .182/.241/.280 against Scherzer with runners in scoring position...That .522 OPS is the sixth-best mark in the majors (min. 125 batters faced with RISP)...Scherzer allowed his first extra-base hit with runner(s) in scoring position this season in his last outing...Clayton Kershaw is the only starting pitcher who has faced 25 or more batters in RISP situations without yielding a single extra-base hit.

**FOUR MORE:** Scherzer has 196 career wins, five away from joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (238) and Zack Greinke (222) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career...He is 196-98 in his career...If he wins four of his next five decisions, he will reach 200 career wins before losing 100 games...Elias says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came before their 100th loss: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96).

**STRIKEOUTS ARE SEXY:** Scherzer's 34.0 percent strikeout rate is the sixth-highest rate in the majors (min. 65.0 innings) this season...It's the highest ever by a Met in his first 11 starts for the team...Only Pedro Martinez (31.6 percent) and Dwight Gooden (31.2 percent) have cracked 30 percent in addition to Scherzer...Scherzer recorded 79 punchouts in his first 10 starts, making him the only pitcher ever to whiff 75+ batters in his first 10 outings with three different franchises...He had 85 strikeouts in his first 10 starts with both the Nationals and Dodgers...Thanks to MLB's Sarah Langs.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (7-6, 3.79)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Finished the first half off with 6.0 innings of one-run ball against the Atlanta Braves at Truist Park...Went scoreless through 5.0 innings before allowing a solo home run to former teammate Matt Olson in the sixth...Bassitt walked two batters and struck out six.

**SLOW DOWN, YOU'RE DOING FINE:** Chris Bassitt owns the third-lowest exit velocity in the majors (85.8 mph)...His 85.8 average exit velocity is tied for the lowest in his career, a feat he first accomplished in 2018.
