METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Wednesday, the team fell to the Brewers, 6-0, in Milwaukee...The loss snapped a six-game winning streak...The Mets are 76-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 34-10-3 in 47 series this year...The Mets continue a seven-day, six-game road trip (2-1) to Milwaukee (2-1) and Oakland (three games)...The Mets are off on Monday and then return to Citi Field for a two-game series against the Marlins.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: Trevor May celebrates his 33rd birthday today.

RETURN OF THE BASS: Chris Bassitt makes his return to Oakland tonight...He pitched for the Athletics from 2015-21, going 30-24 with a 3.44 ERA (201 earned runs/526.0 innings) with 166 walks and 483 strikeouts in that period...He has appeared in 46 games (40 starts) at the home of the A's and has going 13-13 with a 2.44 ERA (70 earned runs/258.1 innings) with 64 walks and 242 strikeouts...According to STATS Inc., Bassitt's 2.44 ERA is the third-lowest at the ballpark amongst pitchers who have made at least 20 starts...Bassitt was acquired in the Mets prior to the start of the season for RHP J.T. Ginn and RHP Adam Oller.

A-OK: The Mets have played 16 games against the Athletics...It's the first time the two teams have played each other since 2017 and the first time the two teams will play in Oakland since 2014...Mark Canha, who played for the Athletics, from 2015-21, is a .241/.347/.432 hitter at the ballpark...He has recorded 165 runs, 50 doubles, six triples, 45 home runs, 146 RBI and 128 walks at the yard...Starling Marte has played 32 games at the ballpark and is a .328 (44-134) hitter with 20 runs, 11 doubles, a triple four home runs, 22 RBI with a .359 OBP and a .515 SLG...Francisco Lindor has appeared in 16 games at the yard and is a .349 (22-63) hitter with eight runs, six doubles, two home runs, five RBI with a .373 OBP and a .540 SLG in that span.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets will conclude their Interleague schedule with three games against the Athletics...The Mets are 7-10 against the American League this year...The Mets own a lifetime record of a 233-226 against the AL, good for a .508 winning percentage...The team's .508 winning percentage ranks second in the National League.

HANG 10: Over the last 10 games, the Mets bullpen has posted a 2.09 ERA (nine earned runs/38.2 innings)...The have posted a .175 opponent's batting average, a 0.80 WHIP with seven walks and struck out 58...Overall, the Mets bullpen has posted a 3.53 ERA this season...That ranks third in the National League.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,455 batters this season, which places them a top the majors...The team's 1,455 strikeouts are already the second-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019 followed...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.75 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.2 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

LINDOR CITY: Francisco Lindor has reached base safely in 14 straight games...He is batting .339 (20-59) with 11 runs, four doubles, a triple, four home runs, 13 RBI, four walks with a .391 OBP and a .644 SLG in the streak that started on September 7...He is on an eight-game hitting streak, batting .314 (11-35) with five runs, a double, a triple, two home runs, seven RBI, a walk with a .905 OPS over that span...He has hit 25 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 homer runs in 2018, for the most home runs by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .307/.377/.489 with 38 runs, 10 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 33 RBI, 23 walks with an .866 OPS in 58 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 6.7 fWAR this season.

YOU DOWN WITH OBP?: New York is batting .261/.332/.422 away from Citi Field...Their .261 road average is the best in the NL and third in the majors and their .332 OBP is second in the National League...Brandon Nimmo (.403), Jeff McNeil (.389) and the Mark Canha (.379), rank three through five in road OBP in the National League.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo is batting .303/.403/.498 with 58 runs, 14 doubles, three triples, 12 home runs, 40 RBI, 39 walks with a .901 OPS in 74 road games this season...This compares to a .221/.309/.329 slashline in 68 games at home.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .638 winning percentage (37-21) following the All-Star break...That is the third-highest winning percentage in franchise history, right below the 1969 (.671) and the 1988 (.644) squads...The team's 37 wins are tied for tied for fourth-most in the majors...The Mets are batting .264/.342/.427 with 63 home runs in 58 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets rank fourth in average, first in OBP and fifth in SLG following the break.

AND I WOULD RECORD 500 HITS: Pete Alonso is one hit shy of 500 for his career...With a hit today, he would be the 42nd player in franchise history to record 500 hits...José Reyes was the fastest Met to record 500 hits with the club, doing so on September 6, 2006 in his 414th game...In addition, he is one run away from 300 scored in his career.

PETE & PETE: Pete Alonso has recorded 15 home runs with runners in scoring position...His 15 home runs lead the major leagues and tie a franchise record set by Todd Hundley in 1996...Alonso has matched his home run total from 2021 with 37 home runs...The only Mets to have 37 or more home runs in consecutive seasons are Alonso, Darryl Strawberry (1987-88) and Mike Piazza (1999-2000)...Alonso and Strawberry are the only two Mets to reach 37 home runs in year three times.

THE ROAD TO 100: Francisco Lindor has recorded a career-high 99 RBI this season...His 99 RBI are a franchise record for a shortstop...Pete Alonso is second in the majors and owns the National League lead with 121 RBI this season, while Lindor's 99 RBI place him fourth in the NL...Only five times in franchise history have the Mets had multiple players with 100 more RBI on the same team...The 2008 Mets were the last team to accomplish this feat (Carlos Beltrán, Carlos Delgado and David Wright).

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso is the only player in the majors with at least 25 doubles and 35 home runs in each of the last two years...He is just the third player in Mets history with 25 doubles and 35 homers in back-to-back years, joining Darryl Strawberry in 1987-88 and Mike Piazza in three straight seasons from 1999-2001.

RIB EYE STEAKS: Pete Alonso ranks second in the majors and tops the National League with 121 RBI this season...He is three RBI from tying the franchise record...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He has 27 game-winning RBI this season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI are tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets seeking their 46th road win...The team's 45 wins on the road are the seventh most all-time...Their 45 road wins is their highest total since they went 47-34 in 2007...Their .600 road winning percentage is the second-best in franchise history...Only the 1986 (.654) team had a better winning percentage on the road...Their .600 road winning percentage is third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...Overall they are 45-30 on the road this year.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have won 95 games...That is the third-most in the major leagues...The last time they won more games was in 2006, when they tallied 97 victories...The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets are 95-56 through 151 games...That is the second-best mark in Mets history...Only the 1986 team (99-52) posted a better record.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 110 strikeouts...That is 18 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Díaz has posted a 0.72 ERA (three earned runs/37.1 innings) with 17 hits, eight walks and 72 strikeouts in 36 appearances since the start of June.

BASSITT NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Worked 6.0 scoreless innings for his 18th quality start of the season...Bassitt earned his 14th win in the team's 5-1 victory over the Pirates on September 17...He struck out eight batters and walked two, allowing only three hits for the first time since June 14 after having allowed three or fewer hits in three of his first four starts of the season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Bassitt's eight wins away from Citi Field are tied for his most road wins in a season, with a win today he would set a career-high surpassing his total from 2021...Across the majors, his eight road wins rank third in MLB...His last road start came on September 7 against the Pirates going 7.0 innings allowing one run on five hits and striking out 10 batters...Across his last three road starts, Bassitt owns a 1.35 ERA (three earned runs/20.0 innings) with 18 strikeouts and two walks...In his career, Bassitt is 26-13 with a 4.24 ERA on the road (165 earned runs/350.1 innings) with 315 strikeouts and 128 walks.

DOING THE SPLITS: Bassitt's .217 opponent batting average against right-handed hitters is the fifth-lowest in the majors among righty pitchers (min. 350 RHB faced)...Bassitt's three hits allowed in his last start were all to left-handed hitters raising his opponent batting average against lefties to .256 for the season, despite a .226 career batting average against left-handed hitters.

OH SNAP: His 14 wins this season are a career-high, ranking seventh in the NL and ninth in the majors...His seven wins since the All-Star Break are tied for sixth-most in the majors during that span...The Mets have won 19 of Bassitt's 28 starts this season, the most team wins among any Mets starter this season...The Mets, Dodgers and Astros are the only teams in MLB with at least three starting pitchers each with 12 or more wins: Chris Bassitt, Carlos Carrasco, and Taijuan Walker have each won 12 or more games for the Mets.

THE RETURN: Will make his first start against the Oakland Athletics since the second start of his career in 2014 with the White Sox...Bassitt will return to Oakland for the first time since being traded in March after pitching for the A's for six years...In his only start against his former team, Bassitt threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball striking out five and walking two...Has made one start against an AL West team this season, going 5.2 innings allowing one run on five hits against the Seattle Mariners on May 14...While Bassitt did not factor into the decision of the game, his one run allowed and eight strikeouts helped the Mets secure a 5-4 win.

THREE HITTER: Allowed only three hits in a start for the first time since his 8.0-inning outing on June 14 against Milwaukee in the team's 4-0 shutout victory over the Brewers...Bassitt has allowed three or fewer hits in six of his starts this season including in three of his first four starts of the season...His six starts with three or fewer hits allowed is the second-most such starts he has had in a season behind only his 2021 total of eight starts.

POBODY'S NERFECT: This season, Bassitt has allowed more than four runs in eight of his 28 starts this season...Despite those eight outings, allowing more than four runs this season, Bassitt has recorded 18 quality starts, which is a career-high...Through 134 career games (121 starts), he has allowed four or more runs only 30 times.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Bassitt struck out eight batters for the ninth time this season which surpasses his career-high of eight such games in 2021...Has gone 7.0+ innings eight times and 6.0+ innings 22 times this year...His 22 starts of at least 6.0 innings are tied for third-most such starts in the NL and the eighth-most such starts in the majors...Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 16 of his 28 starts, going 6.0 inning or longer in 14 of those 16 starts...His 14 starts going 6.0+ innings and striking out six or more batters are tied for the seventh-most such starts in the NL.

THE PITCH...IS GOOD: While he only uses his fastball 14 percent of the time, Bassitt's four-seamer owns a 42.6 strikeout percentage, his highest strikeout percentage of any pitch and the second-highest percentage in the majors behind only Luis Castillo, 44.4 (min. 100 PA)...His cutter has a 26.1 strikeout percentage which ranks fifth in MLB (min. 100 PA).

CAREER YEAR: Struck out Jack Suwinski in the second inning on September 7 to record his 650th career strikeout...Has two 10+ strikeout games this season to set a career high...Bassitt has set career-highs in innings pitched, wins, strikeouts and starts in a season.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JACOB deGROM (5-2, 2.32 ERA)

LAST START: Struck out a season-high 13 batters through 5.0 innings in the team's major league record-tying 20-strikeout performance against the Pirates on September 18...After allowing a lead off double, deGrom retired the next 15 straight batters before allowing two singles and a three run homer to Oneil Cruz in the sixth inning before being pulled.

WALKIN' AFTER MIDNIGHT: DeGrom did not issue a walk in his 13-strikeout outing, becoming the first pitcher in major league history with 13 strikeouts and zero walks in a 5.0-inning start...Joins Alex Cobb and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers in major league history with 13 strikeouts in a start of 5.0 innings or less.

- Enters today on the cusp of two milestones: needs one hit for 500 for his career and is one run scored away from 300.
- Smashed a three-run homer to begin the scoring in the Mets' postseason-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19 and again the following night, September 20 at Milwaukee...Was the second time this season he's homered and driven in at least three in consecutive games (also, May 18-19 vs. St. Louis).
- Had an RBI in eight straight games, the longest streak of his career, from September 13-20...Has 15 RBI in his last 13 games.
- His 121 RBI this year are a career-high and the third-most in a single season in Mets history...The Mets record is 124 RBI (done twice).
- Tied for third in MLB and tied for second in the NL with 37 home runs...Leads the NL and is second in MLB with 121 RBI...Tied for 14th in the NL with 84 runs.
- Ranks 13th in MLB and seventh in the NL with a .507 SLG...Is 15th in the majors and eighth in the NL with an .851 OPS.
- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (eight) and is tied for third in games with multiple RBI (30) this season.
- Has a 1.049 OPS with runners in scoring position, going 45-154 (.292/.413/.636) with eight doubles, 15 homers, 88 RBI and 34 walks (NL-high 15 intentional).
- Leads the majors with a MLB-record 27 game-winning RBI (first officially tracked in 1974)...Also has 35 go-ahead RBI this season...Has 14 go-ahead RBI and 13 game-winning RBI since the break.

- Spent the first seven years of his career with Oakland...Posted a .387 OBP at home during his final three seasons in Oakland.
- Ranks fifth in the NL with a .368 OBP...Leads the majors with a Mets-record 24 HBP.
- Has 16 extra-base hits in his last 33 games...Had 16 XBH in his previous 79 games (May 3-August 14).
- Is 14th in the majors in pitches seen per plate appearance, with his PAs lasting 4.15 pitches on average.
