THE BIG APPLE TV+: Tonight's game against the Los Angeles Angels will be aired exclusively on Apple TV+...Fans can access the game for free by using the Apple TV app or by visiting tv.apple.com...The service is accessible to anyone with internet or wireless access, no cable or satellite subscription is required.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed an off day yesterday...On Wednesday, the Mets fell to the Padres, 13-2...New York is 13-3-2 in 17 series this year... Tonight, the Mets begin their final series of a 10-game, 11-day California road trip (3-4)...They have faced the Dodgers (2-2), Padres (1-2) and begin a three game set against the Angels (three games).

IT'S BEEN AWHILE: The Mets will face the Angles for the first time since May 19-21, 2017 at Citi Field and will pay the first time in Angel Stadium since April 11-13, 2014...The Mets were slated to play the Angels in California from August 18-20, 2020...Francisco Lindor has hit three doubles and five home runs in 15 career games at the ballpark.

WELCOME BACK!: Prior to tonight's game, RHP Tylor Megill is slated to be activated off the 15-Day Injured List...Megill was placed on the IL on May 12 with Right biceps inflammation...He is 4-2 with a 4.41 ERA (17 earned runs/34.2 innings) with nine walks and 37 strikeouts in seven starts this year...The Long Beach, CA native is 3-1 with a 4.91 ERA (10 earned runs/18.1 innings) with two walks and 19 strikeouts in four starts on the road this year.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets continue Interleague play against the Angels tonight...The Mets are 1-2 this year against the American League... The Mets went 9-11 in Interleague play in 2021...The team's .510 winning percentage (227-218) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil's .345 average is the best in the Senior Circuit and third in the majors...Over his last seven games, Jeff McNeil is batting .360 (9-23) with three runs, a double, two RBI, a walk, with a .407 OBP and an .807 OPS...He ranks 10th in the majors and fourth in the National League with a .314 batting average...His batting average has not dropped below .300 since it was .280 on April 22...He is hitting .345 (48-139) with 11 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 10 walks with a .395 OBP and a .504 SLG against right-handed pitchers this season...He has collected 130 multi-hit games in his career...That is tied with Gregg Jefferies for 36th in franchise history...Joel Youngblood and Ken Boswell are tied at 34th with 132 multi-hit games.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets ranked third in the majors with 529 strikeouts this season...Only the Milwaukee Brewers (568) and the Atlanta Braves (536) have struck out more batters this year...New York owns a 3.08 strikeout per walk ratio this year...That is the third-best in the NL behind only the Dodgers (3.44) and the Braves (3.11).

STRIKE THAT: The Mets batters have struck out 442 times this year...That is the eighth-fewest strikeouts in MLB and the third-fewest in the NL...They have struck out 19.6% this year...The Mets are one of six teams who have struck out less than 20% this season...Their 19.6% strikeout rate is third in the majors and second in the National League.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a major league leading 40 times this year...The Mets have been hit nine times in the last nine games...The Mets have been hit 274 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 60 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 46 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 42 HBP and Jeff McNeil is ninth at 36 HBP.

TRIPLES MAKES IT SAFE. TRIPLES IS BEST: The Mets lead the major leagues with 14 three-baggers this year...Brandon Nimmo is tied for the major league lead with four triples, while Eduardo Escobar is tied for fourth with three... Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte have hit two each, placing them tied for 13th in The Show...The Mets recorded 18 triples in 2021...The franchise record is 49 triples accomplished by the 2009 Mets...Lance Johsnon holds the franchise record with a single-season total of 21 triples, doing so in 1996.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets lead the National League and are second in the majors with a .288 average with runners in scoring position...They rank third in MLB with a .358 OBP and sixth with a .451 SLG in those situations...Tomás Nido leads the club, hitting .400 (10-25) in those situations...Jeff McNeil - .396 (19-48), J.D. Davis - .364 (8-22), Pete Alonso - .360 (18-50), Mark Canha - .318 (14-44) and Francisco Lindor - .310 (18-58) are all hitting .300 or better with RISP... Alonso leads the majors with 41 RBI in RISP situations and has nine home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, three more than any other hitter in the majors.

ANGELS-METS NOTES: The Mets are making just their fourth appearance at Angel Stadium...It's the first appearance since April 11-13, 2014 (1-2)...The have also played at the ballpark from June 16-18, 2008 (2-1) and June 13-15, 2003 (2-1)

FOGO POWER: Over his last 16 games, Eduardo Escobar is batting .328 (22-67) with 11 runs, six doubles, a triple, three home runs, 15 RBI with a .582 SLG and a .901 OPS...He is batting .317/.353/.635 against left-handed pitching this season

OMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: Over his last 10 games, Tomás Nido is batting .367 (11-30) with five runs, a double, five RBI, three walks with an .824 OPS...Over his last 19 games, he is batting .298 (17-57) with five runs, two doubles, seven RBI, five walks with a .355 OBP...He has raised his batting average from $\,$.188 to .253 $\,$ in 23 games since May 1.

TWO-FERS: The Mets are batting .248/.326/.392 with two outs this season. Their 110 RBI with two outs are tops in the major leagues...The Mets have hit .200/.274/.281 with two strikes this year...Their .200 batting average is the best in the majors, as is their .274 OBP.

ROAD TRIPPIN': New York is 19-13 on the road this year...Their .594 road winning percentage is the fifth-best in the majors and is the third-best in the NL...The Mets did not record their 19th win on the road until July 4 in 2021 in their 44th road game (19-25)...The Mets finished the first-half of the 2021 season going 19-26 on the road...They did not record their 20th road win until July 18 in 2021 (20-28)...New York is batting .256/.325/.394 away from Citi Field...Their .256 road average ranks fourth in the majors, while their .325 OBP ranks fifth.

BY THE WAY: New York has won 38 games this season, the most in the National League...Their .644 winning percentage is third in the majors and is the second best in the NL...The team has posted a 38-21 record through the team's first 59 games...Only the 1986 (43-16) team posted a better record through the first 59 games of the season...The 1988 Mets also went 38-21.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS: Over his last 13 games, J.D. Davis is batting .341 (15-44) with eight runs, four doubles, six RBI, four walks with a .400 OBP, a .432 SLG and an .832 OPS in that span...Over his last 23 games, Davis is batting .270/.341/.365...He owns a .305/.394/.458 slashline in 21 road games, compared to a .170/.264/.213 slashline in 16 games at Citi Field in 2022.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has recorded 11 saves this season, tied for the ninth-most in the majors...He is second in the major leagues and first in the NL among relievers with 41 strikeouts...His 16.28 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...He has struck out 41 of the 91 batters he faced, good for 45.1%...He is 2-1 with 11 saves, a 2.38 ERA (six earned runs/22.2 innings), allowing 16 hits and 10 walks...The Mets are 22-1 when Díaz appears in a game

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 74 saves as a member of the Mets....That places him ninth on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Francisco Rodríguez who recorded 83 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 183 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is 10-14 with 74 saves, a 3.78 ERA (71 earned runs/169.0 innings) with 69 walks and 279 strikeouts...His 279 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (308) and Josh Hader (301) have struck out more...Additionally, his 279 strikeouts are the 10th most by a reliever in franchise history...Seth Lugo is ninth with 287...Aaron Heilman is eighth with 289.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Mets Manager Buck Showalter is in his first season with the team...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with 1,589...He ranks 23rd on the all-time win list, surpassing Dick Williams (1,571) earlier this year...Tommy Lasorda is next at

MEGILL NEWS & NOTE:

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed a career-high eight runs over 1.1 innings, the shortest outing of his career on May 11 against the Nationals at Nationals Park...Was placed on the 15-day injured list the following day with right biceps inflammation.

REHAB OUTING: On June 5, Megill made a rehab start with the Binghamton Rumble Ponies...Megill allowed two runs over 3.2 innings and struck out five batters without issuing a walk...Megill threw 53 pitches, 36 strikes.

VS. LOS ANGELES - AL: Megill will face the Angels for the first time in his career... This will be Megill's third career start against an Interleague opponent and the first this season...Megill is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (two earned runs/13.0 innings) with 15 strikeouts and two walks through his first two career inter-league starts

GOOD COMPANY: According to *Sportradar*, Megill has exactly 100 more strikeouts (136) than walks (36) entering his 26th career start tonight...He's the fifth Mets pitcher to own a strikeout-walk differential of 100+ through their 25th MLB start (relief appearances disregarded), joining Dwight Gooden, Matt Harvey, Jacob deGrom and Noah Syndergaard.

COMBINED NO-NO: Threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...This is 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodríguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

CAN'T HANDLE ME RIGHT NOW: Tylor Megill has a .172 opponent batting average against right-handed batters...That ranks 14th in the NL among pitchers who have faced at least 50 right-handed batters...His .507 opponent OPS against RHB is the 15th-best mark in the NL.

100 KLUB: Megill punched out César Hernández looking, his first batter faced, on April 7 at Washington for the 100th strikeout of his career...He is the seventh Mets hurler who began his career with New York to record 100 or more strikeouts in his first 19 career starts with the club...He is the first to accomplish the feat since Steven Matz in 2016.

OPENOR: Megill became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history on April 7 at Washington when he earned his first career Opening Day start...Entering the game, his 89.2 career innings pitched were the fewest of any Mets Opening Day starter in franchise history...Marked the fourth straight scoreless Opening Day start by a Mets pitcher (Jacob deGrom, 2019-2021) and the fifth in six seasons (also Noah Syndergaard, 2017)...Became the third starter in club history who did not allow a run or a walk on Opening Day (Tom Seaver in 1972, Noah Syndergaard in 2017).
