**METSSELLANEOUS:** The Mets silenced the Cardinals, 3-0, last night...New York remains a season-high 4.5 games ahead in the NL East...Today, the Mets finish a six-game road trip to Arizona (2-1) and St. Louis (2-0)...Following this trip, the Mets are off on tomorrow, before beginning their second homestand of the season, a six-day, seven-game homestand against the Phillies (three games) and Braves (four games).

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY:** J.D. Davis celebrates his 29th birthday today...Davis is 6-23 (.261) with a double, a home run, two RBI and an .805 OPS in 10 games this year...Overall, 16 players have homered on their birthday in franchise history...Mike Piazza (three) and Jeff McNeil, Jim Beauchamp and Jim Hickman (two each) are the only Mets with multiple birthday blasts...Jeff McNeil was the last Mets player to homer on his birthday, doing so on April 8 at Washington.

**APRIL COME SHE WILL:** The Mets own a .737 winning percentage this month...That is the second-highest winning percentage in March/April in team history...Only the 1986 team at .813 (13-3) posted a better mark in March/April...The 2018 Mets set a team record with a 17 wins in March/April, finishing the month 17-9 (.654).

**THE SOUND OF SILENCE:** New York posted their fourth shutout of the season last night...The team's four shutouts lead the majors...New York has not allowed a run over their last 10.0 innings...The staff has allowed only four runs over their last three games...In five games on this trip, the Mets have posted a 2.80 ERA (14 earned runs/45.0 innings) with 14 walks and 49 strikeouts.

**HOW SWEEP IT IS:** The Mets are looking for their first sweep of the season...This would be the Mets' first three-game sweep of the Cardinals since April 1-4, 2007 in St. Louis.

**PICK SIX:** The Mets claimed their sixth series victory of the season last night...That surpasses the previous Mets record of five series victories to begin the year, held by the 2018 Mets...The last team to win their first six series to start the year was the 2019 Rays...Only four NL teams since 2012 have won each of their first six series of the year (2022 Mets, 2018 Arizona, 2012 St. Louis, 2012 Washington).

**WINNING TIME:** The Mets have posted a 14-5 record through the team's first 19 games...Only the 1986 Mets posted a better record at 15-4 through the team's first 19 games...The 2018 Mets as well as the 2015 Mets also posted a 14-5 record through 19 games...New York's pitching staff has struck out 192 this season...That ranks second in team history through 19 games...The 2018 Mets (198) own the record...The team's 192 strikeouts lead the major leagues.

**EVERYBODY HURTS:** The Mets have been hit by 18 pitches this year, which leads the majors...There is a three-way tie for second place at 11 HBP...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 325 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 43 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 57 HBP, while Starling Marte is fifth (42) in the last four seasons.

**CIS FOR COOKIE:** Carlos Carrasco is 1-0 with a 1.47 ERA (three earned runs/18.1 innings) with two walks and 20 strikeouts in three starts this year...His 1.47 ERA ranks 12th in the majors and is seventh in the NL...He ranks ninth in the majors and fifth in the NL with a 10.0 strikeout to walk ratio...He has posted a 0.60 WHIP, which is second only to Clayton Kershaw's 0.59 mark.

**VENEZUELAN BORN:** Carrasco needs 10 wins to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone, while he ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...His 1,375 career strikeouts are the fourth-highest total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Eclipsed 1,300 career innings pitched on April 10 at Washington, becoming one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to reach the milestone (three active).

**TWO-OUT MAGIC:** New York's hitters have combined for a .255/.357/.423 slashline with two outs this season...The Mets rank second in the majors in two-out OBP as well as two-out hits (53) and RBI (40)...In two-out RISP situations, the Mets rank fourth in the majors in both average (.306, 22-72) and on-base percentage (.412).

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** New York is 9-3 on the road this year...The .750 winning percentage is the best in the majors...New York went 2-10 in their first 12 road games last year...They did not win their ninth game on the road until May 18 (9-12), last season, their 21st game on the road.

**LET'S GO STREAKING!:** New York is on a three-game winning streak...That matches their season-high...New York won three straight from April 7-9, from April 12-15 and again from April 17-19...On the other hand, the Mets have lost back-to-back games just once this season, from April 10-11.

**YES WE McCANN:** James McCann went 3-4 with a run, a double and an RBI in last night's win...Over his last seven games, McCann is batting .300 (6-20) with three runs, a home run, four RBI, a walk, with a .348 OBP, a .550 SLG and an .898 OPS.

**RIGHT ON TIME:** The Mets are holding right-handed hitters to a major league-leading .166 (45-271) mark this year...The team has surrendered just 15 extra-base hits to righties in 2022...Chris Bassitt has allowed just three hits to right-handed hitters this year...He is holding righties to a .077 (3-39) mark...His .077 batting average against right-handed hitters is the third-best in the majors...As a team, the Cardinals are batting .214/.300/.296 against right-handed pitchers...They own a .596 OPS against righties, which is 27th in the majors and 14th in the National League.

**CARDS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are seeking their first season series victory against the Cardinals since they went 4-3 in 2014...The Mets are 21-29 at Busch Stadium since it opened in 2006.

**THE SOUND OF REFRESHMENT:** In seven career games at Busch Stadium, Pete Alonso is 11-31 (.355) with seven runs, a double, two home runs, three RBI and six walks...James McCann is 11-23 (.478) with three runs, four doubles, four RBI and three walks in seven career games at the ballpark.

**IT'S IN THE CARDS:** Robinson Canó is a .341 (14-41) career hitter with six runs, six doubles, a home run, two RBI and three walks in 11 career games vs. St. Louis...J.D. Davis is 9-23 (.391) with three runs, two doubles, a home run, four RBI and a walk in 10 games against St. Louis...Starling Marte has played 116 games against St. Louis and is a .291/.349/.420 hitter with 60 runs, 17 doubles, nine triples, eight home runs, 42 RBI and 24 walks.

**HIGH FIVE:** Jeff McNeil is on a five-game hitting streak, batting .400 (8-20) with six runs, four doubles, a triple, an RBI with a 1.110 OPS in that span...Overall, he is batting .328 (20-61) with 11 runs, five doubles, a triple, a home run, seven RBI, five walks, a .388 OBP, a .492 SLG and an .880 OPS over 17 games this season...McNeil has recorded seven multi-hit games, which is tied for sixth in the majors...He has recorded 117 multi-hit games since he entered the majors on July 24, 2018...That is tied with Angel Pagan and Lenny Dykstra for 47th on the team's all-time list.

**STARTING OFF:** The Mets starting staff has gone 10-2 with a 2.16 ERA (25 earned runs/104.1 innings) with 23 walks and 112 strikeouts...The starting staff leads the majors in ERA, WHIP (0.85), innings, opponent's batting average (.178) and strikeouts.

**FIRST IS THE BEST:** The Mets are 11-1 when scoring first this season...That is the best mark in the majors...New York was 56-23 when scoring first last season.

**THAT'S OFFENSIVE:** New York leads the major leagues in hits (163), tied for second in runs (89), second in OBP (.342), third in average (.255), fourth in walks (69), eighth in OPS (.731), tied for eighth in home runs (17) and 13th in SLG (.389)...Through 19 games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents 89-51.

**WIELDING AND FIELDING:** The Mets have committed just two errors over their last 14 games...Overall, the Mets have committed only five errors in 19 games...That is the second-fewest in the National League and tied for the fourth-fewest in the majors...The Mets rank second in the NL and fourth in the majors with a .992 fielding percentage.

**THE CHARMING MAN:** Drew Smith is one of 15 players this season to pitch at least 8.0 innings and not surrender an earned run...In eight games this season, Smith has posted a perfect ERA, allowing only four hits and three walks while striking out nine in 8.0 innings of work...He owns a career record of 4-3 with a 2.88 ERA (27 earned runs/84.1 innings) with 27 walks and 75 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Rays on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

**DESIGNATED FOR HITTING:** As a team, Mets designated hitters are batting .286 (20-70) with 13 runs, five doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI, eight walks, a .375 OBP and a .571 SLG...They rank second in OBP, third in average, are tied for third in homers as well as doubles and are fourth in SLG.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Alonso is fifth in the majors and second in the NL with 16 RBI...He is batting .267 (19-74) with nine runs, three doubles, three home runs, 16 RBI, two walks and a .419 SLG this year...He is batting .300 (6-20) with six runs, two doubles, three homes, 11 RBI with a 1.214 OPS in five games as a designated hitter this year.

**MOVING ON UP:** Pete Alonso's last home run was the 109th of his career...That broke a tie with José Reyes for sole possession of 13th on the team's all-time list...Ed Kranepool (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120).

**ED, EDD AND EDDY:** Edwin Díaz has recorded 67 saves as a member of the Mets...That places him 10th on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Neil Allen who recorded 69 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 176 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is 10-14 with 67 saves, a 3.88 ERA (67 earned runs/155.1 innings) with 64 walks and 252 strikeouts...His 252 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (284) and Josh Hader (283) have struck out more...Additionally, his 252 strikeouts are the 14th most by a reliever in franchise history...Turk Wendell is 13th with 259.

### CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

**LAST START:** Earned the win at Citi Field for the first time in his career after allowing two runs on four hits (one home run) with seven strikeouts through 7.2 innings on April 21 vs. San Francisco...Retired 20 of his last 22 batters faced...Has issued just two walks this season against 20 strikeouts...Pitched into the eighth inning for the first time since May 4, 2019 vs. Seattle while with Cleveland (7.2 IP).

**OVER THE HUMP:** Threw 10.2 scoreless innings from April 10-21 after surrendering a first-inning home run to Nelson Cruz in his season debut...That span marked his longest scoreless innings streak since not allowing a run in 11.0 consecutive innings from September 15-25, 2020...In his last two outings, Carrasco has tossed consecutive scoreless first innings for the first time since his last six starts of the 2020 season...Last season, Carrasco pitched to a 13.50 ERA (18 earned runs/12.0 innings) in the first inning compared to a 3.89 ERA (18 earned runs/41.2 innings) in all subsequent innings...Eight of his 12 home runs allowed came in the first frame, while opponents slashed .404/.444/.877.

**WHAT A PITCH:** Carrasco ranks ninth in the majors (min. 10 PA) with a 35.7 putaway percentage with his changeup, meaning 35.7 of his changeups thrown with two strikes result in a strikeout...Last season, Carrasco registered a 12.8 putaway percentage using his changeup...According to *Baseball Savant*, he has induced 15 swings and misses with his changeup through three starts this season, compared to 37 swings and missed with his changeup through 12 starts in 2021...His 10 strikeouts on his changeup this year are tied for third in the majors.

**AGE IS JUST A NUMBER:** *Sportradar* notes that Carrasco's 1.47 ERA and 0.60 WHIP through three starts have been matched or bested by just three age-35+ NL pitchers since 1980: Rich Hill (0.00 ERA, 0.42 WHIP in 2016), Greg Maddux (0.00 ERA, 0.45 WHIP in 2001) and Randy Johnson (1.01 ERA, 0.60 WHIP in 2000).

**RATIO:** Through three starts, Carrasco has racked up 20 strikeouts and has walked only two batters...According to *Sportradar*, he is the sixth Mets pitcher in club history with at least 20 Ks and fewer than three walks in his first three starts of a season...Noah Syndergaard (2017, 2019) did it twice...The others are: Matt Harvey (2015), Frank Viola (1990) and Tom Seaver (1972).

**VS. ST. LOUIS:** Last faced the Cardinals on August 29, 2020 at St. Louis when he threw 6.0 scoreless innings in the no decision...Is 0-1 in two career starts against the club and has posted a 2.84 ERA (four earned runs/12.2 innings) with two walks and 13 strikeouts.

**VENEZUELAN BORN:** Carrasco needs 10 wins to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone, while he ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...His 1,375 career strikeouts are the fourth-highest total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Eclipsed 1,300 career innings pitched on April 10 at Washington, becoming one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to reach the milestone (three active).

**2021 RECAP:** Missed the first three months of the season with a hamstring injury and made his Mets debut on July 30 vs. Cincinnati...Issued one or no walks in his first eight starts with the Mets (six walks total in that span)...Only three pitchers have walked fewer batters in their first eight starts with the Mets (Bartolo Colón, Bob Friend and Dennis Ribant each walked five)...He posted a 3.51 ERA (13 earned runs/33.1 innings) in six starts from August 20-September 18, tossing at least 5.0 innings and allowing three earned runs or fewer in each outing...Underwent right elbow surgery on October 19, performed by Mets Medical Director Dr. David Altchek at the Hospital for Special Surgery in Manhattan.

### FRIDAY'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (3-0, 2.35)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Defeated the Diamondbacks in Arizona on April 24 after throwing 6.2 innings and surrendering two runs on five hits...Struck out seven and walked only one batter.

**WINNING WAYS:** New York has won each of Megill's last four starts...That is tied for the longest team winning streak in his outings in his career...New York also won the first four starts of his career (June 23-July 10, 2021).
