**PITTSBURGH PIRATES (9-15) vs. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (11-11)**  
**April 23, 2025 - Angel Stadium - Anaheim, CA - 6:38 PDT - Game #25/Road #12**  
**LHP Andrew Heaney (1-1, 2.13 ERA) vs. RHP Jack Kochanowicz (1-2, 6.20 ERA)**

**THE PIRATES:** snapped their three-game losing streak with a 9-3 win over the Angels in Anaheim last night...Are in the second game of a six-game trip that will also take them across town to Dodger Stadium for three games this weekend...Have won seven of their last 10 games at Angel Stadium, dating back to June 21, 2013...Arrived in Southern California following a seven-game homestand from April 14-20, where they went 3-4 vs. Washington (3-1) and Cleveland (0-3).

**BREAK OUT THE BATS:** In Tuesday's win over the Angels, the Pirates scored nine runs on 18 hits...The nine runs were Pittsburgh's second-most in a game this season (scored 10 on April 14 vs. Washington), while the 18 hits were its most in a game since also having 18 in a 14-3 win at Colorado on April 19, 2023...Fifteen of the Pirates' 18 hits last night went for singles (Cruz and Kiner-Falefa doubled, McCutchen homered), their most singles in a game since also having 15 in a 12-9 win vs. Atlanta on May 17, 2016.

**RED-HOT REYNOLDS:** Bryan Reynolds went 3-for-5 in Tuesday night's win, his third three-hit performance in the last four games...He is 10-for-19 over his last four games (since Friday vs. Cleveland)...Reynolds' 10 hits over his last four games are the most by a Pirate in any four-game span since Oneil Cruz had 10 hits from August 27-31, 2024...In the last four contests, Reynolds has raised his average from .197 to .263...He is a career .341 (14-for-41) hitter against the Angels, including a .387 (12-for-31) mark in Anaheim.

**POTENT PIRATES:** Isiah Kiner-Falefa and Bryan Reynolds each reached base safely four times and drove in two runs on Tuesday...They became the first pair of Pirates teammates to reach base safely four-plus times and have two-plus RBI in a win since Ke'Bryan Hayes (five times, four RBI) and Jack Suwinski (four times, two RBI) on June 9, 2023, vs. New York (NL)...Tommy Pham also added three hits on Tuesday night, making Kiner-Falefa, Pham and Reynolds the first trio of Pirates to each record three hits in a win since Hayes, Connor Joe and Jared Triolo did so at Wrigley Field on September 20, 2023 (13-7 victory).

**DE-PEN-DABLE:** Pirates relievers combined to pitch 5.0 no-hit innings in relief of starter Bailey Falter on Tuesday (Chase Shugart 2.0, David Bednar 1.0, Justin Lawrence 0.2, Dennis Santana 0.1, Ryan Borucki 1.0)...It marked the most no-hit innings thrown by Pittsburgh's bullpen since it threw 7.0 no-hit frames in a 5-3 loss vs. Boston on August 16, 2022, and its most in a win since throwing 5.0 no-hit innings in a 6-3 win at San Francisco on September 11, 2019...Shugart picked up his first Major League win on Tuesday night.

**LET'S HEAR IT FOR HEANEY:** Andrew Heaney, who made 102 starts for the Angels from 2015-21, brings a scoreless streak of 10.1 innings into tonight...That's the second-longest scoreless streak by a Pirates pitcher this season (Bailey Falter's streak of 11.0 innings came to an end in the third inning of last night's game)...Heaney, who was honored for reaching 10 years of Major League service prior to his last start on April 17 vs. Washington, enters today with a 2.13 ERA (25.1ip/6er) and a .191 batting average against, which rank sixth and fourth, respectively, among all left-handed starters in MLB.

**CLIMBING THE CHARTS:** Andrew McCutchen hit his 237th home run as a Pirate, a three-run shot off Angels starter José Soriano, in the fourth inning of Tuesday night's 9-3 win in Anaheim...His 237 home runs with Pittsburgh are fourth-most in club history, trailing Willie Stargell (475), Ralph Kiner (301) and Roberto Clemente (240)...McCutchen and the Angels' Mike Trout are the only two active Major League players with 300-plus homers and 200-plus steals.

**WE ARE PHAM-A-LEE:** Tommy Pham enters today with six Defensive Runs Saved as a left fielder (five DRS overall), according to The Fielding Bible...He ranks first among all Major League left fielders in DRS, while his five total DRS are tied with Boston's Wilyer Abreu and Tampa Bay's Taylor Walls for fourth-most in all of Major League Baseball...Pham also had three hits in last night's win and two hits on Sunday, giving him consecutive multi-hit efforts for the first time since September 10-11, 2024, while he was a member of the Royals.

Earlier in the game, starting pitcher Bruce Kison connected for the first homer of his career with a solo shot off Mets starter Nino Espinosa. Oliver finished the game with four hits, while Rich Gossage picked up the win with 1.1 scoreless innings of work in relief of Kison.

HOW ACQUIRED: Signed as a free agent (one-year contract) on February 22, 2025.

**STARTING OFF:** The 33-year-old southpaw is in his 12th Major League season...He signed a one-year contract with the Pirates on February 22 after spending each of the previous two years with the Texas Rangers...Was the Angels’ nominee in both 2018 and 2019 for the distinguished Roberto Clemente Award for his community involvement.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Heaney earned his first win with Pittsburgh in his last start on April 17 vs. Washington, tossing 7.1 scoreless innings while allowing five hits and two walks and striking out four Nationals...He’s pitched 10.1 consecutive scoreless innings since allowing a third-inning grand slam to Elly De La Cruz in his start at Cincinnati on April 12...His last outing was also the fifth of his career where he pitched 7.0-plus scoreless innings (first time since September 3, 2020, for the Angels vs. San Diego).

**RESPECTED VETERAN:** Prior to his start on April 17, Heaney was honored by his coaches and teammates for reaching 10 years of Major League service...He is one of two Pirates with 10-plus years of service time, along with Andrew McCutchen, who has 15 years and 151 days...Tommy Pham ranks third with nine years and 120 days.

**WELCOME BACK:** On December 11, 2014, Heaney was traded from the Marlins to the Dodgers, who then traded him to the Angels for infielder Howie Kendrick later that day...Heaney made 102 starts for the Halos from 2015-21, posting a 4.51 ERA (569.1ip/285er) with 593 strikeouts in parts of seven seasons with Los Angeles (AL)... Heaney was acquired by the Yankees on July 30, 2021, as part of a three-player trade.

**AGAINST THE ANGELS:** Heaney will make his seventh appearance (fifth start) against his former team...He faced the Angels twice in 2024 while he was with Texas, striking out 16 batters over 13.2 innings...He has made three appearances (one start) here at Angel Stadium as a visitor since leaving in July 2021, allowing nine runs in 7.1 innings.

**PESKY LEFTIES:** According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Bailey Falter (7.0ip/0r on April 16) and Heaney (7.1ip/0r on April 17) became the first pair of Pirates left-handed teammates to pitch 7.0-plus scoreless innings in consecutive team games since John Candelaria (9.0ip) and Larry McWilliams (7.0ip) did so on July 25 and July 27, 1982.

**RIGHT AT HOME:** In his start on April 6 vs. New York (AL), Heaney made the first appearance of his career at PNC Park...He struck out 10 Yankees and allowed only one run over 7.0 innings (his 21st career game with 10-plus strikeouts)...With that start, he became the first Pirates left-handed pitcher to toss 7.0-plus innings and strikeout 10-plus batters while allowing one run or fewer since Francisco Liriano struck out 12 batters and didn’t allow a run across 8.0 innings on June 15, 2015, vs. Chicago (AL).

**WHERE HE RANKS:** Heaney enters today with a 2.13 ERA, the eighth-best mark in the National League (also ranks 14th in all of Major League Baseball)...Heaney has pitched 22 full innings in which he didn't allow a run, good for fourth among National League southpaws, behind Washington's Mitchell Parker (29), Chicago's Shota Imanaga (26) and Philadelphia's Jesús Luzardo (25), and tied for ninth-most among Major League lefties...The Angels’ Yusei Kikuchi has 23-such innings, tied for seventh in all of MLB.

**FOUR YOUR INFO:** Heaney is one of four Major League left-handed pitchers to record 150-plus strikeouts in each of the last two seasons, along with Yusei Kikuchi, Framber Valdez and MacKenzie Gore...He is also one of five lefties to throw 145.0-plus innings in each of the last two years, along with Valdez, Kikuchi, Patrick Corbin and JP Sears.

**THIS AND THAT:** Heaney has 21 career outings with 10-plus strikeouts, the sixth-most among active Major League southpaws...The only ones with more are Chris Sale (87), Clayton Kershaw (68), Robbie Ray (40), Blake Snell (35) and Carlos Rodón (26).

**SIGN HERE, PLEASE:** Heaney signed a one-year contract with the Pirates on February 22...He posted a 5-14 record, 4.28 ERA (160.0ip/76er) and 159 strikeouts in 32 games (31 starts) with Texas in 2024...Heaney's 159 strikeouts and 160.0 innings both ranked second on the Rangers, trailing Nathan Eovaldi (166 strikeouts and 70.2 innings).
