TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Is Game 2 (0-1) of a 4-game series vs **Terry Rodgers' Pirates** and the fifth game (2-1) of a 7-day trip that includes a 2-1 series victory at **Chc**.
- This road trip does not officially include the 2 days (Sat & Sun) the Redlegs spent in **Bristol, TN** playing the **Braves** in the inaugural **MLB Speedway Classic**, as Cin served as the home team in that contest.
- The Reds haven't had a day off since 7/24.
- Following Sun's game, the Reds return home for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs **Phi** (8/11-8/13) and **Mil** (8/15-8/17).

BLANKETY BLANK: The Reds were shut out yesterday at **Pit** (7-0), their first scoreless effort since the 2-0 loss on 5/31 at **Wrigley Field**.

- From Opening Day through 5/31, the Redlegs and **Pirates** were shut out 9 times apiece, most in the majors...the Reds had gone 56 straight games without being shut out since then, until last night.
- Cin was the only Major League team to avoid a blanking from 6/1-8/6.
- That 56-game streak of avoiding a shutout is the third-longest by any team this season (**AZ** 75, **Bos** 59)...the **Astros** are currently working on a 54-game streak in which they've scored at least 1 run in a game.
- Last night's 7-0 loss marked the first time the Reds produced 9 hits in a game and didn't score a run since 8/21/16 vs **LAD** (4-0 loss, 9h).
- In the 6-1 loss at **Wsh** on 7/22, the Reds collected 10 hits and plated just 1 run...was the first time they'd done such a thing since 9/3/17 here at **PNC Park** (3-1 loss, 11h).

NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM: The Reds have not been swept in any of their first 37 series of 2025, including the recently-completed 3-game set at **Chc** (2-1).

- This 37-series, in-season streak without being swept is the longest run in club history, eclipsing the 1970 National League championship team, which opened its season with 32 straight series without getting swept.
- Cin is the only Major League team not to have been swept this season.
- On 6 occasions avoided being swept with a win in the final game of a set (4/23 at **Mia**, 5/15 vs **CWS**, 6/22 at **StL**, 7/2 at **Bos**, 7/23 at **Wsh**, 7/30 vs **LAD**).
- Cin hasn't been swept in a series of at least 2 games since 9/24-9/25, 2024 at **Cle** (2g), a span of 38 straight series...per *Elias*, that marks the fifth-longest streak of sweepless series in team history (see below).

TOUGH ROAD AHEAD: The Reds are in the midst of a final 59-game stretch in which 38 games have been/will be played against opponents with records at or above .500 (3-0 vs **TB**, 1-2 vs **LAD**, 2-1 at **Chc**, 3g vs **Phi**, 3g vs **Mil**, 3g at **LAD**, 3g vs **StL**, 3g vs **Tor**, 3g vs **NYM**, 3g at **SD**, 3g at **StL**, 4g at **Chc**, 3g at **Mil**).

- As of today, the Reds have the toughest remaining schedule in the Major Leagues, based on opponents' winning percentage (.527).
- NYM** has the seventh-toughest remaining schedule (.511) while **Chc** (.480) and **SD** (.477) have the third- and second-easiest remaining schedules in the league, respectively.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds lost 2 of 3 at **Pit** in their last meeting (5/19-5/21) and swept the **Pirates** in 3 games at **Great American Ball Park** in the first series this year between the clubs (4/11-4/13)...it was Cin's first sweep of **Pit** since 8/5-8/8, 2021 at **GABP** (4g).

- Cin has played the **Pirates** 502 times since both teams became charter members of the **National League Central** in 1994 (261-241, .520), more than any other **Pit** opponent.
- The 2-0 loss at **Pit** on 4/23/23 was the Reds' 100th loss at **PNC Park**...are 96-108 overall here...the Reds and **Pirates** played the first regular-season game at **PNC Park** on 4/9/01 (8-2 Reds triumph).
- The Redlegs have lost 44 of the last 63 games they've played at **PNC Park**, including an 11-game losing streak spanning 9/3/18 to 9/27/19 and an 8-game losing streak to begin the 2019 season (4/4-9/27, 2019).

HOME (RUNS) AWAY FROM HOME: The Redlegs are averaging 4.54 runs per game on the road compared to 4.44 runs per game back home in **Cincinnati**...overall during the **Great American Ball Park** era (since 2003), the team has averaged 4.60 runs per game at **GABP** and 4.26 runs per game on the road.

- 5 times in the history of **GABP** has Cin averaged more runs per game on the road than at home (2023, 2013, 2009, 2004, 2003).
- Cin has homered 60 times in 59 games this year at home compared to 57 times in 57 road games.
- 2004 marks the only season during the **GABP** era in which the Reds hit more home runs on the road (102) than at home (92).

MAN OF STEAL: **SS Eily De La Cruz** stole his 30th base of the season in Sun's **MLB Speedway Classic**, becoming the ninth Major Leaguer in the live-ball era (since 1920) with at least 30 steals in each of his first 3 career seasons, the first since **KC's Bobby Witt Jr.** (2022-24).

- His 132 career stolen bases are fifth-most by any Major Leaguer through their first 3 career seasons in the live-ball era (since 1920), behind only **Vince Coleman** (326, 1985-87), **Rickey Henderson** (189, 1979-81), **Delino DeShields** (144, 1990-92), and **Kenny Lofton** (138, 1991-93).

LAST TIME OUT: Hendersonville, TN native started the inaugural MLB Speedway Classic vs Atl in Bristol, TN on 8/2 at Bristol Motor Speedway (1.0ip, 2k, 18TP)...was the first American League or National League game ever played in the Volunteer State.

- Waited out a 2 hour, 17-minute rain delay before taking the mound...pitched a scoreless 1st inning but did not return when the game was ultimately suspended in the bottom of the 1st inning (more rain) and resumed the next day.

JULY 28: Suffered the 5-2 loss on 7/28 vs LAD (5.2ip, 6h, 3r/3er, 1bb, 10k, 1hr, 91TP).

- Was his third consecutive start in which he fanned 10.
- Became the second Reds pitcher since 1900, along with RHP Raisel Iglesias (2015), to have 3 consecutive 10-strikeout games.
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 19 of his 26 batters.

JULY 22: Suffered the 6-1 loss on 7/22 at Wsh (5.2ip, 7h, 6r/5er, 2bb, 10k, 1hr, 98TP).

- Was his second consecutive start in which he fanned 10.
- Became the first Reds pitcher and 14th Major Leaguer since 1900 with multiple 10-strikeout games within his first 5 career apps, the first since Mil's Freddy Peralta in 2018.

JULY 11: Did not factor in the decision in the 3-2 loss on 7/11 vs Col (6.0ip, 4h, 2r/2er, 3bb, 10k, 1hr, 95TP).

- Was his first career quality start.
- Became the sixth Reds pitcher since 1900 to strike out 10 or more batters within his first 4 career appearances.
- Threw 10 pitches in the 1st inning, 15 pitches in the 2nd, 25 pitches in the 3rd, 31 pitches in the 4th, 6 pitches in the 5th, and 8 pitches in the 6th.
- The only runs he allowed came on Ryan McMahon's 2-run homer in the 4th inning...walked Michael Toggia to lead off the inning.

JULY 6: Did not factor in the decision in the 3-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi (4.2ip, 2h, 1r/1er, 4bb, 7k, 91TP).

- Did not allow a run while he was in the game...his 1-out walk to Brandon Marsh scored on Kyle Schwarber's RBI-double off Sam Moll in the 5th inning.
- Was just the second time in his pro career that he walked 4 batters in a game (6/12 for Louisville vs Iowa, 4bb).

JUNE 30: On 6/30, in his second career Major League appearance, was reached for 7 runs (5er) on 5 hits in 0.1 inning (2bb, 1hr, 33TP, 9 batters faced) in the Reds' 13-6 loss at Bos.

- Was the shortest start of his professional career and the shortest by a Reds pitcher this season.
- His outing marked the first time a Cin non-opener was pulled before the end of the 1st inning since Frankie Montas on 4/21/24 vs LAA (0.2ip)...RHP Connor Phillips was the last Reds pitcher to record 0.1 inning or less when he didn't get anyone out in his start on 9/30/23 at StL.
- Became the ninth Reds pitcher since at least 1901 to record 1 or 0 outs in a start within their first 2 career games, the first since Eddie Priest on 6/1/98 at SF (0.1 IP).

10K GAMES: Struck out 10 batters in 3 straight apps (7/11-7/28)...is just the second Reds pitcher since 1900, along with RHP Raisel Iglesias (2015) to have 3 consecutive 10-strikeout games.

- On 7/28 vs LAD, became the eighth Major Leaguer since the mound moved to its current distance in 1893 to record 3 consecutive 10-strikeout games at age 22 or younger - the first since Pit's Oliver Pérez in 2004 (*courtesy Elias*).
- Is the fifth Major League pitcher to post 3 games with 10+ strikeouts through their first 6 career starts - the first since NYN's Masahiro Tanaka in 2014 (*courtesy Elias*).
- Is the seventh Major League rookie since 1893 with at least 10 strikeouts in 3 straight games.

47 STRIKEOUTS: His 47 strikeouts over his first 7 Major League appearances match teammate Nick Lodolo (47, 2022) for the third-most by a Reds pitcher to begin a career, trailing only teammate Andrew Abbott (48, 2023) and Gary Nolan (53k, 1967).

REDS TOP PROSPECT: At the time of his promotion was rated the Reds' top prospect by MLB Pipeline and *Baseball America* and was ranked among baseball's best prospects (BA's No. 8; Pipeline's No.11).

SOUTHERN LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Named Southern League Pitcher of the Week for 5/26-6/1 (1-0, 6.0ip, 2h, 1bb, 4k, 82TP).

RANKED AMONG LEADERS: At the time of his promotion, ranked among all full-season minor league pitchers in WHIP (0.77), ERA (1.77), strikeouts (89), opponents batting average (.167), and K/BB ratio (89k/13bb).

PERSONAL: Was born in Italy where his parents were stationed with the US Navy...his sister was born in Japan...grew up in Hendersonville, TN which is about 20 miles northeast of Nashville...pitched collegiately at Tennessee (2022-2023) before transferring to Wake Forest (2024)...graduated from Beech High School in Hendersonville, TN where he was selected by Baseball America as a 2021 First Team High School All-American...his father, David, played college football at Division II North Greenville College.

ACQUIRED: Was selected by the Reds in the first round (second overall) in the 2024 First-Year Player Draft...was signed by Eddie Lehr.

- Was his third relief appearance of the season, his first since 6/23 vs NYN...was his first relief app since moving to the bullpen following the acquisition of starter Zack Littell at the trade deadline...is filling Lodolo's spot in the rotation while Lodolo is on the 15-day IL recovering from a blister on his left index finger.
- Was his longest relief outing since 7/30/24 vs Chc (4.0ip).
