METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action yesterday and defeated the Phillies, 6-2...The Mets defeated the Brewers, two-games-to-one in the National League Wild Card Series...The Mets will host a workout day on Monday at Citi Field before the series resumes on Tuesday, October 8.

HELLO, JERRY: Jerry Grote was born on this day in 1942...On April 7, the Mets Hall of Fame catcher Jerry Grote passed away at the Texas Cardiac Arrhythmia Institute in Austin, TX...He was 81...The backstop played 12 seasons in Flushing, batting .256/.321/.329 with 35 home runs and 357 RBI...Considered the best defensive catcher in team history, Grote was twice named an All-Star in 1968 and again in 1974...The Mets worn the no. 15 patch this year in his honor.

TO THE POST: The Mets are 55-41 all-time in Postseason play...The club's .573 winning percentage is the third-best in major league history...Only the Marlins (24-16, .600) and the Yankees (245-178, .579) have a better winning percentage...The Mets own the third-best ERA in Postseason history with 3.21 ERA...Only the Orioles/Browns (2.80) and Athletics (3.14) have a lower ERA.

DIVISION BELL: The Mets will play in the Division Series for the first time since 2015...Overall, it's their ninth appearance in the series...The Mets are 13-4 all-time in the series...Their .765 winning percentage in the series is the best in the majors.

JUST THE TWO OF US: The Mets are 10-9 in the second game of a Postseason Series.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are facing the Phillies in the Postseason for the first time in franchise history...The Mets are 3-4 against the NL East in the Postseason...The last time the Mets faced off against a divisional opponent was in 1999, when they faced the Atlanta Braves in the NLCS.

HAPPY TRAILS: According to Sarah Langs, the Mets entered this year 6-27 when trailing entering the eighth inning in franchise history in the postseason...After the Game 1 win in the NLDS, they are now 2-0 in such games this Postseason...The only teams with more such wins in a single Postseason are the 1996 Yankees (5 wins), the 1980 Phillies (4 wins), the 2015 Royals (3 wins) and the 1986 Mets (3 wins).

BACK-TO-BACK: According to Elias, the Mets are the eighth team to win back-to-back Postseason games when trailing in the eighth inning or later in each, joining: the 2015 Royals, 2004 Red Sox, 2001 Yankees, 1999 Mets, 1996 Yankees, 1992 Blue Jays and the 1980 Phillies.

HIGH FIVE: The Mets have scored five or more runs in an inning twice this Postseason (also in Game 1 of the Wild Card Series)...It's the first time they've done so multiple times in a single Postseason in franchise history...Courtesy of Brent Maguire at MLB.com

NOTHING EXTRA: The Mets scored six runs without recording an extra-base hit in their Game 1 win against the Phillie...It marks the second time in franchise history that the team scored six runs without an extra-base hit in a Postseason game...The only other coinurance was Game 6 of the 1986 World Series...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: In game three of the NL Wild Card Series, Pete Alonso hit the 10th go-ahead homer in the ninth inning or later in a winner-take-all game in Postseason history...It was the first ever with a team trailing.

SAVE THE CHEERLEADER, SAVE THE WORLD: There have been 12 players in franchise history to record a save in the Postseason...Jeurys Familia owns the franchise record with five Postseason saves...Armando Benitez, Tug McGraw and Billy Wagner are tied for second with three saves each...Edwin Diaz has appeared in three Postseason games...He is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER/4.1 IP) with three walks and five strikeouts in Postseason play.

ROAD TO RICHES: The Mets are 24-22 on the road in the Postseason...This includes a 3-1 record this season...On Tuesday, the Mets earned their first road victory in the Postseason since an 8-3 victory over the Cubs on October 21, 205 in Game 4 of the NLCS.

ADDICTED TO THE PLAYOFFS: J.D. Martinez has appeared in 36 Postseason games, batting .296 (37-125) with 15 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 34 RBI, 19 walks, a .388 OBP and a .576 SLG.

TO RYNE OWNSELF BE TRUE: Ryne Stanek has appeared in 26 Postseason games...He is 3-0 with a 2.74 ERA (7 ER/23.0 IP) with seven walks and 23 strikeouts in the playoffs.

WILD OUT: The Mets previously made the Postseason as the Wild Card team in 1999, 2000, 2016 and in 2022...In 1999, New York defeated the Diamondbacks, 3-1, in National League Division Series and fell to the Atlanta Braves 4-2, in the League Championship Series...The 2000 Mets defeated the Giants, 3-1 in the NLDS and the Cardinals, 4-1 in the NLCS...The team fell to the Yankees 4-1 in the World Series...The 2016 Mets fell to the Giants, 1-0, in the one-game Wild Card Game...The Mets lost a best-of-three-game series to the San Diego Padres, dropping two games to one in 2022 at Citi Field.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The Mets are in the Postseason for the first time since 2022 and for the 11th time in franchise history...This marks the fifth Wild Card berth in team history...Also in 1999, 2000, 2016 and 2022.

POSTING UP: Pete Alonso appeared in all 162 Mets games this year...Outside of 2020, he became the second Mets player to appear in every single game, joining Félix Millán (1975)...John Olerud appeared in 162 of 163 games during the 1999...This year marked the third time in his career he has appeared in 160 or more games (also, 2019 & 2022).

ON THE RECORD: New York won 20 of their last 29 on the regular season...The Mets finished the year going 89-73...In 2023, the team finished at 75-87...The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets went 65-38...Following a loss on May 29, the Mets played 107 games, going 67-40 in that span...Their .626 winning percentage was the best in the majors in that span...They outscored their opponents 541-433 during those 107 games.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets finished the season going 43-38 away from Citi Field in 2024...The Mets surpassed their road win total of 2023 (32-49)...The Mets hit .254/.316/.416 on the road this year...They ranked seventh in the majors in AVG and SLG and were 10th in OBP.

DANCING IN SEPTEMBER: The Mets went 17-9 in September...Their .654 winning percentage was third in the majors and the second-best in the National League...Their 3.21 ERA in the month was the third-best in the National League.

OMG: Jose Iglesias recorded a hit in both games of the team's doubleheader on the final game of the season...He ended the year with a 22-game hitting streak...It is the longest hitting streak of his career and it is the longest streak by a Mets player this year...His previous high was an 18-game streak from May 27-June 18, 2013 with the Red Sox...The last time a Mets player had a longer streak was Wilson Ramos, when he recorded a 26-game hitting streak from August 3-September 3, 2019...Iglesias batted .395 (34-86) over that span with 14 runs, four doubles, one home run, four RBI, one walk, two steals, a .429 OBP and a .477 SLG.

A LEADING MAN: Francisco Lindor hit 26 home runs when batting first this season...That tied a record for the most in franchise history...He joined Curtis Granderson (26 HR/140 Games, 2015) as the franchise leader...In 109 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Lindor batted .303/.374/.552 with 82 runs, 31 doubles, one triple, 26 home runs, 71 RBI, 42 walks, 23 steals with a .926 OPS...The Mets went 64-43 when Lindor bated first this season.

30-FOR-30: Lindor recorded his second 30 home run/30 double season as a Met and the fifth of his career...Only six players in Mets history have recorded multiple seasons with 30 home runs and 30 doubles - Lindor (2023-24), Pete Alonso (2024 & 2019), David Wright (2007-08), Carlos Beltrán (2006-07), Carlos Delgado (2006 and 2008) and Howard Johnson (1989 and 1991).

FWAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Francisco Lindor finished the season with a 7.6 fWAR...That was the sixth-best mark in the majors and the second-best mark in the National League...Only Shohei Ohtani (9.1 fWAR) had a higher mark...Lindor's 17.4 defensive fWAR was third in the majors.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets stole 106 bases out of 128 attempts this year, giving them a 82.8% success rate...It is the second-highest in franchise history...Last year, the team was successful in 88.7% (118-133) of stolen base attempts, the highest in team history...Brandon Nimmo was not caught in 15 stolen base attempts this year...His 15 steals were a career-best...Francisco Lindor stole 29 bases this year...That is two shy from his career-best 31, accomplished last year.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo hit .241/344/419 with 44 runs, 14 doubles, one triple, 12 home runs, 39 RBI and 39 walks in 74 road games...This compared to a .207/.310/.379 slashline with 11 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs and 38 walks in 75 games at home in 2024...Overall, Nimmo hit 23 home runs this year, one short of his career-best 24 he accomplished last season...His 90 RBI were a career-best...He recorded 77 walks this year...That's three short of his career-best 80 he recorded in 2018.

THE PENIS MIGHTIER: From the All-Star break until the end of the season, the Mets bullpen has posted a 3.74 ERA, the sixth-lowest mark in the National League in that span...Overall, the Mets relief staff have struck out 648 batters this season, which was fifth in the majors and third in the NL...Their 648 strikeouts were second-most in franchise history...The team recorded 571 punchouts in 2023...The 2021 team recorded the franchise record with 658 punchouts from the bullpen.

YOUNG HEARTS RUN FREE: Mark Vientos hit 27 home runs this year...He joined Darryl Strawberry (1983-1986), David Wright (2005-2007), Michael Conforto (2017), Pete Alonso (2019) and Francisco Alvarez (2023) as the only players in franchise history age 24 or younger to have 25 or more home runs in a season...He joined Wright (2005-2008, 2010), Howard Johnson (1987, 1989, 1991) and Robin Ventura (1999) as the only third baseman in franchise history with 25 or more home runs in a season (min. 50% games at 3B each season).

ED, EDD & EDDY: In 15 games since August 29, Edwin Díaz has converted six save opportunities, posting a 1.69 ERA (3 ER/16.0 IP) with five walks and 30 strikeouts...He posted a 3.00 ERA (9 ER/27.0 IP)- with 10 walks and 47 strikeouts in 27 games following the All-Star break...He was 3-1 with 10 saves, a 4.05 ERA (12 ER/26.2 IP) with 10 walks and 37 strikeouts in 27 games prior to the break...This year marks his fourth year in which he converted at least 20 saves for the Mets...Only John Franco (seven) and Armando Benítez (five) had more as a Met...His 224 saves since his debut in 2016 are the second-most...Only Kenley Jansen (305) has more.

POSTSEASON: Has appeared in 12 career Postseason games, including 11 starts...Is 2-4 with a 5.07 ERA (28 ER/49.2 IP) with 23 walks and 47 strikeouts...Has appeared in one game this year, starting Game 1 of the NL Wild Card Series in Milwaukee.

Threw 4.0 innings in the Mets 5-1 loss in Atlanta on September 24...Recorded four earned runs on seven hits with one walk and five strikeouts...Has recorded a quality start in his five of his six outings in September...Has allowed three or fewer runs in seven of his last nine starts...Ranks sixth in the NL with 182.0 innings pitched.

NO WAY: Luis Severino carried a no-hitter into the eighth inning on April 29 against the Cubs...Threw 8.0 innings, allowing one run on one hit with two walks and five strikeouts...The outing was tied for the longest no-hit bid of his career...Threw 7.0 hitless innings on October 3, 2022 at Texas with the Yankees...Courtesy of Elias...Marked his longest start since June 16, 2018 vs. Tampa Bay (Also: 8.0 IP)...Became the first Mets pitcher to throw at least 8.0 innings and allow one or zero hits since Marcus Stroman accomplished the feat on July 21, 2021 at Cincinnati...Ranks fourth in the NL among qualifiers in ERA with a 2.31 (9 ER/35.0 IP) mark.

METS DEBUT: In his Mets debut on March 30, Severino became the 25th pitcher to start a game for both the Yankees and Mets (last: Bartolo Colon, 2011 with the Yankees and 2014 with the Mets)...He threw 5.0 innings, allowing 12 hits with six runs (three earned) and six strikeouts.

STRIKE THAT: Severino has recorded 949 career strikeouts...That ranks third among active Dominican pitchers...Only Johnny Cueto (1857) and Luis Castillo (1331).

2023 RECAP: Appeared in 19 games (18 starts) for the Yankees last season, posting a 6.65 ERA (66 ER/89.1 IP). From 2015-2022...Held a 3.39 ERA (240 ER/638.0 IP) and 1.12 WHIP, each the sixth-best mark in the American League (min. 600.0 IP).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Over eight seasons with the Yankees, went 54-37 with a 3.79 ERA (306 ER/727.1 IP) with 788 strikeouts in 141 games. Is a two-time AL All-Star (2017-18)...In 2017, ranked in the top ten in the AL in strikeouts (fourth, 230), innings pitched (ninth, 193.1), and wins (ninth, 14)...In 2018, finished in the top-10 in AL Cy Young balloting as he ranked eighth in the AL with 220 strikeouts and was third in the league with 19 wins...He was also the fastest Yankee to record 500 career strikeouts, accomplishing the feat in the 85th game of his career.

HIGH VELOCITY: In 2023, his fastball velocity (96.4 mph) ranked in the 88th percentile in the majors.
