RAY REPORT—The Rays conclude their nine-game, 10-day road trip against the Rockies (3-0), Mariners (3-0), and Athletics (2-0, one to play) today at Sutter Health Park...following tomorrow's off day, will open a seven-game homestand against the Orioles (4G) and Blue Jays (3G) on Friday night...are a season-high 27 games above .500, the sixth season in 29 campaigns they have reached that mark (also: 2023, 2021, 2019, 2010, 2008)...reached 27 games over on Aug. 11, third earliest in club history behind 2023 (June 8) and 2010 (Aug. 2)...have won eight straight contests and are a majors-best 17-4 in their last 21 games (July 20–pres.) on the heels of a five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...have spent 87 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including a season-high 46 consecutive days in first (June 27–pres.)...the 87 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (134), Braves (132), Brewers (102), and Guardians (95)...have held the best record in the AL outright for 85 of those days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), per Stats Perform...hold a season-high-tying 6.0-game lead in the AL East, their largest in August or later since winning the division by 8.0 games in 2021...marks the fifth season they have led the division by 6.0 games or more, joining 2023 (largest lead: 6.5), 2021 (largest lead: 9.5), 2020 (largest lead: 7.0), and 2010 (largest lead: 6.0)...their 73-46 record is tied with 2010 for the best in team history through 119 games.

- ★ The Rays matched a franchise record with 6 HR (see table on the right) and **Nick Martinez** threw his first career 9.0-inning complete game in last night's 12-4 victory, securing a series win...it marked the second complete game by a Ray since 2022, joining **Zack Littell** on May 31, 2025 at HOU, and the first on 101 pitches or fewer since **Chris Archer** (98) on Aug. 20, 2015 at HOU...the club's 12 runs tied the Rays most in any road game this season, matching July 21 at TOR (12-2).
- ★ **Taylor Walls** also recorded his first two home runs of the campaign, one from each side of the plate...according to Stats Perform, it marked the third time since 2000 that a club saw its starting pitcher throw a complete game and had a player homer from both sides of the plate in the same game, joining the Yankees on Aug. 2, 2011 at CWS (Phil Hughes CG, Mark Teixeira 2 HR) and the Red Sox on Aug. 29, 2000 at TB (Pedro Martinez CG, Carl Everett 2 HR).
- ★ With the win, the Rays have claimed four straight road series victories for the first time since April 22–May 15, 2025, including three straight series wins on the same road trip for the first time since July 28–Aug. 6, 2023 (at HOU/NYY/DET)...they have won six of their last seven sets (July 20–pres.) and are 10-3-2 in their last 15 series (June 19–pres.).
- ★ Paired with their nine-game streak from June 24–July 3, the Rays have recorded multiple winning streaks of eight games or more in a season for the third time, joining 2021 and 2018...they have the majors' most winning streaks of five games or more (6), six games or more (5), seven games or more (3), and eight games or more (2, 1st with BOS).
- ★ The Rays have won the first eight games of a road trip for the first time in team history...this marks the club's eighth road winning streak of eight games or more, first since April 19–May 7, 2022 (8G)...it falls one game shy of the franchise record (9G, 3x, last: May 9-31, 2021).
- ★ The club has won nine of its first 10 games to open August for the first time and needs to go 6-12 or better over the next 18 games to secure a winning month...the Rays are attempting to complete a season without recording a losing month in a non-shortened season for the first time...they did not tally a losing month during the 60-game 2020 campaign.
- ★ The Rays have been successful on 18 of their last 19 stolen bases attempts (July 30–pres.) to surpass the Guardians (11/5B) for the AL lead with 119 SB...**Chandler Simpson**, whose 33 SB pace the AL, has been successful on a career-high 14 straight attempts.

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win today, the Rays would:

- ★ Complete the first undefeated, three-series (or more) road trip in franchise history...become the majors' second team this season to turn the trick along with the Red Sox from July 3-12.
- ★ Become the 13th team in the modern era (since 1900) to go 9-0 or better on a single road trip (see table on the right), including the fifth since 2003.
- ★ Earn their ninth consecutive win, matching a season high (also: June 24–July 3)...record multiple winning streaks of nine games or more in a season for the second time, joining 2021 (11G, 9G).
- ★ Win their ninth straight road game, tying the longest streak in Rays history for the fourth time, joining May 9-31, 2021; Aug. 15-31, 2020; and July 28–Aug. 13, 2019.
- ★ Record their MLB-leading 13th series sweep, surpassing 2018 and 2013 (12) for second most in team history behind 2021 (14)...tie the 2021 Rays for the club's most sweeps before the end of August.
- ★ Sweep three consecutive road series for the first time...earn their fourth sweep in their last seven series away from home (June 30–pres.) after sweeping one of their first 13 road sets.
- ★ Tally their fifth sweep on the road, tying the Yankees for second most in MLB to the Red Sox (6)...would tie 2019, 2012, and 2011 for third most in franchise history behind 2021 (7) and 2013 (6).
- ★ Sweep the Athletics for the seventh time, first since April 7-9, 2023...sweep the A's on the road for the second time, joining May 2-4, 2022 at Oakland Coliseum.
- ★ Improve to 74-46, keeping pace with the 2010 Rays for the best record in franchise history through the first 119 games of a season...improve to a season-high 28 games over .500.

DREW DAY—**Drew Rasmussen** carries a 20.0 scoreless inning streak into today's outing, the longest active streak in the AL and third longest in MLB to **MIL Abner Uribe** (21.2) and **CHC Jacob Webb** (20.2)...it falls 4.2 IP shy of the longest streak by a starter in club history, a mark set by **Alex Cobb** (24.2IP) from April 1–May 27, 2014...it also falls 7.1 IP shy of the longest single-season streak by any Rays pitcher, which belongs to **J.P. Howell** (27.1IP from June 14–Aug. 30, 2012)...it marks the second-longest streak of Rasmussen's career behind his 23.0-IP run from May 17–June 3, 2025, which remains the third longest by a starter in team history—**Taj Bradley** (24.0IP from July 6-31, 2024) holds the second-longest streak...for the full list of longest scoreless inning streaks by Rays pitchers, see page 299 of the 2026 Rays Media Guide.

- ★ Rasmussen has worked a club-record-tying three straight scoreless starts of 6.0 IP or more...this marks the sixth such streak in Rays history—he is the only Tampa Bay hurler to turn the trick twice, also doing so from May 17-28, 2025...the only AL pitcher since 2006 with a four-start streak is **DET Michael Fulmer** (4GS) from May 27–June 12, 2016...a fourth straight such start today would tie the second-longest streak in AL history (16x) behind **CWS Doc White's** five-start streak from Sept. 12-30, 1904.

THE CAMINER SHOW—**Junior Caminero** launched his 35th home run in the opening frame last night, tying **HOU Yordan Alvarez**, **ATL Matt Olson**, and **PHI Kyle Schwarber** for the major league lead...per Elias, this marks the latest into a season a Rays player has held at least a share of the MLB lead in homers—the previous mark belonged to **Jose Canseco** in 1999 (latest date: June 28, 28HR)...paired with his 45 HR last season, he joined **Carlos Peña** (2009, 2007) as the only players in franchise history with multiple 35-HR campaigns...Caminero also joined **CLE Jose Ramirez** (4), **TEX/LAD Adrian Beltre** (2), and **CHC Aramis Ramirez** (2) as the only Dominican-born third basemen with multiple 35-HR seasons in their careers at 23 years, 37 days old when he reached the mark. Caminero became the second-youngest player in MLB history with consecutive 35-HR seasons, trailing only the Milwaukee Braves **Eddie Mathews** (1953-54; 22, 328), according to MLB.com's Sarah Langs. Langs also noted that this is the first time there has been a four-way tie (or more) atop the MLB home run leaderboard on Aug. 11 or later since the end of play on Sept. 9, 1982 (34 HR—**CAL Reggie Jackson**, **NYM Dave Kingman**, **ATL Dale Murphy**, **MIL Gorman Thomas**).

- ★ Caminero has honored in two consecutive games (or more) for the 18th time in his career, tied with **Aubrey Huff** for fourth most in franchise history, six streaks shy of third-ranked **Brandon Lowe** (24)...with a long ball today, he would record his fifth streak of three games or more, surpassing Huff, **Kevin Kiermaier**, **Austin Meadows**, and Peña for sole possession of second most in club history behind **Evan Longoria** (9).
- ★ He paces the majors with 20 HR in his last 44 games since June 23, five more than any other player in that timeframe...Peña (20HR from Aug. 14–Sept. 30, 2007) is the only other Ray to launch 20 HR over a 44-game stretch within a single season.

TAYLOR MADE—**Taylor Walls** snapped a 105-game, 314-AB stretch without a long ball with his second career multi-homer game last night...it marked the first time a player ended a home run drought of 100 games or more with a multi-homer effort since **AZ Zack Greinke** (103G) on April 2, 2019 at SD, and the second time a non-pitcher has turned the trick since 1999, joining **DET Efren Navarro** (109G) on Sept. 23, 2017 vs. MIN (Elias)...Walls became the first switch hitter in franchise history to record multiple games in which he homered from both sides of the plate in his career, joining April 18, 2023 at CIN—in that contest, the second of his two homers came off current teammate **Casey Legumina**...it was only the fifth such game in team history, also joining multi-homer efforts by switch hitters **Ben Zobrist** (April 13, 2014 at CIN), **Willy Aybar** (Aug. 3, 2009 vs. KC), and **Geoff Blum** (May 4, 2004 at TEX)...Walls became the seventh nine-hole hitter in club history with a multi-homer game, including the second since 2016 along with **René Pinto** on April 14, 2024 vs. SF, and the first Tampa Bay shortstop to do so while batting ninth...he joined **CHC Dansby Swanson** (2x, last: July 1 vs. SD) as the only shortstops to tally a multi-homer game while batting ninth this season, becoming the first AL player to accomplish the feat since **OAK Nick Allen** on Aug. 6, 2023 vs. SF...entering last night, the Rays had recorded an MLB-low 4 HR from the ninth spot in the order all season.

HIT MACHINE—**Yandy Diaz** homered last night for the second straight game, tallying his 1,017th hit as a Ray to surpass **Ben Zobrist** (1,016) for sole possession of third most in franchise history, trailing **Carl Crawford** (1,480) and **Evan Longoria** (1,471)...he joins **HOU Jose Altuve** (2nd, 2,477), **AZ Ketel Marte** (2nd, 1,213), and **LAA Mike Trout** (2nd, 1,839) as the only active players to rank among their current franchise's top-three all-time leaders in hits...Diaz's 116 HR with the Rays are two shy of matching **B.J. Upton** (118HR) for fifth on the club's all-time list...he has homered in back-to-back games for the eighth time in his career (last: May 29-30, 2026)—Diaz has never gone deep in three straight contests.

TODAY'S START—Drew Rasmussen will toe the rubber today for his 23rd start of the campaign and 153rd career appearance (104th start)...has made the ninth-most starts in franchise history (103GS), trailing seventh-ranked **Jeremy Hellickson** and **Blake Snell** (108GS)...carries a 20.0 scoreless inning streak into today's outing, the longest active streak in the AL and 4.2 IP shy of the longest streak by a starter in club history, a mark set by **Alex Cobb** (24.2IP) from April 1-May 27, 2014, and 7.1 IP shy of the longest single-season streak by any Rays pitcher, which belongs to **J.P. Howell** (27.1IP from June 14-Aug. 30, 2012)...it marks the second-longest streak of Rasmussen's career behind his 23.0-IP run from May 17-June 3, 2025, which is the third longest by a starter in team history—**Taj Bradley** (24.0IP from July 6-31, 2024) holds the second-longest streak...for the full list of longest scoreless inning streaks in team history, see page 299 of the 2026 Rays Media Guide.

- ✦ He ranks highly among AL arms (min. 100.0IP) in opp. on-base pct. (1st, .249), strikeout-to-walk ratio (1st, 5.91), WHIP (1st, 0.91), opp. OPS (2nd, .556), walks per 9.0 innings (2nd, 1.59), opp. AVG (3rd, .200), fWAR (3rd, 3.5), and opp. SLG (3rd, .311).
- ✦ He has limited right-handed batters to a .167 (29-for-174) clip this season, the lowest mark in MLB (min. 150BF), ahead of TOR **Trey YeSavage** (.176).
- ✦ Since 2021, his 2.78 ERA (.569.2IP, 176ER) ranks second among all major league pitchers (min 500.0IP) behind LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (2.68).
- ✦ Since the start of 2025, Rasmussen's 19 scoreless starts are the most in the majors...since the start of 2022, his 145 ERA+ is the highest mark among active AL arms (min. 400.0IP).
- ✦ Has posted a career 16-5 (.762) record across 58 day appearances (42 starts), logging a 2.27 ERA (229.2IP, 58ER)...Rasmussen's winning pct. in day games is the highest clip in franchise history (min. 150.0IP) and his ERA is the lowest mark under the same parameters.
- ✦ Today, he looks to become the seventh Rays pitcher (10x) to earn the win in five consecutive starts, including the first since **Shane McClanahan** (5GS) from May 17-June 9, 2022.

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his team-leading 11th win of the year after striking out eight batters over 7.0 shutout innings on his way to his fourth straight win, extending his scoreless streak to 20.0 innings, on Aug. 7 at SEA (W, 7.0IP, 2H, 0ER, 2BB, 8SO)...after allowing a pair of hits to two of his first five batters faced, he did not allow another hit, retiring 17 of his final 19 batters before handing the ball over to the bullpen to begin the 8th inning.

- ✦ Marked his third consecutive shutout start of 6.0 innings or more and his eighth of the season, one shy of MLB leader PHI **Cristopher Sánchez** (8).
- ✦ Was his 16th outing allowing one or zero extra-base hits this season, tied for the most among AL starters with LAA/TOR **José Soriano** and TOR **Dylan Cease**.
- ✦ Rasmussen has worked a club-record-tying three straight scoreless starts of 6.0 IP or more...this marks the sixth such streak in Rays history—he is the only Tampa Bay hurler to turn the trick twice, also doing so from May 17-28, 2025...the only AL pitcher since 2006 with a four-start streak is DET **Michael Fulmer** (4GS) from May 27-June 12, 2016...a fourth straight such start today would tie the second-longest streak in AL history (16x) behind CWS **Doc White**'s five-start streak from Sept. 12-30, 1904.

JUST THE ATHLETICS—Across five career appearances (four starts) against the Athletics, Rasmussen is 3-0 with a 2.45 ERA (22.0IP, 6ER), a .141 (11-for-78) opp. average, and 21 strikeouts...in those four starts, he is 3-0 with a 2.57 ERA (21.0IP, 6ER), a .137 (10-for-73) opp. average, and 18 strikeouts...his teams are 4-1 lifetime against the A's...made his most recent start against the Athletics on Aug. 13, 2025 at Sutter Health Park, posting a quality start after giving up one earned run on three hits in a Rays 9-2 victory (6.0IP, 3H, 2R-1ER, 5SO, HR).

- ✦ He is 10-4 with a 3.18 ERA (108.2IP, 38ER) over 24 career appearances (20 starts) vs. AL West foes, including 10-4 with a 3.35 ERA (102.0IP, 38ER) in the 20 starts.
- ✦ The Athletics are one of three clubs he's earned three career wins or more against without a loss...the other clubs are the Marlins (4-0) and Mariners (3-0).

ROAD WORK AHEAD—The right-hander is making his 12th start on the road this season...is 4-2 with a 2.73 ERA (62.2IP, 19ER) and 62 strikeouts to 10 walks...Rasmussen has logged a career 21-9 record with a 2.99 ERA (285.2IP, 95ER) across 76 road contests (53 starts).

- ✦ Since 2021, Rasmussen's 21 career road wins pace Rays arms...boasts a lifetime .700 (21-9) winning pct. on the road with Tampa Bay, the second-highest clip in franchise history (min. 25GS) behind **David Price** (.701)...with a win today, Rasmussen's .709 (22-9) winning pct. would surpass Price.
