**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners play the second of a 4-game series against the Cleveland Guardians tonight...Seattle will also host the New York Yankees (3 G, 3/30-4/1) on the opening homestand...tonight's game is televised live exclusively on **Apple TV** with **Wayne Randazzo** and **Dontrelle Willis** on the call and **Heidi Watney** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners dropped last night's Opening Day contest to the Guardians by a 6-4 score...Seattle fell to 30-20 in 50 all-time Opening Day games, the 2nd-best opener record in MLB history.

- **Nationally Televised** - The Mariners are televised nationally tonight (**Apple TV**) and Sunday (**Peacock**) during the opening series of the season...Seattle is set to be televised nationally 40 times in 2026, including 13 national-exclusive games.
- **The Core Returns** - Of the 26 players on the Mariners Opening Day roster, 22 of them appeared in a game with the club during the 2025 season (in addition to 4 on the Injured List to start the season)... new additions include All-Star INF/OF **Brendan Donovan**, INF/OF **Rob Refsnyder** and pitchers **Cooper Criswell** and **José A. Ferrer**.

**CONNECT FOUR**...the Mariners homered 4 times last night: **Dominic Canzone** (2), **Brendan Donovan** and **Luke Raley** all connected on home runs...Cleveland-born outfielder Canzone became the fourth player in Mariners history with a multi-homer game on Opening Day, joining Jim Presley (1986), Ken Griffey Jr. (1997) and Richie Sexson (2005)...it was Canzone's third career multi-homer game and his first since his 3-homer game on Sept. 16, 2025 at Kansas City...Seattle homered 4+ times in an Opening Day game for the second time in franchise history (also: 4 HR in 1998), marking the 45th time in MLB history a team's homered 4+ times in its first game of the season.

**COLE WILCOX RECALLED**...the Mariners recalled right-handed pitcher **Cole Wilcox** (#43) from Triple-A Tacoma today...right-hander **Carlos Vargas** has been placed on the 15-day Injured List with a right lat strain, retroactive to March 24...Wilcox appeared in one Major League game with Tampa Bay last season and was acquired by Seattle in exchange for cash considerations on Nov. 5, 2025.

**HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE**...the Mariners went 51-30 (.630) at their home ballpark, T-Mobile Park in 2025, the 6th-best home record in MLB and 2nd-best in the AL...Seattle was also an MLB-best 26-9 (.743) at home after the All-Star Break last year, which included a franchise-record tying 11-consecutive wins at home (Aug. 27-Sept. 25) matching the mark set from May 20-June 8, 2001.

**CAL RALEIGH: SEASON FOR THE AGES**...**Cal Raleigh** finished as the runner-up for the AL MVP in 2025 after batting .247 (147x596) with 110 runs, 24 doubles, 60 home runs, 125 RBI, 14 stolen bases, a .359 OBP and slugging .589 for a .948 OPS and 171 OPS+...he **led the Majors** with 60 home runs, becoming the **4th player in AL history** to reach 60 home runs, in addition to setting the **Mariners record** (previous: Ken Griffey Jr.: 56 HR in 1997 & '98), **the catcher record** (previous: Salvador Perez-KC: 48 HR in 2021) and the **switch-hitter record** (previous: Mickey Mantle-NYY: 54 HR in 1961) for most home runs in a season.

**THE COACHING STAFF**...manager **Dan Wilson** enters his second full season as Mariners skipper...returning to the Mariners coaching staff in the same roles are Bench Coach **Manny Acta**, Major League Coach and Director of Pitching Strategy **Trent Blank**, Assistant Pitching Coach and Major League Pitching Strategist **Danny Farquhar**, Infield Coach **Perry Hill**, Asst. Hitting Coach **Bobby Magallanes**, Senior Director of Hitting Strategy **Edgar Martinez**, Hitting Coach **Kevin Seitzer**, Pitching Coach **Pete Woodworth** and First Base Coach **Eric Young Jr.**...joining the staff this season are Third Base Coach **Carlos Cardoza**, Major League Field Coordinator **Jake McKinley** and Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola**... **Fleming Báez** and **Justin Novak** both return as Bullpen Catchers.

**MARINERS TV AVAILABLE ON CABLE, SATELLITE AND STREAMING IN 2026**...the Mariners announced that Mariners TV will bring Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming will be available on Mariners.TV for \$99.99/season or \$19.99/month...Mariners TV is available across major providers including Xfinity, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on [Mariners.com/Watch](https://mariners.com/watch) to find providers in their area.

**OPENING DAY MEDIA EXTRAVAGANZA**...several Mariners players, coaches, and front office personnel appeared on over 20 different shows and programs yesterday prior to Opening Day first pitch...special guests included President of Baseball Operations **Jerry Dipoto**, Executive VP & General Manager **Justin Hollander**, manager **Dan Wilson**, coaches **Pete Woodworth**, **Kevin Seitzer**, and **Eric Young Jr.**, President of Business Operations **Kevin Martinez**, Chairman & Managing Partner **John Stanton**, and more.

**NAYL'D IT**...first baseman **Josh Naylor** signed a 5-year contract through the 2030 season on Nov. 17, 2025 to remain in Seattle...Naylor was originally acquired by the Mariners from the Diamondbacks prior to the trade deadline on July 24, 2025...in 54 regular season games after the trade, Naylor hit .299 (58x194) with 32 runs, 10 doubles, 9 home runs, 33 RBI and went 19-for-19 in stolen base attempts, getting on base at a .341 clip and slugging .490 (.831 OPS)...in 11 Postseason games, he hit .340 with 3 home runs, 5 RBI and a .966 OPS.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...**Brendan Donovan** homered in his very first plate appearance in a Mariners uniform last night...Donovan hit out of the leadoff spot and played third base, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**... Donovan became the first player in Mariners history to hit a **leadoff home run on Opening Day?**...he became the first Mariners player to homer in his first plate appearance with the team since Abraham Toro in 2021...via **Sarah Langs**, Donovan became the first player to hit a **leadoff** homer in his debut with a team since former Mariner Brad Miller did it for the Rangers on April 8, 2022, and Kyle Schwarber for the Phillies on that same date.

- **2025** - Manager **Dan Wilson** gets his first career Opening Day win as manager with a 4-2 victory over the Athletics...Jorge Polanco went 3-for-3 with a go-ahead home run in the bottom of the 8th inning, becoming the 9th player in Mariners history to record 3+ hits and homer on Opening Day...Opening Day starter **Logan Gilbert** became the first Mariners pitcher to record 8+ strikeouts and no walks in an Opening Day start.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his first start of the 2026 season and the 112th of his career.
• Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
• Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
• Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
• Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

2025 TOTALS...Went 10-8 with a 4.21 ERA (59 ER, 126.0 IP) with 29 walks and 137 strikeouts over 23 starts.

REVIVING UP...Closed out 2026 spring training with a 3.77 ERA over four starts (6 ER, 14.1 IP), recording 11 punch outs and 5 walks in the process...allowed 17 hits and just 1 home run.

CLEVELAND IN CHECK...In 24.2 innings pitched over five career starts against the Guardians, has only allowed 3 walks while recording 19 strikeouts...Is the only starting pitcher in Mariners franchise history to not allow a walk in three consecutive starts (9/4/22-4/3/24) against Cleveland... is tied with Jamie Moyer for the franchise record in career starts with no walks (4) facing the Guardians.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME...Went 3-1 with a 2.70 ERA (10 ER, 33.1 IP) and 44 strikeouts to 10 walks across his last 6 home starts of the 2025 regular season (7/31/25-9/26/25)...his 3.07 career ERA (107 ER, 313.2 IP) at home ranks 3rd-best in Mariners history among pitchers with 50+ career home starts, trailing Luis Castillo (2.80) and James Paxton (2.99)...his 7.02 career strikeout-to-walk ratio at home is a franchise-best mark, ahead of Logan Gilbert (6.46).

K FOR KIRBY...Wrapped the 2025 season with a career-best 9.8 strikeouts-per-nine innings, surpassing his previous career-high 9.2 SO/9 in 2022, and a career-best K% of 26.1...tossed a combined 31 strikeouts across his last 3 starts of the 2025 regular season (9/14-9/26) which is the most by a Mariner across a 3-game span since James Paxton tossed 33 strikeouts from April 26-May 8, 2018.

NO FREE PASSES...Has not allowed more than 3 walks in any start over his first 112 career games...owns the 2nd-longest streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher, behind only Carlos Silva's 150 game streak from 8/2/2003-8/15/2008.

FEW FREE BAGS...has allowed 2-or-fewer walks in 105 of 112 career regular season starts, which are the most such games in the MLB through a starting pitcher's first 112 career starts, ranking ahead of Chris Paddack (101 G, 2019-2025)...are also the 3rd-most such games by a starting pitcher since 2022, trailing Miles Mikolas-STL (121) and Logan Webb-SF (110) and are tied for 9th-most games by a starting pitcher in Mariners history.

ANOTHER STELLAR SEASON...Finishing the 2025 regular season with a 9.8 strikeouts-per-nine-innings and a walk percentage of 5.5, joins Logan Gilbert (2021, 2024, 2025) and Felix Hernandez (2013, 2014) as one-of-three Mariners starting pitchers to record multiple seasons with a strikeouts-per-nine innings over 9 and a sub-6% walk percentage.

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 500 IP), he leads the Majors in fewest walks allowed (93), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.68), walks-per-nine innings (1.31), and walk rate (3.6%).

500 CLUB...reached 500 career strikeouts on June 8, 2025 vs. Angels, joining James Paxton (563), Félix Hernández (539), Logan Gilbert (526), and Erik Hanson (503) as the only pitchers in Mariners history to collect 500+ strikeouts in their first 93 career starts...allowed just 68 walks to his 509 strikeouts, which are the 2nd-fewest walks allowed by a player through his first 500 career strikeouts, behind Koji Uehara-4 Tms (63 BB).

14:0 (x2)...tossed a career-high 14 strikeouts without a walk twice during the 2025 regular season, on June 8 at LAA then on Sept. 14 vs. LAA at home...was the only pitcher in the MLB last season to record multiple games of 14+ strikeouts without a walk and the first to do so since Jacob deGrom tallied 3 such games in 2021...the feat has also been accomplished only 5 times in franchise history by 3 different pitchers: Kirby (done 2x), Randy Johnson (done 2x) and Mark Langston (done 1x).

FINISHED STRONG...Went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA (4 ER, 17.1 IP), 1 walk and 31 strikeouts over his last 3 starts, limiting opponents to a .177 average with a 0.69 WHIP during that span (9/14-end of season)

2025 POSTSEASON...Made four starts for the Mariners in the 2025 postseason, recording 18.0 innings of work for a 6.00 ERA and 21 strikeouts while allowing only 4 walks...his 8 strikeouts on Oct. 4 in Game 1 of the 2025 ALDS are tied for the 3rd-most by a Mariners pitcher in a Postseason start, alongside Freddy García (2x, last: Oct. 9, 2001 in Game 1 of the ALDS) and trails Randy Johnson, who recorded 13 strikeouts on Oct. 5, 1997 in Game 4 of the ALDS and 10 strikeouts on Oct. 6, 1995 in Game 3 of the ALDS
