METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Giants, 7-0, last night...New York captured their second shutout of the season...The Mets finish their second road trip of the season an 11-day, 10-game trip (7-1) against the Athletics (3-0), Dodgers (2-1) and Giants (2-0)...The Mets are off on Monday before they return home for a six-game homestand against the Nationals (three games) and Braves (three games).

#WINNING: New York has won three consecutive games and eight of their last nine contests...The Mets are a season-high seven games above .500...The Mets have secured a winning road trip (7-1)...With a victory today, the Mets would claim their fifth straight series and their seventh series overall...New York's 14 wins are tied for the second-most in the majors and tied with the Braves and Pirates for the most in the National League.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are batting .271/.372/.451 with 53 runs, 15 doubles, 12 home runs, 50 RBI, 39 walks, seven steals and an .822 OPS in the first eight games of the road trip...The team has posted a 3.63 ERA (29 ER/72.0 IP) with 32 walks and 67 strikeouts in that span...The Mets are outscoring their opponents 53-29 in this stretch...Overall, the Mets are 10-5 on the road this season...Their 10 road wins are tied with the Braves for the most in the majors...The team's .667 road winning percentage is tied for fifth in the majors.

CALIFORNIA DREAMING: The Mets are 7-1 with two games remaining on their West Coast California trip...The most wins the Mets have ever had on one road trip facing teams in California is eight...New York went 8-1 from August 18-27, 1986 vs. Los Angeles-NL, San Francisco and San Diego...Research courtesy of Elias.

1010 WINS: The Mets have recorded 10 or more hits in a season-high three straight games...The team has raised its batting average from .222 to .240 in that span...The last time the team recorded 10 or more hits in four straight games was from September 13-17, 2020.

APRIL, SHE WILL COME: Pete Alonso has become the first player in Mets history with 10 home runs before May 1...The last time a player hit 10+ home runs in his team's first 21 games of a season was in 2019, when Christian Yelich (11), Cody Bellinger, Khris Davis and Eddie Rosario all accomplished the feat.

APRIL SHOWERS: Alonso has 22 RBI this month (he had one RBI in March)...The franchise record for RBI in the month of April is 26 by Jeff Kent in 1994.

FOUR TOPS: Alonso became the fourth player in franchise history to have consecutive games with four or more RBI and the first since Lucas Duda, September 25-26, 2015...The others to accomplish the feat are Carlos Beltrán (three times) and Robin Ventura (twice)...No Mets player has ever driven four or more runs in three straight games...The last major leaguer to have four or more RBI in three consecutive games was Baltimore's Chris Davis from April 3-5, 2013.

CAN'T STOP: Pete Alonso leads the majors with 10 home runs and tied for the MLB lead with 23 RBI...He is tied for second in the majors with 18 runs scored...He is fourth in the majors and third in the NL with a .671 SLG and is fifth in the majors and fourth in the NL with a 1.047 OPS...Alonso has nine homers in his last 15 games...He's hitting .350/.418/.800 over that period with 21 RBI and 14 runs.

RED HOT: The Mets have homered in eight of their last nine games...The team has hit 14 home runs in that span...The Mets hit a total of 10 home runs in the previous 12 games.

WAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Brandon Nimmo leads the major leagues with a 1.6 fWAR...Pete Alonso is seventh in The Show and fifth in the NL with a 1.1 fWAR, while Francisco Lindor is ninth in the majors and seventh in the Senior Circuit with a 1.1 fWAR.

ROAD TRIPPIN': Over the eight game road trip, Brandon Nimmo is batting .514 (18-35) with seven runs, four doubles, a home run, six RBI, three walks with a .564 OBP and a .714 SLG...He is batting .373 (19-51) in his last 13 games vs. the Giants...Nimmo is hitting .411 (23-56) on the road...Has a .325 (118-363) road average since the start of last year, fourth-highest in the majors...The Wyoming native ranks second in the majors with a .489 OBP, third in batting average (.375) and is tied for fifth in the majors with 15 walks this season.

THE FRANCISCO LINDOR WAY: Francisco Lindor has reached base safely in 14 of his last 15 games...He is batting .267 (16-60) with 16 runs, seven doubles, four home runs, 16 RBI, six walks, two steals with a .362 OBP, a .683 SLG and a .946 OPS in that span...This comes after Lindor batted .111 (2-18) in his first six games...Lindor is tied for third in the NL with 12 extra-base hits.

GOING BACK TO CALI: Over the last six games, Jeff McNeil has batted .476 (10-21) with five runs, two doubles, a home run, three RBI, three walks, a .577 OBP and a .714 SLG...McNeil has raised his season batting average from .212 to .288 during this span.

THIS IS THE PLACE: Eduardo Escobar has an extra-base hit in seven consecutive games against the Giants...Only six players have ever had a longer streak against the club...Overall, Escobar has hit safely in 10 straight games against San Francisco, going 18-40 (.450) with a 1.275 OPS.

WALK, DON'T STRIKE: The Mets are second in the majors with 98 walks this season...As a team, New York has struck out only 148 times this season, the third-fewest time in the Majors...Brandon Nimmo has drawn 15 walks and struck out just nine times this season...Jeff McNeil has 13 walks and has also struck out only seven times...There are 25 players with at least a dozen walks in 2023 and Cleveland's Steven Kwan is the only other with fewer than 10 strikeouts.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed just four errors in 21 games this season, the fewest in the majors...The team's .995 fielding percentage is the best in the majors...Francisco Lindor has recorded six DRS (defensive runs saved) according to the Fielding Bible...That is tied for the most in the majors.

BROTHERS IN ARMS: Together, Adam Ottavino and David Robertson have combined to post a 1.58 ERA (3 ER/17.1 IP) with five walks and 19 strikeouts...They have converted seven of eight save opportunities... They are one of three pairs of teammates who have each recorded multiple saves this season (also, Devin Williams and Bryse Wilson of the Brewers, Carlos Estévez and José Quijada of the Angels).

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Went 6.0 innings to earn his first win of the season on April 17 against the Dodgers at Dodgers Stadium...Let up six runs on seven hits and six strikeouts...Did not walk a batter in a start for the first time since August 27, 2022 vs. Colorado.

GIANT SLAYER: Peterson earned the win in his only career start against the Giants on May 23, 2022 at Oracle Park...He pitched 6.0 innings, allowed two runs and three hits, walked one and struck out six.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Peterson has a 4.12 ERA (31 ER/67.2 IP) in his last 16 road outings since the 2022 season, including 12 starts...He is 6-10 with a 4.89 ERA (73 earned runs/134.1 innings) in his career on the road...Peterson has struck five or more batters in his last 11 starts on the road, holding the franchise record for a left-handed pitcher.

LETHAL LEFTY: Peterson has limited lefties to a .208 (22-106) average since 2022...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.

SLIP 'N' SLIDE: Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Diaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the third-highest in the majors behind only Diaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

FOUR-HIT WONDER: The southpaw allowed four hits or fewer in 12 of his 19 starts and 21 of his 28 appearances overall last season...He has held the opposition to four hits or fewer in 39 of his 54 career games.

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: Peterson struck out at least five batters in 11 straight starts from June 20-September 9 last season, the second-longest streak by a left-handed starter last season...It was the sixth-longest streak by a Mets left-handed starter in franchise history...Peterson had 82 strikeouts across 58.2 innings during that span (13 G/11 GS) good for a 12.58 K/9 ratio.

HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL: Peterson made four appearances (three starts) during spring training...He threw 12.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit over those four outings...Struck out 13 and walked eight...Peterson last pitched in a minor league game on March 25...In his last Grapefruit League appearance of the spring, allowed one hit, struck out four and walked four over 4.0 scoreless frames vs. the Cardinals on March 19.

2022 RECAP: Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).

BIG DRIP BY THE BAY: Megill will make his fourth career start against the Giants, the most against a club outside of the NL East...Megill is 0-1 with a 6.89 ERA (12 ER/15.2 IP) through his first three career starts against the Giants...In his lone start at Oracle Park, August 18, 2021, Megill allowed one run on five hits, two walks and six strikeouts over 6.0 innings.
