RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a nine-game, 11-day, season-opening road trip through St. Louis (0-1, two to play), Milwaukee (three to play), and Minnesota (three to play) this afternoon at Busch Stadium... marks the longest road trip to begin a season in club history...are opening with a road trip for the eighth time, first since 2021, and second time in the last 17 seasons (2010-26)... are scheduled for five games in March, most in franchise history, more than their four in 2025, 2024, and 2019...will return to Tropicana Field on April 6 vs. CHC, their first game at the ballpark in 561 days (Sept. 22, 2024 vs. TOR).

- ★ The Rays fell to 15-14 on Opening Day (3-5 on the road) with Thursday's 9-7 loss to the Cardinals...they plated six runs in the 6th inning, tying their most in any frame during a season opener (also: 8th inn. on March 29, 2018 vs. BOS), to claim a 7-1 lead...the Cardinals responded with eight runs in the bottom half of the frame—the 14 combined runs were the most in any inning in franchise history...from first pitch to final out, the frame last nearly 51 minutes and featured 15 hits, seven mound visits, and six pitchers...the six-run lead was their largest in a loss since blowing a 6-0 advantage on June 27, 2025 at BAL (L, 22-8) and the largest by any team in an Opening Day defeat since the Rangers on April 8, 2022 at TOR (led 7-0, lost 10-8), per Elias.
- ★ It was the second time in MLB history both teams scored six runs or more in the same inning on Opening Day, joining the Boston Beaneaters and Brooklyn Bridegrooms on April 19, 1890 (Elias).
- ★ The 16 combined runs in the game were third most in any Rays season opener, trailing the 17 runs scored in the first two Opening Days in franchise history on April 5, 1999 at BAL (L, 10-7) and March 31, 1998 vs. DET (L, 11-6)...their seven runs were their most in an opener since April 2, 2017 vs. NYY (7) and their nine runs allowed were their most since April 2, 2007 at NYY (9).
- ★ In their first regular-season game with the Automated Ball-Strike (ABS) Challenge System in effect, the Rays went 2-for-2 on challenges, with Nick Fortes (catcher) and Jonathan Aranda (batter) overturning calls...the Rays, Twins (3), White Sox (3), Nationals (2), and Red Sox (2) were the only clubs with multiple successful challenges on Opening Day.
- ★ Today, the Rays look to avoid their sixth 0-2 start...they dropped their first two games in 2016, 2015, 2011, 2006, and 2005...they started 1-1 each of the last two seasons (2024-25)...they are also looking to avoid losing their first two road games for the first time since 2022.
- ★ After making his first Opening Day roster, Joe Boyle is scheduled to start in his season debut this afternoon...the right-hander pitched at Fort Zumalt West High School, approximately a 35-mile drive west from Busch Stadium, and played travel ball with the St. Louis Pirates.

ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS—Thursday's season-opening, 9-7 loss featured several notable Opening Day performances for the Rays:

- ★ The Rays 17 hits and 23 times on base were both their most on Opening Day in franchise history...the 23 baserunners were their most in any nine-inning loss in club history.
- ★ They finished with more walks (6) than strikeouts (5) in an opener for the second time, joining March 31, 2014 vs. TOR (8BB, 6SO).
- ★ Three Rays (Diaz, Fortes, Williamson) tied a club Opening Day record with three hits, which has now been accomplished 17 times, most recently by Yandy Diaz on March 28, 2024 vs. TOR.
- ★ Rays hitters homered once (Jonathan Aranda) and recorded 16 singles, their most in any game with 1 or 0 XBH in club history.
- ★ Junior Caminero reached base safely five times (4BB, 1B), tying a Rays Opening Day record established by Evan Longoria on April 6, 2012 vs. NYY...the four walks tied the most in the majors on Opening Day since 1901 (16x, last: DET Spencer Torkelson, 2025 at LAD)...at 22 years, 264 days old, he became the youngest third baseman to draw four walks in any game since the Milwaukee Braves Eddie Mathews on April 15, 1954 vs. STL (22.184)...it was the first four-walk game by a Rays hitter since Ji-Man Choi on July 9, 2022 at CIN.
- ★ Caminero also committed two errors, becoming the first player in MLB history to record four walks and multiple errors on Opening Day and the first Ray to do so in any game (Stats Perform).
- ★ Caminero saw a career-high 36 pitches, most by a Ray since Josh Lowe (36) on May 29, 2025 at HOU and most by any Ray in a season opener, besting Randy Winn (29) on April 5, 1999 at BAL.
- ★ Diaz's three-hit game gave him nine Opening Day hits with the Rays, tied with Fred McGriff for second in club history to Longoria (13).
- ★ Ben Williamson's three hits tied a franchise record for a player's team debut, matching Grady Sizemore (June 28, 2015 vs. BOS), Tino Martinez (March 30, 2004 vs. NYY - OD), and Gerald Williams (April 3, 2000 at MIN - OD).
- ★ Between Chandler Simpson and Jake Fraley, the Rays recorded multiple pinch hits in a season opener for the second time, joining their inaugural game on March 31, 1998 vs. DET when Bobby Smith and Rich Butler tallied 9th-inning, pinch-hit singles.

ALL ARANDA BASES—Jonathan Aranda went 2-for-4 with a two-run homer on Thursday, becoming the sixth Mexican-born player (9x) to homer on Opening Day, joining BAL Ramón Urías (2023), OAK Erubiel Durazo (2003), CLE/AZ Karim Garcia (2003, 1998), ATL/COL Vinny Castilla (2002, 1997-98), and CLE Bobby Ávila (1953)...the homer came off Cardinals starter Matthew Liberatore, Aranda's second career long ball off a southpaw along with July 29, 2025 vs. NYY (Max Fried)...he has recorded an RBI in seven consecutive games dating back to July 29, 2025, one game shy of the franchise record (8G) shared by Yandy Diaz (2024), Ben Zobrist (2009), Evan Longoria (2009), Carlos Peña (2008), and Rocco Baldelli (2004)...it also ties Castilla (April 12-19 [G2]) for the second-longest streak by a Mexican-born player in MLB history, trailing Castilla's 10-game run from April 14-25, 2004.

★ Aranda has also hit safely in eight straight games (July 28, 2025-pres.), the second-longest streak of his career behind June 15-28, 2025 (13G), and reached base safely in 15 straight (July 19, 2025-pres.), the longest active streak in the AL and third longest in the majors to LAD Shohei Ohtani (33G) and AZ Geraldo Perdomo (19G)...it also falls one game shy of the longest on-base streak of his career (16G, June 11-28, 2025).

CASH CONSIDERATIONS—Entering his 12th season, Rays manager Kevin Cash is the longest-tenured skipper in the majors with his current club...in 2024, he surpassed his predecessor, Joe Maddon (2006-14), as the longest-tenured manager in Rays history...Cash is 896-785 (533) with the Rays, the most wins and highest winning pct. of any Rays skipper...the 896 career victories are fourth most among active managers, trailing CIN Terry Francona (2,033), DET A.J. Hinch (966), and LAD Dave Roberts (946).

- ★ Upon earning his 900th win, he will become the ninth manager in major league history to reach that mark while managing a single club in his career...the current list: LAD Walter Alston, LAA Mike Scioscia, LAD Tommy Lasorda, BAL Earl Weaver, MIN Tom Kelly, DET Hughie Jennings, PIT Danny Murtaugh, and STL Red Schoendienst.
- ★ Cash, who joined the Rays on Dec. 5, 2014, is the fifth-longest-tenured manager/head coach in the big four North American professional sports leagues (MLB, NBA, NFL, NHL) by hiring date...he trails only Erik Spoelstra (NBA's Miami Heat, April 2008), Andy Reid (NFL's Kansas City Chiefs, Jan. 2013), Jon Cooper (NHL's Tampa Bay Lightning, March 2013), and Steve Kerr (NBA's Golden State Warriors, May 2014).

HOUSE OF CARDS—The Rays and Cardinals complete a three-game season series this week at Busch Stadium, the 11th set between the clubs since Tampa Bay's inaugural 1998 campaign...the Rays are 5-4-1 in the previous 10 series, taking two of three games in the most recent meeting from Aug. 21-23, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field...they lost the opener, 7-4, before outscoring the Cardinals, 17-8, over the next two games...that series featured the Aug. 22 major league debut of Rays No. 1 prospect (MLB.com) Carson Williams, who matched a club record for a player's first big-league game with 3 RBI...the Rays are seeking their first series win at Busch Stadium since Aug. 25-27, 2017.

★ The Rays are 15-14 against the Cardinals all time, including 12-7 in the last 19 matchups dating back to June 11, 2014.

TODAY'S START—Joe Boyle will make his first start of the campaign today...marks the second time in his career he has faced the Cardinals...he was acquired from the Athletics along with INF Will Simpson, RHP Jacob Watters, and a Competitive Balance Round A selection for LHP Jeffrey Springs and LHP Jacob Lopez, Dec. 14, 2024.

- ✦ This season marks his second career Opening Day roster (2024 w/ OAK) and his first with the Rays...he is one of 16 Rays to have made their first Opening Day roster with the organization in 2026.
- ✦ At 6'8", he is tied for the fifth tallest pitcher in Rays history, behind only Paul Gervase (6'10"), Aaron Slegers (6'10"), Aaron Slegers (6'9"), and Jeff Niemann (6'9").

LAST TIME OUT—Boyle last pitched in relief on March 17 vs. NYY in Port Charlotte, Fla., going 3.0 innings...he was tagged for two runs on two hits and a spring-high four walks...his six strikeouts in the game tied his spring training career high (3x), and marked his second six strikeout outing against New York-AL this spring (March 6 at NYY).

ONE BIRD, TWO BIRD, RED BIRD—Made his lone career start against the Cardinals last season at Steinbrenner Field...he suffered the loss after he spun 4.0 innings on Aug. 21 and allowed six runs (5ER) on 9 H, 3 BB, and 1 HBP with 5 SO.

- ✦ Across his career, he has made 10 career starts against NL opposition to a 2-4 record, 5.54 ERA (39.OIP, 24ER), and a .242 (36-for-149) opp. average...today marks just his fourth road start in an NL ballpark, starting at Citi Field (Aug. 13, 2024 at NYM), Great American Ball Park (Aug. 29, 2024 at CIN), and Oracle Park (Aug. 15, 2025 at SF) previously.

NERVOUS FLYER—In 13 career appearances (nine starts) on the road, he holds a 2-5 record, 7.07 ERA (49.2IP, 39ER), and 56 strikeouts...compared to a 4-5 record, 3.41 ERA (66.OIP, 25ER), and 73 strikeouts in 16 games (13 starts) in his home ballparks.

A YEAR IN REVIEW—The right-hander split time between Tampa Bay and Triple-A Durham in 2025, making a combined 31 appearances (26 starts)...in the majors, he went 1-4 with a 4.67 ERA (52.OIP, 27ER) and a .221 (43-for-195) opp. average...in Durham, he spun a 8-4 record with a 1.88 ERA (86.OIP, 18ER), 114 strikeouts, and 1.01 WHIP...he allowed three runs or fewer in every minor league outing, with a total of five quality starts and nine scoreless outings.

- ✦ He was named a Baseball America Triple-A All-Star, International League Postseason All-Star in 2025 in addition to winning International League Pitcher of the Month and Rays Minor League Pitcher of the Month in June...additionally, he won the International League Pitcher of the Week on three occasions (April 20, May 18, June 8).
- ✦ He made five starts with one relief appearance in June to a 3-0 record, 1.80 ERA (30.OIP, 6ER), 49 strikeouts, and a 0.97 WHIP...his 49 strikeouts were the most at the Triple-A level in a single month since May 2019 (Zac Gallen, 50) and the fourth most since 2015.

ALRIGHT, ALRIGHT, ALRIGHT—Boyle has held righties to a .192 batting average (40-for-208) in his career...he has allowed just 13 extra-base hits, walked 31 batters, and struck out 66 right-handed batters...meanwhile, lefties have hit at a .241 clip (53-for-220) against him with 20 extra-base hits, 42 walks, and 63 strikeouts.

FIRST THINGS FIRST—Across his career, Boyle has a .181 (37-for-204) opp. average on his first time thru the order with 12 extra-base hits (7 2B, 5HR), a .623 OPS, and 69 strikeouts...his second time through the order he holds a .207 (35-for-169) opp. average, 14 extra-base hits (9 2B, 3B, 4HR), 47 strikeouts, and a .654 OPS.

- ✦ Last season opposing hitters went 18-for-98 (.184) the first time facing him with 5 2B, 2HR) and a .600 OPS.

FIRING FLAMES—In 2025, Boyle threw 28 pitches at 100.0 mph or more, eighth most in the AL among right-handers and 11th among all pitchers...his average fallball velocity a year ago was 98.5 mph, which ranked 23rd among all major league pitchers and seventh in the AL...his 98.5 mph average was a 0.8 mph improvement from 2024 (97.7mph).

FIRST IMPRESSIONS—Boyle's first start for the Rays came in a spot start on April 13, 2025 vs. ATL...he earned his first and only win of 2025 after tossing 5.0 hitless innings (2R, 0ER) with 2 BB, 1 HBP, and 7 SO...the right-hander retired 13 straight batters to open the game before allowing his first baserunner to reach via walk in the 5th inning...put out the next two batters before yielding a hit-by-pitch and a walk to end his outing.

- ✦ He became one of 22 players since 1901 to toss five hitless innings (or more) in his debut with a team and the second Ray to turn the trick (Nathan Eovaldi - 6.OIP on May 30, 2018 at OAK).

A SLIDING SCALE—Tossed a total of 58 strikeouts in the majors in 2025, with 32 of those coming on sliders...his 32 strikeouts via slider were the most on the Rays last season and tied for the eighth most by a Ray since 2020.

FINISH HIM—In two strike counts last season, he held opposing hitters to a .117 (13-for-111) average with 58 strikeouts in 126 plate appearances...in such situations, he held opponents to a .402 OPS with five extra-base hits (4 2B, HR).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: LHP STEVEN MATZ (0-0, -.-)

LAST TIME OUT—Earned the win on March 23 at PHI after 5.0 scoreless frames with one walk and four strikeouts...he closed spring training with a 1-0 record, 0.00 ERA over 11.0 innings and a 0.82 WHIP.

vs. CARDINALS—In four career starts against the Cardinals, he is 0-3 with a 7.13 ERA (17.2IP, 14ER), .275 (19-for-69) opp. average, and 17 strikeouts...it marks the third time in his career that the former Cardinal has pitched against St. Louis in Busch Stadium.
