To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their six-game homestand against the Padres (3-0) and Mets (0-1 two to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...marks their first multi-series homestand comprised of solely NL opponents since May 6-11, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field (PHI/MIL)...have won four of five and six of their last eight games in the wake of a 2-7 stretch (Aug. 14-22)...are an AL-leading 17-9 in their last 26 games (Aug. 3-pres.) and an MLB-best 26-13 in their last 39 (July 20-pres.)...have the AL's hardest remaining schedule with an opp. winning pct. of .517...following this series, five of their seven remaining opponents are currently in position to qualify for the postseason...are 12-6-2 across their last 20 sets (June 19-pres.)...have spent 106 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 66 consecutive days in first place (June 27-pres.)...are seeking their fifth AL East division title, first since winning the division in back-to-back seasons from 2020-21...have held the AL's best record for 105 days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), according to Stats Perform.

★ The Rays rallied for a pair of 8th-inning runs, but the comeback bid fell short in last night's 3-2, series-opening loss...it marked their first Interleague loss since June 20 vs. WSH, snapping a 10-game winning streak, tied for their second-longest vs. NL opponents in team history.

★ It marked their third straight one-run game, tying their a season high (3x, also: June 15-17 & June 20-22)...their last longer streak was five straight one-run contests from Sept. 13-17, 2025...despite the loss, they are still 9-4 in their last 13 one-run affairs (July 26-pres.) following a 2-9 skid (June 1-July 18), and their 20-14 record in such games ranks second in the AL/fourth in MLB.

★ The club failed to homer in last night's loss, snapping a three-game streak of multi-homer efforts, their second longest this season (6G: June 25-July 1)...the Rays are 40-1 when out-homering opponents, recording 27 straight wins since the lone loss on May 25 at BAL.

★ The Rays went an AL-best 18-10 (.643) during August, second in the majors to the Phillies (21-7/.750) and their best mark during the month since August 2023 (17-8/.680)...the pitching staff led the majors in WHIP (1.12), walk rate (4.9%), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.84), while Rays hitters recorded MLB's most stolen bases (34) and the AL's highest average (.269).

★ The Rays are 25-13 (.658) when opposed by left-handed starting pitchers, the best record in the AL and third in the majors to the Diamondbacks (25-11/.694) and Brewers (28-13/.683).

★ The Rays need to win the next two games to avoid their first series loss to the Mets since May 16-18, 2023 in New York and first at Tropicana Field since June 12-14, 2012...overall, the club is looking to avoid its fourth series loss in its last five home sets (July 31-pres.).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—In accordance with major league rosters expanding from 26 to 28 players today, the Rays reinstated **OF Victor Mesa Jr.** (left hamstring strain) from the 10-day IL and recalled **RHP Alex Cook** from Triple-A Durham.

THE RAY WAY—The Rays clinched a winning season before the end of August for the fourth time (excl. 2020), joining 2023 (82-52), 2021 (84-48), and 2008 (84-51)...this marks the 13th winning season across 29 campaigns in franchise history, all of which have come in the last 19 seasons becoming the Rays in 2008 after the Devil Rays had none across the franchise's first decade of existence (1998-2007)...including results thus far from this season, the 13 winning seasons since 2008 are tied with the Braves and Brewers for fourth most among all major league clubs, trailing the Dodgers (18), Yankees (17), and Cardinals (16)...the Astros, Guardians, and Red Sox (all 11) are the next closest AL teams over that timeframe.

★ The Rays opened a season with five straight winning months for the second time, joining 2008...the 2008 squad posted a 13-14 record in September, but went on to make the first World Series appearance in franchise history.

★ This marks the fourth time the Rays have entered September atop the AL East, joining 2021 (84-48), 2020 (25-11), and 2008 (84-51)...they went on to win the division crown in each of those seasons, including World Series appearances in 2020 and 2008 and a club-record 100 wins in 2021.

★ The Rays hold a 4-5 game lead over the second-place Yankees in the AL East standings...according to MLB.com's Sarah Langs, only five clubs in the divisional era (since 1969) have held a lead of 4-5 games or more entering September and not gone on to win their division: the 2025 Tigers (9-5), 2006 Tigers (4-5), 1995 Angels (7-5), 1978 Red Sox (6-5), and 1969 Cubs (4-5).

★ The Rays are approaching their first postseason berth since 2023 and sixth in the last eight seasons since 2019...as it stands, their five postseason appearances since 2019 are sixth most in the majors, trailing the Dodgers (7), Astros (6), Braves (6), Brewers (6), and Yankees (6)...they have made the postseason nine times since becoming the Rays in 2008, tied with the Astros and Brewers for fifth most in MLB behind the Dodgers (15), Yankees (13), Braves (10), and Cardinals (10).

THE LEADING CHAN—With 41 hits and 11 steals in August, **Chandler Simpson** became the first player in franchise history to lead the majors in both hits and steals during a calendar month, becoming the first major league player to turn the trick since **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (42H/16SB) in September 2024 (Elias)...he was the first Ray to pace MLB in hits during a month since **Yandy Diaz** in June 2025 (40) and the first to lead in steals since himself in July 2025 (11st with **CLE Jose Ramirez**, 10)...it was the first time a Ray recorded MLB's most steals outright in a month since **Jose Caballero** a month prior in June 2025 (10)...Simpson became the first player with 40 hits or more and 10 stolen bases or more in any month since **PHI Trea Turner** in August 2025 (41H/10SB) and the second AL hitter since 2015, joining **SEA Julio Rodriguez** in August 2023 (45H, 11SB)...he joined **Carl Crawford** as the only Rays to accomplish the feat—Crawford did so in May 2009 (43H/21SB), August 2007 (50H/11SB), and June 2004 (40H/11SB)...the 41 hits were fourth most by a Rays hitter during August, trailing Crawford in 2007 (50) and **Aubrey Huff** in both 2002 (44) and 2003 (42)...it marked the second-most hits by a Ray during any month since 2011, trailing **Corey Dickerson** in May 2017 (44).

★ Over his last 60 games (June 19-pres.), Simpson paces the majors in batting average (.368/84-for-228), hits, and stolen bases (24)...min. 150 AB, it marks the second-highest average across any 60-game span within a single season in Rays history, trailing Huff (.372) from July 16-Sept. 17, 2002.

★ Simpson (.311) is six points behind **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (.317) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join Diaz (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he could become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title in one of his first two MLB seasons, including the third since 1942 along with **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season) in 2001 and Rays Hall of Famer **BOS Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season) in 1983.

★ With 38 SB, third most in MLB, Simpson's two steals shy of joining **CAL Chad Curtis** (1992-93), **MON Delino DeShields** (1990-91), **STL Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and **NY Yankees Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns.

STREAKING INTO SEPTEMBER—Junior **Caminero** has hit safely in a career-high 14 straight games, the majors' longest active streak and the longest by a Ray since **Chander Simpson's** career-best 18-game run from June 25-July 19, 2025...he is slashing .352/.407/.500 (19-for-54) with 2 2B, 2 HR, 8 RBI, and a .907 OPS during the streak, tying with three other players for the AL's most hits since it began on Aug. 17...he has homered in two of his last three games on the heels of a career-high-tying 15-game drought without a long ball...with 37 HR, Caminero is tied with **HOU Yordan Alvarez** for the most homers in the AL, trailing only **PHI Kyle Schwarber** (40) and **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** (38) across all of MLB...this marks the latest date in franchise history a Rays player has held at least a share of the AL home run lead...the 37 HR marked third most by a Ray before the end of August, trailing Caminero last season (39) and **Carlos Peña** (38) in 2009...he is 3 HR shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-HR campaigns (45HR in 2025) and needs 9 HR over the Rays final 25 games to tie Peña's franchise record from 2007 (46HR).

CLOSING TIME—**Bryan Baker** has converted a franchise-record 28 consecutive save opportunities (May 17-pres.), pushing his season-long total to an MLB-leading 39 saves, most by a Ray since **Alex Colomé** paced the majors with 47 in 2017...Baker's 28-save streak ties **SD Mason Miller** (March 28-July 29) for MLB's longest this season and is the longest single-season streak by an AL pitcher since **CLE Emmanuel Clase** converted 34 straight saves from May 20-Sept. 25, 2024...he is attempting to join Colomé as the only Rays to pace the majors in saves over a full season.

PITCHER'S PARADISE—The Rays staff has yielded 3 ER or fewer in eight of the last nine games, turning in a 2.30 ERA (82.0IP, 21ER) while holding opponents to a .185/.219/.282 (55-for-298) line—they lead the majors in opp. AVG, opp. OBP, hits per 9.0 IP (6.04), walks per 9.0 IP (1.43), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.85) over that stretch (Aug. 22-pres.)...they also have MLB's best WHIP in that span (0.93), with the Dodgers (1.01) being the next closest staff...entering that stretch Rays pitchers had permitted five runs or more in a season-high six consecutive games (Aug. 16-21)...the starting rotation has a 2.19 ERA during the nine-game span, going 4-1 with 44 SO against 5 BB...six of their last eight starts have been quality.

FROM THE BIG APPLE TO THE BAY—The Rays continue their three-game set against the Mets tonight at Tropicana Field after falling 3-2 in Monday's series opener...the Rays swept the Mets in their three-game series at Citi Field last season (June 13-15), outscoring them 24-9, to improve to 8-5-0 in their last 13 series against New York...they have won 16 of their last 22 games against the club since **Kevin Cash** took the helm in 2015—only the Astros (15-4/.789) have a better record vs. the Mets in that span...last night's loss snapped an eight-game winning streak over the Mets at Tropicana Field...it marked the Rays' second-longest home winning streak over an NL opponent behind a nine-game run vs. the Pirates (2014-25) and tied for their sixth longest against any club.

★ **Nick Fortes** is 3-for-4 with 2 HR lifetime vs. Mets starter **Sean Manaea**, one of two pitchers he has multiple home runs against in his career along with **CWS Luis Castillo** (2).

TONIGHT’S START—**Freddy Peralta** is slated to make his sixth start as a Ray and second at home tonight, his 28th start of the season and the 190th (239th outing) of his career...marks his first start against against his former team after the Rays acquired him from the Mets on Aug. 2 in exchange for minor leaguers **RHP Gary Gill Hill**, **INF Émilien Pitre**, and **OF Aidan Smith**...was traded to the Mets from the Brewers on Jan. 21, 2026 and pitched to a 4.99 ERA (113.2IP, 63ER) with 113 strikeouts across 22 starts.

- With a win tonight, Peralta would become the only active pitcher with five career wins or more and zero losses against the Mets...is currently tied with ATL **Chris Sale** (4-0)...only three other active pitchers have won each appearance without a loss against a single club (min. 5G), a list that includes PHI **Nestor Cortes** vs. CWS (6-0), HOU **Hunter Brown** vs. CWS (5-0), and BOS **Sonny Gray** vs. SD (5-0).
- His career .205 (296-for-1,447) opp. average following the All-Star break ranks second among active MLB starters (min. 1,300AB) behind LAD **Blake Snell** (.190/387-for-36).
- He has gone 6.0 IP or more in back-to-back starts for the second time this season, joining June 3-9...his last longer streak was three straight starts from July 2 (G1)-13, 2025.
- Since 2023, Peralta's 747 strikeouts are the fourth most in the majors, trailing TOR **Dylan Cease** (870), PHI **Zack Wheeler** (785), and SEA **Logan Gilbert** (748)...his 122 starts in that span are tied with CHC **Kevin Gausman** for third most in the majors behind SF **Logan Webb** (124) and Cease (123).
- His .214 (640-for-2,989) opp. average against NL opponents is the third lowest among active MLB pitchers (min. 750.OIP), trailing TEX **Jacob deGrom** (.208) and TOR **Max Scherzer** (.212).

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his first win as a Ray on Aug. 26 at DET after firing 6.0 scoreless innings in a 3-0 win at Comerica Park (W, 6.OIP, 2H, OER, 4SO)... turned in his second quality start as a Ray (also: Aug. 10 at ATH) and his sixth of the season...retired the hif his 20 batters faced, allowing a **Dillon Dinger** in the 2nd inning and a **Brett Callahan** single in the 6th...four of his six frames pitched were 1-2-3 innings...handed the ball to **Kevin Kelly** to begin the 7th inning.

- Marked his first scoreless start of 6.0 innings or more since Aug. 29, 2025 at TOR with Milwaukee (W, 6.OIP, H, OER, BB, 8SO, HBP)...was the fifth Ray (16x) to record a scoreless outing of 6.0 innings or more this season.
- Did not walk a batter for the first time since Opening Day (March 26 vs. PIT w/NYM), snapping a career-long streak of 25 games with a walk allowed (April 1–Aug. 21).
- He registered 10 whiffs, including a career-high-tying eight whiffs on the changeup (also: May 29, 2026 vs. MIA), the 20th time this year he has recorded double-digit whiffs in a start.

APPLES & ORANGES—The veteran right-hander will make his fifth career appearance/start against the Mets...he earned the win in all four of those previous outings, owning a 2.70 ERA (23.1IP, 7ER), 26 strikeouts, and a .130 (10-for-77) opp. average against his former club...with his last outing against the club came in a 7-2 victory on July 2 vs. NYM (w/MIL) at Citi Field (W, 6.OIP, 2H, 2ER, BB, 6SO).

- The Mets are one of two clubs that Peralta has faced in which he has four wins or more and zero losses against in his career (also: AZ, 4-0).
- In 46 career appearances (39 starts) against NL East foes, he has fashioned a 17-13 record with a 4.42 ERA (215.2IP, 106ER) and 262 strikeouts...in six starts against the division this season, Peralta is 1-2 with a 6.30 ERA (30.OIP, 21ER) and 30 strikeouts.
- Has gone 57-39 with a 3.85 ERA (801.1IP, 343ER), 965 SO, and a .214 (640-for-2989) opp. AVG in 181 career appearances (143 starts) against NL opponents... his .594 winning pct. against the NL is the ninth highest among active MLB starters (min. 750.OIP)...is four points behind tying NYY **Gerrit Cole** and KC **Michael Wacha** for seventh (.598/67-45).

FALL BASEBALL—In 39 career appearances (22 starts) in September, Peralta is 9-8 with a 3.58 ERA (128.1IP, 51ER), 175 strikeouts, and a .213 (103-for-483) opp. average...last season with Milwaukee, he pitched to a 1-1 record with a 3.52 ERA (23.0IP, 9ER), 36 strikeouts, and a .198 (17-for-86) opp. average in five starts in September.

MAKING IT HOME—Peralta has made one start at Tropicana Field this season, suffering the loss on Aug. 16 vs. BAL (L, 4.2IP, H, 2ER, 3BB, 5SO, HBP)...in 14 starts at home this season (Tropicana Field & Citi Field), he has gone 3-5 with a 4.09 ERA (72.2IP, 33ER), 71 strikeouts, and a .237 (66-for-279) opp. average...nine of those 14 starts have been 5.0 innings or more.

- Across 126 career home appearances (98 starts), he is 43-24 with a 3.31 ERA (571.1IP, 210ER), 695 strikeouts, and a .196 (408-for-2084) opp. average...his teams are 79-47 lifetime in his home appearances.
- His career .196 opp. average at home ranks third among active major league pitchers (min. 2,000AB) since 2018, and his 693 punchouts at home are the 10th most in that span.
- In two career appearances (both starts) at Tropicana Field, Peralta has pitched to a 1-1 record with a 4.22 ERA (10.2IP, 5ER) and .167 (6-for-36) opp. average.

LIMITING LEFTIES—Since his debut in 2018, Peralta has held left-handed batters to a .211 (433-for-20) batting average, the third-best mark in the majors during that span (min. 2,000BF) behind NYY **Gerrit Cole** (.190) and DET **Justin Verlander** (.198)...in 2021, Peralta held lefties to a .157 (43-274) batting average, the third-best mark in a single season by a right-handed pitcher (min. 300 LHB faced) in the expansion era (since 1961)...in 2025 with the Brewers, left-handed batters hit .204 (66-323) off of Peralta, the fourth-lowest mark among right-handers in the NL and the 11th-lowest mark in the majors (min. 300 LHB faced).
