METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets contest against the Red Sox was suspended with New York leading, 4-3, and one out in the bottom of the fourth inning...The game will resume at 2:10 p.m. today and will follow with a second game at 7:10 p.m...The Mets continue a five-game, six-day road trip to Boston (three games) and The Bronx (two games).

DOWN ON THE FARM: In his second start at Double-A Binghamton, RHP Tyler Stuart allowed two runs on eight hits with one strikeout in a 5-2 loss for the Rumble Ponies last night...Stuart has allowed two or fewer runs in all 16 of his starts across High-A Brooklyn and Double-A Binghamton this year...Overall, the right-handed pitcher is 4-0 with a 1.62 ERA (16 ER/88.2 IP) with 24 walks and 90 strikeouts, posting a 1.049 WHIP and a 9.1 K/9 IP ratio...The Kankakee, IL native was selected by the Mets in the sixth round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Southern Mississippi.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Mets are set to play their fifth doubleheader of the season today...This includes the completion of the suspended game last Saturday in Washington..New York is 4-4 in twinbills this season... New York has swept eight of their last 15 doubleheaders, including five DH sweeps last season.

MORE THAN A FEELING: The Mets and Red Sox will square off in a doubleheader for the firs time in franchise history.

FEELIN' SATISFIED: Max Scherzer is set to make his sixth career start at Fenway Park...He is 3-2 with a 2.87 ERA (12 ER/37.2 IP) with 12 walks and 44 strikeouts in his previous six starts...Scherzer last started on August 27, 2020 allowing one run over six innings and struck out 11 in

SHIPPING UP TO BOSTON: The Mets face the Red Sox for the first time since 2021, when the they played a pair of home and away games from April 27-28 at Citi Field and September 21-22 at Fenway Park...The Mets have dropped six straight to the Red Sox and eight of the last 10... Overall, New York is 8-11 at Fenway Park (during the regular season. The Mets went 2-1 at Fenway during the 1986 World Series)...Omar Narvaez has hit .346 (9-26) with three runs, one double, three home run and three RBI in nine career games at the yard...Pete Alonso has homered thrice in four career games in Boston.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets hit the road for the first time in the second-half...New York is 22-29 on the road this season...The team's 51 road games as tied for the most in the National League and are tied for second in the majors.

GOOD TIMES ROLL: Brandon Nimmo socked his 15th homer of the season in the top of the third inning of the suspended game last night. Nimmo's career-high is 17 home runs, which he accomplished in 140 games in 2018...The left-handed hitter smacked 16 home runs in 151 games last season.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .292 (59-238) with 28 runs, eight doubles, three triples, six home runs, 28 RBI, 29 walks, a .384 OBP, .450 SLG and an .834 OPS on the road...This compares to a .226/.332/.451 slashline with 18 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .254 (51-201) with 35 runs, 14 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 42 RBI, 20 walks, a .329 OBP, a .522 SLG and an .851 OPS on the road in 2023...He is slashing .195/.301/.371 with 14 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 29-5 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

REX SOX-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped six straight to the Red Sox...The team's six-game losing streak is their longest current losing streak against any opponent.

JULY! JULY! JULY!: The Mets are 9-5 through 14 games in this month... The team's .643 winning percentage is sixth in the majors and is third in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.34 ERA (48 ER/129.1 IP), the lowest ERA in National League in July...Only the Mariners (2.92 ERA) and Blue Javs (3.23) have a lower mark in July...The Mets have hit 23 homers this July, tied for the eighth-most in the majors.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The Mets are in a stretch of eight consecutive games against American League opponents..They are 2-1 in that span...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 12-11 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 247-238 record in Interleague play... The team's .509 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso has hit 37 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 37 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

ALL-AMERICAN: Jeff McNeil has batted .316 (106-335) with 44 runs, 16 doubles, seven home runs, 41 RBI, 23 walks with a .369 OBP and a .427 SLG in 91 career games against the American League...McNeil's .316 average ranks fourth among active players in Interleague games.

YOU CAN CALL ME AL: Francisco Alvarez leads all major league catchers in home runs and is tied for first among all rookies in homers with the Rangers' Josh Jung...He is second in home runs in the majors this month with seven...Only San Diego's Manny Machado has hit more with nine dingers...He is tied for seventh in MLB with 14 RBI this month and is hitting .356 (16-45) in July...Alvarez Francisco Alvarez has a .527 slugging percentage, which would be the highest ever by a Met in his age 21 season or younger...Only two other Mets have had a .500-plus slugging percentage at that age or younger: David Wright (.525 in 2004) and Darryl Strawberry (.512 mark in1983), both in their age 21 seasons.

SECOND HALF SQUAD: The Mets are 273-239 in the second half since 2015 (not including 2020)...New York has only posted a losing second half twice during that time frame (2021 and 2017)...New York's .533 winning percentage during that span is the fifth-best in the NL, behind Los Angeles (.627), St. Louis (.599), Chicago (.576) and Milwaukee (.534).

BROOKS WAS HERE: Since returning from the IL on May 14, Brooks Raley has posted a 0.81 ERA (2 ER/22.1 IP) over 27 games...Raley has 18 holds, tied for the third-most in the NL and tied for the sixth-most in the majors...In 22 games at Citi Field this season, Raley has posted a 1.57 ERA (3 ER/17.1 IP) with five walks and 15 punchouts.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has been successful in all 15 of their stolen base attempts in July, bringing their season tally to 76 steals in 83 attempts...Their 76 steals are tied for 10th in the majors and tied for sixth in the NL...The team's 91.6 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 50 of their last 51 stolen base attempts.

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched 7.0 shutout innings against Los Angeles-NL at Citi Field on July 16... Held the Dodgers to just one hit...Struck out six and walked three in the Mets' 2-1 victory... Was his seventh career start of 7.0 or more innings and one or zero hits allowed.

SHIPPING UP TO BOSTON: Today, Scherzer will make his 13 career start against the Red Sox, his first since August 8, 2020...In those appearances, he is 5-5 with a 5.51 ERA (41 ER/67.0 IP) and has 73 strikeouts...When facing the Red Sox on the road, Scherzer has pitched to a 2.87 ERA (12 ER/37.2 IP) with a 3-2 in six starts, recording five quality starts...Over his last six starts against Boston, dating back to 2013, Scherzer has posted a 4-2 record and holds a 2.79 ERA (12 ER/38.2 IP) with 50 strikeouts during that span

EIGHT IS GREAT: Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings for the first time this season on June 19 at Houston...The last time Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings or more was September 12, 2021 with the Los Angeles Dodgers...This was Scherzer's first time accomplishing this feat as a Met.. Scherzer holds a career record of 47-3 and has a 1.25 ERA (66 ER/475.2 IP) in games where he pitches 8.0 innings or more.

TERRIFIC TEN: Scherzer whiffed ten batters for the first time this season on June 7 at Atlanta...Marked his first double-digit strikeout game since striking out 11 on August 28, 2022 vs. Colorado...He did not record more than six strikeouts in any of his first eight starts of the season and dating back to his final start of the 2022 season...He has had six strikeouts or fewer in eight straight starts only one other time in his career (September 2009-April 2010 with Arizona/Detroit)

DOUBLE THE FUN: With his start on June 13, Scherzer advanced to third place all-time with 111 double-digit strikeout games in his career, three more than Pedro Martinez...He broke a tie with Roger Clemens, who had 110 in his career...He'll need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just 32 punchouts separating the two...With 71 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer nter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

OPENING UP: Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 $\rm ER/45.2~IP$) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field... Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)... Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.
