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SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (58-82) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (68-72)

THE PIRATES: have split the first two games during their penultimate homestand of the 2026 campaign vs. San Francisco (1-1, Tuesday-Thursday) and Los Angeles-AL (Friday-Sunday), including a 5-4, 10-inning loss on Wednesday vs. the Giants at PNC Park...Went 4-5 on their recent season-long, nine-game/11-day road trip to Los Angeles-NL (0-3, August 21-23), San Diego (2-1, August 24-26) and St. Louis (2-1, August 28-30)...Have hit 163 home runs (they hit 117 home runs all of last season)...Have the most hits (1224) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the fourth-most runs (686) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Chicago-NL (751), Washington (735) and Milwaukee (704), after scoring a Major League-low 583 runs all of last season (they are looking to become only the fourth team in Major League history to finish top three in the league in runs scored the year after finishing last in the league in runs scored and the first since Chicago [AL] in 1915).

A GIANT CHANCE: Pittsburgh can win its first home series vs. San Francisco since winning two of three games from April 19-21, 2019, with a win today...The Pirates could also capture their third straight series victory with a win (also August 24-26 at San Diego and August 28-30 at St. Louis), something they have not done since winning two of three games last year from September 19-21 vs. the A's, two of three games from September 23-25 at Cincinnati & two of three games from September 26-28 at Atlanta.

CALL TO THE HALL: The Pirates will host their fifth annual Hall of Fame Game on Friday vs. Los Angeles (AL)...Wilbur Cooper, John Candelaria and Jack Wilson will officially be inducted during a ceremony tonight at PNC Park's Left Field Lounge...The trio will join the list of 29 previously inducted members...Cooper pitched for Pittsburgh from 1912-24 and ranks first in team history in wins (202) and third in strikeouts (1196)...Candelaria pitched for the Pirates in two separate stints (1975-85 and 1993) and ranks fourth in team history in strikeouts (1159)...He threw the team's last individual no-hitter on August 9, 1976 vs. Los Angeles...Wilson played for the Pirates from 2001-09 and was both a National League All-Star and a Silver Slugger Award recipient in 2004.

HALO AGAIN: Pittsburgh will host Los Angeles (AL) for three games this weekend (Friday-Sunday)...The Pirates have played nine games vs. the Angels at PNC Park (since 2001), their fewest vs. any American League team in stadium history...They hosted the Angels for three games from June 15-17, 2004, three games from June 3-5, 2016 and three games from May 6-8, 2024.

AMERICAN SPIRIT: The Pirates will play 12 of their final 22 games vs. American League teams...They will play vs. Los Angeles (Friday-Sunday), at Chicago (September 8-10), vs. Kansas City (September 18-20) and at Detroit (September 25-27)...They have won nine straight interleague series here at home, dating back to a three-game sweep from July 21-23, 2025 vs. Detroit.

SWEET SIXTEEN: Brandon Lowe is one home run shy of becoming the eighth player to hit at least 16 home runs at PNC Park in a single season (since 2001) and the first since Jack Suwinski (also 16 home runs) in the 2022 campaign.

THE GREAT LAKE: Lake Bachar, who will make his fourth start with the Pirates today vs. San Francisco, is one of nine different starters used by the team (also Braxton Ashcraft, Bubba Chandler, Jared Jones, Mitch Keller, Carmen Mlodzinski, Mason Montgomery, Yohan Ramírez and Paul Skenes)...They have not used nine or fewer starters in a full season since 2018 (nine).

ONE AND DONE: Pittsburgh has played three straight one-run games here at PNC Park (August 19 vs. Detroit and Tuesday-Wednesday vs. San Francisco)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, the Pirates have played four straight one-run contests here at PNC Park five times in stadium history (since 2001), coming from July 18-28, 2001 (five), July 2-5, 2003 (four), September 14-25, 2011 (four), September 28-October 1, 2012 (four) & September 13-16, 2015 (four).

HOW ACQUIRED: From Miami in a four-player trade on August 3, 2026.

AS OF LATE: Bachar allowed one run on one hit (a solo home run to Joshua Báez) while striking out two batters across his 2.1 innings of work in his start on August 29 at St. Louis (the Pirates won, 6-2)...He retired each of the four batters he faced during his last relief appearance, which was on August 26 at San Diego (the Bucs were defeated, 3-0).

START ME UP: Bachar has a 2.20 ERA (16.1ip/4er) and a .148 batting average against (8-for-54) in seven starts this year, coming on June 2 at Washington (2.2ip), June 6 vs. Tampa Bay (3.0ip), June 13 at Pittsburgh (2.0ip), June 19 vs. San Francisco (1.1ip), August 16 vs. Boston (3.0ip), August 23 at Los Angeles-NL (2.0ip) and August 29 at St. Louis (2.1ip)...He made his first MLB start on September 1, 2025 at Washington (2.0ip).

AGAINST THE GIANTS: Bachar has one save and a 3.00 ERA (6.0ip/2er) in four career appearances (one start) against San Francisco, including a 4.15 ERA (4.1ip/2er) in three games (one start) this year...He earned a save in his last outing vs. the Giants (June 21).

I WANT YOU, BACH: Bachar was acquired by Pittsburgh from Miami, in exchange for right-handed pitcher Brandon Bidois, outfielder Brian Sanchez and infielder Hyun Seung Lee, prior to Major League Baseball’s Trade Deadline on August 3...He went 1-2 with two saves, a 3.84 ERA (58.2ip/25er), 61 strikeouts and a .201 batting average against (43-for-214) over his 38 appearances (four starts) with the Marlins this season.

RIGHT ON: Bachar has limited right-handed hitters to a .167 batting average against (20-for-120), a .239 on-base percentage and a .589 OPS this year...His batting average against versus righties is the fifth-lowest mark in Major League Baseball (minimum 120 at-bats)...He trails Texas’ Jacob Latz (.106), Los Angeles (NL)’ Shohei Ohtani (.142), Tampa Bay’s Kevin Kelly (.154) and New York (NL)’s Nolan McLean (.164) on that list.

HOME SWEET HOME: Bachar has posted a 2.16 ERA (33.1ip/8er), 37 strikeouts, a .172 batting average against (20-for-116) and a 0.90 WHIP in his 20 home appearances (three starts) split between Miami’s loanDepot park and Pittsburgh’s PNC Park...His home batting average against is 10th in Major League Baseball (minimum 115 at-bats), behind Houston’s Steven Okert (.131), Milwaukee’s Jacob Misiorowski (.158), Seattle’s Bryce Miller (.159), Tampa Bay’s Bryan Baker (.165), Chicago (AL)’s Huascar Brazobán (.167), Toronto’s Spencer Arrighetti (.170), New York (AL)’s Brent Headrick (.170), Kansas City’s Daniel Lynch IV (.172) and Los Angeles (NL)’ Shohei Ohtani (.172).

ROAD TO THE SHOW: Bachar pitched in parts of seven minor league seasons (2016-19 and 2022-24) in San Diego’s organization (there was no minor league season in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and he missed all of 2021 while recovering from “Tommy John” surgery)...He was designated for assignment by the Padres on September 1, 2024 and was claimed off waivers by Miami on September 3, 2024...He made his Major League debut on September 8, 2024 vs. Philadelphia, where he struck out the side (Weston Wilson, Brandon Marsh and Aramis Garcia) in the eighth inning.

BACH-GROUND INFO: Bachar was originally selected by San Diego out of the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, where he played both football (2013-15) and baseball (2015-16), in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft (was rated by Baseball America as the No. 100 draft prospect before the season)...He led the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference w/103 strikeouts as a junior (‘16).
