AT A GLANCE: The Yankees complete their final homestand of the season today with the final game of a three-game set vs. Arizona (1-1 thus far)...are 2-3 on the homestand after losing two-of-three games vs. Toronto and splitting their first two games vs. Arizona...after this homestand, will

embark on their final road trip of the season, making stops in Toronto (Tues.-Thurs.) and Kansas City (9/29-10/1). With Sunday's loss, the Yankees were eliminated from

- postseason contention for the first time since 2016.
- Are 8-5 in their last 13 games (since 9/10).

 Have posted a 16-9 (.640) record since 8/28, tied for the best record in the Majors over that span...are 18-12 in their last 30 games (since 8/23).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Diamondbacks, 7-1, on Sunday at Yankee Stadium...LHP Carlos Rodón (6.1IP, 5H, 5R/3ER, 1BB, 4K, 0HR) started and took the loss... 1B DJ LeMahieu (1-for-2, 3BB) reached base a season-hightying four times...DH Aaron Judge (1-for-3, 1 double, 1RBI, 2BB) reached base three times and drove in the Yankees' only run with a bases-loaded walk in the ninth...**CF Estevan** Florial (1-for-4, 1 triple) recorded his first career triple in the fifth inning...RHP Randy Vásquez (2.1IP, 3H, 2ER, 2BB, 2K, 1WP) allowed 2ER over 2.1IP...RHP Zach McAllister (0.1IP) retired his only batter faced in the ninth inning.

RARE OCCURRENCE: The Yankees were eliminated from postseason play on Sunday for the first time since 2016... the Yankees were just one of three teams to make the postseason in each of the past six seasons (2017-22, also Houston and Los Angeles-NL)...over that span, 26 teams missed the playoffs at least twice, 22 teams missed the postseason at least three times, 18 teams missed the playoffs at least four times and 13 teams missed the postseason at least five times during that six-season stretch

HOME SWEET HOME: The Yankees are 41-39 at home this season... have clinched their 32nd straight winning **season at home (since 1992)**...according to *Elias*, their streak is the second-longest in Major League history, trailing only their own 47-year streak from 1918-64.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 2.95 ERA (173.2IP, 57ER) in their last 32 games (since 8/20). allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 29 of those 32 starts and 2ER-orfewer in 23 of those starts.

Have posted a 1.69 ERA (26.2IP, 5ER) and 29K in their last four games.

WHERE'S WALDO: INF/OF Oswaldo Cabrera is batting .295 (13-for-44) with 5R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 5BB and 1SB over his last 12 games (since 9/10).

HIGH VOLPAGE: INF Anthony Volpe has had five of his last seven hits, 17 of his last 28 hits, 20 of his last 38 hits and 25 of his last 49 hits have gone for extra bases (12 doubles, 2 triples, 11HR).

GO WITH THE FLO: OF Estevan Florial recorded his first career triple in the fifth inning on Sunday...has hit safely in eight of his last 10 games (since 9/12-G2).

GLEYBER DAY: INF Gleyber Torres is batting .303/.392/.528 (54-for-178) with 28R, 13 doubles, 9HR, 22RBI, 24BB, 2HP and 5SB in 47 games since 8/1...has hit safely in 33 of those games and has reached base safely in 39 of those contests. his .920 OPS since 8/1 is the seventh-highest in the AL (min. 150PA).

Since 7/6, is hitting .301/.368/.504 (77-for-256) with 38R, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 30RBI, 27BB, 3SF, 2HP and 6SB in that span.

BATTERS' EYE: Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a 9.35 PA/BB ratio and a 4.04 pitches per plate appearance ratio...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in PA/BB (11.90) and P/PA (3.86).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge reached base three times on Sunday...is batting .433/.575/.933 (13-for-30) with 7R, 3 doubles, 4HR, 13RBI and 10BB over his last nine games (since 9/14-G2).

- Has reached base in 38-of-80 plate appearances over his last 18 games (since 9/5), posting a .475 OBP in that span (18H, 20BB).
- Has driven in eight of the Yankees' 13R over their last three games (since 9/21).
- Has reached base multiple times in each of his last five games (since 9/19), matching his second-longest streak of the season (6G from 5/17-24 and 5G from 8/6-11)...has also reached base multiple times in nine of his last 12 games (since 9/12-G1), 11 of his last 15 games (since 9/8), 13 of his last 18 games (since 9/5) and 15 of his last 21 games (since 9/1)...has reached base multiple times in 53 of his 101 games this year, including 41 of his last 72 games (since 5/12).
- Each of his last six hits have gone for extra bases (3 doubles, 3HR).
- Has hit 35HR in 101 games this season...is just the fourth player in Major League history to hit at least 35HR in a season while playing in 108 games-or-fewer (the Yankees have seven games remaining this season)... joins Albert Belle (36HR in 106G in 1994 with Cleveland), Mark McGwire (39HR in 104G in 1995 with Oakland) and Rudy York (35HR in 104G in 1937 with Detroit).
- Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, his 35HR are the fourth-most in the AL and his 82BB rank sixth.
- Since being reinstated from the injured list on 7/28, leads the AL with 47BB and ranks second in the Majors, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (57).
- Has hit at least 35HR for his third straight season and for the fourth time in his career (52HR in 2017, 39HR in 2021 and 62HR in 2022)...is the fifth Yankee in franchise history to record at least four such seasons...joins Babe Ruth (12), Lou Gehrig (seven), Mickey Mantle (six) and Alex Rodriguez (five)... is the only Yankee to record at least four 35HR seasons within their first eight
- Major League seasons.
 Has hit .336/.447/.727 (37-for-110) with 24R, 4 doubles, 13HR, 27RBI, 22BB and 1SB in 30 Interleague games this eason...has batted .313/.410/.656 (141-for-450) 94R, 21 doubles, 2 triples, 43HR, 85RBI, 73BB and 9SB in 124 career Interleague games.
- His 3HR on Friday marked his first career home runs against the Arizona Diamondbacks...has now homered against 28-of-29 opponents in his career (0HR in 5G vs. St. Louis).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU: Today is C Ben Rortvedt's 26th birthday (DOB: 9/25/97).

LEMACHINE: INF DJ LeMahieu reached base a season-hightying four times on Sunday (also 8/25 at Tampa Bay and 5/5 at Tampa Bay)...his 3BB on Śunday also matched a season high (also 3BB on 7/25-26 vs. the Mets).
▶ Is batting .314/.415/.400 (11-for-35) with 6R, 3 doubles,

- 5RBI, 6BB and 1SB in his last nine games (since 9/12-G1).
- Since the All-Star break (since 7/14), is hitting .276/.383/.444 (54-for-196) in 54 games in that span... prior to the break, had batted .220/.285/.357 (61-for-277) in 76 games.
- Has reached base multiple times in 20 of his last 38 games (since 8/4) and 26 of his last 48 games (since 7/21).
- Has reached base in 18 of his last 20 games (since 8/30), 36 of his last 40 games (since 8/1), 53 of his last 59 games (since 7/4) and 60 of his last 68 games (since 6/23).

FAN-TASTIC: The Yankees have averaged 40,860 fans per home gate this season, the highest home average attendance in the American League and the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only the Los Angeles Dodgers (47,371)...the Yankees have drawn 3,227,920 fans this year...have drawn 3 million fans at home for their 23rd straight season when there was full attendance (also 1999-2019, '22-23)...marks the longest streak in Major League history.

Sept. 25, 2014: Derek Jeter plays his al game at Yankee Stadium, going 2-for-5 with 3RBI, including a game-winning, "walk-off" single in the ninth in a 6-5 win over Baltimore.

Sept. 25, 1929: Former Yankees manager Miller Huggins passes away at the age of 51. He skippered the Yankees from 1918-29, winning three World Series titles.

Sept. 25, 1917: Yankees shortstop Phil Rizzuto is born in New York City.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 26, 2013: In his final career appearance, Mariano Rivera is removed from the game by Derek Jeter and Andy Pettitte, who come out of the dugout to make the pitching change.

Sept. 26, 1998: David Cone earns his 20th win of the year in his final start of the season, tossing 7.0 shutout innings vs. Tampa Bay in a 3-1 Yankees victory. He finishes 20-7 with a 3.55 ERA, marking the second of two career 20-win seasons (also 20-3 with the Mets in 1988).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CLARKE SCHMIDT (9-9, 4.65 ERA)

RHP Clarke Schmidt will make his 32nd appearance (31st start) of the season in today's series finale vs. Arizona...the 27-year-old will make the start on regular extended five days' rest...last pitched on Tuesday vs. Toronto and took the loss after allowing 4ER over 5.0IP (4H, 2BB, 1K, 2HR)... has allowed 3R-orfewer in 18 of his last 21 starts (since 5/19), 20 of his last 24 starts (since 5/3) and 21 of his last 26 starts (since 4/23)...his 23 starts with 3R-or-fewer allowed are tied for the seventh-most such starts in the AL and tied for the 10th-most such starts in the Majors this season...has tossed at least 5.0 innings in 18 of his last 21 starts (since 5/19) and 21 of his last 26 starts (since 4/23) after not doing so in his first four starts this season...has tossed at least 6.0IP in two of his last five starts (since 8/26) after doing so just three times in his first 25 starts this season (4/1-8/20)...made his second career Opening Day roster in 2023 (also 2022)...was selected by the Yankees in the first round (16th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University

LAST TIME OUT: Last pitched on Tuesday vs. Toronto and took the loss after allowing 4ER over 5.0IP (4H, 2BB, 1K, 2HR)...surrendered a leadoff home run to George Springer in the first inning, an RBI single to Cavan Biggio in the fourth and a two-run HR to Bo Bichette in the fifth.

Allowed more than 3ER for just the second time in his last 21 starts (since 5/19), the third time in his last 24 starts (since 5/3) and just the fourth time in his last 26 starts (since 4/23).

VS. ARIZONA/INTERLEAGUE: Will be making his first career appearance vs. Arizona today...has gone 2-1 with a 7.79 ERA (17.1IP, 15ER) and 23K in five Interleague appearances (four starts) this season.

- In 10 career Interleague appearances (six starts), has gone 3-2 with a 6.00 ERA (33.0IP, 22ER) and 33K.
- Has made two starts vs. NL West opponents this season (4/1 vs. San Francisco and 7/15 at Colorado), going 1-0 with a 4.82 ERA (9.1IP, 5ER) and 13K in those games.

HOME SWEET HOME: Is 4-6 with a 4.14 ERA (82.2IP, 38ER) and 75K in 17 appearances (16 starts) at home this season...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 13 of those starts.

- Has made 32 appearances (18 starts) in his career at Yankee Stadium, going 6-8 with one save and a 3.95 ERA (114.0IP, 103H, 58R/50ER, 34BB, 105K,
- 18HR) in those games.

 Has tossed 5.0IP-or-more in each of his last 10 home starts (since 5/25) and in 12 of his 16 home starts this season...has also allowed 3R-or-fewer in nine of his last 10 home starts (since 5/25) and in 13 of his 16 home starts this season.

2023: Has made 31 appearances (30 starts) this season, going 9-9 with a 4.65 ERA (151.0IP, 158H, 87R/78ER, 43BB, 143K, 23HR)...his 23 starts with 3R-orfewer allowed are tied for the seventh-most such starts in the AL and tied for the 10th-most such starts in the Majors this season.

+ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 18 of his last 21 starts (since 5/19), 20 of his last 24 starts (since 5/3) and 21 of his last 26 starts (since 4/23).

- Has tossed at least 5.0 innings in 18 of his last 21 starts (since 5/19) and 21 of his last 26 starts (since 4/23) after not doing so in his first four starts this season...has tossed at least 6.0IP in two of his last five starts (since 8/26) after doing so just three times in his first 25 starts this season
- Had a 14-start streak of 3R-or-fewer allowed from 5/19-8/8, tied for the fourth-longest such streak in the Majors this season, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell's 22-start streak (5/25-present), Minnesota's Sonny Gray's 17-start streak (4/1-7/2) and Cleveland's Tanner Bibee's 16-start streak (6/18-present).
- Recorded a 10-start undefeated streak from 6/11-8/8, going 6-0 with a 3.42 ERA (52.2IP, 20ER) in that span.

 Made his first relief appearance on 7/9 vs. Chicago-NL (0.2IP, 1K)...marked his first relief appearance since 10/4/22-G2 at Texas.
- Tossed a career-high 6.2IP on 8/26 at Tampa Bay.
- Did not allow a HR in four straight starts from 5/14-31, marking the longest homerless stretch of his career as a starter (previous: three straight starts from 6/16-9/3/22).
- In his eighth start of the season on 5/9 vs. Oakland, earned his first win of the season after allowing just 2ER over a career-high-tying 6.0IP (5H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR, 1WP)...marked his first career win as a starter... reached 100.0 career innings in the first inning.
- Struck out Ezequiel Duran (swinging) in the fifth inning on 4/28 at Texas for his 100th career strikeout \dots struck out Spencer Torkelson (swinging) in the fourth inning on 8/31 at Detroit for his 200th career strikeout.
- Recorded a career-high-tying 8K on 4/23 vs. Toronto, 4/28 at Texas, 7/15 at Colorado and 8/20 vs. Boston.

FOR STARTERS: Will be making his 36th career start...over his first 35 career Major League starts (30 in 2023, three in '22, one in '21, one in '20), is 9-12 with a 4.70 ERA (170.1IP, 182H, 101R/89ER, 50BB, 162K, 24HR).

+ Is 9-9 with a 4.67 ERA (150.1IP, 78ER) and 142K in 30 starts in 2023...tossed a career-high 6.2IP on 8/26

at Tampa Bay...recorded a career-high-tying 8K on 4/23 vs. Toronto, 4/28 at Texas, 7/15 at Colorado and 8/20 vs. Boston.
