TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 21, 2012: Down 9-0 after the fifth inning, the Yankees rally at Fenway Park to win 15-9, marking the fifth time the Yankees have erased a nine-run deficit to win. Nick Swisher hits a grand slam and Mark Teixeira homers twice.

April 21, 2009: Starter Andy Pettitte does not strike out or walk a batter in 7.0IP as the Yankees win the first night game in the current Yankee Stadium's history, 5-3. He is the first Yankee to pitch at least 7.0IP without recording a walk or strikeout since Dave Eiland in a 7-4 Yankees victory on 10/6/91 vs. Cleveland.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 22, 1959: Whitey Ford pitches a 1-0, 14-inning shutout at Griffith Stadium in Washington (7H, 7BB, 15K). Moose Skowron provides the margin of victory with a solo homer off Chuck Stobbs.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will continue their seven-game homestand today with the final game of a three-game set vs. Tampa Bay (1-1 thus far)...will also face Oakland in a four-game set from Mon.-Thurs.

- ▶ Their 14-7 record (.667) is the fourth-best record in the Majors, trailing only Atlanta (14-5, .737), Cleveland (15-6, .714) and Milwaukee (13-6, .684)...their 14 wins are tied with Atlanta for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland.
- ▶ Marks just the fifth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees have gone 14-7 or better to start a season (also went 15-6 in 2020 and '22 and 14-7 in 2010 and '17).
- ▶ *With a win today*, it would also mark just the fifth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees went 15-7 or better to start a season (went 16-6 in 2020 and '22 and 15-7 in 2010 and '17).
- ▶ The Yankees are in the midst of a 17-day stretch without an off day (4/19-5/5)...are 1-1 so far.
- ▶ Are 2-0 in rubber games this season.
- ▶ Are 4-2 following a loss this year.
- ▶ Seven of the Yankees' 14 wins are come-from-behind wins...have recorded four wins this season when trailing after six innings...recorded just six such wins in 2023.
- ▶ Have won five of their six completed series.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Rays, 2-0, in 10 innings on Saturday at Yankee Stadium...**LHP Nestor Cortes** (7.0IP, 6H, 0R, 0BB, 9K) tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and recorded a season-high 9K in a no-decision...**Yankees batters** were shut out for the third time this season...**RF Juan Soto** (2-for-4, 1 double) was the only Yankee to record multiple hits...**1B Anthony Rizzo** (1-for-4) and **LF/CF Alex Verdugo** (1-for-4) were the only other Yankees to record hits...**RHP Luke Weaver** (1.0IP, 1K) tossed a scoreless eighth inning of relief...**RHP Clay Holmes** (1.0IP, 1H, 2K) tossed a scoreless ninth inning...struck out Curtis Mead looking to record his 300th career strikeout...**LHP Caleb Ferguson** (1.0IP, 2H, 2R/1ER, 2K) recorded his third loss of the season after allowing 2R/1ER in the 10th inning.

BLANK SPACE: Yankees batters were shut out for the third time this season on Saturday vs. Tampa Bay (also 0R on 4/2 at Arizona and 4/5 vs. Toronto)...in their other 18 games this year, have scored at least 4R in 14 of those games, at least 5R in 12 games and at least 6R in eight games

GOT YOUR NUMBER: INF **Anthony Rizzo** has hit .500/.500/1.200 (5-for-10) with 1 double and 2HR off Tampa Bay's RHP Aaron Civale.

ON A ROLL: C **Jose Trevino** is batting .467/.529/.667 (7-for-15) with 3R, 1HR, 5RBI and 2BB over his last five games (since 4/13).

THREE'S COMPANY: The Yankees are 14-2 this season when scoring at least 3R.

HOLMES SWEET HOLMES: RHP **Clay Holmes** has not allowed an earned run over 11.0 innings this season, going 1-0 with eight saves (11.0IP, 12H, 3R/0ER, 1BB, 8K, 2HP).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 3.16 ERA (111.0IP, 39ER) in 21 starts this year, the fourth-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (1.71), Philadelphia (2.25) and Kansas City (2.77)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 18 of their 21 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 14 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in nine starts...have not allowed more than 4ER in any start this season.

VERDAWGO: OF **Alex Verdugo** is hitting .316 (12-for-38) with 9R, 6 doubles, 1HR, 2RBI, 6BB, 1HP and 1SB over his last 11 games (since 4/8)...has reached base in 10 of those games.

BATTERS' EYE: Yankees batters lead the Majors with a 4.14 pitches per plate appearance ratio.
▶ Lead the Majors with 95BB and an 8.46 PA/BB ratio (804PA/95BB)

NASTY NESTOR: LHP **Nestor Cortes** tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and recorded a season-high 9K without recording a decision on Saturday vs. Tampa Bay...marked his second scoreless start this season (also 0R in 8.0IP on 4/8 vs. Miami).

- ▶ Has gone 1-0 with a 1.89 ERA (19.0IP, 4ER) and 21K in his last three starts (since 4/8).
- ▶ His 9K marked his most in a game since his career-high-tying 12K on 10/1/22 vs. Baltimore...also marked his most strikeouts in a game without issuing a walk in his career.
- ▶ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 49-of-59 starts since the beginning of 2021 and 2R-or-fewer in 41 of those starts... in 67 appearances (59 starts) since the beginning of 2021, has gone 20-10 with a 3.12 ERA (343.2IP, 119ER), 361K and a .211 (268-for-1,270) opponents' BA.

THE GREAT JUAN: OF **Juan Soto** recorded the Yankees' only multi-hit game on Saturday...has reached base in each of his last 13 games (since 4/6), reaching base multiple times in nine of those games...**has hit .391/.517/.739 (18-for-46) with 10R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 16RBI, 13BB, 1SB and 1SF in that span.**

▶ Saturday marked his 800th career game played...his 658 career walks marked the fourth-most by any Major League player through his first 800 career games played, trailing only Ted Williams (731BB), Max Bishop (707BB) and Frank Thomas (673BB).

▶ **Is batting .563/.636/1.188 (9-for-16) with 1 double, 3HR, 17RBI, 5BB and 1SF with RISP this season**...with RISP, leads the Majors in BA, SLG and OPS (1.824), and ranks second in OBP (second in AL).

▶ Has batted .294/.457/.535 (199-for-678) with 37 doubles, 5 triples, 39HR, 324RBI and 214BB with runners in scoring position in his career, posting the fifth-highest career on-base percentage with RISP by any Major League player over the last 51 years since 1974 (min. 500PA).

▶ Over the last three games, has driven in five of the Yankees' 11R.

▶ Has reached base safely in 19 of his 21 games this season, hitting .354/.469/.608 (28-for-79) with 13R, 5 doubles, 5HR, 20RBI, 18BB, 1SB and 1SF...has reached base multiple times in 14 of those games.

▶ Ranks second in the Majors in OBP (.469, first in AL), times on base (46, first in AL) and WAR among position players (1.7 - FanGraphs, first in AL), tied for second in walks (18, tied for first in AL), third in OPS (1.077, first in AL), tied for fifth in RBI (20, tied for third in AL), seventh in BA (.354, fourth in AL), tied for seventh in multi-hit games (9, tied for fifth in AL), ninth in hits (28, fourth in AL) and 10th in SLG (.608, fourth in AL).

▶ Is only the second Yankee in the last 18 years (since 2007) to reach base at least 46 times in the Yankees' first 21 games of a season, joining Aaron Judge (46TOB in 2018).

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a **2.99 ERA (189.2IP, 63ER) this year, the second-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.59)**...their 2.99 ERA is their second-lowest through the Yankees' first 21 games of a season in the last 43 years since 1982 (2.70 ERA in 2022).

▶ Have held opponents to 3R-or-fewer in 13 of 21 games this year (are 10-3 in those games)...are 12-3 this season when holding their opponent to 4R-or-fewer.

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees have had 16 of their 21 games decided by 3R-or-fewer...their 16 such games are tied with St. Louis and Detroit for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (17)...are 10-6 (.625) in those games.

- ▶ The Yankees have had 13 of their 21 games decided by 2R-or-fewer (are 9-4 in those games)...their 13 such games are tied with Detroit for the most in the Majors...are 6-2 in one-run games...their eight one-run games are the third-most in the Majors (Detroit-10; Oakland- nine).
- ▶ Each of their last six games, seven of their last eight games and eight of their last 10 games have been decided by 2R-or-fewer.

PEN PALS: Yankees relievers have posted a 2.75 ERA (78.2IP, 24ER) this season, the third-lowest ERA in the Majors...trails only Detroit (1.37) and Cleveland (2.19).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS GIL (0-1, 3.86 ERA)

RHP Luis Gil will make his fourth start of the season in today's series finale vs. Tampa Bay...the 25-year-old will start on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...last pitched on Monday at Toronto and took the loss after allowing 3ER in a season-high 5.0IP (3H, 7BB, 6K, 0HR, 1WP)...his first start of the season on 4/1 at Arizona marked his first Major League appearance since 5/12/22 at Chicago-AL...has held opponents to a .133 BA (6-for-45) this season...**has struck out at least six batters in eight of his first 10 career starts, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (nine) for the most such games in a pitchers first 10 career starts in franchise history...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in eight of his 10 career starts**...spent the entire 2023 season on the 60-day injured list recovering from right elbow surgery...underwent right elbow UCL reconstruction surgery on 5/24/22...the surgery was performed by Dr. Christopher Ahmad at Columbia Presbyterian Hospital in New York, N.Y....made his first career Opening Day roster in 2024...was added to the Yankees' 40-man roster on 11/20/19...was acquired by the Yankees from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for OF Jake Cave on 3/16/18...was originally signed by Minnesota as a non-drafted free agent on 2/13/15...last name is pronounced "HEEL."

LAST TIME OUT: Took his first loss of the year in the Yankees' 3-1 loss on Monday at Toronto (5.0IP, 3H, 3ER, 7BB, 6K, 0HR, 1WP)...his 5.0IP marked a season high...his 7BB tied his career high (also 7BB on 9/8/21 vs. Toronto)...surrendered a walk with the bases loaded to Isiah Kiner-Falefa and allowed the go-ahead run to score on a wild pitch in the second inning...also allowed an RBI double to Alejandro Kirk in the third inning.

VS. TAMPA BAY: Will be making his first career start vs. Tampa Bay today.

- ✦ In five career starts vs. AL East opponents, has gone 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA (23.1IP, 13H, 8ER, 23BB, 30K, 0HR)...has held opponents to a .160 BA (13-for-81).

HOME SWEET HOME: Will be making his second start this season at Yankee Stadium today vs. Tampa Bay.

- ✦ In his first home start on 4/7 vs. Toronto, did not record a decision after allowing 2ER in 4.1IP (2H, 4BB, 8K, 0HR, 1HP)...his 8K tied his career high (also 8K on 8/8/21 vs. Seattle and 9/13/21 vs. Minnesota)...retired eight of his first nine batters faced (1BB).
- ✦ In seven career home starts, is 1-1 with a 3.21 ERA (33.2IP, 22H, 13R/12ER, 23BB, 46K, 4HR)...has held opponents to a .177 BA (22-for-124) at Yankee Stadium...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in six of his seven home starts...has recorded six-or-more strikeouts in six of those seven games.**

2024: Is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA this season (14.0IP, 6H, 6ER, 14BB, 20K, 0HR)...has struck out six-or-more batters and allowed 3ER-or-fewer in all three starts this season...has held opponents to a .133 BA (6-for-45).

- ✦ Made his last start on Monday at Toronto, recording his first loss of the season after allowing 3ER in a season-high 5.0IP (3H, 7BB, 6K, 0HR, 1WP)...his 7BB matched his career high (also 7BB on 9/8/21 vs. Toronto).
- ✦ On 4/7 vs. Toronto, did not record a decision after allowing 2ER in 4.1IP (2H, 4BB, 8K, 0HR, 1HP)...his 8K tied his career high (also 8K on 8/8/21 vs. Seattle and 9/13/21 vs. Minnesota)...retired eight of his first nine batters faced (1BB).
- ✦ Made his season debut on 4/1 at Arizona (ND, 4.2IP, 1H, 1ER, 3BB, K, 0HR)...retired all eight right-handed batters faced (4K).
- ✦ Among Major League rookies this season, ranks sixth in strikeouts (first in AL).

2023: Made just two rehab starts with Single-A Tampa, posting an 11.25 ERA (4.0IP, 6H, 5ER, 3BB, 6K, 0HR)...spent the entire season on the 60-day injured list recovering from right elbow surgery.

- ✦ Made his first career Opening Day roster in 2024.
- ✦ Missed all of the 2023 Major League season on the 60-day injured list after undergoing right elbow UCL reconstruction surgery on 5/24/22...the surgery was performed by Dr. Christopher Ahmad at Columbia Presbyterian Hospital in New York, N.Y.
- ✦ Saw his first Major League action in 2021, going 1-1 with a 3.07 ERA (29.1IP, 20H, 11R/10ER, 19BB, 38K, 4HR) in six starts with the Yankees...**recorded at least 6K in five of his first six Major League starts in 2021, becoming just the fifth Yankee in franchise history to accomplish the feat...** joined Deivi García, Masahiro Tanaka, José Contreras and Al Leiter (also five games).
- ✦ Was added to the Yankees' 40-man roster on 11/20/19.
- ✦ Was acquired by the Yankees from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for OF Jake Cave on 3/16/18...was originally signed by Minnesota as a non-drafted free agent on 2/13/15.
- ✦ Last name is pronounced "HEEL."

MONDAY'S STARTING PITCHER VS. OAKLAND: LHP CARLOS RODÓN (1-1, 3.66 ERA)

LHP Carlos Rodón will make his fifth start of the season in Monday's series opener vs. Oakland...the 31-year-old will make the start on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...made his fourth start of the season on Tuesday at Toronto, recording his first loss of the season after allowing 3ER in 4.0IP (5H, 4BB, 5K)...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his four starts this season**...in his first season with the Yankees in 2023, went 3-8 with a 6.85 ERA (64.1IP, 65H, 51R/49ER, 28BB, 64K, 15HR) in 14 starts...missed 100 team games due to two injured list stints...has played in parts of 10 Major League seasons with the Chicago-AL (2015-21), San Francisco (2022) and Yankees (2023-24)...has finished in the top-six of Cy Young voting twice (fifth in 2021 and sixth in 2022)...is a two-time All-Star (2021 and 2022)...has made six Opening Day rosters (2016, '19-22, '24)...began the 2017, 2018 and 2023 seasons on the injured list...was originally selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 16th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play three seasons at North Carolina State University (2012-14)...was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the first round (third overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...signed a six-year Major League contract with the Yankees extending through the 2028 season on 12/21/22.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his fourth start of the season on Tuesday at Toronto, recording his first loss of the season after allowing 3ER in 4.0IP (5H, 4BB, 5K)...his 4.0IP marked a season low...allowed a sac fly to Justin Turner in the third inning and a two-run single to Vladimir Guerrero Jr. in the fourth.

#17 AARON BOONE—Manager**Career Managerial Record: 523-368 (8th-most wins by a Yankees Manager, next: Billy Martin, 556)**

- The 2024 season marks his seventh year at the helm for the Yankees (also 2018-23)...guided the Yankees to an 82-80 record in 2023, finishing fourth in the AL East...marked the Yankees 31st consecutive winning season and sixth such season under Boone...has led the Yankees to two division titles (2019 and 2022).
