BACK IN BLACK: The Mets are encouraging fans to wear black this Friday, July 30 when the Mets host the Cincinnati Reds at 7:10 p.m....The Mets will wear their black Nike jerseys that night and all Friday nights at Citi Field for the remainder of the 2021 regular season....In celebration of the return, the first 12,000 fans in attendance July 30 will receive a Black Francisco Lindor Mets T-Shirt presented by New Balance...Tickets are on sale now at Mets.com/Tickets.

METS HALL OF FAME: LHP Jon Matlack, RHP Ron Darling and infielder Edgardo Alfonzo will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, July 31 in an on-field ceremony at Citi Field that begins at 6:45 p.m....The three new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 30...Al Jackson will be posthumously honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for contributions to the organization...This group was scheduled to be celebrated in 2020, but due to the pandemic, the ceremony was moved to this year. Tickets for Saturday are on sale at Mets.com/Tickets.

METSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves yesterday, 12-5...The team has won six of its last 10 games...The Mets continue a 10-day, 11-game homestand (3-3) against the Blue Jays (2-1), Braves (1-2) and Reds (three games)...Following this homestand, the Mets head to Miami for four games and Philadelphia for three.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Tonight's starter Tylor Megill is celebrating his 26th birthday today...He becomes the first Mets pitcher to make a start on his birthday since Steven Matz did so on May 29, 2018 in Atlanta...He is the first Mets player ever with a July 28 birthday.

TYLOR THE CREATOR: Megill has tossed 6.0 shutout innings in back-to-back starts and extended his scoreless streak to 12.2 innings...He is the first Mets rookie to have back-to-back scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings since Steven Matz did so on April 29 and May 4, 2016...Courtesy of Elias...The Mets are 5-1 in games which Megill has started...He owns a 2.10 ERA (seven earned runs/30.0 innings) this year with 10 walks and 33 strikeouts...He is set to make his fifth start at Citi Field tonight, where he has posted a 1.89 ERA (four earned runs/19.0 innings) with eight walks and 23 strikeouts...The Mets are 4-0 at home when he starts.

STRIKE THAT: Megill has 33 punchouts in 30.0 innings through his first six major league starts...That is the seventh-most strikeouts by a Mets pitcher in the first six starts of their career...Dwight Gooden owns the team record for strikeouts through the first seven career games with the club at 51 in 38.2 innings in 1984.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: New York is 20-20 against the NL East this season, posting a 3.54 (132 earned runs/335.1 innings) ERA in those games...The Mets are batting .232/.307/.367 in 40 games against the division this season...The Mets are 12-8 against the division at home with a 2.47 ERA (46 earned runs/167.0 innings) with 59 walks and 189 strikeouts.

IT'S BEEN TWO WEEKS: Jeff McNeil is on a career-high 14-game hitting streak, batting .373 (19-51) with eight runs, two doubles, two home runs, 12 RBI, five walks and an 1.007 OPS in that span...It surpasses his previous best 11-game hitting streak, which he accomplished from August 16-26, 2018...He has safely reached base in each of his last 15 games, putting up a .439 OBP in that span...He is batting .348 (23-66) with 11 runs, four doubles, two home run, 12 RBI and seven walks with a .919 OPS in 20 games this month.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil recorded his 100th multi-hit game last night...He is the 56th player in franchise history to record at least 100 multi-hit games with the Mets...He recorded his 100th multi-hit game in his 310th career game...David Wright owns the franchise record with 495 multi-hit games...Jose Reyes is the fastest Met to 100 multi-hit games, reaching the mark in career game No. 308...McNeil became the 10th player to debut since 2010 with at least 100 multi-hit games within his first 310 games played...Mookie Betts, Mike Trout, Starlin Castro, Francisco Lindor, Corey Seager, Manny Machado, Buster Posey, Whit Merrifield and Yasiel Puig are the nine others.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets own a 49-66 record against the Braves since Citi Field opened in 2009.

WHAT A RELIEF: The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.17 ERA (12 earned runs/49.2 innings) with 12 walks and 58 strikeouts over their last 10 games...Overall, the Mets bullpen owns a 4.01 ERA (159 earned runs/356.2 innings) with 149 walks and 397 punchouts...That is 13th in the majors and seventh in the NL.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso is batting .327 (16-49) with eight runs, two doubles, five home runs, 11 RBI, five walks, a .389 OBP and a .673 SLG in 12 games after the All-Star break...He is batting .275/.337/.545 with 24 runs, six doubles, 15 home runs, 37 RBI, 15 walks and an .882 OPS in 52 games since the start of June.

PONY EXPRESS: Alonso has 91 home runs through 307 career games...Despite Alonso's second year in the majors being last year's 60-game season, he currently ranks tied for 15th all-time in home runs through his third career season...He is now tied for the 12th-most home runs through three big league seasons with Jose Abreu, Bob Horner and Ted Williams...Only seven players have hit 100+ homers through their first three major league seasons...Only 14 players in franchise history have hit 100 or more home runs with the Mets...He leads the major leagues in home runs since he entered the league in 2019.

MOVIN' ON UP: Michael Conforto has hit 124 home runs and is now tied with Todd Hundley for eighth on the team's all-time home run list...Lucas Duda is seventh with 125...Pete Alonso is now 20th on the Mets all-time home run list with 91 blasts...Cleon Jones is next with 93 home runs.

HOMER BOUND: The Mets have homered in 12 of their last 16 games, hitting 29 home runs in that span...The team's 29 home runs since July 9 are the second-most in the majors...Only the Dodgers (30) have hit more...By comparison, the Mets hit 13 home runs in their previous 16 games.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since Saturday, May 8, a streak of 81 days...This is their longest run atop the East in the last 14 seasons...The 2007 Mets (135 days in a row) were the last iteration of the club to be in first longer than 81 days in a row, per Elias...The team has been in first place for 97 days overall this season, the most of any team in 2021.

JULY! JULY! JULY! As a team, New York is batting .267/.347/.453 with an .800 OPS in 23 games this month...This is their highest batting average, OBP and SLG in any month this season...The team leads the majors OBP and OPS, is fourth in batting average and fifth in SLG...The Mets hit .222/.297/.379 in 30 games in June...The team has hit 35 home runs this month, tied for the second-most in the majors and their highest total of any month this year...New York is 12-11 this month.

IN A PINCH: The Mets pinch-hitters are batting .264/.338/.479 with 12 doubles, six home runs, 32 RBI and 13 walks...Their .264 batting average is the fourth-best in the majors and is the best in the NL...Their .816 pinch-hit OPS is also the best in the NL...The team's six pinch-hit home runs is tied for the fourth most in the majors.

ACT II: The Mets are batting .276/.353/.485 with 57 runs, 21 doubles and 21 home runs since the break...The team's 21 home runs after the All-Star break are the most in the major leagues, while their .838 OPS is the third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...The team's .353 OBP is fourth in the majors in that span and their .276 batting average is second-best...The Mets hit .231/.310/.373 in the first half.

36 DAYS OF NO. 36: There are 31 days until the Mets retire Jerry Koosman's number 36 in a pregame ceremony on August 28...In honor of the event, the team is on a 36-day countdown noting the most memorable moments of his historic career...On this day in 1978, the Mets fell to the Astros, 4-3, in 10-innings in Astrodome...Kooz started the game allowed three runs on nine hits, while striking out six in 8.2 innings...The Mets were up 3-0 heading into the ninth, but Houston scored thrice in the ninth and again in the 10th to earn the win...Kooz was one out away from getting the complete game victory before the Astros tied it up...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

PRO-NUN-SEE-AY-SHUN: Tylor's first name is pronounced TIE-lore.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!!: Megill is celebrating his 26th birthday today...He is the first Mets player ever with a July 28 birthday...He will become the 11th Met in history to start a game on his birthday...Steven Matz was the last Met to start on his birthday (3.0 scoreless IP at Atlanta on May 29, 2018)...The last Met to earn a win on his birthday was Justin Wilson (August 18, 2020)...10 Mets pitchers have won a game on their birthday...Ron Darling is the only Met with multiple birthday Ws.

LAST TIME OUT: Megill made his first interleague start of his career vs. the Blue Jays on July 23...For the second consecutive start he went 6.0 scoreless innings...Allowed two hits and a walk with five strikeouts...He is the first Mets rookie to have back-to-back scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings since Steven Matz, did so on April 29 and May 4, 2016...He also recorded his first career big league base hit.

VS ATLANTA: Tonight, Megill will make his third career start against the Braves...In both of his previous starts against the club, the only runs he allowed have come on home runs...In each outing, he kept the Braves off the board until allowing a fifth-inning home run...Megill currently owns a 4.82 ERA when facing the Braves.

HOT LIKE THE JULY SUN: Megill's 0.87 ERA in July is the second-best in the major leagues (min. 20 IP) behind only the Cardinals' Kwang Hyun Kim (0.72)...Only three pitchers have an ERA this month south of 1.00 with a minimum of 20.0 innings pitched (Corbin Burnes, 0.99, is the other).

IT'S ALL ABOUT MEGILL: Megill is the first Mets starter to strike out at least 30 batters and own ERA of 2.10 or lower through his first six career starts...He joined Nolan Ryan as the only Mets pitchers with two scoreless starts within their first six career games in franchise history...Has allowed one or no runs in four of his first six career starts, tied with Jim McAndrew for the most such outings through six starts in Mets history.

ALLOW TO ME TO INTRODUCE MYSELF: Through Megill's, first six career starts his 2.10 ERA (7 ER/30.0 IP), is ranked fourth-best ERA in Mets history through four career starts, topped only by Terry Leach (1.73), Nolan Ryan (1.98) and Dillon Gee (2.09)...Megill joins Steven Matz and Noah Syndergaard as the only three Mets pitchers who have struck out 30+ batters while allowing no more than 10 walks in their first six career starts.

CHA CHA SLIDE: Megill uses his slider 21.1 percent of the time...The pitch has generated a .133 BAA, with batters totaling just four hits (4-30) with nine strikeouts on at-bat ending with that pitch...His foes have a 29.8% whiff percentage on the slider.

2021: Megill made eight starts between Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) this season...He is 2-1 with a 3.35 ERA (15 earned runs/40.1 innings) and has walked 12 and struck out 59...He is averaging 13.16 strikeouts per 9.0 innings and is walking just 2.68 per 9.0 IP in the minors.

MINOR LEAGUE REVIEW: Megill has pitched in three seasons in the Mets organization...In his first professional season, he appeared in 10 games (two starts) for Brooklyn (A), going 1-2 with a 3.21 ERA...In 2019, he began the year with Columbia (A), making 14 appearances (three starts) before being promoted to St. Lucie (A), where he started seven times...He was then promoted to Binghamton (AA) for his final outing of the year...All told, in 2019, the right-hander went 6-7 with a 3.52 ERA in 22 games (11 starts)...Megill did not pitch in 2020 as the MiLB season was canceled...He started this season at Binghamton, making five starts there (2-1, 3.12 ERA) before earning a promotion to Triple-A Syracuse...In his minor league career, he is 9-10 with a 3.41 ERA and has 51 walks and 187 strikeouts in 140.0 innings.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER (7-4, 3.43 ERA)

LAST TIME OUT: Took the ball on July 24 at Citi Field against Toronto, his former club...He allowed six runs on eight hits with two walks in 4.0 innings...It was his second straight start allowing six runs.

VS ATLANTA: Walker has had success when tossing against this NL East rival. Owns a career ERA of 1.35 (3 ER/20.0 IP) in four career starts with 20 punchouts. When facing the Braves home, he is 1-0 with an ERA of just 0.82 (1 ER/9.0 IP).
