STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a six-game homestand against the Angels (1-0, two to play) and Tigers (three to play) today at Tropicana Field...have won 17 of 24, 23 of 31, and 30 of their last 42 games... have owned the AL's best record for each of the last 21 days (May 9–pres.), including eight consecutive days leading the majors (May 18–25), their first time holding MLB's best winning pct. since June 30, 2023 (57-28)...have the third-easiest remaining schedule in MLB (.478 opp. winning pct.) behind only the Guardians (.476) and Athletics (.476)...hold the best home record in the majors at 20-5 (.800), and are on a stretch of 19 home games within a 28-game span from May 29–June 28 (1-0)...have a 90.3 pct. chance to make the postseason, per FanGraphs, fourth highest in the majors to the Dodgers (99.8%), Yankees (99.1%), and Braves (97.8%)...it marks a 60.8 pct. increase from their Opening Day odds (29.5%)...have spent 27 days leading the AL East, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

★ The Rays earned an 8-5, come-from-behind victory in their series opener against the Angels last night...it marked their sixth straight series-opening win at home, tied for the third-longest streak in team history (4x, last: May 23–June 20, 2025).

★ **Yandy Diaz** began the game with his 23rd career leadoff home run, most in team history, ahead of **B.J. Upton** (8)...he added another homer in the 7th inning for his fifth career multi-home run game (last: Aug. 2, 2025 vs. LAD - 2HR) including a postseason effort on Oct. 2, 2019 at OAK.

★ **Jonathan Aranda** followed up Diaz's second home run with one of his own, going back-to-back as part of a seven-run 7th inning...Diaz and Aranda are the first pair of Rays hitters to go back-to-back since **Junior Caminero** and Aranda did so on Sept. 26, 2025 at TOR...it marked the most runs the Rays have scored in a single frame since Aug. 5, 2025 at LAA (4th, 7R) and their most in a frame from the 7th innng since Aug. 22, 2023 vs. COL (8th, 9R).

★ The win marked their 35th of the campaign, tied for the second most in team history before the end of May (also: 2021 & 2019)...only the 2023 Rays (40W) had more before the calendar flipped to June.

★ The Rays staff allowed 10 hits last night and has yielded double-digit hits in seven of their last 11 games (May 16–pres.) compared to six of their previous 40 (March 30–May 15).

★ Despite dropping four straight to AL opponents between May 24–27, they are 25-8 against the AL to begin the season...7 of the 11 AL teams in league history to win 25 or more of their first 33 intraleague games have won the World Series (last: 1998 NYY), with nine of 11 making it to the Fall Classic.

★ The Rays have won each of **Drew Rasmussen's** last five starts at Tropicana Field (Aug. 18, 2024–pres.)...he has turned in a 2.13 ERA (25.1IP, 6ER) with 22 strikeouts to four walks, and a 0.95 WHIP in those five outings.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays reinstated RHP **Cole Sulser** from the 15-day IL (low back strain) and optioned RHP **Hunter Bigge** to Triple-A Durham...RHP **Jon Heasley** cleared waivers and has been outrighted to Durham.

★ Since April 15 at CWS when Sulser was used as an opener, 11 of his 12 outings have been scoreless, with the righty posting a 2.08 ERA (13.0IP, 3ER) and .174 (8-for-46) opp. average over that span.

YOU'RE DANGEROUS, MAVERICK—Former Ray player and current Rays Brand Engagement Executive **Brett Phillips** is celebrating his 32nd birthday today...the Seminole, Fla. native joined the Rays front office this offseason after playing in parts of seven big league seasons with the Angels (2023), Orioles (2022), Rays (2020–22), Royals (2018–20), and Brewers (2017–18)...his walk-off single in Game 4 of the 2020 World Series is one of three postseason walk-offs in Rays history and added 82.5 pct. to the team's win probability (WPA), the fourth-highest WPA on a single play in postseason play since 1903 and second highest in the World Series behind only LAD **Kirk Gibson's** walk-off home run in Game 1 of the 1988 World Series (87.0%).

WE'RE ONE THIRD THERE—One third of the way into the season, the Rays sit at 35-19, tied for the third-best start to a campaign in team history (also: 2020) behind only the 2023 (38-16) and 2010 (36-18) clubs...in the divisional era (since 1969), 69 of 90 teams (76.6%) that began 35-19 or better and completed their seasons have gone on to make the postseason, with 32 of those clubs (35.6%) going on to win the World Series...the Rays have led the AL East four previous times at this point in team history, with each team going on to win the division (2021, 2020, 2010, 2008).

GO JONNY GO—**Jonathan Aranda** tallied his fourth consecutive multi-hit game last night, tying his career best (2x, May 2-5, 2026 & May 26-29, 2025)...his 10 multi-hit efforts in May are tied for the most in the AL with CWS **Sam Antonacci**, CLE **Chase DeLauter**, and DET **Riley Greene**...he has a seven-game hitting streak (May 20–pres.), tied for the fifth-longest active streak in MLB and tied for the third-longest streak of his career (also: July 5-11, 2025)...with a hit today, he would extend his streak to eight games, two shy of the second-best streak in his career (10G, July 27, 2025–March 29, 2026).

★ In May, he is hitting .381 (32-for-84) with 5 2B, 3 HR, 17 RBI, a .461 OBP, a .548 SLG, and a 1.008 OPS...he paces the majors in average, on-base pct., and OPS this month...min. 90 PA, his .381 average is the ninth best during a calendar month in franchise history and would be the best since **Yandy Diaz** (.400) in September/October 2025...it would mark Aranda's highest average in any calendar month of his career, surpassing May 2025 (.341).

★ Throughout his career, Aranda has slashed .332/.412/.479 (70-for-211) with 10 2B, 7 HR, 38 RBI, and an .891 OPS in May...his .332 career May average is the fourth best in franchise history (min. 100PA) behind **Avisail Garcia** (.360), **David DeJesus** (.346), and **Akinori Iwamura** (.338), while his .412 on-base pct. is the second best under the same criteria to Garcia (.430).

★ Aranda has 42 RBI thus far in 2026, tied for the second-most by a Ray before the end of May (see table on the right)...his 42 RBI are the most in the AL and tied for fifth most in the majors...he is 27 RBI shy of **Jose Canseco's** franchise record of 69 RBI (1999) before the All-Star break with 40 games to go.

HOME SWEET HOME—The Rays have a major league-best 20-5 (.800) record at home, their second-best winning pct. before the calendar flips to June in team history (2023, .813/26-6)...since April 22, they are 16-1 at Tropicana Field, tied with April 22–May 26, 2008 as the best 17-game span at home within a single season in team history...since returning to the ballpark, they have won eight of nine series openers, including each of their last six...they have won five straight series at Tropicana Field (April 24–pres.), their longest home streak since they won six straight sets between May 9–June 8, 2025.

★ They have reached 20 wins at home before the end of May for just the third time in franchise history, joining 2023 (26-6) and 2008 (23-10).

★ Rays hitters are slashing .270/.344/.428 (215-for-795) at Tropicana Field this season...their .270 average paces the AL and two points behind the Pirates (.272) for best in the majors...their slugging pct. (2nd) and on-base pct. (3rd) at home also rank among the AL's best.

★ The Rays starting rotation has produced a 2.92 ERA (123.1IP, 40ER) at home, second best in the majors to the Braves (2.36).

ROTATIONAL DOMINATION—Rays starting pitchers have yielded three runs or fewer in 29 of their last 31 outings (April 22–pres.) and 45 of 54 starts this season...their 2.99 ERA (270.2IP, 90ER) is second in the majors (NYY, 2.95) while their .283 opp. on-base pct. is the third best...their ERA is on pace to be the second best in club history through May, trailing only the 2019 rotation (2.35)...they have permitted 26 long balls, tied for MLB's second fewest (also: NYY) behind the Brewers (24).

★ At Tropicana Field, Rays starting pitchers hold a 2.92 ERA (123.1IP, 40ER) and a .227 (104-for-459) opp. average...they have allowed three runs or fewer in 20 of the 25 contests, going 19-1 when doing so...they have allowed one or zero runs in 13 of their last 17 home games since April 22.

★ The rotation has held opponents to an average exit velocity of 87.6 mph, best in the majors, while they have the second-lowest hard-hit rate at 35.4 pct. behind the Brewers (35.0%)...their 87.6 mph average exit velocity would be the majors' lowest mark since 2022 (PHI, 87.4mph).

STRAIGHT OUTTA ANAHEIM—The Rays and Angels continue the first of two series in 2026 today, with the teams meeting in Anaheim between June 12-14...since 2017, the Rays are 37-18 against the Angels and are unbeaten in seven of their eight home series against them (4-1-3).

★ **Junior Caminero** has hit .360 (9-for-25) with 2 2B, 3 HR, 5 RBI, an .800 slugging pct., and a 1.193 OPS in seven career games against the Angels.

★ In 37 career games opposite the Angels, **Yandy Diaz** has slashed .289/.372/.408 (44-for-152) with 6 2B, 4 HR, 18 RBI, and 20 BB...15 of the 38 games have been multi-hit efforts.

★ The Rays three probable starting pitchers for this series (**RHP Nick Martinez**, **RHP Drew Rasmussen**, **LHP Shane McLanahan**) have a combined 2.25 ERA (171.2IP, 43ER) in 31 starts this season...in their careers against the Angels, the trio holds a 2.38 ERA (102.0IP, 27ER) with 90 strikeouts to 23 walks.

FIREWORKS ON THE FARM—OF **Theo Gillen** [MLB No. 43] [TB No. 1] went 3-for-3 with 1 2B, 2 RBI, 3 BB, 1 R, and 4 SB last night for Class-A Bowling Green...he is one of two full-season minor league players to have six plate appearances or more, reach base in all of them, and steal four bases or more in a single contest since at least 2005 (also: Class-A Delmarva **Brayton Payne**, Sept. 7, 2024 - 6PA, 4SB).

★ The 20-year-old top prospect has reached base in 114 of 119 professional games he has appeared in, with a career slash line of .278/.423/.451 (114-for-410).

TODAY'S START—Drew Rasmussen will toe the rubber this afternoon for his 11th start of the campaign and 141st career appearance (92nd start)...min. 50.0 IP, ranks third in the AL in opp. on-base pct. (.252) and WHIP (0.98) this season, while ranking fourth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.10).

- ✦ Min. 175.0 IP, his 2.22 ERA (190.1IP, 47ER) in day games ranks third among active pitchers, trailing **TEX Jacob deGrom** (2.02) and **TOR Tyler Rogers** (2.11).
- ✦ Entering play today, is three starts shy of tying **Matt Garza** (94GS) and **Matt Moore** (94GS) for ninth most in franchise history.
- ✦ Needs 21 strikeouts to reach 500 for his career.

LAST TIME OUT—Rasmussen threw his 48th consecutive start with four runs or fewer allowed on May 24 at NYY, turning in an ultra quality start (7.0IP or more with 2ER or fewer) in his second scoreless outing of the season (7.0IP, 5H, OR, BB, 6SO) that joined 6.0 scoreless innings on April 12 vs. NYY...marked his longest outing since May 11, 2023 at NYY (7.0IP), his final start before undergoing his third elbow surgery on July 24, 2023 (hybrid internal brace).

- ✦ Lowered his career ERA against the Yankees to 0.89 (50.2IP, 5ER) across nine career appearances (eight starts).
- ✦ Generated a season-high 14 whiffs, his most in a start since April 18, 2025 vs. NYY (17 whiffs).

GOT ANGELS ALL AROUND ME—Across two career appearances (one start) against the Angels, Rasmussen has posted a 1-0 record with a 1.42 ERA (6.1IP, ER) and 10 strikeouts...made his lone start against them on Aug. 25, 2022 vs. LAA (1,374 days ago), surrendering one earned run across 5.1 innings while striking out nine batters...in his other appearance on June 26, 2021 at Tropicana Field, he retired three of four batters faced in 1.0 inning of relief...received five runs of support in each outing.

- ✦ He is 9-3 with a 2.75 ERA (92.1IP, 28ER) over 21 career appearances (17 starts) vs. AL West competition, logging a 2.93 ERA (86.0IP, 28ER) in the 17 starts.
- ✦ Will mark his first start against an AL West club in 2026, last facing the division on Sept. 2, 2025 vs. SEA (5.0IP, 4H, 3R, 3HR, 2SO).

WITH HEAVEN ON TROP—The right-hander is 3-0 with a 2.31 ERA (23.1IP, 6ER) and a 1.03 WHIP across four starts inside Tropicana Field in 2026, joining teammates **Shane McClellan** (4-0) and **Jesse Scholtens** (4-1) the only pitchers with three wins or more at the Trop this year...across 37 career appearances at the Trop, Rasmussen has fashioned a 2.58 ERA (163.1IP, 44ER) with a 0.94 WHIP, the lowest ERA (min. 150.0IP) among any pitcher in the venue's history, ranking ahead of **Blake Snell** (2.70ERA) and **David Price** (2.85ERA).

OL' RELIABLE—Rasmussen has allowed four runs or fewer in 48 straight regular-season starts (April 30—pres.), the longest run in franchise history by a traditional starter, ahead of **Shane McClellan's** 44-start run from April 29, 2021–July 26, 2022, and the longest active streak in the majors...he is one of seven pitchers in the modern era (since 1900) to turn the trick and the first since **Jacob deGrom's** 59-start streak between May 22, 2019–Sept. 18, 2022...Rasmussen is eight starts behind opener **Ryne Stanek** (56GS from May 26, 2018–July 16, 2019) for the longest streak by any starter in franchise history.

RIGHT ON—Right-handed hitters are batting .135 (10-for-76) with 16 SO and 1 BB against Rasmussen, the lowest mark in the majors (min. 60AB), ahead of **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (.141) and **CIN Chase Burns** (.143)...right-handed batters are hitting .105 (2-for-19) against his cutter, 1-for-12 (.083) off his four-seamer, and 5-for-37 (.135) against his sinker.

- ✦ Min. 250 AB, his .184 (59-for-321) opp. average vs. right-handed batters since the start of 2025 is the lowest in the majors, ahead of **ATH JT. Ginn** (.185) and **NYM Freddy Peralta** (.186).

MAY I HAVE THIS DANCE—Rasmussen is 10-3 with a 2.32 ERA (100.2IP, 26ER) and 1.01 WHIP over 23 career appearances (17 starts) during May, his most wins during any month in his career and his second-lowest ERA and WHIP to August (2.03 ERA, 0.93 WHIP)...six of his last seven May starts have been quality, a span that began on May 17, 2025 at MIA...four of the seven starts were scoreless.

- ✦ Has gone 2-0 with a 2.96 ERA (24.1IP, 8ER) across four starts this month.

SIXTH OR SEVENTH—Rasmussen has pitched into the 6th inning during six of his 10 starts this season and he has not allowed a run in the 6th or later...he has a .182 (4-for-22) opp. batting average, 0.79 WHIP, and 6.2 barrel pct. in those instances...since the start of 2023, he boasts a 1.27 ERA (21.1IP, 3ER) in the 6th or later across the 22 starts in which he's pitched into the 6th inning.

FIRST THINGS FIRST—Rasmussen earned the starting nod for the Rays on Opening Day for the first time in his career, firing 5.0 innings of one-run ball on March 26 at STL...he became the 18th Opening Day starter in franchise history (12th right-hander), third in the last three seasons, and eighth in the last nine years on the heels of **Chris Archer's** four consecutive starts from 2015-18...at 30 years, 260 days old, he was the third-oldest pitcher to start for the Rays on Opening Day, trailing **Charlie Morton** (36.255) in 2020 and **Tanyon Sturtze** (31.172) in 2002.

LEADING THE WAY—Last season, Rasmussen paced the Rays rotation and ranked fourth in the AL (min. 150.0IP) with a 2.76 ERA (150.0IP, 46ER), trailing only **DET Tarik Skubal** (2.21), **HOU Hunter Brown** (2.43), and **BOS Garrett Crochet** (2.59)...under the same parameter, he also ranked among AL leaders in WHIP (4th, 1.02), opp. slugging pct. (5th, .340), ground ball rate (5th, 49.0%), opp. OPS (6th, .611), opp. on-base pct. (6th, .271), fewest pitches per IP (6th, 15.4), opp. average (7th, .221), walks per 9.0 IP (8th, 2.22), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 3.43) en route to his first career All-Star selection...led the majors with 10 starts of 5.0 IP or more with 0 XBH allowed, most by an AL pitcher since **CAL Nolan Ryan** (13) in 1977...made a club-record 10 scoreless starts of 5.0 IP or more, tied for third most in the majors behind **DET Tarik Skubal** (12) and **PIT Paul Skenes** (12).

- ✦ In 2025, he also became the fourth Rays pitcher (5x) to record a sub-3.00 ERA while making 30 starts or more, joining Cy Young winners **Blake Snell** (1.89) in 2018 and **David Price** (2.56) in 2012, **James Shields** (2.82) in 2011, and **Price** (2.72) in 2010.
