RAYS REPORT—The Rays continue their final road trip of 2025 tonight at Rogers Centre, a six-game trek through Baltimore (1-2) and Toronto (3G)...have split their last eight games (4-4) after dropping nine of their previous 11 contests (Sept. 5-16), which came on the heels of a season-high seven-game winning streak (Aug. 28-Sept. 4)...are winless in their last six series (0-5-1), their longest such streak since Sept. 8-28, 2017 (0-4-2)...have gone 7-17-1 over their last 25 series since a 16-8-2 start...are fourth in the AL East for the 77th consecutive day dating back to July 11, 14.0 GB the first-place Blue Jays...have a 2.0-game lead over the fifth-place Orioles with three games to play...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 107 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ★ The Rays carried a 5-2 lead into the 8th inning but yielded four runs over the final two frames of yesterday's 6-5 loss, including a walk-off home run by **Dylan Beavers**...it was their eighth walk-off loss, tied for third most in the AL and their second most over the last 10 seasons (2016-25) behind 2021 (12).
- ★ It also marked their fourth time this season losing on a walk-off home run, tied with the Royals for the most in the majors and the Rays most since 2018 (4).
- ★ Since their season-high seven-game winning streak ended, the Rays have gone 6-13 in their last 19 games and have won back-to-back games once (Sept. 17-18 vs. TOR).
- ★ With a major league-leading 190 SB, the Rays need to steal four bases this series to tie the 2009 team's franchise-record 194 SB.
- ★ The Rays need to win tonight to finish the season with a winning record in series openers...after losing each of their last four, their 26-25 mark in series-opening games is tied for fifth best in the AL/tied for 11th in the majors.
- ★ Tampa Bay also needs a win to avoid falling a season-high-tying six games under .500, which would match its 61-67 record entering play Aug. 22.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays reinstated **INF Jonathan Aranda** (left wrist fracture) from the 10-day IL and placed **OF Everton Pereira** (low back inflammation) on the 10-day IL...a first-time All-Star in 2025, Aranda's last appearance came on July 31 at NYY...he carries a four-game hitting streak into tonight's game (6-for-15/.400).

THE RAY WAY—Tampa Bay's pitching staff has a 3.28 ERA (266.2IP, 94ER) over the last 31 games since Aug. 22, third in MLB behind Pittsburgh (2.84) and Cleveland (2.96)...the 31-game stretch has lowered the club's season-long ERA from 4.01 to 3.87, 11th best in the majors, but within striking distance of the 10th-ranked Mariners (3.85) and ninth-ranked Cubs (3.84)...the Rays are seeking their ninth consecutive season with a top-10 ERA in the majors (since 2017), which would extend the longest active streak in baseball...entering the season, no other team had an active streak longer than four seasons (HOU, NYY)...according to Stats Perform, the only team in the Wild Card era (1995-pres.) with a longer streak is the Dodgers (12) from 2011-22.

CHASING 300—**Jake Mangum** (.299, 395AB) and **Chandler Simpson** (.300, 404AB) are attempting to become the second and third Rays rookies to hit .300 or better with at least 400 AB, joining **Joey Wendle** (.300, 487AB) in 2018...only four pairs of rookie teammates since 1901 have accomplished the feat, most recently **PIT Kevin Newman** (.308)/**Bryan Reynolds** (.314) in 2019...other instances involved **BOS Fred Lynn**/**Jim Rice** in 1975, **DET Dale Alexander**/**Roy Johnson** in 1929 and **STL George Barclay**/**Homer Smoot** in 1902.

- ★ Between Mangum, Simpson and **Yandy Diaz** (.302), the Rays could have three players hit .300 or better (min. 400AB) for the first time in team history...under the same parameter, the last team in MLB to accomplish the feat was the 2019 Red Sox (Bogaerts/Devers/Martinez)...since 2012, the only Rays to do so in any given season are **Diaz**, **Wendle** and **Harold Ramirez** (2023, 2022).
- ★ Paired with 2023 (.330), Diaz is attempting to join **Carl Crawford** (5x) as the only players in team history with multiple qualified seasons hitting .300 or better...he would join **José Abreu** (4x) and **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (2) as the only active Cuban-born players with multiple such campaigns.

MAN OF STEAL—**Chandler Simpson's** 43 SB are second in MLB to NYY **José Caballero** (48SB) and 10th most in a season in Rays history, 2 SB shy of joining **Carl Crawford** (6x, last: 47SB in 2010) as the only Rays to reach 45 SB...with a .300 average, he has a chance to become the ninth MLB rookie since 1901 to hit .300 or better with 40 SB or more and the first since **LAA Mike Trout** (.326/.49SB) in 2012...the only Ray to meet those marks, regardless of rookie status, is **Carl Crawford** (5x, last: 2010 - .307/.47SB)...the only two players in the majors to do so since 2022 are **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (.310/.59SB) in 2024 and **ATL Ronald Acuña Jr.** (.337/.73SB) in 2023...the last AL hitter was KC **Whit Merrifield** (.304/.45SB) in 2018.

- ★ Simpson has tallied a hit in 10 of his last 12 games, going 20-for-49 (.417) with 3 2B, 3 RBI, 2 BB, 2 R and 4 SB in those contests...it marks the majors' third-best average over that stretch (Sept. 11-pres.) behind NYY **Aaron Judge** (.455) and **Yandy Diaz** (.436).
- ★ **THE GREAT YANDINO**—Reigning AL Player of the Week **Yandy Diaz** has hit safely in 20 of his last 26 games since Aug. 25, batting .419/.505/.624 (39-for-93) with 7 2B, 4 HR, 10 RBI, 16 BB, 11 SO, 19 R and a 1.128 OPS...during that span, he paces the majors in average, ranks second in on-base pct., OPS and hits, and ninth in slugging pct....min. 100 PA, he is the fourth Ray to post a .500 on-base pct. or better over any 26-game span, joining **Matt Joyce** (2011), **Carlos Peña** (2007) and **Fred McGriff** in both 2001 (1x) and 1999 (9x).
- ★ He is one double away from joining **Ben Zobrist** (2011-14) as the only players in Rays history with four straight 30-double seasons.
- ★ Diaz's 53 multi-hit games, which are tied with SEA **Julio Rodríguez** for the MLB lead, match his career high from 2023...he could become the first player in Rays history to pace the majors in multi-hit efforts...the last Tampa Bay batter with more multi-hit games was **Carl Crawford** (54G) in 2009.
- ★ He has already posted career highs in hits (174), home runs (25), RBI (83) and games played (148)...his 55 XBH are two shy of his career high from 2023 (57XBH).

LA MÁXIMA—With three games to play, **Junior Caminero** (44HR) is 2 HR shy of tying **Carlos Peña's** franchise-record 46-HR campaign in 2007...he has 17 HR since Aug. 1, fourth most in the majors...his 108 RBI are the most by a Ray since **Evan Longoria** (113RBI) in 2009 and are fourth most in Rays history (see table to the right)...his 72 XBH match **Ben Zobrist** (2011) for seventh most in a season in team history, one shy of Longoria in 2010 (73XBH) for sixth and two shy of Longoria in 2013 (74XBH) for fifth...Caminero has gone a season-high eight straight games without an extra-base hit...he is 6-for-27 (.222) with five walks and a .364 on-base pct. over that stretch, matching his total walks from his previous 25 contests (Aug. 17-Sept. 14).

- ★ Caminero (28 2B/44HR) needs two more doubles to become the first player in franchise history with a 30-double, 40-homer season.

RAYS AND JAYS—The Rays and Blue Jays conclude a 13-game season series this weekend in Toronto...this marks the clubs' second meeting in a two-week span after splitting a four-game set from Sept. 15-18 at Steinbrenner Field...Tampa Bay has won seven of the first 10 meetings, securing its eighth straight season series win, 10th in 11 seasons under **Kevin Cash** (2015-pres.) and 16th in 18 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...the eight-season streak is tied for the longest over a single opponent in franchise history, matching another eight-year run over the Angels (2016-24)...Tampa Bay has gone 6-0-2 over its last eight individual series vs. Toronto since its last loss from Sept. 22-24, 2023 at Tropicana Field, its longest streak of unbeaten series vs. the Blue Jays since a 9-0-1 stretch from Aug. 22, 2017-July 28, 2019...this includes wins in each of their last four series at Rogers Centre, tied for their longest streak at this venue in franchise history (also; June 29, 2009-June 2, 2010).

- ★ The Rays have won six of eight and 11 of their last 14 meetings with Toronto...their 16-7 (.696) record vs. the Jays since the start of 2024 is the best by any AL team.
- ★ Tampa Bay's 2.37 ERA (91.0IP, 24ER) against Toronto this season would surpass 2012 (2.40) for its lowest vs. the Blue Jays in franchise history...the staff has yielded three runs or fewer in eight of 10 matchups in 2025.
- ★ **Junior Caminero** has hit safely in all six of his career games at Rogers Centre, going 8-for-28 (.286) with 2 2B and 9 RBI...he recorded his first career home run (Oct. 1, 2023) and first grand slam (May 13, 2025) in this venue.
- ★ **Brandon Lowe** is 15-for-38 (.395) with 2 2B, 5 HR, 15 RBI and five multi-RBI efforts in nine games vs. the Blue Jays this season...he has 11 XBH (4 2B, 7HR) in his last 13 games against Toronto dating back to July 25, 2024...min. 35 PA, his .842 slugging pct. vs. the Blue Jays this year would be the highest in Rays history.

TONIGHT’S START—Adrian Houser will toe the rubber for his 21st start of the season and 10th with the Rays...marks his 125th career start and 173rd appearance...marks his fifth career start opposite Toronto...has thrown back-to-back quality starts for the first time with Tampa Bay... has a career-high 3.3 bWAR after collecting 2.7 bWAR through his first eight MLB seasons...was acquired from the White Sox on July 31 for **INF Curtis Mead**, **RHP Duncan Davitt** and **RHP Ben Peoples**.

LAST TIME OUT—Houser logged his 11th quality start, extending a single-season career high, but took his third consecutive no-decision in a 6-3 loss on Sept. 20 vs. BOS (ND, 6.0IP, 5H, 3ER, 3BB, 2SO, HBP)...navigated a 1-2-3 opening frame on nine pitches...worked around back-to-back singles to begin the 2nd to maintain a scoreless tie...allowed **Jarren Duran** to single and steal second before he came around to score on a pair of wild pitches...marked only the second time Houser has recorded multiple wild pitches in an entire game, let alone an inning, joining Sept. 17, 2021 vs. CHC (2)...worked a scoreless 4th before permitting one run in both the 5th and 6th innings to finish the outing.

- ✦ Houser did not allow an extra-base hit for the second time this season, joining June 28 vs. SF during his stint with the White Sox.
- ✦ The Rays are 5-2 in his last six starts, with Houser going 2-0 with a 3.86 ERA (39.2IP, 17ER) in those games...this, after he took the loss and posted a 7.59 ERA (10.2IP, 9ER) across his first two outings with Tampa Bay.

NORTHERN ATTITUDE—In four previous starts opposite the Blue Jays, Houser is 1-2 with a 5.32 ERA (23.2IP, 14ER)...this includes a 2.03 ERA (13.1IP, 3ER) in two starts this season compared to a 9.58 ERA (10.1IP, 11ER) in two previous starts in 2022 and 2023 during his time as a Brewer... Blue Jays hitters have slashed .343/.398/.414 (34-for-99) against Houser, his third-highest opponent average vs. any team in his career behind the Angels (.423) and Yankees (.355)...he is seeking his first career win at Rogers Centre, which would be the 15th ballpark (sixth AL ballpark) in which he has recorded a victory.

- ✦ This marks his second start against an AL East opponent as a Ray, joining his lastouting on Sept. 20 vs. BOS...he is 1-1 with a 3.16 ERA (25.2IP, 9ER) in four starts against the division this season, all of which were quality.

TRAVELING MAN—Since taking the loss in his first two road starts with Tampa Bay, the Rays have won three of his last four starts away from home, with Houser pitching to a 2.66 ERA (20.1IP, 6ER) with 21 SO, 4 BB and 2 HR allowed in those contests...he is seeking his second road win this season, which would join July 4 at COL...that win marks his only victory on the road in 23 starts as a visitor since the beginning of 2024... despite this, his teams are still 6-3 across his last nine outings on the road.

MIX IT UP—In 11 starts with the White Sox, Houser threw his changeup at a 10.5 pct. clip, allowing opponents to bat .293 (12-for-41) against the pitch...in nine starts with the Rays, they are 4-for-32 (.125) off Houser’s changeup, and he has increased his usage rate by 5.3 pct. to 15.8 pct. ... Houser has relied on his sinker/slider combination 68.2 pct. of the time with the Rays, but opponents are 46-for-141 (.326) against those pitches... with Chicago, he threw those offerings 38.1 pct. of the time, and opposing hitters went 38-for-149 (.255) against them.

DEEP CUTS—Houser has allowed 9 HR in 20 starts this season, including 7 HR in his last 10 starts compared to 2 HR in his first 10...min. 100.0 IP, his 0.68 HR per 9.0 IP ranks fifth in the AL, trailing BAL **Trevor Rogers** (0.25), KC **Kris Bubic** (0.46), LAA **José Soriano** (0.64) and NYY **Max Fried** (0.65)... in 11 starts in which he has held opponents homerless, three of which have come with the Rays, Houser is 4-1 with a 1.77 ERA (66.0IP, 13ER).

- ✦ He went five straight starts without a long ball from June 22–July 19, the fourth-longest stretch of his career...he has allowed multiple home runs just once since the beginning of 2024 (July 14, 2024 vs. COL) and 12 times in 171 career appearances.

STRIKE 1, 2 AND 3—Houser set his season high in strikeouts in consecutive starts on Sept. 3 vs. SEA (8SO) and Sept. 9 at CWS (9SO)... these are the most strikeouts he has had in a game since he tied his career high on July 22, 2023 vs. ATL (10SO)...since that two-start stretch, he has struck out two batters in each of his last two outings.

BUCKLE DOWN—Houser has held opponents to a .202 (20-for-99) clip with runners in scoring position, tied for the ninth-lowest average in the AL (min. 90AB with RISP)...this includes a 9-for-41 (.220) clip accross nine starts with the Rays.

BETTER THAN EVER—This season marks his first pitching in the AL, and it has turned into a career year for the right-hander...in eight previous major league seasons from 2015-24, Houser made 104 starts in 152 appearances to a 32-39 record, 4.21 ERA (608.2IP, 285ER) and a 1.38 WHIP...thus far in 2025, he is 8-4 with a 3.18 ERA (119.0IP, 42ER) and 1.27 WHIP over 20 starts...his ERA, 11 quality starts and 3.3 bWAR are all the best marks of his career...his 119.0 IP are his second most behind 2021 (142.1IP)...this season marks the first of his career in which every outing will come as a starting pitcher.

SUMMER STARTER—He began the year with nine appearances (8GS) for Triple-A Round Rock in the Rangers organization, going 2-2 with a 5.03 ERA (39.1IP, 22ER) before being released May 15...Houser officially signed with the White Sox 20 and made his debut with the club the same day vs. SEA, throwing 6.0 scoreless innings with two hits, three walks and two strikeouts in a winning decision...min. 100.0 IP, his 3.18 ERA (119.0IP, 42ER) since his May 20 debut ranks 12th in the AL.

TOMORROW’S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP JOE BOYLE (1-3, 4.40)

LAST START—Struck out a career-high nine batters in the 7-3 win over the Red Sox on Sept. 21 at Steinbrenner Field (ND, 4.1IP, 4H, ER, 4BB, 9SO)...had turned in a 0.87 ERA (10.1IP, 1ER) across his last two starts, holding opponents to a .216 (8-for-37) average with 14 SO against 4 BB.

vs. BLUE JAYS—Boyle made his lone career start opposite Toronto earlier this month on Sept. 15 in Tampa, working six scoreless frames in a 2-1 setback (ND, 6.0IP, 4H, OR, 5SO)...he is 0-1 with a 3.20 ERA (19.2IP, 7ER) in five appearances (3GS) againsts AL East clubs this season.
