### Doubleheader

The Braves and Mets today are set to play the first of two scheduled doubleheaders between the clubs, with the other slated for August 12 here at Citi Field.

The Braves went 2-4 in doubleheader games last season, with all four losses coming in a pair of doubleheaders with New York.

Ronald Acuña Jr. has played in 25 doubleheader games in his career, and is batting .357/.432/.869 with 12 homers and 23 RBI. He has five career leadoff homers in doubleheader games, and has went deep in both games three different times.

**TODAY'S GAMES:** The Braves and Mets today conclude a three-game wraparound series with what are the second and third of 13 games between the teams this season...The two will next meet from June 6-8, playing a three-game set at Truist Park in Atlanta.

*A* Atlanta won the opener, 4-0, on Friday night in a game that was called after 5.0 innings due to rain, before rainouts on Saturday and Sunday.

*A* The Braves went 10-9 against the Mets last season, taking the season set from their N.L. East rivals for the fifth consecutive season...They also went 10-9 in 2021, 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018...Since the start of the 2018 season, Atlanta is 52-35 (.598) against New York overall.

*A* The Braves have won seven of the last eight games with New York dating to last season, outscoring the Mets 46-19 (+27) over the stretch...Atlanta allowed more than two runs just twice in the eight games.

*A* RH Spencer Strider has made five appearances and three starts in his career against New York, compiling a 2-1 record with a 4.30 ERA (7 ER/14.2 IP)...In three turns last season, the 6-foot-0, 205-pound right-hander went 1-1 with a 4.38 ERA (6 ER/12.1 IP) and 17 strikeouts...The Braves have yet to lose any of Strider's five starts this season, and he is 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA in these games.

*A* RH Charlie Morton has made 18 career appearances and 17 starts against the Mets, going 4-5 with a 3.66 ERA (39 ER/96.0 IP)...The 6-foot-5, 235-pound right-hander made four starts against New York last year, going 1-2 with a 4.98 ERA (12 ER/21.2 IP)...Morton has allowed no more than two runs in each of his last four starts, including 7.0 one-run innings last turn.

*A* RH Denyi Reyes is set for his first start of the season and the second of his career...In five relief appearances with the Mets this season, he has yet to allow a run over 6.1 innings, and has a 1.29 ERA (2 ER/14.0 IP) in eight career games...Reyes has never faced Atlanta.

*A* RH Tylor Megill has pitched in six games and made five starts against Atlanta in his career, going 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (11 ER/25.2 IP)...The 6-foot-7, 230-pound native of Long Beach, CA made one start and one relief appearance against the Braves last season, and allowed seven hits and five runs over just 6.0 innings...In five games this year, all starts, he has gone 3-1 with a 3.96 ERA.

**WIN:** Atlanta won the opener of this series Friday night, 4-0, after rains stopped play at the end of the fifth inning...Atlanta improved to a perfect 5-0 in series openers on the road this season.

*A* LH Max Fried was credited with the shutout, his first of the season...The first complete game of his career also came in a rain-shortened affair, a 4-1 win over the Reds on August 1, 2019...That game was called after six innings.

**STRIDER STRIKEOUTS:** RHP Spencer Strider enters tonight with 49 strikeouts on the season, third most in the majors...Both of the two pitchers with more (TOR's Kevin Gausman -54; ARI's Zac Gallen - 51) have made six starts on the season, compared to Strider's five.

*A* Strider's 14.70 SO/9.0 IP are most in the majors, and just one other pitcher (Jacob deGrom, 13.35) is over 13.00.

*A* Strider struck out 13 over 8.0 scoreless innings in his last start, carrying a no-hitter into the eighth...He induced 31 swings-and-misses in the start, the most by a Braves pitcher since pitch tracking was introduced in 2008.

*A* He has 16 strikeouts this season on just three pitches, the most such strikeouts in the majors...Tampa Bay's Shane Bieber has 15 to rank second.

*A* Strider has fanned at least nine batters in each of his last nine starts, dating to last season...The run is the longest active streak in baseball of at least nine strikeouts, and stands as a new franchise record...He surpassed John Smoltz's then-record eight such starts in his last turn.

*A* Just two pitchers in baseball's modern era (since 1900) have a longer streak of nine-plus strikeout games...Chris Sale did so in 10 straight starts in 2018, while Nolan Ryan owns the major league record with 11 straight games of at least nine strikeouts, done in 1977.

**MARCH & APRIL:** Back-to-back rainouts ended Atlanta's schedule for the opening month of the season, and the Braves played to an 18-9 (.667) record entering May...That is the second-best record in the National League (Pittsburgh, 20-9, .690), and fourth best in the majors (Tampa Bay, 23-6, .793; Baltimore, 19-9, .679).

*A* This year marks Atlanta's best record entering the month of May since 2000, when that club played to an 18-6 record and a .750 winning percentage in March and April.

*A* The Braves went 11-2 (.846) on the road to open the season, the club's best road mark before May since the 1982 team played to a perfect 8-0 away from home.

**OLSON RBI:** 1B Matt Olson drove in three of Atlanta's four runs on Friday night, connecting on a three-run homer in the top of the fifth...Olson's 25 RBI on the season are tied for most in the National League, and his eight home runs rank fourth.

*A* The home run also accounted for the 500th RBI of his career.

*A* Since his major league debut on September 12, 2016, he is one of just 11 players in baseball with at least 500 RBI, and one of four first basemen to do so in that span...Nolan Arenado leads all of baseball with 621 RBI since that date, while José Abreu (576), Paul Goldschmidt (562) and Freddie Freeman (552) have more among primary first basemen.

#### Today's Game

- Strider is set to make his sixth start of the year and first against the Mets in '23.
  - Won his last matchup against New York (NL) August 15, 2022.
- Enters play with nine consecutive games of at least nine strikeouts dating to September 1, 2022.
  - It is the longest active streak in baseball and is tied for third-longest in the modern era (since 1900).
  - Passed Hall-of-Famer John Smoltz for the longest streak in franchise history.
  - The most in baseball were 11 games by Hall-of-Famer Nolan Ryan.
  - Among active pitchers, only Chris Sale has recorded a longer streak of consecutive games with at least nine strikeouts.
- Leads all qualified starters with a rate of 14.70 strikeouts per nine innings.
- Strider's 59.5% rate of pitches in the zone is the highest among qualifiers.
  - His swing and miss rate of 40.1% is the second highest in the majors, trailing only Texas' Jacob deGrom's 42.1%.
- Carried a perfect game into the seventh inning in his last start against Miami until he lost his bid on a Matt Olson error.
  - Maintained a no-hitter through 7.1 innings; broken up on a single by Jean Segura.
  - Struckout a season-high 13 hitters and finished with two hits allowed over 8.0 innings pitched.
- Enters play with a 1.80 ERA, second lowest in the NL and fourth in the majors.

#### 2023 Recap

- Started the second game of the season for Atlanta and earned the win, fanning nine hitters while pitching 6.0 scoreless innings against Washington.

#### 2022 Recap

- Pitched his first full major league season and went 11-5 with a 2.67 ERA (39 ER/131.2 IP) and 202 strikeouts...Led rookie pitchers in the majors with 4.9 fWAR and 3.7 bWAR.
  - Fanned 202 and allowed just 86 hits on the season.
  - Is the only pitcher in baseball history to record at least 200 strikeouts and allow fewer than 100 hits in a year.
- Became the quickest pitcher in baseball history to ever reach 200 strikeouts in a single season, doing so in his 130.0th inning...Hall-of-Famer LHP Randy Johnson held the previous record, reaching 200 strikeouts in 130.2 innings in 2001.
  - Was the third rookie in franchise history to strikeout 200 in a season, and the first in the modern era...The other rookies to reach 200 strikeouts were RHP Kid Nichols, who struck out 222 in 1890, and Bill Stemmyer, who fanned 239 in 1886. ...Just 16 rookies have done so in history, with Yu Darvish being the last to do so (221 strikeouts in 2012).
  - His 13.8 strikeouts per 9.0 innings is the highest by a rookie pitcher in MLB history (min. 12 starts)...Chicago's Kerry Wood held the previous mark with 12.6 K/9.0 IP.
  - No pitcher in Braves franchise history has pitched at least 100 innings in a season and fanned 11.0 batters per 9.0 innings...In fact, just two pitchers, Brandon Beachy with 10.7 in 2011 and Charlie Morton with 10.5 last year, have been above 10.0.
- Started on September 1 vs. Colorado and pitched a career-most 8.0 innings, holding the Rockies to just two hits and no runs in the effort...The Braves beat the Rockies, 3-0, to give Strider his ninth win of the season.
  - Set the single-game, Atlanta-era record with 16 strikeouts in the game, which also ranks second in all-time franchise history...John Smoltz previously held the Atlanta-era record, punching out 15 on two occasions: May 24, 1992 at Montreal and April 10, 2005 versus the New York Mets...Warren Spahn holds the all-time Braves record with 18 punchouts on June 14, 1952 versus the Chicago Cubs.
  - Strider's 16 strikeouts are the most in a single game by a Braves rookie in franchise history.
  - He became the fourth different rookie in the modern era to strike out at least 16 batters in a game without issuing a walk...Dwight Gooden had exactly 16 K's in two consecutive starts in 1984 (9/12 vs. PIT, 9/17 @ PHI)...Kerry Wood struck out 20 against Houston on May 6, 1998, and Jon Gray fanned 16 Padres on September 17, 2016....Research courtesy Elias.

#### Career Recap

- Drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the fourth round of the 2020 MLB June Amateur Draft.
- In three seasons with Clemson, went 5-2 with a 4.71 ERA (33 ER/63.0 IP) in 26 appearances, 10 starts.
  - Struck out 89, an average of 12.7 per 9.0 innings.

#### Today's Game

- Ⓐ Set to make his first start of the season New York (NL) and sixth of the year.
- Ⓐ Scattered three hits over 7.0 innings of one-run ball with nine strikeouts during his last start against Miami.
  - Ⓐ The 7.0 frames tossed and nine punchouts were both season highs.
  - Ⓐ It was Morton's third consecutive start of at least 6.0 innings and two-or-fewer earned runs.
  - Ⓐ Morton and Strider became the fifth pair of teammates to each strikeout at least nine in back-to-back games this season.
- Ⓐ Enters play with only 15% of balls put in play against him registering as line drives.
  - Ⓐ The fourth lowest mark in the majors.
- Ⓐ In his age 39 season, Morton is the sixth-oldest active pitcher in the majors.
- Ⓐ Since the beginning of the 2020 season, Morton has struck out 289 hitters with his curveball, the most in the majors.
  - Ⓐ He has thrown his curveball on 37.3% of pitches, the third highest rate in baseball among qualified starters.
  - Ⓐ During that span hitters missing on 51.5% of curveballs thrown, the third highest rate in the majors...The MLB average is 12.3% (among QS).

#### 2023 Recap

- Ⓐ Made his first start of the season against St. Louis.
  - Ⓐ Only struck out one hitter through 5.1 innings pitched against the Cardinals, marking just the ninth time in his career Morton pitched at least 5.0 frames while failing to record at least two punchouts and the first since June 5, 2015 against Pittsburgh.
- Ⓐ Struck out San Diego's Jake Croneworth on April 8 to record his 1,700th career punchout.
  - Ⓐ Is one of 16 active pitchers in baseball with as many strikeouts.

#### 2022 Recap

- Ⓐ Made 31 starts during his 15th major league season and went 9-6 with a 4.34 ERA (83 ER/172.0 IP) and 205 strikeouts...Compiled 1.6 bWAR on the year.
  - Ⓐ His 205 strikeouts on the season were tied for ninth most in the majors...Since June 1, his 159 strikeouts were fifth most in baseball.
  - Ⓐ Morton's 205 strikeouts last season were fifth most in the National League, and he is one of just three pitchers in Atlanta franchise history to log at least 200 strikeouts in multiple seasons...He struck out 216 last year...Hall-of-Famers John Smoltz (five seasons) and Phil Niekro (three seasons) were the only others to do so
  - Ⓐ Since the start of the 2018 season, Morton's 904 strikeouts are fifth most in the majors...Only Gerrit Cole (1,207), Max Scherzer (1,050), Aaron Nola (1,011) and Robbie Ray (931) have more.
- Ⓐ Had 45 total strikeouts in June, most in the National League and tied for tops in the majors...The White Sox' Dylan Cease also had 45.
  - Ⓐ Morton had never previously struck out 45+ batters in five or fewer starts in a single month...His previous high was 40 strikeouts, done over five starts in May of 2018.
  - Ⓐ Furthermore, since the mound-to-plate distance was first set at 60'6" in 1893, Morton is the only Braves pitcher to fan at least 45 batters in five or fewer starts in a single month.
  - Ⓐ Research courtesy the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Ⓐ With his start on May 25, became the 10th active pitcher in the majors to make 300 career starts.
  - Ⓐ Over his first 150 career starts, from his debut through August 20, 2015, Morton compiled a 44-65 record and a 4.46 ERA...In his next 150 starts, he went 66-33 with a 3.61 ERA.

#### Career Recap

- Ⓐ A 15-year major league veteran, has compiled a 116-101 record and a 4.03 ERA (805 ER/1797.0 IP) across 323 games, 322 starts...Has fanned 1,697 and pitched a pair of shutouts.
  - Ⓐ Has pitched for Atlanta (2008, '21-22), Pittsburgh (2009-15), Philadelphia (2016), Houston (2017-18) and Tampa Bay (2019-20).
  - Ⓐ Is a two-time All-Star (2018 & 2019) and won the 2017 World Series while with Houston and 2021 World Series with Atlanta.
