**TONIGHT'S TILT...**the Mariners play the third of a 4-game series against the Cleveland Guardians (1-1) tonight...Seattle will also host the New York Yankees (3 G, 3/30-4/1) on the opening homestand...tonight's game is televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

**ODDS AND ENDS...**the Mariners earned their first victory of the season last night with a 5-1 victory over the Cleveland Guardians.

- **Nationally Televised** - The Mariners are televised nationally tomorrow on **Peacock** with **Jason Benetti** on the call and **Rick Manning** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as analysts...Seattle is set to be televised nationally 40 times in 2026, including 13 national-exclusive games.

- **The Core Returns** - Of the 26 players on the Mariners Opening Day roster, 22 of them appeared in a game with the club during the 2025 season (in addition to 4 on the Injured List to start the season)... new additions include All-Star INF/OF **Brendan Donovan**, INF/OF **Rob Refsnyder** and pitchers **Cooper Criswell** and **José A. Ferrer**.

- **Wilcox Recalled** - Yesterday the Mariners recalled right-handed pitcher **Cole Wilcox** (#43) from Triple-A Tacoma yesterday...right-hander **Carlos Vargas** has been placed on the 15-day Injured List with a right lat strain, retroactive to March 24.

**CAN I GET A WOO?...**Bryan Woo is set to make his first start of 2026 tonight...the 26-year-old right-hander is coming off an All-Star 2025 season where he went 15-7 with a 2.94 ERA (61 ER, 186.2 IP), 36 walks, 198 strikeouts and a 0.93 WHIP in 30 starts, finishing 5th in AL Cy-Young voting...Woo has turned in back-to-back seasons with a sub-3.00 ERA and a sub-1.00 WHIP, the only pitcher in Mariners history with multiple such seasons (min. 100.0 IP)...Woo ranked 5th in ERA, 5th in strikeouts, 7th in IP, T-3rd in Opp. AVG (.200), 3rd in WHIP and T-2nd in quality starts (21) among qualified AL pitchers in 2025.

**LET'S GET RALEY CRAZY...**Luke Raley homered for the second-consecutive game yesterday, and is 2-for-8 with 2 HR and 3 RBI in his first 2 games of 2026...it marks the first time since Aug. 6-8, 2024 that he has homered in consecutive games...Raley was a key contributor in 2024, hitting a career-high 22 home runs with a .783 OPS in 137 games, but was limited to just 4 home runs in 73 games in 2025 due to injury.

**A YOUNG MAN'S GAME...**Cole Young broke open the game with a 3-run home run in the 4th inning of last night's win...Young has continued his power surge from Cactus League play, where he finished T-4th in MLB with 6 home runs.

**HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE...**the Mariners went 51-30 (.630) at their home ballpark, T-Mobile Park in 2025, the 6th-best home record in MLB and 2nd-best in the AL...Seattle was also an MLB-best 26-9 (.743) at home after the All-Star Break last year, which included a franchise-record tying 11-consecutive wins at home (Aug. 27-Sept. 25) matching the mark set from May 20-June 8, 2001.

**CAL RALEIGH: SEASON FOR THE AGES...**Cal Raleigh finished as the runner-up for the AL MVP in 2025 after batting .247 (147x596) with 110 runs, 24 doubles, 60 home runs, 125 RBI, 14 stolen bases, a .359 OBP and slugging .589 for a .948 OPS and 171 OPS+...he led the Majors with 60 home runs, becoming the 4th player in AL history to reach 60 home runs, in addition to setting the Mariners record (previous: Ken Griffey Jr.: 56 HR in 1997 & '98), the catcher record (previous: Salvador Perez-KC: 48 HR in 2021) and the switch-hitter record (previous: Mickey Mantle-NYY: 54 HR in 1961) for most home runs in a season.

**MARINERS TV AVAILABLE ON CABLE, SATELLITE AND STREAMING IN 2026...**the Mariners announced that Mariners TV will bring Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming will be available on Mariners.TV for \$99.99/season or \$19.99/month...Mariners TV is available across major providers including XFINITY, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on [Mariners.com/Watch](https://mariners.com/watch) to find providers in their area.

**WELCOME TO SEATTLE, DONNIE!...**Brendan Donovan homered in his first plate appearance in a Mariners uniform on Opening Day, becoming the first player in Mariners history to hit a leadoff home run on Opening Day...he is also the first player since Abraham Toro in 2021 to homer in his first plate appearance with Seattle and the first player to hit a hit a leadoff homer in his debut with a team since former Mariner Brad Miller did it for the Rangers on April 8, 2022, and Kyle Schwarber for the Phillies on that same date (via *Sarah Langs*)...Donovan is 2-for-6 with 1 homer, 1 double and 2 walks in his first 8 PA with Seattle.

**SEASON 5 OF THE J-ROD SHOW...**Julio Rodríguez is entering his 5th Major League season in 2026...through his first 4 Major League seasons, J-Rod is batting .274 (654x2384) with 368 runs, 110 doubles, 9 triples, 112 home runs, 341 RBI and 116 stolen bases with a .331 OBP, slugging .469 for a .800 OPS and a 130 OPS+...among centerfielders through their first 4 seasons, Rodríguez ranks 2nd in home runs, trailing only Joe DiMaggio (137 HR) and 3rd in bWAR (22.9), trailing only Mike Trout (27.6) and DiMaggio (27.1)... Julio finished 6th in AL MVP voting in 2025 after recording 32 home runs, 30 stolen bases, 95 RBI, a .798 OPS and 6.8 bWAR in 160 games.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW...**the Mariners have hit 6 home runs over their first 2 games of the season, just the 4th time in team history the team has hit at least 6 homers in their first 2 games and 1 shy of the team record (7 in 1979), but...**DID YOU KNOW?...**that per *Sarah Langs*, the Mariners are the first time since at least 1900 without a single through their first 2 games of the season?...the Mariners have recorded 9 extra-base hits in their first 2 games of 2026: 6 home runs, 2 doubles and 1 triple.

## ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MARCH 28

- **2012** - The Mariners defeated the Oakland A's 3-1 in 11 innings in the 2012 season opener at the Tokyo Dome in Tokyo, Japan...Dustin Ackley went 2-for-5 with a home run and 2 RBI to be named game MVP...Ichiro went 4-for-5, tying the Mariners Opening Day single-game hits record (with Ken Griffey Jr. in 1990) and set the all-time hits record in club history on Opening Day (17).

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 1st start of the season...marks his 71st Major League regular season start, and 2nd career start against the Guardians.

2025 TOTALS...went 15-7 with a 2.94 ERA (61 ER, 186.2 IP), 36 walks, 198 strikeouts and a 0.93 WHIP in 30 starts...held opponents to a .200/.243/.353 slashline last season.

- Finished 5th in 2025 BBWAA Cy Young Award voting.

END OF THE ROAD...finished the 2025 regular season on Sept. 19 at HOU, throwing 5.0 scoreless innings and allowing 1 hit and 1 walk while striking out 7 batters before exiting with right pectoral inflammation ... returned 27 days later to make Post-season debut in ALCS Game 5 vs. TOR, allowing 1 run in 2.0 innings of relief.

WOO-NDERFUL STREAK...began the 2025 season with 25 consecutive starts of 6.0+ innings and 2-or-fewer walks, the 2nd-longest such streak in MLB history (Cy Young, 30 G, 1905)...his run of 6.0+ inning starts was also the longest to begin a season in Mariners history.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR...selected to his first American League All-Star team last season...tossed a scoreless 3rd inning with 1 strikeout in All-Star Game.

FIRST HALF WARRIOR...threw 6.0+ innings in all 18 starts before the All-Star break, while posting a 2.75 ERA (35 ER, 114.2 IP) with 109 strikeouts and 21 walks...his 2.75 ERA is the 6th-best by a starting pitcher in the first half (min. 15 GS) in franchise history, while his 0.93 WHIP ranks 3rd-best (1st: Logan Gilbert, 0.87 in 2024)...is 12-6 with a career 2.84 (61 ER, 193.1 IP) and 181 strikeouts across 34 starts pre All-Star Break.

DOWN IN THE DESERT...went 1-0 with a 3.29 ERA (5 ER, 13.2 IP), 14 strikeouts and 0.805 WHIP across 4 starts in Spring Training...allowed 5 runs on 10 hits, 0 home runs, and just 1 walk across 51 batters faced.

AMONG THE BEST...is 1 of 4 pitchers in MLB to have a sub-3.00 ERA and a sub-1.00 WHIP since 2024, joining Zack Wheeler-PHI, Tarik Skubal-DET and Paul Skenes-PIT (min. 300.0 IP)...his 2.92 ERA over that span is 7th best in MLB.

QUALITY STUFF...threw a quality start in 21 of his 30 starts last season, tied for 4th-most in the Majors, trailing only Logan Webb-SF (22), Cristopher Sánchez-PHI (22) and Garrett Crochet-BOS (22).

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY...was 1 of 6 pitchers in the Majors last season with 175+ strikeouts and 40-or-fewer walks, joining Tarik Skubal-DET, Sonny Gray-STL, Zack Wheeler-PHI, Joe Ryan-MIN, Jacob deGrom-TEX.

WOO TANG FOREVER...recorded back-to-back seasons of a sub-3.00 ERA and a sub-1.00 WHIP (2024-25)...is the only starting pitcher in Mariners history with multiple such seasons.

CAREER DAYS...struck out a career-high 13 batters on Sept. 13 vs. Los Angeles-AL, inducing a career-high 23 swings-and-misses in the game...took no-hitter into the 8th inning on July 10 at New York-AL, finishing with 7.1 innings pitched, 2 hits, 2 runs, 2 walks and 5 strikeouts.

FROM EDGAR & DAVE...in 24 starts at T-Mobile park since 2024, he is 16-3 with a 2.45 ERA (40 ER, 147.0 IP), 155 strikeouts and 22 walks, with the Mariners going 20-4 in his starts...has allowed 3-or-fewer runs in 21 starts, and 5-or-fewer hits in 18 of those 24 starts at home.

WHAT A STRETCH...in his last 9 starts (8/5-c), he is 7-1 with a 2.52 ERA (15 ER, 53.2 IP), .170 batting average against, 0.82 WHIP, 71 strikeouts, and 11 walks...From 8/5/2025 to the end of the 2025 regular season, he is 1st in WHIP, T-1st in wins, 2nd in strikeouts-per-nine (11.91) and strikeouts, and 3rd in batting average against.

NO FREE BAGS...his 48 consecutive games started (5/10/24-8/27/25) with 2-or-fewer walks was the longest streak in MLB since George Kirby (68 GS, 4/3/23-6/8/25)...has recorded 2-or-fewer walks in 64 of 70 career starts, 1-or-fewer in 48 starts, and no walks in 19 total career starts.

LOW, LOW, LOW...his 0.981 career WHIP is the lowest in franchise history (min. 300.0 IP), and among starting pitchers in their first 70 games with Seattle, he ranks 1st in fewest hits allowed (308), 2nd in fewest runs allowed (149), 2nd in walks allowed (80), 2nd in ERA (3.21), and T-4th in strikeouts (392).

PART OF HISTORY...Woo (13 K, 1 BB on 9/13) and George Kirby (14 K, 0 BB on 9/14) are the first pair of teammates in Major League history to record back-to-back starts with 13+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks...was also 1 of 3 starters (also: Luis Castillo and George Kirby) in the 3-game series sweep against the Pirates (7/4-7/6) to throw 3 consecutive shutouts, marking the first time in team history recording 3 consecutive shutouts.
