THE PIRATES:...were walked off for the fourth time this season Friday night...Played in their longest game Friday night in innings (14) since August 14, 2018, against the Brewers (15 innings)...Have played in 14 games decided by one or two runs in their last 25 contests...Have played in 19 one-run games, which is tied with Oakland and the New York Mets for the second-most in MLB (the Cubs have played in 22 one-run contests)...Have gone $16-0$ this season when recording 10 -plus hits; the only undefeated team in the Majors in such games and a club record for the longest such streak to start a season, surpassing the 1939 club that started 14-0 when recording 10-plus hits to start the season...Have lost each of their last three games in extra innings since winning each of their first five games in extra frames...Have been involved in 15 last at-bat decisions, which is tied for the fourth-most in all of MLB along with the Rockies; the only teams with more last at-bat decisions are the Mets (19), Tigers (19) and Cubs (18)...Have played in 22 games started by opposing lefthanders, which are tied for the second-most in MLB along with the Dodgers (the Phillies have played in a league-leading 25 games against left-handed starters).

GIMME FIVE: Mitch Keller allowed one run in 6.2 innings last Saturday vs. Atlanta, giving him 42 straight starts of working at least 5.0 innings in a game...It's the longest active streak in all of MLB coming into today...lt's also the longest streak by a Pirate since A.J. Burnett made 49 straight starts of at least 5.0 innings from May 8, 2012, to August 10, 2013.
MITCH IN MAY: Mitch Keller finished the month of May with a 4-0 record and 1.30 ERA (27.2ip/4er)...Keller's 1.30 ERA was tied for the sixth-lowest in all of MLB last month along with Seattle's Bryan Woo...The only five pitchers in all of MLB with a lower ERA last

LET'S GET IT STARTED: Bailey Falter tossed 6.0 scoreless innings last night, marking the third time in the team's last seven road games that the starting pitcher has worked at least 6.0 scoreless innings...Beginning with their four-game series at Wrigley Field on May 16, Pittsburgh's starting rotation has a 2.57 ERA (42.0ip/12er) and . 156 batting average against in seven games on the road.
CATCH THIS: Last night 35 -year-old Yasmani Grandal caught all 14 innings in Pittsburgh's game against the Blue Jays...Prior to last night, the last Pirates backstop at least 35 years old to to catch a complete game of least 14 innings was Erik Kratz, who caught all 18 innings on July 17, 2016, at Washington at 36 years old....According to Baseball Reference, last night was only the 10th time in the modern era by a Pirates catcher age 35 -plus to catch all 14 -plus innings in a game.
CUTCH CLUTCH: Andrew McCutchen is hitting .329 (23-for-70) with two doubles, five home runs, $12 \mathrm{RBI}, 14$ runs scored, .413 OBP, .571 slugging percentage and .984 OPS in 17 games dating back to May 11 ...During that time, McCutchen ranks sixth in the National League in OPS, slugging and batting, tied for sixth in OBP, tied for first in home runs, and tied for fifth in runs scored.

NICKY G: Nick Gonzales singled in each of his first two at-bats Friday night and comes into today hitting . 319 (22-for-69)...Since making his season debut on May 10, Gonzales has recorded 16 RBI, which ranks second in the National League behind San Francisco's Luis Matos (19)...During that time, the 25 -year-old Gonzales also ranks eighth in the National League in slugging (.536), ninth in OPS (.913) and tied for seventh in batting (.319).
