METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets began their 61st season with a 5-1 over the Nationals in Washington...The Mets continue their first road trip of the year, a two-city seven game series against Washington (1-0) and Philadelphia (three games)...The Mets return to New York for their home opener on Friday, April 15 against the Arizona Diamondbacks.

CONNECT FOUR: Tylor Megill's outing last night was the fourth straight scoreless Opening Day start by a Mets pitcher (Jacob deGrom 2019-21) and the fifth in six years (also Noah Syndergaard 2017)...The Mets' Opening Day starter has now thrown 5.0 or more scoreless innings 12 times...According to Elias, the Mets (2019 to 2022) are the first team in MLB history to have a scoreless start from their starting pitcher on Opening Day in each of four (or more) consecutive seasons.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: Jeff McNeil celebrates his 30th birthday today...McNeil was the last player to homer on his birthday, doing so on his 29th birthday last year at Citi Field...Overall, 16 players have homered on their birthday in franchise history... Mike Piazza and Jim Hickman are tied for the franchise record, having homered on their birthday twice in their career.

THREE'S COMPANY: Megill tossed 5.0 scoreless innings last night, striking out six and did not surrender a walk...He became the third starting pitcher in franchise history who did not allow a run or walk on Opening Day...He joined Tom Seaver in 1972 (6.0 IP, 5 H, 6 K) and Noah Syndergaard in 2017 (6.0 IP, 5 H, 7 K).

THE KID: Gary Carter was born on this day in 1954...Carter spent five seasons with the Mets and hit .249/.319/.412 with 89 home runs and 349 RBI in 600 games...He was a member of the 1986 World Champion New York Mets and was an 11-time All-Star, including four appearances with the Mets...Carter was inducted in the Mets Hall-of-Fame in 2001 and the Baseball Hall-of-Fame in 2003...Sadly, Carter passed away in 2012 at the age of 57.

WASHINGTON, D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME: The Mets improved to 1-0 against the Nationals this year...The Mets have won nine of their last 12 games dating back to August 10 of last year...Robinson Canó has hit .382 (26-68) with 14 runs, four doubles, three home runs with eight walks and eight RBI in 18 career games at Nationals Park.

MEET THE MAX: Max Scherzer makes his Mets debut tonight in Washington...In December, the Mets signed the three-time Cy Young Award winner and eight-time All-Star to a three-year contract...Scherzer went 15-4 with a 2.46 ERA (49 earned runs/179.1 innings) in 30 starts between the Washington Nationals and Los Angeles Dodgers last year...He struck out 236 and walked 36 while earning his eighth All-Star nod...He led the majors in opponents' batting average (.185) and WHIP (0.864), was second in ERA and walks per 9 IP (1.807), was fourth in strikeouts and pitcher bWAR (6.0), and ranked fifth among pitchers in fWAR (5.4) as well as fifth in wins...The three-time Cy Young Award winner, took home the trophy with Detroit in 2013 and with Washington in 2016 and 2017...He finished third in voting last season and is one of seven pitchers in major league history to finish in the top five of his league's Cy Young voting eight or more times.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to last night's game, the Mets acquired RHP Adonis Medina from the Pittsburgh Pirates in exchange for cash...Medina was optioned to Syracuse (AAA)...In order to make room on the 40-man roster, the Mets designated RHP Yennsy Diaz for assignment...Medina, 25, has appeared in five major league games over the last two years with the Philadelphia Phillies, going 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (five earned runs/11.2 innings).

HE USED TO WORK HERE: Tonight, Scherzer will make his 97th career start at Nationals Park...Only two pitchers have started here more often: Stephen Strasburg (128) and Gio Gonzalez (100)...He has never pitched here as a visitor (all three of his previous appearances against his old club came either in Arizona or Detroit)...During his seven seasons with the Nats, he went 37-26 in D.C. with a 2.99 ERA (208 earned runs/626.2 innings), 830 strikeouts and 145 walks...He ranks second on the ballpark's all-time list in strikeouts and innings pitched, trailing only Stephen Strasburg (914 K, 774.0 IP)...Scherzer has the best K/9 (11.92), WHIP (0.97), K/BB (5.72) and H/9 (6.65) in the ballpark's history (min. 100.0 IP).

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Mets Manager Buck Showalter begins his first season with the team...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with 1,551.

OUR NATIONAL LAST TIME: Scherzer has not faced Washington in nearly a dozen years...He made one appearance against the Nats each season from 2008-2010, appearing in relief his rookie season and starting the latter two games...He went 1-0 with a 5.27 ERA (eight earned runs/13.2 innings) in the three outings...Elias notes that Scherzer's 11 years, 297 days between starts against the Nationals is the fourth-longest gap in Washington/Montreal history...Only Jamie Moyer (13 years, 45 days), Jason Vargas (12 years, 332 days) and Mike Torrez (12 years, 287 days) have gone longer between starts against the Nationals/Expos.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets improved to 1-0 on the road this year...The team finished the 2021 season going 30-51 (.370) with a 4.39 ERA, 224 walks and 686 strikeouts on the road...The team's 30 wins were tied for 23rd in the majors...Outside of 2020, the team's 30 road wins were the fewest for the franchise since they went 29-52 in 2009...Despite this, the Mets' 686 road strikeouts were a franchise record, edging the 2019 Mets by one punchout.

OUCH: The Mets were plunked three times last night...Overall, New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 310 pitches, the most in the majors in that span...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 40 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span, having been hit 55 times by a pitch since 2019.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets improved to 1-0 against the NL East yesterday...Last year, the team went 39-37 against the NL East last season...They posted a 3.58 ERA (255 earned runs/640.1 innings) and hit .243/.314/.400 against the division.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES: The 2022 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster, including: RHP Chris Bassitt (trade), OF Mark Canha (free agent), INF Eduardo Escobar (free agent), OF Travis Jankowski (free agent), OF Starling Marte (free agent), RHP Adam Ottavino (free agent), LHP Joely Rodríguez (trade), RHP Max Scherzer (free agent) and LHP Chasen Shreve (free agent).

HE'S KEITH HERNANDEZ: Earlier this year, the Mets announced that the team will retire Keith Hernandez's uniform #17 prior to the Saturday, July 9 game vs. Miami...Hernandez was elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 1997, ranks second in team history in batting average (.297) and earned six Rawlings Gold Gloves with the Mets, the most in franchise history...Hernandez will become the fourth player to have his number retired by the Mets, joining Tom Seaver (#41), Mike Piazza (#31) and Jerry Koosman (#36). In addition, the Mets have retired #14 for Manager Gil Hodges, #37 for Manager Casey Stengel and #42 across baseball for Jackie Robinson.

SEE YOU SOON, SEAVER: The countdown is on until the unveiling of the Tom Seaver statue...The statue will be unveiled in a special pre-game ceremony to the right of the Home Run Apple in front of Citi Field on Opening Day...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He led the NL in wins three times, ERA three times and strikeouts five times...Seaver was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1992...He spent 12 years with the Mets and went 198-124 with a 2.57 ERA and 2,541 strikeouts and is the Mets' all-time leader in wins, strikeouts, shutouts (44), ERA, complete games (171) and starts (395)...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975, as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

PATRIOTIC PETE: Pete Alonso has reached base safely in each of his last 20 games at Nationals Park...He has hit .395 (30-76) with 14 runs, four doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 17 RBI, eight walks, a steal with a .460 OBP and a .789 SLG in that span that dates to September 2, 2019...This includes a 10-game hitting streak at the ballpark...He is batting .432 (16-37) with seven runs, three doubles, a triple, three home runs, eight RBI, two walks, a .476 OBP and an .811 SLG in the stretch that dates to June 19, 2021...Overall, he is a .381 (37-97) with 16 runs, seven doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 20 RBI and 10 walks in 26 career games in D.C.

MOVING ON UP: Alonso currently ranks 14th in Mets history with 106 career homers...Up next on the Mets all-time HR leaderboard: Jose Reyes (108), Ed Kranepool (118), Edgardo Alfonzo (120).

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

I USED TO WORK HERE: Tonight, Scherzer will make his Mets debut, which will be his 97th career start at Nationals Park...Only two pitchers have started here more often: Stephen Strasburg (128) and Gio Gonzalez (100)...He has never pitched here as a visitor (all three of his previous appearances against his old club came either in Arizona or Detroit)...During his seven seasons with the Nats, he went 37-26 in D.C. with a 2.99 ERA (208 earned runs/626.2 innings), 830 strikeouts and 145 walks...He ranks second on the ballpark's all-time list in strikeouts and innings pitched, trailing only Stephen Strasburg (914 K, 774.0 IP)...Scherzer has the best K/9 (11.92), WHIP (0.97), K/BB (5.72) and H/9 (6.65) in the ballpark's history (min. 100.0 IP).

OUR NATIONAL LAST TIME: Scherzer has not faced Washington in nearly a dozen years...He made one appearance against the Nats each season from 2008-2010, appearing in relief his rookie season and starting the latter two games...He went 1-0 with a 5.27 ERA (eight earned runs/13.2 innings) in the three outings...Elias notes that Scherzer's 11 years, 297 days between starts against the Nationals is the fourth-longest gap in Washington/Montreal history...Only Jamie Moyer (13 years, 45 days), Jason Vargas (12 years, 332 days) and Mike Torrez (12 years, 287 days) have gone longer between starts against the Nationals/Expos.

MAX EFFORT: Scherzer enters this season on an 11-game winning streak...He won his final 11 decisions of the 2021 season beginning June 4, going 11-0 with a 2.54 ERA (31 ER/110.0 IP) in his last 19 starts of the year...His teams have won each of his last 13 regular season starts dating back to July 18, 2021...He won a career-high 13 consecutive decisions to begin the 2013 season (April 6-July 3, 2013), a year that culminated in the first of his three Cy Young Awards.

SPRING TRAINING: Scherzer made two appearances during Grapefruit League play, totaling 11.0 innings with 12 strikeouts...Posted a 2.45 ERA in those two games...Threw 5.0 innings March 21 in Jupiter against Miami and tossed 6.0 innings in relief following Jacob deGrom's 3.0-inning start March 27 vs. St. Louis...Was scheduled to throw in a minor league intrasquad game April 2, but was scratched due to right hamstring tightness.

2021 RECAP: Signed with the Mets on November 30, 2021...Was traded from Washington to the Dodgers on the day of the trade deadline last season...Led the majors in WHIP (career-best 0.86) and opponent batting average (.185)...Had the second-best ERA (career-best 2.46) in the majors and ranked fourth in strikeouts (236)...Notched his ninth career 200-strikeout season...Started the NL Wild Card Game for LA, throwing 4.1 innings of one-run ball in a 3-1 win over St. Louis...Made two appearances in the NLDS against the Giants and recorded the final out of the decisive Game 5 in that series to earn his first career MLB save...Made one start in the NLCS against Atlanta...Finished third in the NL Cy Young vote, his sixth career top-3 finish.

CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD: Scherzer enters the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts with 3,020...He ranks 18th on MLB's all-time strikeout list and is within striking distance (pun intended) of several pitchers above him...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (0-0, 0.00)

LAST OUTING: In his last Spring Training start, Bassitt faced the Miami Marlins on April 3 at Clover Park...Bassitt threw 5.0 innings, giving up four runs, three earned, on six hits...He had six strikeouts and walked two...The right-hander came out of the game with 90 pitches.

2021 RECAP: Bassitt pitched his way into his first All-Star Game and into AL Cy Young contention with a 3.15 ERA (55 earned runs/157.1 innings) in 27 starts, with 159 strikeouts and 39 walks...Threw his first career complete game shutout on May 27, a two-hitter, vs. the Angels...Missed about a month with facial lacerations and a fractured cheekbone after being struck by a line drive on August 17 at Chicago-AL...Returned on September 23 and made his final two starts (6.1 IP, 1 ER).

(September 2, 2019-present) is the longest active streak at this ballpark...Also has a 10-game hitting streak here, going 16-37 (.432/.476/.811) with seven extra-base hits, eight RBI and seven runs scored in that span.
- Ranked third in the NL with 37 home runs last season...Tied for seventh in the league with 67 extra-base hits and was 11th with 291 total bases...He tied for 11th in the NL with 94 RBI, was 13th with a .519 SLG and 15th with an .863 OPS.
- Struck out in 31 percent of his April plate appearances in 2021, then cut his K-rate to 18.2 percent for the rest of the season, leading to a career-best 19.9 K%.
- Ranks 14th in Mets history with 106 career homers...Up next on the Mets all-time HR leaderboard: Jose Reyes (108), Ed Kranepool (118), Edgardo Alfonzo (120).
- Last season, led the NL with 16 home runs off left-handed pitchers...Homered every 10.56 at-bats vs. LHP, first in the NL and fifth in MLB.
- In 11 Spring Training games, Alonso hit .233/.361/.467 (7-30) with four doubles, one home run, four RBI, seven runs scored and six walks.
