**RAY REPORT**—The Rays continue a six-game homestand against the Angels (2-1) and Tigers (0-1, two to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...despite dropping six of their last eight, have won seven of 13, 18 of 27, 24 of 34, and 31 of their last 45 games...have owned the AL's best record for each of the last 24 days (May 9-pres.), including eight consecutive days leading the majors from May 18-25...are 9-1-1 in their last 11 series and have won six straight home sets...have the majors' fourth-easiest remaining schedule (.484 opp. winning pct.)...have a 1.0-game lead in the AL East, their smallest since May 10 (1.0)...have spent 30 days leading the division, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

\* The Rays fell behind, 8-2, and saw a late comeback bid fall short in last night's 10-9 loss to the Tigers, snapping a streak of six straight series-opening wins at Tropicana Field...it ended a nine-game winning streak in one-run affairs, marking their first one-run loss since March 28 at STL (6-5).

\* They yielded a season-high-tying 5 HR, matching April 21 vs. CIN...of the 253 runs allowed by Rays pitching, 107 (42.3%) have come on the 68 HR against them...since holding opponents to 1 HR over a nine-game stretch from April 28-May 7, they have been tagged for 30 HR in their last 20 games, tying the Athletics for the most in the AL over that span (May 8-pres.).

\* The Rays staff has a 6.58 ERA (64.1IP, 47ER) over their last seven games, allowing 10 runs or more in three of those contests after doing so three times in their first 50 games (Opening Day-May 24)...opponents are batting an AL-high .293 (149-for-508) over their last 16 games (May 16-pres.).

\* The Rays have scored in the 1st inning in four of six and 11 of their last 19 games (May 10-pres.) compared to nine of their first 38 games (Opening Day-May 8)...they are 15-5 when scoring in the 1st.

\* The Rays need to win the next two games to avoid their fourth series loss in five sets with the Tigers since the start of 2024...it would mark their first home series loss since April 20-22 vs. CIN, which would snap a six-series winning streak at the Trop.

\* After celebrating his 35th birthday last Friday, **Steven Matz** is set to become the fifth pitcher age 35 or older to appear for the Rays this season, tying the club record from 2009...see page two of tonight's game notes for more information.

**RECENT TRANSACTIONS**—Today, RHP **Andrew Wantz** cleared waivers and elected free agency.

**NEXT MAN UP**—Between **Nick Fortes** (2RBI), **Ryan Vilade** (3RBI), and **Ben Williamson** (2RBI), the Rays tied a modern era (since 1900) record last night with three players tallying multiple RBI after entering as substitutes, marking MLB's 23rd such occurrence over that span and first since the Athletics on June 28, 2016 at SF...the Rays and Athletics are the only clubs to accomplish the feat since 2004...Rays substitutes have tallied multiple RBI an MLB-leading seven times—they had three total such efforts in each of the last three campaigns (2025, 2024, 2023).

\* Rays pinch hitters are batting .278 (15-for-54), third in the majors behind the Cubs (.283) and Braves (.280)...their pinch runners have scored eight runs, matching the Blue Jays for the most in MLB.

**WALKIN' ON THE SUN**—Rays batters have drawn eight walks or more in a franchise-record three straight games, matching the Angels (April 10-12) and Yankees (April 3-5) for the longest streak in the majors this season...**Junior Caminero** (7BB), **Cedric Mullins** (5BB), and **Richie Palacios** (5BB) lead the club during the streak...there have been only seven four-game streaks in the modern era (since 1900), most recently the Athletics from June 13-17, 1999, and the 1949 Red Sox hold the record of five straight games (Aug. 11-14 [G1])...the Rays have tallied an MLB-most 86 walks in their last 17 games since May 12, producing a majors-best 12.5 pct. walk rate in that timeframe...this, compared to 128 walks and an 8.5 pct. walk rate in their first 40 games (Opening Day-May 11), both of which ranked 14th among AL clubs...they have recorded 214 walks through 57 games and are pacing for 608 free passes, which would mark their highest total since a franchise-record 672 walks in 2010.

\* Caminero has drawn multiple walks in a career-high three straight games, tied for the longest single-season streak in team history (7x, last: **Randy Arozarena** from June 8-10, 2023)...**Evan Longoria** holds the overall club record (4G from Sept. 26, 2011-April 6, 2012)...only one player in the majors this season has a longer streak: **LAA Mike Trout** (4G) from May 27-30...Caminero's 16 walks over his last 15 games since May 17 are second most in MLB to Trout's 15.

\* Caminero (36BB) and **Jonathan Aranda** (35BB) are one of four pairs of MLB teammates to both record 35 walks or more, joining duos from the Cubs (Busch/Happ), Yankees (Bellingher/Judge), and White Sox (Murakami/Vargas).

**LA MÁXIMA**—**Junior Caminero** has reached base safely in 11 of 15 PA over his last three games and 14 of 20 PA in his last four contests...the 14 TOB are tied for third most over any four-game span in Rays history, trailing stretches by **Austin Meadows** (16 TOB from April 9-13, 2019) and **Evan Longoria** (16 TOB from Sept. 26, 2011-April 6, 2012)...the club record for times on base over a five-game span is 17 (6x, last: **Yandy Diaz** from Sept. 15-19, 2025)...Caminero has reached base at a .483 clip since the calendar flipped to May, fourth in the majors behind **ATH Nick Kurtz** (.456), **CHC Michael Busch** (.446), and teammate **Jonathan Aranda** (.444), after entering the month with a .328 on-base pct.

\* The MLB leader in average bat speed (79.9 mph), Caminero is slashing .380/.523/.660 (19-for-50) with 8 XBH, 11 RBI, 15 BB vs. 7 SO, and 11 R over his last 14 games.

\* He leads the AL with 71 batted balls hit at 100 mph or faster and is pacing for 201, which would break Diaz's Statcast era (since 2015) club record established last season (200)...he would join Diaz, **ATL Ronald Acuña Jr.** (2023), **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (2024-25), and **TOR Vladimir Guerrero Jr.** (2024, 2021-22) as the only players to record 200 such batted balls under Statcast.

**THE BIG THREE**—**Jonathan Aranda** (11HR, 43RBI), **Junior Caminero** (14HR, 30RBI), and **Yandy Diaz** (11HR, 38RBI) are one of three trios of MLB teammates to each record 10 HR or more and 30 RBI or more each, joining trios from the Braves (Baldwin, Harris II, Olson) and White Sox (Montgomery, Murakami, Vargas)...they are on pace to become the first trio of Rays teammates to each record 30-homer seasons in the same year...the three have accounted for 36 the Rays 50 HR (72.0%), 111 of their 257 RBI (43.2%), and 64 of their 142 extra-base hits (45.1%)...Aranda, Caminero, and Diaz have a combined .293/.388/.511 slash line while the rest of the Rays lineup has posted a combined .243/.312/.332 line.

\* Despite going hitless (0-for-5) last night, Aranda has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games and is 11-for-26 (.423) in his last seven games, reaching safely in 17 of 33 PA (.515 OBP).

\* Diaz has tallied multiple hits in three of four games on the homestand, going 7-for-18 (.389) with 1 2B, 3 HR, and 5 RBI, and is slashing .405/.479/.833 (17-for-42) with 10 XBH and 11 RBI in his last 11 games (May 18-pres.), pacing MLB in average (T1st), slugging pct., and OPS (1.312) over that stretch...his season-high 16-game on-base streak is the third-longest active run in MLB (see table on the right).

**BAKE SHOW**—**Bryan Baker** earned his 16th save on Sunday vs. LAA, third in the majors behind **CLE Cade Smith** (20) and **SD Mason Miller** (17) and tied with **Fernando Rodney** (2012) for the most by a Ray before the end of May in franchise history...he has converted five straight save opportunities and 12 of his last 13, earning saves in three straight and five of the Rays last seven wins (May 17-pres.)...Baker is on pace for 48 saves, which would tie Rodney's franchise record set in 2012 (48)...he entered the campaign with four saves in 205 career appearances.

**DOMESTIC SWEET DOME**—The Rays MLB-leading 21-7 home record marks the second-best home start in franchise history behind only 2023 (23-5)...they have won 17 of their last 20 games at Tropicana Field, outscoring opponents, 112-68 (+44), in that span, while homering in 15 of the 20 contests...the Rays have won six consecutive home series, tied for their seventh-longest stretch in team history and their longest since claiming six straight at Steinbrenner Field from May 9-June 8, 2025...the franchise record is nine consecutive home sets, done three times, most recently from Sept. 2, 2011-April 30, 2012...the Rays are in a stretch of 19 home games within a 28-game span from May 29-June 28, going 2-2 thus far.

\* **Junior Caminero** has hit safely in nine straight games at the Trop, going 15-for-31 (.484) with 8 XBH, 11 RBI, 12 BB vs. 4 SO, and 10 R in that span, reaching base safely in 27 of 43 PA (.628 OBP)...the 27 TOB are the most in club history across any nine-game span at home...he has already tied the Rays record for times on base over a 10-game stretch at home, excluding multi-season spans (27, **Carlos Peña**, 2x, last: Aug. 23-Sept. 9, 2007).

\* **Kevin Kelly** has not permitted a run in 13 appearances at the Trop, tied for the fourth-longest season-opening streak at home in Rays history (see table on the right).

**MOTOR CITY KITTIES**—The Rays and Tigers continue a six-game series tonight, with the clubs reconvening from Aug. 24-26 at Comerica Park...they split six matchups last season, with both sides winning home series...the Rays are 5-2-1 in the last eight season sets dating back to 2017, going 30-22 in that span despite a 4-9 mark over the last two years (2024-pres.)...the Rays have dropped three of their last four sets with the Tigers on the heels of a 7-1-1 stretch (July 9, 2018-Aug. 6, 2023).

\* The Rays are 26-10 (.743) vs. AL opponents, the best intraleague record in MLB...this includes a 10-3 (.769) mark against the AL Central, second in the AL behind the Yankees (6-0).

\* **Yandy Diaz** is batting .406 (13-for-32) with 2 2B, 2 HR, and 3 RBI in seven games against the Tigers since the start of 2025...he is 4-for-10 (.400) with 1 HR in his career vs. Detroit starter **Jack Flaherty**.

**TONIGHT'S START**—Steven Matz will take the ball for his 10th start of the season and fifth and Tropicana Field this evening...marks his 182nd career start (256th appearance) and fifth opposite the Tigers (eighth appearance)...is seeking his fifth win, which would tie three other pitchers for the club lead (**Nick Martinez**, **Shane McClellan**, **Jesse Scholtens**) and match his total from all of 2025 (5-2)...was on the 15-day IL from May 5-20 with left elbow inflammation...is in his 12th major league season and first with the Rays...signed a two-year contract on Dec. 16, 2025, 2022.

★ His four wins are tied for fourth most among AL southpaws.

**LAST TIME OUT**—Matz was tagged for season highs in hits and runs en route to his second loss of the campaign in an 11-2 defeat on May 27 at BAL, his second consecutive start against the Orioles and second outing since returning from the injured list (L, 3.OIP, 7H, 6ER, 2BB, 2SO, HR)...allowed his first 6 BF to reach base safely in a five-run opening frame...the inning included a two-run homer by **Gunnar Henderson** and RBI-singles from **Leody Taveras** (1R) and **Blaze Alexander** (2R)...worked a three-up, three-down 2nd frame on 13 pitches, but yielded two hits in the 3rd, including a run-scoring single, in what proved to be his final inning before giving way to the bullpen.

★ It was the third time in 181 career starts Matz allowed five runs or more in the 1st inning, joining April 16, 2019 at PHI (8R) and July 31, 2018 at WSH (7R), both as a member of the Mets...it marked the most runs he has permitted in any frame since yielding five in the 3rd inning on April 10, 2022 vs. PIT during his stint with the Cardinals.

★ He needed 36 pitches to navigate the opening frame, his most in an inning since a 38-pitch 2nd inning on April 27, 2022 vs. NYM.

**TIGER TALK**—Matz is set for his seventh career appearance and fifth start opposite the Tigers...he made three scoreless relief appearances against them last season, including two from Sept. 26-28 at Fenway Park during the Red Sox' final regular-season series of 2025, retiring 12 of 13 BF in those outings...he has not received a decision in the four starts, turning in a 3.05 ERA (20.2IP, 7ER), including a 1.56 ERA (17.1IP, 3ER) in the first three before allowing 4 ER over 3.1 IP on April 30, 2024 at Comerica Park...Matz has produced a 1.17 ERA (15.1IP, 2ER) in five career appearances (2 starts) at home against the Tigers, his lowest home ERA against any opponent in his career (min. 10.OIP), ahead of his 2.00 ERA (18.OIP, 4ER) at home vs. the Guardians.

★ He is 9-1 with a 2.34 ERA (127.OIP, 33ER) and 0.98 WHIP in 31 career appearances (19 starts) opposite AL Central opponents, his lowest ERA and WHIP vs. any division in his career...has turned in a 2.14 ERA (105.OIP, 25ER) across the 19 starts.

**HOME COOKIN'**—He has permitted two runs or fewer in three of his four home starts, pitching to a 4.00 ERA (18.OIP, 8ER) at Tropicana Field...Matz has limited opposing hitters to a .200 (13-for-64) clip at home (2-for-13/154 with RISP) compared to .248 (25-for-101) on the road (6-for-18/333 with RISP)...the Rays are 3-1 in his starts at the Trop...he is seeking his first home win since his first home start as a Ray on April 10 vs. NYY.

**AGE IS BUT A NUMBER**—Matz celebrated his 35th birthday last Friday, May 29...with his outing tonight, he will become the fifth pitcher age 35 or older to appear for the Rays this season, joining **Aaron Brooks**, **Craig Kimbrel**, **Nick Martinez**, and **Cole Sulser**...it will tie 2009 for the most 35-or-older pitchers to appear for the Rays in club history—the 2009 Rays featured **Chad Bradford**, **Jason Iiringhausen**, **Troy Percival**, **Brian Shouse**, and **Russ Springer**...he will become the first southpaw age 35 or older to appear for the Rays since **Jake Diekmann** (36,252) on Sept. 30, 2023 at TOR and the first to start since **Rich Hill** (41,129) on July 18, 2021 at ATL...Matz is set to join Hill (19 starts, 2021) and Erik Bedard (14 starts, 2014) as the only left-handed pitchers age 35 or older to start for the Rays in franchise history.

★ Matz will also become the seventh southpaw age 35 or older to start in MLB this season, joining CHC **Matthew Boyd** (35), TOR **Patrick Corbin** (36), ATL **Martin Pérez** (35), COL **Jose Quintana** (37), and ATL **Chris Sale** (37).

★ He entered the 2026 season with 10 years, 99 days of service time, most among Rays...he reached the 10-year mark last June and was one of 16 left-handed pitchers to appear in the majors last season to conclude the year with a decade of service time.

**MILESTONE WATCH**—Entering his start tonight, Matz has 975 career strikeouts, 25 shy of reaching 1,000...he would become the 15th active left-hander in the majors to reach the mark and seventh active AL southpaw along with TOR **Patrick Corbin** (1,896), NYY **Carlos Rodón** (1,429), BOS **Aroldis Chapman** (1,356), DET **Framber Valdez** (1,107), NYY **Max Fried** (1,102), and LAA **Yusei Kikuchi** (1,044).

**FALTERED IN THE FIRST**—Of the 23 runs Matz has allowed, 10 have come in the opening frame...he has a 10.00 ERA (9.OIP, 10ER) and .324 (12-for-37) opp. average in the 1st inning compared to a 3.31 ERA (35.1IP, 13ER) and .203 (26-for-128) opp. average from the 2nd frame on...he has permitted 1st-inning runs in four of his last seven outings and has retired the side in order in the opening frame only three times in 11 starts, all on the road: March 29 at STL, April 4 at MIN, and April 27 at CLE.

**LIMITING LEFTIES**—Matz has held left-handed batters to a .217 (10-for-46) average and .245 on-base pct. ...they went 4-for-25 (.160) in his first five starts compared to 6-for-21 (.286) in his last four...of the 7 HR he has permitted, five have come against right-handed batters...lefties are batting .190 (4-for-21) against his sinker and a combined .133 (2-for-15) in at-bats ending with his changeup (2-for-14) and curveball (0-for-1), but they have hit .400 (4-for-10) against his slider...left-handed hitters have registered a 45.5 pct. whiff rate against the changeup (24.4% vs. RHB).
