THE PIRATES:...have won two straight and four of their last five games after opening their three-game series against the White Sox with a 4-1 last night...Have won 10 games in their last at-bat, matching their total from all of 2023 (the team won 13 games in the final at-bat of 2022)...Have gone $34-3$ (.919 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have drawn at least one walk in 59 straight games, which is the longest active streak in MLB (the Brewers have the second-longest active streak at 46 games)...Have played in 31 one-run games, which are the second-most among National League teams behind the Cubs (33)...Have the fourth-most quality starts (45) in MLB behind the Mariners (56), Phillies (53) and Royals (48)...Have the fourth-best ERA (3.53) among all starting rotations in MLB, trailing only the Phillies (3.20), Mariners (3.42) and Royals ( 3.47 )...Rank second in all of MLB in stolen base percentage ( 84.5 percent), trailing only the Brewers ( 84.8 percent)...Are $6-7-2$ in their first 15 series on the road...Come into today with a season-high errorless streak of 68.0 innings dating back to $7 / 5 \ldots$ Rank second in MLB with a .995 fielding percentage this month (the Cards lead with a .997 fielding percentage)...Have won two straight and four of their last five games on the road... Have won five straight and eight of their last nine games when scoring at least four runs.

ABOUT TODAY'S STARTER: Luis Ortiz gets the start this afternoon in the middle game of this weekend series against the White Sox...Ortiz made each of his first 21 appearances of the season out of the bullpen before starting and winning a 6-1 decision (6.0ip/1r) on June 26 against the Reds...His next outing came out of the bullpen on July 2 against St. Louis before starting and tossing 6.0 scoreless innings Sunday against the Mets...Since April 20, Ortiz is 3-1 with one save and a 2.61 ERA ( $51.2 \mathrm{ip} / 16 \mathrm{r} / 15 \mathrm{er}$ ) in his last 18 appearances (two starts).

CALL TO THE PEN: Carmen Mlodzinski, Colin Holderman and David Bednar closed out Pittsburgh's win on Friday with a combined 4.0 scoreless innings...Since June 25 , Pittsburgh's relief pitchers have posted the fourth-lowest ERA (2.58) in all of MLB behind the Braves (1.52), Cubs (1.91) and Angels (2.36)...Holderman comes into today 12th among National League relievers in ERA (1.82)... Mlodzinski has produced an 0.49 ERA (18.1ip/3r/1er) and .117 batting average against in his last 13 appearances out of the bullpen since May 31 .

SUMMING UP JULY: Pittsburgh comes into today with the fourth-best ERA (3.15) in all of MLB for the month of July...The only three teams with a lower ERA are the Cubs (2.10), Braves (2.64) and Mariners (2.67)...The pitching staff is tied with the Cubs for the fewest home runs allowed (seven) in MLB...Offensively, Pittsburgh's 19 home runs are tied for the second-most in MLB along with the Tigers (the Reds lead with 22)...The Bucs are ninth in all of MLB and fourth among all National League teams in runs scored (54) this month...The only NL teams with more runs this month are the Diamondbacks (69), Reds (62) and Mets (60).

PLAY RENEGADE: David Bednar has converted each of his last 16 save opportunities dating back to April 12...That's the second-longest active saves streak in all of MLB behind Josh Hader of the Astros (18 straight)...Since the beginning of last season, Bednar's 90.3 save percentage is the fourth-best in all of MLB...The only three pitchers with a better save percentage are Alexis Diaz (91.8\%), Evan Phillips ( $90.5 \%$ ) and Kenley Jansen ( $90.4 \%$ ).

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew MCCutchen's double Friday night moved him into a tie for fifth place career extra base hits (592) in Pirates history along with Hall of Famer Pie Traynor...McCutchen also ranks fifth on the team's all-time walks list (801)...The only four Pirates with more career walks are Willie Stargell (937), Max Carey (919), Paul Waner (912) and Honus Wagner (877).

STARTING OFF: The 25 -year-old righthander is in his third Major League season, all with the Pirates...Entering today, he's made 46 career appearances ( 21 starts) for the Bucs, including 22 relief appearances in 2024 (two starts)...He made the first Opening Day roster of his career with the Pirates in 2024 after making just two appearances (both starts) with the club in 2022 and 18 appearances ( 15 starts) over two stints with the Bucs in 2023...Ortiz was signed by the Pirates as an international free agent on October 2, 2018 and is one of four players to come up through the Pirates' Dominican Academy and reach the Major Leagues with the club, joining RHP Yerry De Los Santos, RHP Osvaldo Bido and INF Rodolfo Castro.

LIKE RIDING A BIKE: Today will be Ortiz' 22nd career Major League start and his third of the season, having last took the mound in a starter's role in his last appearance on July 7 vs. New York-NL...Served in the bulk role following Carmen MIdozinski "opening" for the Bucs three times this season...Ortiz threw 4.1 shutout frames on June 8 vs. Minnesota, allowed one run in 5.0 IP on June 14 at Colorado and allowed 6 earned runs in 4.0 innings pitched on June 21 vs. Tampa Bay.

Has posted a 3-1 record with a 2.45 ERA (9 ER in 33.0 IP) in his last six starts since September 4, 2023, allowing two runs or fewer in five of those games and one run or fewer in four of them.

- Ortiz was a starter in 19 of his first 22 career Major League games with the Bucs from 2022-23 before primarily pitching out of the bullpen this season. He started 67 of his 72 appearances in the Minor Leagues from 2019-2023.

LAST TIME OUT: Ortiz did not factor in the decision on July 7 vs. New York-NL after tossing 6.0 shutout innings, allowing just four hits with five strikeouts and no walks.

EFFECTIVE WORK: In 18 games (two starts) since April 20, Ortiz has gone 3-1 with one save, a 2.61 ERA ( 15 ER in 51.2 IP) and 47 strikeouts against 12 walks.

Has pitched more than 1.0 inning in 16 of those 18 games.
VS. CHICAGO: Ortiz will be making his first career start and appearance against the White Sox today.

SHUTTING IT DOWN: Ortiz earned the first save of his big league career on June 1 at Toronto, facing a total of 10 batters in 3.0 scoreless innings while throwing 36 pitches.

DAY MAN: Ortiz will be making his 16th appearance of the season in a day game today (third start), where he has posted a 3-1 record with a 1.14 ERA (5 ER in 39.1 IP) and .176 opponents average.

He has posted an 0.79 ERA (3 ER in 34.1 IP) in his last 12 appearances (two starts) during the day.

2023 RECAP: Ortiz had two different stints with the Pirates last season, going 4-5 with a 4.93 ERA ( 40 ER in 73.0 IP ) in his 15 starts and $1-0$ with a 3.95 ERA ( 6 ER in 13.2 IP) in three relief appearances.

Pitched with the Dominican Republic team in the World Baseball Classic, making one appearances and striking out three batters in 2.0 scoreless innings.
