RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a six-game homestand against the Marlins (2-1) and Orioles (three to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...are a season-high-tying 15 games above .500 for the third time...have won five of seven, 12 of 15, 18 of 22, and 25 of their last 33 games...marks their best 22-game stretch since April 2-25, 2023 (18-4)...own the majors' best record (28-10) and ERA (3.19) in their last 38 games since April 4—during that timeframe, have boosted their postseason odds from 24.0 pct. to 86.9 pct., a 62.9 pct. increase, largest in the majors—the Guardians (+33.6%) are the next closest team...own MLB's second-best record overall behind the Braves (32-15)...are off to the third-best start in club history (see table on the right) and have MLB's third-easiest remaining schedule by opponent winning pct. (.473) behind the Athletics (.468) and Rangers (.470)...have led the AL East for nine straight days, their longest reign atop the division since a club-record 113-day streak in 2023 (Opening Day–July 19)...have spent 15 days leading the AL East, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- ★ The Rays became the first AL team to reach 30 wins with a 6-3, rubber-match win over the Marlins yesterday afternoon...45 games marks the third-fastest they have reached the mark in franchise history, trailing the 2023 (39th game) and 2010 (41st) clubs.
- ★ They have been the first AL team to 30 wins in four of the last seven seasons (2026, 2023, 2021, 2020)...in the divisional era (since 1969), the first AL team to 30 wins has made the postseason in 43 of 56 (76.8%) seasons, including each of the last 12 since 2014...22 (39.3%) of those teams went on to make the World Series, and 12 (21.4%) of them lifted the Commissioner's Trophy...these figures do not include the strike-shortened 1994 campaign.
- ★ The Rays are an MLB-best 12-3 during May...at their current pace, they would finish the month 22-6, which would tie April 2023 and May 2021 (both 22-6) for their most wins during a calendar month in franchise history...Tampa Bay is currently pacing for a club-record 108 wins on the season.
- ★ They have scored first in a season-high seven straight and 17 of their last 22 games (April 22-pres)...their 21-5 (.808) record when plating the opening run ranks second in the majors to the Rangers (17-3/.850)...the club has scored in the 1st inning in five of its last seven games compared to three of its previous 22 contests (April 15–May 8).
- ★ The Rays (20-4) are the 13th team in the modern era (since 1900) to win 20 of their first 24 intraleague games and first since the 2003 Yankees (20-4)...tonight's game begins a stretch of nine straight vs. AL East opponents—the Rays 833 (10-2) winning pct. against divisional opponents is tied with the Cardinals (5-1) for the best in the majors.
- ★ Tonight marks the sixth time in 11 games and eighth time over 16 games in May the Rays will face a left-handed starting pitcher...they are an MLB-best 11-2 vs. southpaw starters (11-1 in last 12G).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays placed RHP Cole Sulser (low back strain) on the 15-day IL (retro May 15) and recalled RHP Chase Solesky from Triple-A Durham...additionally, RHP Joe Boyle (right elbow strain) was reinstated from the 15-day IL and optioned to Durham.

★ This marks Solesky's second major league stint (also: May 5-8), but he has yet to make his MLB debut.

SERIES-1Y SPEAKING—The Rays have won seven straight series, the third-longest single-season streak in franchise history behind a pair of 10-set streaks from June 24–July 29, 2013 and July 28–Aug. 31, 2008...they have won nine of their last 11 series since dropping three of their first four to open the campaign...the Rays lead the majors with five sweeps, three of which have come in their last seven sets, and have won eight of nine series against clubs that entered with a sub-.500 record...the Rays have won each of their eight series against AL opponents, the majors' second-longest season-opening streak in intraleague play since 2000 behind the 2018 Diamondbacks (9) and 2001 Mariners (9), according to Stats Perform...the eight-series stretch is tied for their third-longest vs. AL competition at any point in a season (also: Aug. 20–Sept. 19, 2018), trailing streaks of 14 (June 24–Aug. 25, 2013) and 10 series (July 28–Aug. 31, 2008)...they are 4-0-0 against AL East clubs.

★ The Rays have won seven consecutive series openers, their longest streak since May 23–June 24, 2025 (10)...the club record is 11 straight (April 21–May 26, 2023)...their 11-4 record in openers is tied with the Braves and Yankees for the best in the majors.

RETURN OF THE MAC—Shane McClanahan carries a career-best 21.2 scoreless inning streak into tonight's start, the eighth longest by a starting pitcher in club history, but only 3.0 IP shy of the franchise record (see table to the right) and the second-longest active streak among MLB starters behind PHI Christopher Sanchez (29.2IP)...the only Rays left-handed pitchers with longer streaks as starters are Matt Moore (22.1IP) in 2013 and Ryan Yarbrough (22.0IP) in 2019...McClanahan has gone 5.0 scoreless frames or more in a club-record-tying four straight starts, matching Drew Rasmussen from May 17–June 3, 2025...only 11 pitchers in the modern era (since 1900) have turned the trick in five straight starts, most recently MIL Freddy Peralta (5GS) last season...the last AL pitcher to accomplish the feat was KC Zack Greinke (5GS) from 2008-09...the modern era record is six consecutive starts (3x, last: AZ Zac Gallen, 2022).

★ Rays starters lead the AL with a 2.94 ERA (226.1IP, 74ER), including a 1.16 ERA (23.1IP, 3ER) their last turn through the rotation (last 5GS: May 12-17)...they have yielded three runs or fewer in 22 consecutive starts, the longest single-season streak in franchise history and one start shy of a club-record 23-start stretch spanning two seasons from Sept. 11, 2024–April 2, 2025...it marks MLB's longest streak since the Tigers went 27 straight starts from May 16–June 13, 2025 (Stats Perform).

THE FIREMAN—Kevin Kelly tallied five outs yesterday to extend his scoreless inning streak to 13.0, tied with CWS Sean Newcomb for the second-longest active streak among MLB relievers behind ATL Raisel Iglesias (26.1IP)...the effort earned him his 10th hold, tied with CIN Tony Santillan for third most in MLB behind CLE Erik Sabrowski (16) and STL JoJo Romero (13)...Kelly joins Jason Adam (10, 2024), as the only Rays pitchers since 2020 to record 10 holds before the end of May...with 13 games to play, he is five holds shy of Joel Peralta's club-record 15 holds at the conclusion of May 2013...Kelly's 0.72 WHIP is third best in the AL (min. 20.0IP) to BAL Rico Garcia (0.45) and TEX Jacob Latz (0.60)...he also ranks third in ground-ball rate (60.3%) and has induced 5 GIDP, tied with three others for the most among MLB relievers.

★ Kelly has inherited 20 baserunners, tied for fifth most in MLB, and allowed only two of them to score...his 10.0 pct. IRS rate ranks ninth in the majors (min. 10IR), and only CLE Matt Festa and DET Brant Hurter (both 19) have stranded more inherited runners than Kelly (18).

TO THE WINDOW—After his bases-clearing, go-ahead triple yesterday that put the Rays in front for good, Taylor Walls extended his hitting streak to a career-high-tying six games (4x, last: April 10-16, 2026), going 6-for-21 (.286) with 3 XBH, 8 RBI, and an .899 OPS in that span...he has tallied 3 RBI in two of his last three games—entering that stretch, he had two contests with 3 RBI or more across his previous 229 games (Sept. 12, 2023–May 13, 2026)...Walls is 5-for-14 (.357) with RISP during May, and his three hits with the bases loaded (3-for-4) this season are tied for fifth most in the AL...min. 40 PA, his .488 career on-base pct. with the bases loaded is the best in franchise history, ahead of Carlos Pena (.443), and his .387 (12-for-31) average is fifth, trailing Fred McGriff (.400), Carl Crawford (.396), Julio Lugo (.395), and Matt Joyce (.390).

★ He is 19-for-71 (.268) with 14 RBI in Rays wins (25G) and 3-for-31 (.097) with 0 RBI in losses (9G).

★ Walls' 7 DRS are tied for fifth most among MLB infielders...he has 66 DRS since the start of 2022 tied with TOR Andrés Giménez for third in the majors to TOR Daulton Varsho (83) and CIN Ke'Bryan Hayes (81)...Walls has played nearly 800 fewer innings than any other member of that group.

THE ENTERTAINER—Cedric Mullins is batting .367 (11-for-30) with 1 HR, 5 RBI, 8 R, and 4 SB over his last nine games, including 8-for-18 (.444) during a season-high five-game hitting streak...the nine-game stretch has raised his average from .131 to .182...Mullins has recorded a 123 OPS+ in May after posting a 16 OPS+ during March/April...OPS+ is a statistic that measures a hitter's offensive production compared to the rest of the majors, accounting for external factors such as ballparks...league average is 100, meaning Mullins'.853 OPS this month is 23 pct. better than the average major league hitter.

★ The Orioles will become the 30th and final major league club Mullins has appeared against...he was selected by Baltimore in the 13th round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft and spent nearly eight seasons with the club before being dealt to the Mets at last year's July 31 trade deadline...Mullins remains one of four players to record 100 HR and 100 SB (101HR/140SB) in an Orioles uniform, joining Brady Anderson (1988–2001), Paul Blair (1964–76), and Ken Williams (1918–27).

X's AND O's—The Rays and Orioles kick off a 13-game season series tonight, meeting six times over the next 10 days (May 18-27)...Baltimore won the season series, 7-6, last year, including a 6-5, walk-off win in the season series rubber match on Sept. 25 at BAL...it marked the Rays third straight season series loss (2023-25) on the heels of six straight wins (2017-22)...the Rays are 15-24 (.385) against the Orioles since the streak began in 2023, their second-worst mark vs. any AL opponent in that span, ahead of only the Rangers (6-12/.333)...they are 1-3-2 in home series vs. Baltimore during that timeframe, with the lone series win coming in their last home meeting from July 18-20, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field...their last series win over the O's at Tropicana Field was from Aug. 12-14, 2022 (0-3-1 in last four).

★ This marks Craig Albarnaz's first series at Tropicana Field as a manager...he began his coaching career in the Rays minor league system from 2015-19 following eight seasons as a Tampa Bay minor leaguer, earning Midwest League Manager of the Year honors with Class-A Bowling Green in 2018...he appeared in 380 games as a Rays farmhand, including 122 with Triple-A Durham.

DOWN ON THE FARM—Rays No. 25 prospect (MLB.com) OF Austin Overn was named Southern League Player of the Week for May 11-17 (.524/11-for-21, 1 2B, 3HR, 5RBI, 4BB, 6SB, 1.600 OPS).

TONIGHT'S START—Shane McClanahan will toe the rubber for his ninth start of the season and fifth at Tropicana Field...will be making his 83rd career start and 45th career home start tonight...missed the last two years after his second Tommy John surgery wiped out his 2024 season and nerve-related issues sidelined him for 2025...selected by the Rays in the Compensatory Round (31st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Florida.

- ✦ Has allowed no runs over his last four starts (April 25–pres.), tying **Drew Rasmussen** (4GS, May 17–June 3, 2025) for the longest streak in franchise history by a traditional starter.
- ✦ McClanahan is one of three AL pitchers (min. 30.0IP) and one of two major league lefties to hold opponents to a .170 batting average or lower (.168).

LAST TIME OUT—Tossed 5.0 scoreless innings but did not receive a decision, allowing just one hit and one walk with seven strikeouts in a 7-6 win over the Blue Jays on May 12 in Toronto...yielded a walk in the 3rd inning but retired 12 of his first 13 batters faced...allowed three other baserunners to reach in the 5th (fielding error, single, fielder's choice)...marked the Rays fourth straight win in his starts, the longest streak since they won eight consecutive starts from March 30–May 8, 2023.

- ✦ He is one of three pitchers in the majors, and the only one in the AL, to throw 10.0 innings or more in May with no runs allowed.
- ✦ His 2.27 ERA marks his second-lowest ERA through his first eight starts of a season and trails only the start to his 2023 season (2.03).
- ✦ After issuing 11 walks over this first three starts (March 31–April 14), he has permitted only four over his last five (April 19–pres.) with 28 strikeouts.

CHARM CITY—The Baltimore native will make his 10th career start against the Orioles tonight...he's 6-0 with a 2.86 ERA (50.1IP, 16ER) with 57 strikeouts and has limited opponents to a .234 (44-for-188) average against him...he has allowed 2 ER or fewer in seven of those starts, going 6-1 in those contests...McClanahan lived in Baltimore until he was six and some of his best memories of his childhood involve taking the train to watch the Orioles play.

- ✦ McClanahan's six wins against the Orioles are his most against any opponent in his career...his 57 strikeouts are also his most.
- ✦ Against AL East opponents, McClanahan owns a 17-7 career record with a 2.84 ERA (184.0IP, 58ER), 200 strikeouts, and a .220 (150-for-683) opp. average over 34 starts...among active AL southpaws, his 17 wins vs. AL East foes is tied for eighth and his strikeouts are 13th most.

PURE PREMIUM—Through four home starts this season, he has a 3-0 record with a 0.87 ERA (20.2IP, 2ER), 21 strikeouts, and a .155 (11-for-71) opp. average...has yet to allow a home run has yielded just three extra-base hits in those starts (3 2B)...among major league pitchers at home (min. 20.0IP), he ranks second in opp. OPS (.428), fourth in opp. AVG, third in ERA, and T10th in WHIP (0.87).

FEELING SUPPORTED—McClanahan has received three runs of support or more in 42 of his 81 career appearances...in those 42 outings, he holds a 32-1 record, 2.67 ERA (236.1IP, 70ER), .210 (184-for-875) opp. average, 1.06 WHIP, and 262 strikeouts to 67 walks...in games where he receives three runs of support or more, the Rays are 38-4 and have won 18 of the last 19.

STRIKEOUT ARTIST—He has recorded four strikeouts or more in every start this campaign...with seven in his last outing, he surpassed **Matt Moore** (494SO) and is now ninth on the Rays all-time strikeout list and fourth among Tampa Bay southpaws.

- ✦ During his first three seasons (2021-23), McClanahan's 10.14 strikeouts per 9.0 IP ranked second among MLB left-handers (min. 400.0IP) behind **Blake Snell** (11.85)...under the same parameter, it was the second-highest mark by a southpaw through his first three major league campaigns, trailing SD/PIT **Oliver Pérez** (10.34)...his 456 career strikeouts were sixth-most by a left-hander in franchise history and were the most by any Ray through his first three seasons, regardless of handedness, outpacing **James Shields** (448, 2006-08) despite McClanahan (404.2IP) throwing 150 fewer innings than Shields (554.2IP).
- ✦ Min. 1,000 BF, his 33.4 pct. whiff rate from 2021-23 ranked fourth in the majors behind ATL **Spencer Strider** (37.0%), SD **Blake Snell** (33.7%), and MIL **Corbin Burnes** (33.7%)...he led the majors with a 48.4 pct. whiff rate on his changeup in that span (min. 1,000 changeups thrown).
- ✦ Min. 400.0 IP, his 3.02 ERA (404.2IP, 136ER) from 2021-23 ranked second in the AL to LAA **Shohei Ohtani** (2.84) and was second among all left-handed pitchers in the majors to ATL **Max Fried** (2.71).

MLB CAREER RUNDOWN—In 2023, was the Rays Opening Day starter for the second straight year and started 21 games before Tommy John surgery ended his season...after his final start on Aug. 2 at NYY, led the AL in whiff rate (33.4%) while ranking highly in wins (T2nd, 11), opp. average (6th, .222), and ERA (8th, 3.29)...earned the win in each of his first five starts, matching **Matt Moore** (2013) for the longest streak to begin a season in Rays history and was the first Rays pitcher to win 11 of his first 12 decisions in a season...from Opening Day–June 16, went 11-1 with a major-league-best 2.12 ERA (89.1IP, 21ER), 15 points lower than the next closest pitcher (HOU **Framber Valdez** - 2.27)...marked the third-lowest ERA through a Rays pitcher's first 15 starts of a season behind himself in 2022 (1.77) and **Chris Archer** in 2015 (2.08)...was the Rays Roberto Clemente Award nominee.

- ✦ Named the Rays Don Zimmer MVP by the Tampa Bay chapter of the BBWAA and finished sixth in AL Cy Young voting in 2022 after leading the club in wins (12), innings (166.1), and strikeouts (194)...started on Opening Day, for the AL in the All-Star Game and in Game 1 of the Rays Wild Card Series at CLE...his 0.93 WHIP ranked second in the AL and was the lowest in Rays history, passing **Blake Snell** (0.97) in his 2018 Cy Young season.
