TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME! With anticipated high attendance figures this weekend due to the U.S. Open, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets downed the Nationals, 7-3, last night...The Mets have won three straight games and have won six of their last eight contests...New York will play nine of their next 15 games at home...The Mets are 68-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 30-8-3 in 41 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-day, 10-game homestand (6-2), the second-longest of the year, against the Rockies (3-1), Dodgers (2-1) and Nationals (1-0)...Following this series, New York hits the road for a seven-day, six-game trip to Pittsburgh (three games) and Miami (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY! David Peterson celebrates his 27th birthday today...He is 7-3 with a 3.32 ERA (35 earned runs/95.0 innings) with 41 walks and 110 strikeouts in 21 games (17 starts) this year...Peterson has not allowed more than three runs in any of his last 10 starts...He has struck out at least five batters in each of those starts...He is the first lefty to record at least five strikeouts in 10 straight starts for the Mets since Johan Santana from April 24-June 25, 2012.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Max Scherzer is tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...Roger Clemens also had 110 in his career...Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212) are the top two.

HOME IS WHERE THE K'S ARE: Scherzer is 4-2 with a 1.66 ERA (11 ER/59.2 IP) in nine home starts this season with 71 strikeouts and just 10 walks...His 30.3 percent strikeout rate at home ranks sixth in the NL while his 1.66 home ERA ranks third in the league (min. 50.0 IP).

MILESTONE ALERT: Scherzer has 199 career wins, one away from joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (242) and Zack Greinke (223) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career... He is 199-101 in his career...If he wins his next decision, he will reach 200 career wins and be 99 games over .500...Elias says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came with fewer losses on their résumé: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96)...Randy Johnson was also 99 games over .500 at the time of his 200th career victory.

200 SPRINT: Scherzer's 200th win, if it happens today, would come in his 427th career game...He would be the 30th pitcher to win 200 of his first 427 career appearances...The other 29 pitchers include 23 Hall of Famers as well as Roger Clemens, Andy Pettitte, CC Sabathia, Justin Verlander, Tim Hudson and George Mullin.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo recorded his 500th career hit last night...He has recorded hits in four straight games...He is 7-17 in that span with three runs, two doubles, a triple, two RBI with a .412 OBP and a .647 SLG in that span...Over his last 19 games, Nimmo is batting .292 (21-72) with 11 runs, six doubles, a triple, two home runs, six RBI, 10 walks with a .393 OBP and a .486 SLG.

WASHINGTON D.C. IS PARADISE TO ME: Pete Alonso is a lifetime .335 (75-224) hitter with 42 runs, 16 doubles, a triple, 22 home runs, 49 RBI, 29 walks with a .426 OBP and a .710 SLG in 62 career games against the Nationals...It's his highest home run and RBI total against any one opponent...Only Darryl Strawberry (31), Howard Johnson (24) and David Wright (24) have hit more home runs against the franchise.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 26 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985)...That is the most by any player since the statistic was officially tracked in 1974...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) with 27 each are the only players with more in a season (data incomplete pre-1974)...Alonso has 11 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 12 of the Mets' 27 second-half wins.

WASH AND FOLD: The Mets have won all four games against the Nationals at Citi Field this year...They are 11-2 against Washington at Citi Field since the start of last season, posing a 2.79 ERA in that span with a .320/.377/.525 slashline...They have outscored them 78-35...In 2022, the Mets are 11-3 against the Nationals, posting a 2.71 ERA and a .302/.381/.465 slashline...They have outscored the Nats 82-40 in 2022...The Mets have recorded 10 or more wins in four of their last five seasons against Washington...The franchise record for total wins against Washington/Montreal in a single-season is 14 accomplished in 1991...Since the team moved to D.C., the Mets have recorded a record 12 wins against the club three times (2019, 2008 and 2006).

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have clinched the season series against the Nats and have won it in four of the last five years.

AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 45-87 Nationals today...Each of their next 15 games and 23 of their 29 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 46-18 against teams with a record below .500 this year, giving them a .719 winning percentage...Their .719 winning percentage is the third-highest in MLB vs. sub-.500 opponents.

WHEN YOU'RE 15: Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte have record at least 15 doubles, 15 home runs and stolen 15 bases this season...They are the first pair of Mets teammates to accomplish that feat in the same season since Carlos Beltrán, José Reyes and David Wright did so in 2008...Lindor and Marte joined Texas's Adolis García and Marcus Semien as the only pair of teammates to hit 15 or more home runs and record 15 or more stolen bases this season...Lindor also joined Trea Turner, Tim Anderson and José Ramírez as the only players with four seasons of 15 or more homers and 15 or more steals since 2017.

HECK OR HIGHWATER: The Mets are a season-high 37 games over .500...Prior to this year, it is the most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60), their highwater mark for the year...New York has won 85 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the second-most in the majors...Their .639 winning percentage is third in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 85-48 record through the team's first 133 games...Only the 1986 (89-44) team posted a better record through the first 133 games of the season.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .675 winning percentage following the All-Star break...That is the highest winning percentage in franchise history, above the 1969 (.671), 1988 (.644) teams...The Mets are 27-13 in the second-half...The team's 27 wins are tied for the second-most in the majors...The team is batting .269/.338/.436 following the All-Star break...They are third in the majors in OBP and rank fourth in SLG and fifth in average following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 187-137 following the break.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 144 consecutive days...According to Elias, it's the fourth longest-streak in franchise history.

CITI SLICKERS: New York has won 14 of its last 17 games at home...Overall, the Mets are 46-21 at Citi Field...New York's 46 wins at home are the most in the majors...They are third in the majors and second in National League with a .687 winning percentage at home...The team's .687 winning percentage is currently the second-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700) had a better home winning percentage...They are right above the 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679)...The Mets have posted a 3.03 ERA with 189 walks and 659 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL...The Mets have struck out 659 at home this year...That is already the eighth most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

ADAM'S SONG: Adam Ottavino is 1-0 with three saves and a 1.00 ERA (two earned runs/18.0 innings) with four walks and 24 strikeouts in 17 appearances following the All-Star break...Overall, he is 5-2 with three saves and a 2.01 ERA (12 earned run/53.2 innings) with 14 walks and 65 strikeouts in 54 appearances this year...Opponents are averaging 85.0 MPH exit velocity against Ottavino...That is the eighth-lowest in the majors and sixth-lowest in the National League...Teammate Edwin Díaz ranks ninth-lowest in the majors with a 85.1 MPH opponents exit velo.

PUTTING UP LUG-O'S: Seth Lugo has not allowed a run in 10 of his last 11 appearances...He has tossed 11.0 innings in that span, allowed eight hits, four walks, struck out 15 and posted a 0.82 ERA (one earned run/11.0 innings)...In 17 games following the All-Star break, Lugo has posted a 1.56 ERA (three earned runs/17.1 innings) with seven walks and 20 strikeouts...Lugo ranks ninth in Mets history with 319 strikeouts as a reliever.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,255 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...Only the Braves with 1,272 have struck out more...The team's 1,255 strikeouts are already the eighth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.54 K/9 IP, a rate... Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.6 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz has struck out 49.0% of batters faced (100/201), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 53 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.04 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 3-1 with 29 saves, a 1.52 ERA (nine earned runs/52.1 IP), allowing 31 hits and 17 walks...The Mets are 47-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

30 FOR 39: Díaz is tied for fourth in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Set or tied season-high marks in innings, strikeouts and pitches thrown as he held the Rockies to one run over 7.0 innings with 11 strikeouts, needing 112 pitches to complete his outing on August 28 at Citi Field...Was dealt a tough-luck loss as the Mets were blanked, 1-0...Was the second time this season he pitched in a 1-0 Mets loss (also, July 5 at Cincinnati)...Of the seven Scherzer starts the Mets have lost this season, five have come in one-run games and all seven have been decided by three runs or fewer...Despite missing almost two months on the IL, Scherzer moved into the team lead in strikeouts in his last outing.

MILESTONE ALERT: Scherzer has 199 career wins, one away from joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (242) and Zack Greinke (223) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career...He is 199-101 in his career...If he wins his next decision, he will reach 200 career wins and be 99 games over .500...Elias says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came with fewer losses on their résumé: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96)...Randy Johnson was also 99 games over .500 at the time of his 200th career victory.

HARD TO BEAT POCKET ACES: Scherzer had 44 strikeouts in August and teammate Jacob deGrom punched out 55 last month...It's the first time a pair of Mets each recorded at least 44 strikeouts in the same calendar month since David Cone (47) and Sid Fernandez (44) each did it in August 1990...The only duo in Mets history to produce more than Scherzer and deGrom's 99 August strikeouts in a calendar month is Tom Seaver (53) and Jerry Koosman, (47) who combined for 100 strikeouts in June 1969.

HOME IS WHERE THE K'S ARE: Scherzer is 4-2 with a 1.66 ERA (11 ER/59.2 IP) in nine home starts this season with 71 strikeouts and just 10 walks...His 30.3 percent strikeout rate at home ranks sixth in the NL (min. 50.0 IP) while his 1.66 home ERA ranks third in the league.

RETURN OF THE MAX: Since returning from the IL on July 5, Scherzer has gone 4-3 with a 2.10 ERA (17 ER/73.0 IP) in 11 starts...That is the third-lowest ERA in the NL and the sixth-lowest mark in the majors...He leads the major leagues with 89 strikeouts since that date...Scherzer's 73.0 innings since his return are third-most in the majors...He is second in the NL and fourth in the majors with an 8.09 K/BB ratio since July 5.

VS. WASHINGTON: Scherzer has won both of his starts against his former club this season and the Mets were victorious each time by an identical 7-3 score...He threw a quality start each time out, tossing a total of 12.2 innings with 11 strikeouts over the two starts...He has never lost a start to the Nationals.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...Roger Clemens also had 110 in his career...Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212) are the top two.

THE 7.0 LINE: Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings eight times in 19 starts this season...Each time Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings this season, he has finished his outing with one or no runs allowed...Despite missing seven weeks on the Injured List, those seven outings of 7.0+ innings while allowing one or no runs are still tied for the third-most in the majors.

CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD: Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts...He was passed by Justin Verlander while on the IL and the two veterans have been swapping places on the leaderboard since...He now ranks 13th all-time, one ahead of Verlander...Scherzer is still within striking distance of Fergie Jenkins as well this season...He needs 25 strikeouts to pass Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

LAST TIME OUT: Carrasco exited his start on August 15 at Atlanta after 2.0 innings with left side tightness...He took the loss after giving up three runs on four hits (two home runs) and a walk with one strikeout...He was placed on the 15-day Injured List on August 16 with a low-grade left oblique strain.

WINNER, WINNER: Prior to his last start, Carrasco had won each of his five previous decisions from July 3-August 9, his second-longest win-streak of the season...Won six consecutive decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...His 13 wins on the season are tied for the sixth-most in the majors.
