Roster Moves

The Braves today made four roster moves, recalling RHP Huascar Ynoa to Atlanta and selecting C Chadwick Tromp to the major league roster.

The club also optioned RHP Ian Anderson and OF Guillermo Heredia to Triple-A Gwinnett.

Ynoa, 24, made two starts for the Braves earlier this season, going 0-2 with a 13.50 ERA (10 ER/6.2 IP).

Tromp, 27, appeared in nine games with the Giants last season, hitting .222 (4-for-18) with a home run.

TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Mets finish a five-game series with the 12th of 19 meetings between the clubs this season...The teams will meet a week from Monday in Atlanta for another four-game series...That will mark the last time the clubs will meet until the penultimate series of the season, September 30-October 2.

A The Braves and Mets also played a five-game series here last season, July 26-29, with Atlanta taking three of the games in the set...The Mets have already won this series, and will look to take four-of-five today after sweeping yesterday's doubleheader.

A The clubs last met July 11-13 for three games in Atlanta with the Mets taking two-of-three... Overall, the Mets have won four of the last five games between the teams.

A The Braves went 10-9 against the Mets last season, taking the season set from their NL East rivals for the fourth consecutive season...They went 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018.

A RHP Spencer Strider is set to face the Mets for the second time as a starter and for the fourth time overall...The 23-year-old rookie went 4.2 innings on July 12, taking a no-decision in a 4-1 win at Truist Park...He allowed five hits, one run, earned, and three walks, while striking out eight...Strider's only two appearances last season came against the Mets in relief during the last series of the year, and he earned his first win in the final game of the season.

A RHP Jacob deGrom is 9-7 with a 1.96 ERA (35 ER/160.1 IP) in 25 career games, all starts, against the Braves...He has eight double-digit strikeout games against the Braves, and fanned 14 the last time he faced them on July 1, 2021 in Atlanta... Despite deGrom's overall success against the Braves, the Mets are 11-14 in his 25 starts against them.

LOSSES: The Braves dropped both games of yesterday's split doubleheader, and are now 0-4 in doubleheader games this season...All four losses have come against the Mets...They also lost both games of the doubleheader on Tuesday, May 3.

A Atlanta has lost four of their last five games, falling 5.5 games behind the front-running Mets in the NL East...That is the farthest the Braves have been back since after play on June 21, when they were also 5.5 out.

A The Braves were a season-high 10.5 games back after play on June 1.

A Atlanta has allowed 29 runs over their last five games...In previous 10 games dating to the All-Star break, the club allowed 33 runs total...They were 7-3 over this stretch.

A Despite the recent struggles, the Braves are 41-18 (.695) since June 1, the second-best record in baseball...Only the Dodgers at 41-17 (.707) have been better.

THREE STRAIGHT LOSSES?: The Braves have lost two straight games 13 times this season after yesterday's doubleheader sweep by the Mets.

A Atlanta is the only team in the majors without a three-game losing streak this season...This marks the deepest a team has gone into a season without a three-game skid since 2001, when the Mariners did not suffer through their first until games No. 147-150 (a four-game streak).

A That 2001 Mariners team also holds the major league record for the deepest any team has gone into a season without a three-game skid...Research courtesy of the Elias Sports Bureau.

A The Mariners won 116 games that season, tying the major league record for most victories in a single season first set by the 1906 Chicago Cubs.

A This also marks the deepest by games played the Braves have ever gone into a season without losing three games in a row...The previous franchise record was held by the 1884 Boston Beaneaters, which did not suffer through their first three-game losing streak until games 72-77, when they lost five straight...The Beaneaters had a tie in game No. 73, so their first three-game losing streak was game No. 72, 74 and 75.

A The last time the Braves lost three straight games was September 14-18, 2021...Since that date, the club is 87-52 (.626) in 139 games including the playoffs.

ACUÑA JR.: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. had three hits, two doubles and two RBI during yesterday's doubleheader, a day after collecting a career high-tying four hits.

A Acuña Jr. is hitting .375 (9-for-24) with three walks, two doubles and a home run in six games this month...He has a 1.027 OPS over this six-game stretch.

A In the entire month of July, Acuña Jr. hit .219 (21-for-96) with four total extra-base hits (three doubles, one home run)...He compiled a .599 OPS in 24 games during the month.

STRIDER: RHP Spencer Strider fanned a career-best 13 in his last start on August 2 to beat Philadelphia, 13-1... The 23-year-old rookie won his second consecutive start, and pitched into the seventh inning for the first time in his career (6.2 innings total).

A Strider now has 133 strikeouts on the season in just 87.0 innings pitched.

A His 13.8 strikeouts per 9.0 innings is the highest by a rookie pitcher in MLB history (min. 12 starts)... Chicago's Kerry Wood held the previous mark with 12.6 K/9.0 IP.

A No pitcher in Braves franchise history has pitched at least 100 innings in a season and fanned even 11.0 batters per 9.0 innings...In fact, just two pitchers, Brandon Beachy with 10.7 in 2011 and Charlie Morton with 10.5 last year, have been above 10.0.

Today's Game

- A* Set for his 13th start of the season, and his 24th appearance... Tonight is his 26th career game.
- A* Has made one career start and three total appearances against the Mets, and is 1-0 with a 2.57 ERA (2 ER/7.0 IP) and eight strikeouts versus New York.
- A* Made his lone start against them three weeks ago, July 12 at Truist Park, and allowed five hits and one run over 4.2 innings...Walked three and struck out eight...The Braves beat the Mets, 4-1.
- A* Made his major league debut against New York in the final series of last year, appearing in two games out of Atlanta's bullpen and allowing one run over 2.1 combined innings.
- A* Last started on August 2 vs. Philadelphia and allowed just three hits and one run over a career-most 6.2 innings...Fanned 13, which also established a new career high...Earned the win after the Braves beat the Phillies, 13-1.
- A* Has now allowed one earned run or less in six of his last seven starts dating to June 26, and is 3-1 with a 2.06 ERA (9 ER/39.1 IP) in that span...Five of the nine runs he has allowed came in his start on July 17.
- A* Despite Strider's ERA in this span, Atlanta is just 3-3 in his last six starts with a pair of extra-inning defeats.
- A* Fanned 13 in his last start against Philadelphia, and has 133 strikeouts on the season in just 87.0 innings pitched.
- A* His 13.8 strikeouts per 9.0 innings is the highest by a rookie pitcher in MLB history (min. 12 starts)...Chicago's Kerry Wood held the previous mark with 12.6 K/9.0 IP.
- A* No pitcher in Braves franchise history has pitched at least 100 innings in a season and fanned even 11.0 batters per 9.0 innings...In fact, just two pitchers, Brandon Beachy with 10.7 in 2011 and Charlie Morton with 10.5 last year, have been above 10.0.
- A* Became just the second Braves pitcher in history with a start of at least 13 strikeouts within his first 25 career games...Kevin Millwood also fanned 13 in just his 15th career game in 1998.
- A* His 133 strikeouts are 11th most in the majors, and each of the 10 pitchers above him have pitched at least 105 innings...Among pitchers with at least 50 innings this season, Strider's rate of 13.76 strikeouts per 9.0 innings is most in the majors.
- A* Among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings, he leads the majors in opponent's average (.174), slugging percentage (.260), OPS (.514) and strikeout percentage (38.3).
- A* Righties are batting just .169 against him, while left-handers are hitting .178... They have combined for just 16 extra-base hits in 311 at-bats.

2022 Recap

- A* Was named NL Rookie of the Month for July...Went 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA (8 ER/26.2 IP) over five starts in the month.
- A* Five of the eight runs came in one start, July 17 at Washington...In his other four turns, went 2-0 and pitched to a 1.19 ERA (3 ER/22.2 IP) with 37 strikeouts.
- A* Becomes the second consecutive Braves player to win Rookie of the Month, after Michael Harris II earned the honor for June...Is the first Atlanta pitcher to win the award since Craig Kimbrel won it twice in 2011.
- A* On July 7 vs. St. Louis, allowed just two hits over 6.0 scoreless innings, walking two and striking out a career-most 12 batters.
- A* Recorded his first nine outs via strikeout...Since at least 1961, Strider is the only Braves pitcher with nine strikeouts through the first three innings of a game...Only two other pitchers have done it since the start of the 2020 season: Pablo López (MIA; July 11, 2021) and Aaron Nola (PHI; June 25, 2021).
- A* He became the only pitcher in Braves history to have three games of at least 10 strikeouts within his first eight starts...League-wide, the last pitcher with at least three double-digit strikeout performances in his first eight career starts was Masahiro Tanaka, who did it for New York (AL) in 2014.
- A* Research via the Elias Sports Bureau.
- A* He allowed one hit and fanned 11 in his previous start at Cincinnati, and became the first rookie in MLB's modern era (since 1900) with 11+ strikeouts and two-or-fewer hits in consecutive starts.
- A* Started on July 2 at Cincinnati and allowed just one hits and one run over 6.0 innings, walking one and striking out a career high-tying 11.
- A* Also allowed just one hit with 11 strikeouts on June 15 at Washington, and is one of just three pitchers in the majors with multiple such starts this season... The White Sox' Dylan Cease and the Astros' Cristian Javier each have two as well.
- A* Per research from Stats, Inc., Strider became the only rookie pitcher in baseball's modern era (since 1920) to have two games with 11+ strikeouts and no more than one hit allowed.

- A* Drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the fourth round of the 2020 MLB June Amateur Draft.

Raisel Iglesias • RHP • 6-2 • 190 • 32 yrs • #26

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 1 **1st Batter/Retired:** 1/0 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- Made his Braves debut on August 5 at New York (NL), pitching a scoreless inning in relief.
- Logged 16 saves and 2-6 record while pitching to a 4.04 ERA in 39 appearances with the Angels this season.
- Acquired by Atlanta from the Los Angeles Angels on August 1 in exchange for LHP Tucker Davidson and RHP Jesse Chavez.
- Ranks eighth among active pitchers with 156 career saves.
- Iglesias and teammate Kenley Jansen are the only two pitchers to record at least 30 saves in the previous four seasons.
- Named to All-MLB Second Team in 2021...His 34 saves were the second most in the American League last season.
- Leads the majors with 37 saves of 4-plus outs since the beginning of the 2017 season.
- Since 2017, his 134 saves are the third most in baseball...Trails teammate Kenley Jansen and Mets reliever Edwin Diaz.
- Made his Major League debut with Cincinnati on April 12, 2015 against St. Louis.

Kenley Jansen • RHP • 6-5 • 265 • 34 yrs • #74

Saves/Opp: 24/28 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 40/32 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/3

- Recorded his 20th save of the season against LAD on 6/25...With that save against his former team, he became just the 14th player in history to record at least 20 saves in 10 different seasons, tied for seventh most.
- Passed Jonathan Papelbon with his last save on June 23 and now ranks 10th among all-time saves leaders...He is three saves away from tying Joe Nathan for the ninth most career saves in baseball history.
- Ranks tied for third in the National League with 24 saves.
- His career 2.44 ERA is the fourth lowest in history among players with as many appearances...Trails Hall-of-Famers Walter Johnson and Mariano Rivera, while Billy Wagner ranks third.
- His 374 career saves are the second most among active pitchers, trailing only Craig Kimbrel...Ranks 10th on the all-time save list and his 19 career postseason saves are second only to Mariano Rivera.
- Is a three-time N.L. All-Star and a two-time recipient of the Trevor Hoffman N.L. Reliever of the Year award.

- Pitching to a 1.88 ERA in 24 relief appearances and is averaging 1.1 innings pitched per outing...Has not surrendered an earned run in 18 of his 24 outings this year.
- Throwing strikes on 69.0% of his pitches, sixth highest rate in the NL (min. 10 appearances).
- His 7.75 rate of strikeouts per walks issued is seventh highest mark in baseball (min. 10 appearances).
- Pitched to a 7.20 ERA in five combined appearances (three in the postseason) last year...This year owns a 1.32 ERA.
- Had a 2.30 ERA in 14 outings with Triple-A Gwinnett this year...Made his debut on October 1, 2021 with Atlanta.
- Became just the second pitcher in major league history to make his first career start in the postseason (first in the world series)...The first was teammate A.J. Minter in the 2020 NLCS.

Tyler Matzek • LHP • 6-3 • 210 • 31 yrs • #68

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 6 **1st Batter/Retired:** 24/16 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 12/2

- Pitching to a 3.21 ERA since being reinstated from the IL...Had a 5.06 ERA prior to his IL stint.
- Made his first appearance since missing 46 games on the IL on 7/5 vs. STL...Pitched a scoreless frame.
- Was placed on the 15-day IL on May 14 with left shoulder inflammation, and was reinstated on 7/4.
- Struck out five of the six hitters he faced in two rehabilitation appearances with Triple-A Gwinnett.
- In 2021, owned a 3.31 ERA in the first half of the season...Pitched to a 1.78 ERA in the second half.
- Stranded 25 of 28 inherited runners and his 89.3% strand rate was the highest in baseball (min. 25 IR) last year.
- Set a new franchise record for appearances in a single postseason with 13...The previous mark of 11 was set by Mark Wohlers in 1995...Appeared in each of the Braves' first eight games, setting a new franchise-record mark and tying the MLB record held by Jesse Orosco, Wade Davis and Greg Holland for consecutive outings to open a postseason.
