TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 5, 2005: Derek Jeter hits his only career regular season "walk-off" HR, breaking a 3-3 tie vs. Boston with a ninth-inning solo shot off Keith Foulke.

April 5, 1977: The Yankees acquire shortstop Bucky Dent from the Chicago White Sox for Oscar Gamble, LaMarr Hoyt, Bob Polinsky and cash.

April 5, 1913: The Yankees lose to the Brooklyn Dodgers, 3-2 in an exhibition game at Ebbets Field, marking the stadium's first contest.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 6, 2014: Derek Jeter ties and passes Paul Molitor (3,319) for eighth on the all-time hits list with singles in the 3rd and 4th innings off Blue Jays starter Drew Hutchison.

April 6, 1974: The Yankees play their first home game at Shea Stadium as Yankee Stadium begins a two-year remodeling effort. They defeat Cleveland, 6-1, en route to a 90-69 (.566) record at Shea over the stretch.

April 6, 1973: At Fenway Park, the Yankees' Ron Blomberg becomes the Major League's first designated hitter. Batting in the top of the first inning, he walks with the bases loaded off Luis Tiant. He goes 1-for-3 with 1 RBI as the Yankees lose to the Red Sox, 15-5.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play the final game of their three-game set vs. Miami today (2-0 thus far)...is part of a six-game homestand, also featuring a three-game series against the Athletics (Tues.-Thurs.)...went 5-1 on their season-opening road trip after sweeping San Francisco in a three-game series and going 2-1 at Seattle.

▶ **The Yankees are a Major League-best 7-1 to start the season, matching their best start through their first eight decisions in franchise history** (started 7-1 in nine previous seasons: 1933, '49, '56, '58, '88, '99, 2002, '03 and '20)...marks just the second time in the last 23 years (since 2004) and the sixth time in the last 68 years (since 1959) the Yankees have started 7-1.

▶ **With a win today**, would match their best start through their first nine decisions in franchise history and mark only the fourth time in franchise history the Yankees went 8-1 in their first nine decisions (started 8-1 in three previous seasons: 1988, 2003 and '20).

▶ **Are in a stretch of playing 13-of-16 games at home** (4/3-19)...are 2-0 so far.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees clinched a series win after overcoming a four-run deficit to defeat the Marlins, 9-7, on Saturday at Yankee Stadium...**LHP Ryan Weathers** (3.2IP, 6H, 3R/ER, 3BB, 4K, OHR) started and did not record a decision...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-3, 1R, 2RBI, 2BB, 1SB) reached base three times and hit a go-ahead two-run single in the eighth inning...**LF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI, 1BB, 1SF) hit his first home run of the season with a two-run shot in the fifth inning and hit a go-ahead sac fly in the sixth inning...**CF Trent Grisham** (1-for-3, 1R, 1RBI, 2BB) reached base three times and hit an RBI single in the sixth inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 2R, 1RBI, 1BB) reached base three times and hit a game-tying RBI single in the sixth inning...**LHP Brent Headrick** (0.2IP, 11BB) earned his first win as a Yankee.

▶ Marked the Yankees' second comeback win of the year and largest come-from-behind win since 7/19/25 at Atlanta (overcame a five-run deficit).

PITCH PERFECT: Despite allowing 7R on Saturday vs. Miami, Yankees pitchers own a 1.77 ERA (71.1IP, 14ER) this year...**the Yankees' 15R allowed this season are their second-fewest in franchise history through their first eight games of a season, trailing only the 1909 Yankees (14R).**

▶ Their 2HR allowed are their fewest in their first eight games of the season in the last 23 years (since 2004)...marks only the second time in the last 45 years (since 1982) the Yankees have allowed 2HR-or-fewer over their first eight games (2HR in 2003).

▶ Rank first in the Majors in opponents' SLG (.261), second in ERA (1.77, first in AL), opponents' OPS (.517, first in AL), HR/9.0IP (0.25, second in AL) and K/BB (4.41, second in AL), third in opponents' OBP (.256, second in AL), BB/9.0IP (2.14, second in AL) and WHIP (0.97, second in AL), and fourth in opponents' BA (.199, second in AL).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have allowed **3R-or-fewer in each of their eight starts this year, posting a 1.47 ERA (43.0IP, 7ER) and 45K...** their 7R allowed this year are their fewest in franchise history through their first eight games of a season...also matches the second-fewest runs by any Major League team's starting rotation through their first eight games of a season since 1893, trailing only the 2022 New York Mets' 6R (the 2018 Boston Red Sox, 2002 San Francisco Giants and 1993 Atlanta Braves also allowed only 7R).

▶ Lead the Majors in ERA (1.47), opponents' SLG (.248) and BB/9.0IP (1.88), rank second in opponents' BA (.176, second in AL), opponents' OPS (.480, second in AL) and WHIP (0.84, second in AL), third in opponents' OBP (.232, third in AL) and HR/9.0IP (0.42, second in AL), and fourth in K/BB (5.00, third in AL).

FAST AND FURIOUS: Yankees baserunners have recorded 125B this season, marking their most through their first eight games of a season in the last 28 years (since 1999) and matching their most through their first eight games in the last 38 years since 1989 (also 125B in 1989 and 1998)...the last time they recorded more was 1988 (135B).

▶ Their 125B are the second-most in the Majors this season, trailing only Milwaukee (17).

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham reached base three times on Saturday vs. Miami, including an RBI single in the sixth inning...has reached base in 9-of-18PA over his last four games since 3/31 (3H, 6BB)...his 8BB this season rank fifth in the AL and tied for seventh in the Majors.

KING OF THE HILL: LHP Tim Hill retired all 3BF on Saturday vs. Miami...has retired 13-of-14BF this year over 4.2 scoreless innings (1H, 3K).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge reached base three times and hit a game-tying RBI single in the sixth inning on Saturday vs. Miami...has reached base in 7-of-10PA over his last two games (4H, 2BB, 1HP).

LAND OF THE FRIED: LHP Max Fried will make his third start of the season in today's series finale...in two starts this season, has gone 2-0 over 13.1 scoreless innings (5H, 2BB, 10K, 2HP)...**is only the seventh pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two appearances of a season**, joining Ray Caldwell (first 3G in 1914), Mel Stottlemyre (first 2G in 1967), Bob Turley (first 2G in 1958), Allie Reynolds (first 2G in 1947), Bob Shawkey (first 2G in 1922) and Slow Joe Doyle (first 2G in 1906)...is the 10th pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two starts of a season (also George Mogridge's first three starts in 1916, Freddy Garcia's first two starts in 2011 and Lew Brockett's first two starts in 1909).

▶ **His season-opening 13.1 scoreless inning streak is tied for the second-longest by a Yankees starter to begin the season in the last 15 years** (since 2012), trailing only Luis Gil's 18.2 scoreless inning streak in 2021 (Nestor Cortes also had a 13.1 scoreless inning streak in 2022).

▶ Has held opponents to a .114/.188/.114 (5-for-44) slash line this year...has not surrendered an XBH.

▶ **Has won a career-high eight straight starts since 8/27/25, posting a 1.34 ERA (53.2IP, 8ER) and 51K over that span...** also owns a career-high-tying nine-game winning streak (since 8/16/25), posting a 2.09 ERA (64.2IP, 15ER) and 64K during that stretch (also had nine-game winning streaks from 9/21/24-5/24/25 and 4/19-7/6/22)...is only the fourth Yankee in the last 11 years (since 2016) to record as long of a winning streak, joining James Paxton (10-game winning streak in 2019), Luis Gil (nine-game winning streak in 2024) and Jameson Taillon (nine-game winning streak in 2022).

▶ **With a win today, would become only the eighth pitcher (11th time) in franchise history to win nine consecutive games...** would join Jack Chesbro (14 games in 1904 and nine games in 1904 and 1906), Ron Guidry (11 games in 1979 and 10 games in 1978), Whitey Ford (11 games in 1961), James Paxton (10 games in 2019), Mike Mussina (nine games from 2002-03), Atley Donald (nine games in 1939) and Herb Pennock (nine games from 1927-28).

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton reached base three times and hit a go-ahead two-run single in the eighth inning on Saturday vs. Miami...stole a base in the seventh inning and later scored on a passed ball...**marked his first regular season stolen base since 8/3/20 vs. Philadelphia** (stole a base in 2024 ALDS Game 3 at Kansas City).

▶ **Has reached base multiple times in six of his seven games this season, batting .393/.433/.571 (11-for-28) with 3R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 6RBI, 2BB and 1SB.**

▶ His 11H mark his most through his first seven games of a season in his career (previous: 10H in 2014).

▶ **Has gone 5-for-10 with 1 double and 5RBI with RISP this year.**

CRUZ CONTROL: RHP Fernando Cruz retired both of his batters faced on Saturday vs. Miami (1K)...has retired 8-of-9BF in four games this year (1BB, 4K).

WALK IT OUT: Yankees batters have walked 21 times over the last two games, their most in a two-game span since recording 21BB from 8/18(G2)-19/06...**have recorded double-digit walks in back-to-back games for only the fifth time in franchise history** (also 2G from 6/13-15(G1)/97, 6/24-26/94, 5/3-4/86 and 4/22-23/70).

SAVE BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger drove in three runs on Saturday vs. Miami, hitting his first home run of the season with a two-run shot in the fifth inning and a go-ahead sac fly in the sixth inning...has reached base in seven of eight games this season, batting .286/.400/.500 (8-for-28) with 7R, 1 double, 1 triple, 1HR, 3RBI, 6BB, 2SB and 1SF.

PEN PAL: LHP Brent Headrick earned his first win as a Yankee on Saturday vs. Miami and first win since 9/2/23 at Texas with Minnesota...has not allowed a run in six appearances this year (5.0IP, 5H, 2BB/1BB, 7K) and owns a career-long 10.0 scoreless inning streak (since 8/3/25)...as a Yankee (since 2025), has not allowed a run in 19-of-23 games, going 1-0 with a 2.57 ERA (28.0IP, 8ER) and 37K.

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice reached base twice on Saturday vs. Miami...has reached base safely in each of his seven games this season, batting .360/.484/.760 (9-for-25) with 8R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 8RBI and 6BB.

▶ Has reached base multiple times in each of his last four games (since 3/31)...has reached base safely in 11-of-18PA over that span, going 6-for-13 with 6R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 6RBI and 5BB.

▶ **His 1.244 OPS ranks third in the AL and sixth in the Majors...** is also tied for third in the Majors in XBH (six, tied for second in AL), tied for fifth in runs scored (eight, tied for third in AL), seventh in SLG (.760, fifth in AL), eighth in OBP (.484, fifth in AL), tied for ninth in RBI (tied for third in AL) and tied for 10th in total bases (19, tied for seventh in AL).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP MAX FRIED (2-0, 0.00 ERA)

LHP Max Fried will make his third start of the season in today's series finale vs. Miami...the 32-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...earned his second win of the season in the Yankees' 5-0 victory on Tuesday at Seattle after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings (3H, 1BB, 6K, 1HP)...in two starts this season, has gone 2-0 over 13.1 scoreless innings (5H, 2BB, 10K, 2HP)...went 19-5 with a 2.86 ERA (195.1IP, 164H, 73R/62ER, 51BB, 189K, 14HR) in 32 starts in his first season with the Yankees in 2025, setting career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts and pickoffs (eight)...over 10 Major League seasons with the Atlanta Braves (2017-24) and Yankees (2025-26), has gone 94-41 with six complete games (four shutouts) and a 3.00 ERA (1,093.0IP, 952H, 405R/364ER, 299BB, 1,062K, 90HR) in 202 career games (185 starts)...among Major League pitchers since 2020 (min. 700.0IP), ranks first in ERA (2.78), wins (75), winning percentage (.714) and pickoffs (26), is tied for first in shutouts (four), second in HR/9.0IP (0.65), opponents' SLG (.328) and opponents' OPS (.608), groundball percentage (53.9%) and groundball/flyball ratio (2.18), sixth in opponents' OBP (.280), tied for sixth in complete games (five) and seventh in WHIP (1.09)...his 92 wins since 2019 are the most in the Majors...the three-time All-Star (2022, '24-25) and four-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020-22, '25) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting three times in his career (second in 2022, fourth in 2025 and fifth in 2020)...the Santa Monica, Calif., native was originally selected by San Diego in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Atlanta along with INF Jace Peterson, OF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on 12/19/14...was signed by the Yankees to an eight-year contract extending through the 2032 season on 12/17/24.

LAST START: Earned his second win of the season in the Yankees' 5-0 victory on Tuesday at Seattle after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings (3H, 1BB, 6K, 1HP)...did not allow a hit to his first 12BF (1BB).

2026: In two starts this season, has gone 2-0 over 13.1 scoreless innings (5H, 2BB, 10K, 2HP)...**is only the seventh pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two appearances of a season**, joining Ray Caldwell (first 3G in 1914), Mel Stottlemyre (first 2G in 1967), Bob Turley (first 2G in 1958), Allie Reynolds (first 2G in 1947), Bob Shawkey (first 2G in 1922) and Slow Joe Doyle (first 2G in 1906)...is the 10th pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two starts of a season (also George Mogridge's first three starts in 1916, Freddy Garcia's first two starts in 2011 and Lew Brockett's first two starts in 1909).

- ✦ Has held opponents to a .114/.188/.114 (5-for-44) slash line this year...has not surrendered an XBH.

ON A ROLL: Has won a career-high eight straight starts since 8/27/25, posting a 1.34 ERA (53.2IP, 8ER) and 51K over that span...also owns a career-high-tying nine-game winning streak (since 8/16/25), posting a 2.09 ERA (64.2IP, 15ER) and 64K during that stretch (also had nine-game winning streaks from 9/21/24-5/24/25 and 4/19-7/6/22)...is only the fourth Yankee in the last 11 years (since 2016) to record as long of a winning streak, joining James Paxton (10-game winning streak in 2019), Luis Gil (nine-game winning streak in 2024) and Jameson Taillon (nine-game winning streak in 2022).

OPENING DAY NOD: Made his fourth career Opening Day start and first as a Yankee in the club's 7-0 win on 3/25 at San Francisco...earned the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 4K, 1HP)...**was the first Yankees Opening Day starter to throw at least 6.1 scoreless innings since David Cone in 1996** (also OR in 7.0IP)...**was only the fifth Yankees starter in the Divisional Era (since 1969) to do so**, joining Cone, Rick Rhoden (SHO in 1988), Ron Guidry (OR in 9.0IP in 1980) and Catfish Hunter (OR in 7.0IP in 1977).

- ✦ **Was only the fourth pitcher in franchise history to toss more than 6.0 scoreless innings and allow 2H-or-fewer on Opening Day**, joining David Cone (2H and 0R in 7.0IP in 1996), Ron Guidry (2H and 0R in 9.0IP in 1980) and Mel Stottlemyre (2H in SHO in 1967).
- ✦ Retired his final 8BF, 15 of his last 16BF and 18 of his final 20BF.
- ✦ Was the 61st different pitcher to start on Opening Day for the Yankees and the 19th left-handed pitcher...along with Nestor Cortes in 2024 and Carlos Rodón in 2025, it marked the first time the Yankees have had three different left-handed pitchers start three straight Opening Days.

VS. MIAMI: Has made 16 career starts vs. the Marlins, going 6-4 with a 4.23 ERA (83.0IP, 39ER)...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 13 of his 16 starts against Miami...his team has gone 12-4 in his 16 starts against Miami.

- ✦ **Over his last nine starts vs. Miami (since 6/12/21), has gone 6-2 with a 2.91 ERA (52.2IP, 17ER).**
- ✦ **Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of his last six starts against Miami (since 2022), going 5-1 with a 2.02 ERA (35.2IP, 8ER) over that stretch.**
- ✦ Has not faced the Marlins since 9/21/24 at Miami (6.0IP, 5H, 2R/1ER, 1BB, 6K, 0HR).

IN PINSTRIPES: As a Yankee, has gone 21-5 with a 2.67 ERA (208.2IP, 62ER) and 199K in 34 starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 24 of his 34 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 17 of those starts...his 24 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the seventh-most in the Majors since 2025...his 17 starts of 1ER-or-fewer are tied for the fifth-most in the AL and tied for the 10th-most in the Majors.

- ✦ Since 2025, leads the Majors in wins (21) and winning percentage (.808), ranks second in pickoffs (eight, first in AL), sixth in HR/9.0IP ratio (0.60, second in AL), seventh in ERA (2.67, fourth in AL) and opponents' SLG (.321, fourth in AL), tied for seventh in starts (34, tied for third in AL), eighth in groundball/flyball ratio (1.94, third in AL) and groundball percentage (52.2%, third in AL), and ninth in opponents' OPS (.597, fifth in AL)...also ranks eighth in the AL in opponents' OBP (.276) and ninth in WHIP (1.06).
- ✦ The Yankees are 24-10 in Fried's starts...his 24 team wins are tied for the most in the AL and tied with Boston's Garrett Crochet (24-10) for the second-most in the Majors since 2025, trailing only Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (25-9).
- ✦ Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 23 of his 34 starts, tied for the fifth-most in the AL and tied for the seventh-most in the Majors...has tossed at least 7.0 innings in 14 of his starts, tied with Detroit's Tarik Skubal and Boston's Garrett Crochet for the most in the Majors.
- ✦ Has left only five of his 34 starts trailing.
- ✦ As a Yankee, has made 17 starts after a Yankees loss and has gone 12-1 with a 1.71 ERA (110.2IP, 21ER) in those starts...has tossed at least 6.0IP in 15 of those starts and has not allowed an ER in eight of them...the Yankees have gone 13-4 when Fried starts after a loss.
- ✦ Has allowed only 14HR to 849BF, posting a 0.60 HR/9.0IP ratio.
- ✦ Has allowed 2BB-or-fewer in 29 of his 34 starts and 3BB-or-fewer in each of his 34 starts.
