Old-Timers' Game

Martín Pérez, 35, starts tonight for Atlanta and enters play with a 2.96 ERA, while rotation-mate Chris Sale, 37, has compiled a 2.16 ERA through 22 starts this season.

In modern MLB history (since 1900), only nine teams have finished a season with two starters aged 35-or-older who each pitched to an ERA under 2.97 over at least 19 turns.

The 2002 Braves was the last team to do so, when Hall of Famers Greg Maddux (2.62 ERA) and Tom Glavine (2.96) posted the requisite numbers across 70 combined starts.

Sale and Pérez rank second and ninth in ERA, respectively, among NL pitchers with at least 19 starts this season.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Twins tonight open a three-game mid-week series in what are the only scheduled matchups between the clubs this season...The clubs last saw each for three games at Truist Park in Atlanta in April of 2025.

 The Braves have never lost a series here at Target Field, going 9-2 (.818) here all time since the park opened in 2010...Atlanta swept three games here in its last visit in 2024.

 Atlanta and Minnesota have played just 28 total games since the advent of interleague play in 1997, with the Braves going 20-8 (.714) all-time against the Twins...The two franchises squared off in the 1991 World Series, with Minnesota claiming the title in seven games.

 RH Bailey Ober has made just one career start against Atlanta, facing the Braves here at Target Field on August 26, 2024...The 6-foot-9, 260-pound North Carolina native allowed a career-most nine runs over just 2.0 innings in that start to take the loss...The right-hander has completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last three turns.

MARTÍN PÉREZ: Goes for the 100th win of his major league career tonight, and enters play with an even 99-99 career ledger over 348 games, 298 starts...He earned his 99th win in his last outing, last Tuesday vs. the Mets, with 6.0 scoreless innings.

 He is the only starting pitcher in baseball yet to allow a run in August (min. 3 starts), tossing 16.0 total scoreless frames in the month...Atlanta has won each of his three turns this month by a combined score of 23-6.

 The 6-foot-0, 210-pound left-hander has made nine career starts and 14 total appearances against Minnesota, and has pitched to a 1-4 record with a 4.88 ERA (32 ER/59.0 IP) all-time against the club...His lone win came in his most recent appearance, March 31 of last season while with the White Sox, when he fanned nine over 6.0 scoreless innings.

ELEVEN STRAIGHT: The Braves have swept three-game series against the Twins in each of the last three seasons, and Atlanta has won 11 straight games over Minnesota in total...The winning run dates to a 12-7 victory on August 6, 2019.

 The 11-game win streak over Minnesota is Atlanta's longest in history against the franchise, after previously winning seven straight from 2010 to 2016...It is the longest active winning streak in baseball against Minnesota.

 Per Elias, since moving to Atlanta in 1966, the Braves have won at least 11 straight games against a single opponent nine times, most recently with an 11-game winning streak over Oakland that spanned from 2008-2022.

 Atlanta's all-time record for consecutive wins over a single opponent is 16, done against Colorado from 1993-1994.

TWIN CONNECTIONS: Four of Atlanta's 10 assistant coaches return to Minnesota this week after spending time on staff with the Twins earlier in their careers... Tonight's starter Martín Pérez also made 32 appearances and 29 starts for Minnesota in 2019, his lone season with the club, while tomorrow's starter Tyler Mahle made nine starts for the Twins across 2022 and 2023.

 Tommy Watkins returns to Minneapolis this season after 28 years in the Twins organization...He was selected by Minnesota in the 38th round of the 1998 draft and spent his entire professional career in the organization prior to joining Atlanta this offseason...Following his playing career he coached nine seasons in Minnesota's minor leagues, before spending seven seasons (2019-2025) as a base coach on the major league staff.

 Tony Diaz spent six seasons on staff with the Twins, from 2019-24, as third-base coach (2019-21) and assistant bench coach ('22-24).

 Jeremy Hefner was Minnesota's assistant pitching coach in 2019 after serving as the Twins' advance scout in 2017-18.

 J.P. Martinez worked for six seasons as a minor league coach in Minnesota's system, from 2015-2020, before his first major league appointment with the Giants in 2021.

OLSON WHEN IT'S CLOSE: Matt Olson drove a 3-0 pitch in yesterday's seventh inning out to dead center for a three-run homer...The drive broke a 2-2 tie and gave Atlanta a lead it would not relinquish.

 Olson has hit 21 of his 36 home runs this season when the score is within one run in either direction, the most such homers in the majors...**Eight of these 21 have come in the seventh inning or later, three more homers than any other player in baseball.**

 Olson has 15 total RBI from the seventh inning on and the score within one run, also tops in the league.

RONALD NEARING HISTORY: Ronald Acuña Jr. drove a 2-2 changeup in Saturday night's first inning out to center field for his 13th home run of the season...The drive was also the 199th home run of his career.

 Acuña Jr.'s next home run will stand as the 200th of his career, and he is looking to become the fastest player in major league history, by games played, to reach at least 200 home runs and 200 stolen bases.

 Alfonso Soriano holds the current record, swiping a pair of bases in his 929th career game to reach 203 home runs and 201 stolen bases...Acuña Jr. currently has 220 stolen bases to go with his 199 home runs... Tonight's game will be the 890th of his career.

 Just two Braves in history have reached 200 career homers prior to playing their 890th game...Bob Horner hit his 200th in his 882nd game in 1986, while Eddie Mathews needed just 779 games to reach the mark in 1957.

Makes his 20th start of the season and the 299th of his career in the opener of a series at Minnesota...Atlanta is 11-8 in his 19 turns this year.
- 🔥

Will make his 10th career start and 15th appearance against the Twins, and is 1-4 with a 4.88 ERA (32 ER/59.0 IP) against the club...his lone win came last season.
- 🔥

In his most recent turn against the Twins, March 31, 2025, he tossed 6.0 no-hit innings with nine strikeouts and three walks in a 9-0 Texas win on Opening Day.
- 🔥

Is 99-99 in his career, one victory shy of the 100-win milestone...a win would make him the fourth left-handed pitcher born in Venezuela to reach 100 (joining Johan Santana, Eduardo Rodríguez and Wilson Álvarez) and the 10th Venezuela-born pitcher overall.
- 🔥

The 6-foot-0, 210-pound Venezuelan enters 8-6 with a 2.96 ERA (35 ER/106.1 IP) over 23 appearances, with 80 strikeouts against 43 walks.
- 🔥

Carries an 18.0-inning scoreless streak into the outing, spanning his last three starts, the third longest active streak in the majors...has not allowed an earned run since the third inning of his July 27 start at New York (NL).
- 🔥

His 2.96 ERA over his first 23 appearances this season is the second-lowest such span to begin a season in his career, trailing only a 2.79 mark over 23 games to open 2022 with Texas.
- 🔥

Since the All-Star break, Pérez is 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (3 ER/25.0 IP) over five starts, the second-lowest ERA in the majors in that span among pitchers with at least five starts...only Arizona's Brandon Pfaadt (0.92) has been lower.
- 🔥

He and rotation mate Chris Sale each own an ERA of 2.97-or-lower while being 35-or-older...In modern baseball history (since 1900), only nine teams have finished a season with multiple such starters (min. 19 starts each)...The 2002 iteration of these Braves was the last to do so, when Greg Maddux (2.62 ERA) and Tom Glavine (2.96) did it across 70 combined starts.
- 🔥

Opponents are batting .208 (79-for-380) against him this season...right-handers are hitting .196 (52-for-265) with seven homers and left-handers .235 (27-for-115) with four.
- 🔥

His 48.5 percent ground-ball rate is the fourth-highest among National League left-handers with at least 15 starts...opponents are hitting .161 (23-for-143) on ground balls against him.
- 🔥

Is 3-2 with a 4.30 ERA (21 ER/44.0 IP) in nine road appearances (eight starts) and 5-4 with a 2.02 mark (14 ER/62.1 IP) in 14 outings at Truist Park...opponents are batting .253 (42-for-166) away from Atlanta and .173 (37-for-214) at home.
- 🔥

Has worked to a 2.27 ERA (19 ER/75.1 IP) in 17 night outings and a 4.65 ERA (16 ER/31.0 IP) in six daytime turns.
- 🔥

Batters are hitting .152 (21-for-138) against his changeup with 34 strikeouts, more than he has recorded with any other pitch...they have hit .234 (30-for-128) against his sinker and .237 (19-for-80) against his cutter.

2026

- 🔥

Recorded a quality start August 11 against New York (NL), tossing 6.0 scoreless innings on four hits with three walks and two strikeouts in a 4-0 win at Truist Park...it was his third quality start of the season.
- 🔥

Allowed just one hit over consecutive starts August 1 and 6, a span of 10.0 innings... became the third Braves starter in modern baseball history to allow one hit across two starts spanning at least 10.0 innings, joining Kent Mercker (11.0 IP, September 4-9, 1993) and Jim Tobin (18.0 IP, April 23-27, 1944)...the last major league pitcher to do so was Tampa Bay's Ryan Pepiot, August 30-September 4, 2025.
- 🔥

Earned the win August 1 against Washington, allowing one hit over 7.0 shutout innings with six strikeouts in an 8-3 victory...retired the first 20 batters he faced and did not allow a hit over his first 6.2 innings, the longest no-hit bid of his career and the longest by a Brave since AJ Smith-Shawver's 7.0 no-hit innings May 5, 2025 against Cincinnati.
- 🔥

Was placed on the 15-day injured list July 6 with a left forearm contusion and reinstated July 22...returned with 4.0 scoreless innings against San Diego.
- 🔥

Logged the first 10-strikeout game of his career May 19 at Miami, in his 285th career start - the second-most starts before a first career 10-or-more strikeout game among pitchers to debut since 1893, trailing only Doyle Alexander (321st start)...at 35 years, 45 days, he was the first pitcher aged 35-or-older to record a first career 10-strikeout game since Colin Rea on September 18, 2025 (per Elias).
- 🔥

Allowed five hits or fewer in 20 consecutive starts from March 31, 2025 to June 13, 2026, the second-longest such streak by a left-handed starting pitcher since 1901, trailing only Tony Cingrani's 22-game run from 2013-14...the streak ended June 19 against Milwaukee.
- 🔥

Earned his first win as a Brave on April 17 at Philadelphia, holding the Phillies to four hits over 6.0 scoreless innings in a 9-0 win at Citizens Bank Park.

In his 15th major league season, Pérez has pitched for seven clubs: Texas (2012-18), Minnesota (2019), Boston (2020-21), Texas (2022-23), Pittsburgh (2024), San Diego (2024), Chicago (AL) (2025) and Atlanta (2026).
