TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners open a 7-game homestand against AL West opponents with the first of 4 games against the Athletics...Seattle will also host the Texas Rangers for a 3-game set (9/8-10) on the homestand...the Mariners are coming off a 6-game road trip where they saw both the Red Sox (2-1) and the Blue Jays (0-3)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryon Healy** on the call and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as field analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won yesterday's rubber match against the Red Sox by an 8-3 score... Seattle is 49-19 (.754) when they score at least 4 runs, 42-11 (.792) when they score at least 5 runs and 56-35 (.615) when they hit a home run.

- **Offensive Explosion** - Over the last three games (8/31-c), the Mariners offense has scored 25 runs, batting .322 (37x115) with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 13 walks, a .402 OBP and slugging .539 for a .941 OPS.
- **EXTRA! EXTRA!** - Seattle's 14 extra-base hits across the 3-game series against Boston matches the team's season-high mark across a 3-game series (done 2x, last: 8/14-16 at HOU).
- **20 Home Run Quartet** - **Randy Arozarena** (22 HR), **Dominic Canzone** (21 HR), **Cal Raleigh** (20 HR) and **Julio Rodríguez** (20 HR) are 1 of 5 teammate quartets with 20+ homers apiece this season, along with the Cubs, Reds, Braves and Nationals.
- **September to Remember** - Last season, the Mariners went 17-8 (.680) in September...over the last 5 seasons (2022-c), the Mariners are 64-49 (.566), 3rd-best September/October record in the AL, trailing the Yankees (71-40/.640) and the Guardians (72-43/.626).
- **Guitar Heroes** - **Lazaro Montes** and **Randy Arozarena** each homered in Tuesday's game and became just the 2nd pair of Cuban-born teammates to homer in the same game with the Mariners, joining Yonder Alonso and Leonys Martín on Aug. 16, 2017 vs. Baltimore.

RUNNING THROUGH THE WEST...the Mariners today begin a 4-game set against the Athletics, kicking off a stretch of 13-consecutive games against AL West opponents (9/3-16)...6 of Seattle's last 7 series of the season are against AL West opponents, including each of its last 6 games of the year (2 G vs. HOU, 4 G vs. LAA)...Seattle is 20-13 against AL West opponents this season, including 10-3 at home.

KEEPING UP WITH CAL...**Cal Raleigh** has hit safely in each of his last 4 games while slugging 6 home runs across his last 8 games (8/24-c), tied for the most in MLB across that span (also: Rafael Devers-SF)... Raleigh, who is the reigning American League Player of the Week, hit his 20th home run of the season in Monday's game at Boston for his fifth consecutive 20+ homer season (2022-c), becoming the 8th Mariners player with at least five 20+ homer seasons.

- **Cal's Streaky Stretch** - Cal has reached base safely in 14 of his last 15 games (8/16-c), batting .283 (13x46) with 8 home runs, 2 doubles, 12 RBI, 11 walks, and a .421 on-base percentage while slugging .848 for an 1.269 OPS in 57 plate appearances.
- **Did You 'Catch' This?** - Raleigh became the 18th catcher (min. 50% of games at catcher in a season) in MLB history to record five or more seasons with 20+ homers, and the 9th to do it before turning 30 years old.

RANDY'S MONSTER SERIES...over the 3-game set vs. Boston, **Randy Arozarena** went 6-for-15 with 4 runs, 1 double, 2 home runs and 8 RBI for a 1.267 OPS...over his last 21 games (8/11-c), Randy is batting .253 (21x83) with 16 runs, 3 doubles, 8 home runs, 17 RBI, 11 walks, a .361 OBP and slugging .578 for a .939 OPS...Arozarena's 4.3 bWAR this season ranks T-8th in the American League.

MAKING HIMSELF AT HOME...MLB's top pitching prospect (per *MLB Pipeline*) LHP **Kade Anderson** today will make his 2nd career start at T-Mobile Park and just the 3rd start of his professional career...made his Major League debut in his last home start on Aug. 22 vs. CHC, allowing 3 runs (3 ER) across 5.2 innings with 2 walks and 5 strikeouts...across 18 career starts with Double-A Arkansas this season, he went 10-1 with a 1.06 ERA (11 ER, 93.1 IP), a 0.64 WHIP, 135 strikeouts, 13 walks while limiting batters to a .147 average.

CANZONE CRUSHES...**Dominic Canzone** reached base 3 times in yesterday's win and went 4-for-13 with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 3 RBI and 2 walks over the last 3 games (8/31-c)...his 4 extra-base hits against Boston are the most he has hit across a 3-game series in his career...over his last 21 games (8/9-c), he is batting .282 (24x85) with 8 runs, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs, 14 RBI, 1 stolen base and 8 walks while reaching base at a .351 clip and slugging .482 (.833 OPS)..."Dom" has already set career-high marks in nearly every category this season, hitting .255 (99x388) with 49 runs, 23 doubles, 2 triples, 21 home runs, 63 RBI, 39 walks while reaching base at a .329 clip and slugging .487 (.816 OPS) over 124 games.

FORCE OF NAYLOR...in 40 games since the All-Star Break (7/17-c), **Josh Naylor** is batting .303 (47x155) with 16 runs, 7 doubles, 2 home runs, 12 RBI, 11 walks, 87 stolen bases, a .351 OBP while slugging .387 for a .738 OPS, reaching base in 35 of those games...his 47 hits in the second half rank T-8th among American League show hitters while his 8 stolen bases across that span are tied for 6th-most in the AL.

THE LAZER SHOW HAS ARRIVED...on Tuesday, **Lazaro Montes** made his MLB debut, going 2-for-4 with 1 walk, 1 home run and 2 RBI, becoming the youngest Mariners player and 6th overall to hit a home run in his debut...also became the first Mariners player since Hall of Famer Ichiro Suzuki to record multiple hits in his debut...the No. 56 overall prospect (per *MLB Pipeline*) slugged 38 home runs over 123 games between Triple-A and Double-A this season, tied for 2nd-most among all MiLB batters at the time of his call-up.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners scored 8+ runs on 10+ hits in three consecutive games for the first time since July 11-13, 2025, and...**AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...four or more players recorded multiple hits in each of the last 2 games, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Mariners 7-8-9 hitters all recorded multiple hits and reached base 3+ times in both Tuesday and Wednesday's games, marking the first time they have done so in consecutive games in franchise history?...**Lazaro Montes**, **J.P. Crawford** and **Brock Rodden** did so in Tuesday's game, while **J.P. Crawford**, **Weston Wilson** & **Jhonny Pereda** did so on Wednesday.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - SEPTEMBER 3

- 1981 - The Red Sox and the Mariners play 19 innings to a 7-7 tie. The game ends with the Mariners winning, 8-7, in 20 innings when the suspended game is resumed the next day, making it the longest game played in Fenway Park history.
- 2001 - Jay Buhner makes his first start in left field since July 23, 1988.
- 2023 - **Julio Rodríguez** wins AL Player of the Month award after batting .429 (45x105) with 19 runs, 10 doubles, 7 home runs, 30 RBI, 8 walks and 11 stolen bases in 23 August games, getting on base at a .474 clip, slugging .724 with a 1.198 OPS...**Andrés Muñoz** wins AL Reliever of the Month after leading the American League in saves (9) during the month, going 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA (3 ER, 14.0 IP) with 7 walks and 20 strikeouts in 14 August appearances.

ABOUT KADE ANDERSON...

- The 22-year-old left-handed pitcher is set to make his 3rd career start and 1st ever start against the Athletics.
- Drafted by the Seattle Mariners in the 1st round (3rd overall) of the 2025 MLB First-Year Player Draft from Louisiana State University (Baton Rouge, LA)...he was the highest selection by the Mariners since catcher Mike Zunino (3rd overall in 2012).
- Spent 2 seasons at LSU (2024-25) where he was named College World Series Most Outstanding Player after helping lead the Tigers to their 8th national title in 2025...did not pitch in 2023 while recovering from Tommy John surgery.
- Was born in Slidell, LA and attended St. Paul's School in Covington (LA).

LAST TIME OUT...made 2nd career start on Aug. 29 at TOR, tossing 4.1 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 3 hits with 3 walks and 3 strikeouts...did not factor into the decision...he threw 85 pitches and 54 strikes while inducing 8 swings and misses.

FROM THE MANAGER:

"I thought Kade threw the ball extremely well again. I was impressed with his ability to use his stuff and use all his pitches. He had good command, I thought he used his fastball well at times...I really liked the way Kade hung in there and continued to compete and press. I thought for just his second outing in the Big Leagues, I thought it was a good one."

ANDERSON vs. ATHLETICS

Anderson is making his 3rd career start and 1st ever start against the Athletics...he has yet to face any current Athletics batters in his career.

ABOUT THE DEBUT...made his MLB debut in his last home start on Aug. 22 vs. CHC...became the 23rd pitcher in franchise history to throw 5.2+ innings with 3-or-fewer earned runs allowed in their MLB debut, joining current starters **Bryce Miller** (5/2/23 at OAK) and **George Kirby** (5/8/22 vs. TB), and is the 5th left-handed pitcher to do so in franchise history (last: Mike Montgomery, 6/2/2015 vs. NYY)...also became the 10th pitcher in franchise history to throw 5.0+ IP with 3-or-fewer earned runs allowed and 5+ strikeouts in their MLB debut...joins Miller, Kirby and **Matt Brash** (4/12/22 at CWS) as the most recent players to do so.

LATEST DEBUTANT...was the first player from the 2025 Draft to debut this season...is also the 6th player (4th pitcher) to debut for the Mariners this year, joining RHP Alex Hoppe (4/27 at MIN), RHP **Nick Davila** (5/3 vs. KC), RHP **Domingo González** (5/12 at HOU), INF **Colt Emerson** (5/17 vs. SD) and INF **Brock Rodden** (8/14 at HOU).

FINAL NOTES...at 22 years and 47 days, he was the youngest starter to debut for the Mariners since RHP Taijuan Walker (21 years, 17 days) on Aug. 30, 2013 vs. HOU and was the first lefty to start his MLB debut with the Mariners since Yusei Kikuchi on March 21, 2019 at OAK at the Tokyo Dome in Japan.

DOMINATED IN DOUBLE-A...across 18 career starts with Double-A Arkansas this season, he went 10-1 with a 1.06 ERA (11 ER, 93.1 IP), a 0.64 WHIP, 135 strikeouts, 13 walks and 3 quality starts while limiting batters to a .147 average...among all minor league pitchers at the time of his MLB debut (min. 80 IP), he led MiLB in ERA (1.06), strikeout-to-walk ratio (10.38), strikeout rate (40.5%), WHIP (0.64) and opponent batting average (.147).

ALL EYES ON HIM...is currently ranked the top pitching prospect in MLB and No. 5 overall by *MLB Pipeline*...entered the 2026 season ranked as the Mariners No. 2 prospect and top pitching prospect (*MLB Pipeline*).

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT...was selected to the 2026 MLB Futures All-Star Game in Philadelphia where he made the start for the American League Team...tossed a scoreless inning in the Futures Game...was joined by Travelers teammate, Mariners No. 2 prospect and MLB No. 8 overall prospect (*MLB Pipeline*) RHP **Ryan Sloan**.

DOWN ON THE FARM...did not allow an earned run in 13 of his 18 Double-A starts, including each of his last 4 outings since July 24 across which he logged 20.2 consecutive scoreless innings...he allowed 2-or fewer runs over 4.0 IP in 17 of his 18 minor league starts and on July 24, recorded 5.0 perfect innings with 7 strikeouts...allowed no hits over 5.0 innings twice and allowed 3-or-fewer hits in 14 of his 18 starts...struck out 9+ batters in 7 starts, and 7+ batters in 13 of his 18 outings with Arkansas, including a career-high 11 strikeouts in just his 2nd ever start of his pro career.

LOONEY PLATOONS...across his 18 Double-A starts, he limited opponents to a .147 average (47x319)...limited left-handed hitters to a .170 average (17x100) with just 2 extra-base hits for a slashline of .224 / .230 / .454...was even more efficient against right-handed batters, limiting them to just a .137 average (30x219) with 98 strikeouts and a slashline of .164 / .210 / .374.

FARM GROWN TALENT...became the 33rd player drafted by the Mariners to make their debut as a starting pitcher with the team and is the 6th player to do so since 2018 joining **Logan Evans**, the most recent Mariners player to make his debut as a starting pitcher, and the Mariners current starting rotation in **Emerson Hancock**, **Bryan Woo**, **Bryce Miller**, **George Kirby**, and **Logan Gilbert**.

AMONG THE AWARDS...was named Texas League Pitcher of the Week five times this season and was named Texas League Pitcher of the Month in June 2026, going 4-0 with a 0.79 ERA (2 ER, 22.2 IP), 0.62 WHIP, 32 strikeouts and 3 walks allowed in four starts...has also been named the Mariners Minor League Pitcher of the Month three times this season (April, May and June).

"THEY PICKED A WINNER"...before he was drafted, Anderson dominated at the college level for LSU...in 2025, he went 12-1 with a 3.18 ERA (42 ER, 119.0 IP) while leading NCAA with 180 strikeouts in 19 starts for the Tigers...he also led the team to their 8th national title that season and was named CWS Most Outstanding Player...in his Game 1 start of the MCWS against Coastal Carolina, he allowed 3 hits with 10 strikeouts in a complete game shutout, becoming the 3rd pitcher to throw a complete game since the best-of-three finals were introduced in 2003...was also named First Team ABCA/Rawlings All-American and 2025 Baseball America College Pitcher of the Year in 2025.

"I came here to win. They picked a winner, honestly. When I was at LSU, we won, and that was the coolest moment of my life, but now I have this opportunity to play for the Mariners. Obviously, everyone's goal is to win. It's a lot easier said than done. I think that's one thing that I can really bring to the table, that I've experienced those kinds of things. I think it starts with the people that are in the locker room, I really believe that."

- On Call Often - His 65 relief appearances this season lead the Mariners bullpen and ranks T-6th in MLB...his 26 holds also rank 5th in MLB.
- Reliable Arm - Has only allowed an earned run in 16 of 65 appearances this season...has allowed 2+ ER only five times.
